SUBJECT: Water Supply for Rome.  
TO : Chief Commissioner.

1. The water supply situation for Rome according to Doctor Frozini of the Water Supply Department, Ministry of Public Works, is as follows:

- a. The present shortage is entirely due to the persisting drought.
- b. The present population of Rome is about  $\frac{1}{2}$  million more than it was pre-war. New sources of supply have been connected to the system which would take care to the added load if the present drought did not exist.
- c. All known war damages to the system have been repaired.
- d. The normal water flow should be about 5600 litres per second; due to the drought this has been decreased by 1500 litres per second to about 4100 litres per second. Several new sources are under process being connected to the system, the more important of which are one at Acquoria (near Tivoli) which will permit an increase of 700 litres per second. This will be completed in 4 months. Another is the Pescara project (beyond Rieti) which will produce an increase of about 1000 litres per second. The normal rain will better the situation considerably although they will show no immediately effects.
- e. It is not anticipated that any further ration of water will be necessary. The present rationing scheme consist in interrupting the supply thus making less water available for use. This is attempted on an equitable basis for the entire city, but due to the old and complicated system is bound to deprive some parts of water while other parts go practically uninterrupted.

1. Reference is made to your file M.3 on the above subject and our letter dated 2 April 1946, file reference 062/PWU.

2. Enclosed for your information are letters dated 10 April from the Comune of Florence to the Genio Civile office of Florence; a letter dated 18 April from the Genio Civile, Florence, to the Ispettorato for Electricity, Water and Gas of the Ministry of Public Works, and letter dated 18 April from the Ministry of Public Works to Allied Commission.

3. Briefly, the Communal authorities of Florence take the position that the amount of water treatment required by the military is in excess of that which is actually needed. Further, that it would cost the Comune the sum of 300,000 lire per month which cannot be carried by the Communal administration in its present financial condition.

4. This Headquarters is not in a position to determine whether the Comune is correct with respect to the amount of treatment required and the matter is therefore referred to your Headquarters for decision.

5. In the event a decision is reached by your Headquarters directing that the military specifications for water treatment be continued, 2 courses are open for the Comune to recover the cost of water treatment:

- a. Arrangements be made with the Italian Government to subsidize the cost of chemicals required in excess of the amount normally used by the Comune of Florence.
- b. That the Comune of Florence be directed to make application to the Interministerial Price Committee of the Italian Government for permission to apply a surcharge on all service statements to its customers, thereby increasing its income by a sufficient amount to absorb the added cost of chemicals.

SUBJECT: Purification of water in Florence

TO : Genio Civile Office - Florence

With reference to your letter no. 725/591, dated April 11, we are sending the following information concerning the letter sent by the Ispettorato on 1 February on the handing over to the Italian Government of the matter of purifying Florence water.

1. The plant supplying water to Florence utilize an underground source that, due to the special constitution of the filtering layers, protected by some watertight ground are highly dependable as to hygienic properties. The plant has been operating for a great many years and frequent chemical analysis has shown a perfect purity.
2. At present, after the end of the war, all the factors that could have provided some infection of the water do not exist any more, due to some reconstruction work.
3. It is now believed by the Technical and Medical Direction of this Administration that the "coloring" of the water, as in pre-war time, be sufficient for the water coming from Gerolamo-Serrone and Monteroggi springs being conveyed into the city aqueduct.
4. The purification with calcium chloride, as requested by A.C. would provide a monthly expenditure of about 300,000 lire which should be paid by this Administration and cannot be afforded in the present financial condition.
5. It is then believed not financially convenient and hygienically useless to keep on purifying water by means of chlore.
6. In case the water purification, following request by A.C. <sup>4,867</sup> should be made with the chloride process the necessary expense would have to be charged to the Government.

Will you please report on this to the Ministry and take measures as required either to discontinue the chloration of water or, if not possible, to provide from the Government the required amount of money, reimbursing at the same time this Commune of the expenses since 28 March.

I also inform you that the Prefect of Florence Province was reported on that through an official letter.

With reference to your letter no. 475 of February 1, 1946 and your cable, same number, of 1 March 1946 I wish to inform you that the Office for Aqueducts, Florence Commune, today reported as what follows:

That office is in contact with Montecatini Co., Florence Branch, for the supply of Aluminum Sulphate to be used as purifier of the water from Arno river; S.A.L.P.A. Co. only produces potass. aluminum which cannot be employed.

An amount of 100 quintals (10 tons) of Aluminum Sulphate is at present being supplied by Montecatini Co.

The supply of Calcium Chlorate is being discussed with Allied H.Q. in Florence in order to fix the necessary amount for ordinary requirement.

Societa Chimica Aniene (Rosignano Solvay Factory) notified that they are able to supply that chemical, and this offer will be considered in connection with the actual purchase. The Aqueduct Office of the Commune also stated that they now have chemicals for the purification of water up to March 20.

I will be glad to report to that Ispettorato Generale on any further progress concerning this matter.

2. Reference para 1 and 2 your M.3 dated 17 November 1945 and para 1 your M.3 dated 4 December 1945. Enclosed is copy of letter AC/5756/IND - 1 June 45 wherein instructions were given to S.A.L.P.A. to supply chemicals to the "Genio Civile" Florence for use in purifying the Florence water supply. Also enclosed copy of letter AC/5568/IND - 1 June to G-5 AFHQ notifying that Alum and Lime for Florence had been arranged for. A search of AC files does not disclose what steps were taken thereafter (The personnel which handled the matter are no longer with AC), however, it now seems evident that the military have continued supplying these chemicals up to present time.

3. Para 2 your M.3 dated 17 November 1945. Upon receipt of this letter the matter was taken up personally with Dr. Lubrans, Chief of the Chemical Division, at the Ministry of Industry and Commerce. At the same time this official was given the names and addresses of the manufacturers in the Florence area who were in a position to furnish the required chemicals. This was covered by our letter O38/IAU - 30 November 1945 to Economics and Supply Division G-5 AFHQ.

4. Reference para 2 your M.3 dated 4 December 1945. Numerous verbal requests were made of the Minister of Industry and Commerce to furnish written acknowledgement of acceptance of responsibility for the supplying of chemicals. Finally AC wrote the Ministry of Industry and Commerce on 21 January 1946, copy enclosed, reference AC/5568/IND.

An acknowledgement to this letter has been made by the Direttore Generale of the Division of Industry and Mining of the Ministry of Industry and Commerce per letter 26 January 1946, Reference G30-653, copy enclosed.

In addition A.C. has contacted the Ministry of Public Works notifying them of their responsibility in the matter as per letter of 26 January 1946, Reference OCP/PWU copy attached. The date of 1 January 1946 was stated as the time when supplying these chemicals from military stocks would cease in order to speed up government action in this matter. As soon as an acknowledgement is received from them, a copy will be forwarded to you.

In view of past difficulties and of possible further delay on the part of the Italian Government, in getting under way on the supplying of these chemicals, this Headquarters is in accord with your arrangements to continue supplying chemicals until 1 February 1946, which was the subject of your cable C-15908 dated 22 January 1946 to ALCOM.

As an additional precaution this Headquarters is in accord with your recommendation that the water used by Allied personnel be treated before consumption until it is definitely established that the city of Florence is adequately treating its water supply.

5. Reference para 4 (2) your M.3 dated 17 November 1945, and para 3 your M.3 dated 4 December 1945. The Chief Accountant of Allied Supply Accounting Agency has been consulted in this matter. He states that as soon as price issue vouchers, duly acknowledged by the receiving authorities, are received by this Headquarters, they should be handed to him for debiting to the Italian Government in sterling. This, however, he can only do if:-

- (a) the issues were made prior 30 November 1945
- and (b) the chemicals in question are of imported origin

If the issues were made after 30 November 1945 ASAA advises that the accounting cannot be done on behalf of Allied Commission, but will have to be handled by AFHQ. If the chemicals concerned are of Italian origin they do not constitute a proper sterling charge to the Italian Government.

1. This letter will confirm the information given you verbally, in December, by Eng. F. Florio of this office, regarding firms able to supply the alum (solfato d'alluminio) and calcium chloride (clorure di calce), required by the city of Florence's water works for purification purposes.
2. These firms are : S.A.L.P.A. of Castellina in Chianti which could supply the 2 tons/month of alum needed; while the firm "Solvay" at Resignano can readily furnish the 10 tons/month of calcium chloride.
3. Would you kindly furnish this office with written confirmation that the Italian authorities concerned, have already taken steps to assure the Florence Public Works with the above mentioned chemical supplies hereafter.
4. We have to advise that the above mentioned items have not yet been supplied from Italian sources as agreed previously. The Allied Armed Forces which in the past have furnished these chemicals, essential to the proper maintenance of a sanitary water supply for the civilian population of Florence, have notified us that they will no longer accept responsibility in the matter.

4. Please have this letter acknowledged by your Ministry since the responsibility for the purity of the water at Florence, for human consumption, comes within the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Public Works.

5. It is recommended that your Ministry together with the Department of Health arrange to send representatives to Florence to insure that the proper steps are taken to continue the correct treatment at the city's water supply in order to eliminate any possibility of epidemics or disease amongst the civil population.

2. No reply has yet been received to our M-3 dated 17 Nov. para 5 or to our M-3 dated 4 December para 3. In addition information has been received from No.3 District that they are being called upon once more to produce the necessary sterilization chemicals for the water supply for the month of January, although the attention of the Allied Commission was drawn on 26 May 1945 to the fact that this was a civil commitment.

3. It is requested, therefore, that you will furnish replies to our two letters under reference by 19 January and confirm that the ITALIAN Government is prepared to shoulder its responsibility in respect of the supply of these chemicals. Units have already begun to carry out their own water sterilization and if the ITALIAN Government does not produce the chemicals concerned it may be necessary to restrict sterilization to military water points.

1. Under reference of this HQ letter M-3 dated 26 May 1945, the attention of the AC was drawn to a signal received at this HQ from HQ Florence Command, in which it was requested that a monthly allocation of 10 tons of Chloride of Lime and 10 tons of Alum be provided for the purification of the City of FLORENCE Water supply.

2. To meet the then existing emergency, this HQ authorised releases of these chemicals for a period of 2 months only, but at the same time, stressed that all future requirements must be obtained through Civil channels.

In this respect, AC was asked to give the matter its immediate attention and initiate action as was deemed necessary to ensure the future supply of chemicals for water purification purposes.

3. A further letter, reference as above dated 28 May, notified AC that the SALPA firm, FLORENCE, was producing 2 tons of Alum per day at CASTELLINA IN CHIANTI, near SIENNA, and in view of this the release of Alum from military stocks was cancelled. See also your letter, ref 306/PWU dated 12 June.

4. The following is an extract from a letter from this HQ to HQ, No. 3 District:-

"1. Authority is given for issue of 15 tons Chlorine and 15 tons of Aluminium Sulphate for sterilisation of FLORENCE water supply until end of Dec 1945.

2. G-5 is requested to ensure that the value of these supplies is noted in AC's books as a charge against the Italian Government in sterling. ST will forward necessary vouchers to G-5 for this purpose.

3. G-5 are also requested to investigate as to whether AC can take over this commitment wef 1 Jan, as it is not a proper military responsibility."

5. In view of the disclosures in para 4 above, will you please notify this HQ by not later than 30 Nov what action was taken by Allied Commission on receipt of letters referred to in paras. 1 and 2 above, and take action under para. 4 (2) above.

In May this Society sent to Milan one of their employees to procure a supply of materials needed for the maintainment of the aqueduct. These materials have not been available for a few years and the Society is at present without them. Though these are available (see No. 1 letter inclosed) we have not been able to buy them yet because of the well known restrictions existing and inspite of the fact that the Ministry of Industry recognizes the need. (See letter No. 2 inclosed).

Since it is absolutely urgent that we have these materials for the execution of those works which are for the benefit of the consumers, we request that you intervene for us at the proper Allied Authorities so that we may obtain the authorization to buy from the Damine Firm of Bergamo; Falci and Novati of Milan, the materials in question as listed in the attached list.

Since we have to provide for the Transportation of these materials from Milan and Bergamo to our warehouses in Rome and considering that it would require at least 10 trucks (total weight of materials about 35 Tons) and be a serious expense and a large waste of gasoline: we request that permission be obtained to transport these materials in two covered railway cars on a Allied Military train. These cars could be assigned for this purpose by the Railway Command.

We are certain that you will interest yourself in this matter in recognition of our efforts to overcome the serious difficulties which obstructed us in restoring to normality the service of supplying drinking water to Rome. We thank you very much.

1. It is understood that the Genio Civile of Leghorn Province has presented to the Public Works and Utilities Division, Toscana Region, Allied Commission, a proposal by Sella, 4 Via Sallustiana, Rome, for the construction and installation of ten (10) pump-motor units at the Filottolo Pump Station of the Leghorn water system. It is further understood that a contract for the work has not yet been signed. The project was originally proposed in January 1945.

2. Water supply in Leghorn, particularly for the civilian population, is critical with the advent of hot weather and heavy military water demands for redeployment and prisoner of war compounds. Pumps at Filottolo now consist of one (1) civilian-owned electric motor driven pump and four (4) army-owned gasoline engine driven pumps. The army-owned pumps will have to be withdrawn within the next few months which will leave Leghorn with only about 30 per cent of the capacity of the Filottolo Pump Station and no standby unless additional pumps are installed.

3. This headquarters is interested in the completion of the project in order that military equipment may be relieved and at the same time provide water for the civilian population and more adequately for military use.

4. It is requested that completion of the contract and the whole project be expedited particularly in view of present critical water supply situation for civilians in the Comune of Leghorn.

2. The normal supply is entirely from private wells, about 7 metres deep. This supply is stated to be always adequate as regards quantity (no figures available) but has previously been unsatisfactory as regards quality. There have been previous outbreaks of typhoid. The present epidemic is supposed to be due to flooding from the ARNO last year, which carried pollution from cesspools etc. into the water bearing strata. The population is about 9000; there were 146 typhoid patients in hospital on 31 March, and 110 on 5 April. There have been 11 deaths, but the situation is considered to be improving steadily.

3. As stated in para 5 of Capt. Saul's report, the supplies are being chlorinated at public fountains, and sterilizing powder is distributed to individuals for use with private supplies.

4. According to the Engineer, the question of a piped supply from another source was considered at least 20 years ago. The deep wells only produce an unpotable water, and the nearest adequate potable supply was found to be at M.R. 950390. The supply has been measured over a considerable period and the minimum yield (October) found to be 10 litres/second which would supply 24 gallons per head per 24 hours.

Work in the intake, a series of wells joined by an underground gallery, was started some years ago, and this intake would be available for use after clearing. We visited the site, but the wells are covered over and could not be examined. The outlet from the gallery was found, and the supply appears good.

5. The source is 177 metres above S. Giovanni, but as it lies in a valley the pipe line would have to follow the line of the stream for some distance, and the total length would be 7800 metres with no possibility of any appreciable reduction in length. A service reservoir would be required above the town, and would also provide a means of reducing static head in the town supply.

7. There is considerable unemployment in S. Giovanni and unskilled labour is readily available but would need transporting to site.

8. Summary. (a) The present method of chlorinating the supply from public foundations appears adequate, but the private chlorination does not appear very satisfactory in view of the lack of supervision. It is suggested that the provision of more tanks, or barrels, to give a total storage of up to 30,000 litres (6,600 gallons) from supplies which can be chlorinated by the local

medical authorities, and closing of all other wells, would be the simplest, quickest, and cheapest solution to the present problem. The tanks offered by 55 Area might be scraped and painted internally and put into use.

The figure of 30,000 litres is based on a daily consumption of 40 litres per head over 12 hours, the tanks being in pairs as before to allow at least one hour's storage after chlorination. This will probably involve considerable use of private wells as public supplies, but appears to be the only means of ensuring adequate chlorination.

(b) If a new supply of water be considered essential (and it has been apparently shelved for a long period) the source mentioned in para 5 appears the best supply. (Montevarchi has very little water to spare, and the saving of 3,000 metres of pipe would be offset by the need for a pumping plant). The necessary amount of Victualic piping could be laid by civilian labour supervised by military engineer M/O.Rs in 7-10 days, largely depending on transport available for materials and labour. The source could be cleaned out during the same period.

Since no adequate storage reservoir exists, a small break pressure tank above the town would be necessary to avoid excessive pressure at public stand-pipes.

This scheme would presumably be of a temporary nature only, either until the present epidemic ceases, or until a permanent piped supply from the same sources, which could take about 2-3 months to lay, could be completed. A services reservoir could be constructed later when the authorities decide to lay a distribution system in the town.

3. If this scheme could be done without interfering with other, more important, work it should be done, but the immediate decision is rather one for the Public Works and Utilities Officer, who knows details of availability of labour, materials etc., than for this Department.

The following information is offered with reference to the water situation at the above Commune:

Lt.Col.Lee, Regional Engineer, has been informed locally on the situation but has received no request from either the Regional Medical Officer or the Provincial Commissioner for work to be undertaken. The Commune has never had a central water supply system but depended entirely upon several wells. Certain of the wells have become contaminated as a result of the flood water and adjacent cess pools and water can be used for drinking purposes from these particular wells only after boiling. Some fear is prevalent locally of an outbreak of typhoid.

The supply of water pipe, as suggested, will not solve the problem, as a complete water system will be required including impounding facilities. If it is desired Lt.Col.Lee will cause an engineering investigation to be made after which definite recommendations can be offered as to the most practical solution.

1. The Aniene plant was put in working order by this Sub-Commission and therefore the situation at the plant is well known. The plant has been ready for operation since December 1944.
2. For technical reasons a specially pure quality of salt is required. This is produced in Sicily. No other salt available on the mainland at this moment is suitable.
3. Reactivation of the plant has been delayed by transportation difficulties. The enclosed list is self-explanatory in this respect. This list is not forwarded for the purpose of criticism, but in order to state the facts.
4. Following new arrangements made between Transportation Sub-Commission and ANIC emergency transfers by sea have been accepted. The first schooner load (120 tons) is under way and the second (120 tons) should follow by the end of the month.

SUBJECT : Rome Water Supply Chlorination.

TO : Chief of Staff  
Headquarters, Allied Commission.

1. The Regional Engineer reports that the present supply of chemicals for chlorination are sufficient to last until 15th February in the case of AGRA and 1st March in the case of MARCIA. The water supply for Rome and surrounding towns is unfit for drinking without chlorine. The situation will be worsened with the advent of the summer months. The situation is obviously critical.
2. The Societa' Elettrochimica Aniene, Rome, in order to produce chlorine and chlorites for the treatment of the water supply for Rome and surrounding towns, needs certain types of salt.
3. It will be necessary to have 110 tons of marine salt or 100 tons of rock salt in order to operate the plant. The full capacity of the plant would require between 500 and 600 tons per month. 100 to 110 tons per month is the minimum capacity on which the plant can operate.
4. Either of the above types of salt can be used with the requirement that the percentage of magnesium shall not exceed 0.10 or 0.15%. For technical reasons production by electrolysis methods will not permit the use of a higher percentage of magnesium. For that reason the salt coming from the State factories at Sardinia and the existing salt in Rome, is not usable (magnesium content 1 to 1.5%). Salt from Sicily or Pontovecci and other places in Sardinia which falls within the 0.10 or 0.15 % magnesium content is usable.
5. On the basis of minimum permissible operation, a sufficient supply of chlorine can be manufactured in two thirds of a month's operation of the Aniene plant in order to take care of the present normal needs of the A.C.E.A. and MARCIA water companies Rome water supply for a six months period.
6. This situation had been brought to the attention of the Economic Section, Headquarters, Allied Commission, as early as December. Immediate action is requested.
