SUBJECT: Battalions A.C. D.P. Corps - Meeting with Italian Government.

20 : 0-5 A.P.M. (2) SEP 30 1946

A meeting took place with representatives of the Ministries of the Italian Government interested on 27th September, 1946 to discuss the provision of rations to the A.C. Corps. After considerable previous discussion and talk, the Alto Commissariato per l'Alimentazione issued the A.C. representatives if he would accept Italian Rations (see ration card for D.P. Corps). This request had been anticipated and was agreed to. The representative dell'Alimentazione then proceeded to detail the ration he could supply on this scale. When he came to the question of meat, powdered milk and soap, etc., the Italian representative interposed and stated that he had instructions to oppose the issue of these articles to A.C. Corps as they were under dispute. I pointed out that he was eating on instructions but this attitude of U.S.S.R., who is prepared to be holding the Italian Government, is somewhat surprising as it will cost the Italian Government far more to supply the remaining articles on scale 15 than it would have to provide the Italian Rations ration scale. The following was finally agreed.

That the Italian authorities concerned would provide bread (325 - 350 grams), Rice and Pasta, or Flour in lieu, (85 grams), Cooking Oil (5.5 grams), Sugar (24 grams) from local sources, which are rationed items. The following could be bought by Corps on local contract:- Tea, Fresh Meat, Potatoes, Fresh, Vegetables, Bread, Oil, Lard, Beans/Lentils and Salt. All the above to be paid for from the Post Bellini scale.

It was agreed by the Post Bellini representative, who was most helpful throughout, that with Department of the Italian Government eventually should pay me an internal affair but that Post Bellini would finance D.P. A.C. Corps until further decision.

In view of the great difficulty and of the prohibitive cost of obtaining the following items locally, it is requested that the Military Authorities be approached by 0-5 with a view to advancing them as substitutes:- Meat Powder, Beans limited, Tea, Skin Milk Powder and Lentils Meat. The Italian Government would pay for these items but unless the U.S.S.R. restriction is removed, it would appear impossible for them to replace in exact kind these commodities:- Meat, Tea, Cheese, Powdered Milk and Lentils Meat.

The representative of the Ministry of Agriculture made an

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A meeting took place with representatives of the Ministry of the Italian Government in Rome on 27th September, 1946 to discuss the provision of milk to the A.C. Camps. After considerable previous discussion and talk, the Alto Comandante per l'Alimentazione asked the A.C. representative if he would accept Italian Refugee Scale rates for A.C. Camps. This request had been anticipated and was agreed to. The representative of the A.C. then promised to send the articles he could supply on this scale. Then he came to the question of meat, processed milk and soap, etc. The A.C. representative interposed and stated that he had no objection to supply the same of these articles to A.C. Camps as they were UNRRA imports. I assume that he was acting on instructions but this attitude of UNRRA, who is presumed to be holding the Italian Government, is somewhat surprising as it will cost the Italian Government far more to supply the remaining articles on scale 10 than it would have to provide the Italian Refugee Scale scale. The following was finally agreed:

That the Italian authorities concerned would provide Bread (300 - 350 grams), Rice and Pasta, or Flour in lieu, (45 grams), Cooking Oil (15.5 grams), Sugar (24 grams) from local stocks, which are released items. The following could be bought by Camps on local contract: Jam, Fresh Fruit, Potatoes Fresh, Vegetables Fresh, Onions, Beans/Tomatoes/Lentils and Salt. All the above to be paid for from the Post Italian credits.

It was agreed by the Post Italian representative, who was not helped throughout, that which Department of the Italian Government eventually should pay was an internal affair but that Post Italian would finance 3.5, A.C. Camps until further decision.

In view of the great difficulty and of the prohibitive cost of obtaining the following items locally, it is requested that the Military Authorities be approached by S-3 with a view to advancing them as hereinafter: Meat (Pork), Cheese (Swiss), Fat, Skim Milk Powder and Lard. The Italian Government would pay for these items but unless the UNRRA restriction is removed, it would appear impossible for them to replace in each kind these commodities: Jam, Onions, Potatoes, Processed Milk and Lard.

The representative of the Ministry of Agriculture made an impassioned demand with reference to the sad plight of Italy and protested against the Italian Government providing rations for persons who he alleged were not U.S. It was pointed out to him that it was not within the competence of the A.C. representative to discuss this matter, but that the Australian and German people had to bear the same burden.

1. Reference is made to Chief Liaison Officer, Bolzano, letter No. ACLO/B2/29 dated 3rd September 1946.

2. No Displaced persons are entitled to British Scale 1 Rations and the only personnel entitled to free issues of cigarettes are British soldiers also British Red Cross.

3. It is NOT possible to obtain authority for ex Yugoslav Naval personnel to be issued with a free cigarette ration.

4. Most D.P. Centres obtain an allotment of Italian cigarettes from local authority. As the Yugoslav guards with you are paid for guard duties, they could easily purchased such cigarettes.

5. Copies of this H.Q. letters DPR/20/Q of 2nd and 29 August 1946 are forwarded herewith. This D.P. ration is being supplied with effect from 1 October by Italian Authorities; therefore there is no reason why this ration is not drawn by you and issued to the R.N. Yugoslav Guards.

SUBJECT : Displaced Persons Rations.

SEP 5 1946

TO : Distribution.

1. Most of the D.P.R.S.C., A.C. Displaced Persons Camps at present, for convenience, are drawing all rations for Displaced Persons from Allied Military Supply Points. These rations are repaid to the Allied Military Authority in bulk by the Italian Government.

2. Allied Military Supply Points are becoming fewer and it has been decided that for uniformity and economy of transport all rations for Displaced Persons will be drawn direct from the Italian Authorities concerned.

3. The change-over from Military Supply Points to the Italian Authorities will take place in two phases :-

(a) All flour or bread will be drawn from Italian Authority concerned for consumption on 15 September onwards.

(b) Remainder of the rations will be drawn from Italian Authority concerned for consumption on 1st October onwards.

4. Unless other instructions are issued, those rations drawn from the Italian Authorities will be paid for through the Post Bellum Camp Account.

5. It is anticipated that similar instructions will shortly be issued as regards Petrol, Oil and Fuel-oil.

6. Group and Camp Commanders will contact Italian Provincial Authorities concerned forthwith, inform them of these instructions and make arrangements for the necessary supplies to be available by the dates mentioned in para 3 above.

7. The revised Ration Scale, as ordered under A.F.H.Q. letter G-5: 383.7 dated 30 July 1946, is attached as Appendix 'A' with weights shown in English and Italian.

5. Preserved Meat, Milk and Sugar, will be indented for by the Camps to Supral, or A.G. Food/Supply Officers where established, in accordance with normal practice.

6. Records will be kept showing the number of Rations issued and the quantities involved. These will be shown in the Monthly Rationing Statistics Summary, Section "D".

7. Any travel ration at present being issued without authority from this H.Q. is hereby cancelled and will be replaced by the scale laid down above.

4. In the circumstances, the welfare of these travelling refugees should be considered as of primary importance. Regional/Provincial Food Officers, in conjunction with the representatives of the Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission and/or Italian High Commissioner for War Refugees, should ensure that the local arrangements for the provision of the meals, particularly at the feeding points, are of as high a standard as possible.
