The firm, ARCOLEO BROTHERS, of Palermo, maritime organisation for shipment, transhipment, and transport, has unfolded its activity in the port of Palermo on behalf of the Federated Commission of Agrarians for the last ten years.

Since the Liberation they have been the only ones to perform, with technical and well-organized activity, the landing of ships for the Federation itself. The enclosed letter is evidence of the above statement. In June, another firm made pressure with the offices of the Federation in Palermo, in order to get hold of our work. The Federation thought it could economize by making the change, but, due to inefficiency a great deal of waste and extra expense have resulted. We would like the whole situation reconsidered, and our firm in Palermo be given back its work with the Federation.

Please beg Admiral Stone to recommend us to the Ministry of Food, and ask them to examine our case.

TO : Finance Sub-Com. (attention of Lt. Col. Thomas)

The new War Establishment involves a considerable cut in transport on the British side, so that while there should be enough transport to cover the immediate needs of A.C. officers, there is nothing left over for all those odd occasions when transport is needed. H.A.W. is a good example. The transport allocation will cover the needs of the 12 members of the Division Group - but will not cover the visitors who arrive at H.A.W. by air, and who need to get to H.A.O., H.A.D.C. etc.

The Executive Commissioner has therefore asked me to find out whether there is any objection to S.L.C. being given authority to hire civilian cars to cover emergency needs, and to the cost of hire being met out of A.C. funds. It is not known yet how possible it may be to hire suitable civilian cars, but perhaps will you please say whether you have any objection in principle to the project.

SUBJECT: Special Transportation to North and Return

TO : Executive Commissioner

1. Mr. Kenneth L. Stauffer of this section has been ordered to Milan to make a very important investigation into the movements of textiles. His assignment will require travel from Milan to a few of the more important textiles centers of the North.

2. The original plan was for Mr. Stauffer to fly to Milan and while there use my car for the necessary short trips out of Milan; this car being already in Milan with another party. As you know, there have been no plane flights for the past eight days and today's report on the weather in the North makes it seem improbable that there will be any flights for another three or four days.

3. Mr. Stauffer has been under treatment by the AC medical officer for a back injury and has been advised not to make the trip in a jeep or command car or in the AC railroad accommodations. The possibility of private transportation in the new pullman service has been investigated and it has been reported that no space is available for another two weeks.

4. It is requested in view of the above circumstances that the proper office be instructed to provide a comfortable car for this important mission. It is expected that the work in the North will require four days which would mean that the car would be required for only six or seven days, allowing for the time to end from Milan.

My dear Admiral,

In a memorandum 6/1204/32, dated November 7th, our Minister asked for the permission of the Allied Commission to send by rail to Warsaw a car train 1100 destined to Ambassador Pocie.

Another memorandum 6/122/306 asked for a visa for transit through the territory under allied control, in favour of Mr. CULU Nsimango, who should be travelling on the same wagon to escort the car, and remain in Warsaw as Ambassador Pocie's driver.

In spite of many inquiries, no affirmative answer was received about the two requests.

On the 19th., i.e. next Wednesday, one of the last trains for the repatriation of Polish troops will be leaving, and but for the allied permission, everything is ready to attach the wagon with the said car to the train.

Considering that this is a very urgent matter, I shall be most grateful if you kindly intervene so that the permissions required may come in time, i.e. no later than the 10th inst., to give the necessary orders for the departure of the wagon.

Mr. Alberto Gradi, son of a dependent of the Royal Household, residing in Rome - via Marche, 17 - forwarded to H.R.H. the Lieutenant General of the Kingdom the enclosed memorandum, hoping to obtain from the Allied Command, the allocation of some vehicle for passengers transport for long distance trips.

It seems that Mr. Gradi has already contacted the 'Ente provinciale del Turismo', establishing the itineraries, time schedules and prices.

According to the instructions of His Royal Highness, and considering that Mr. Gradi was dismissed by the Farmers Confederation because he refused to go North and collaborate with the Nazi-fascists, and that, during the underground period, he belonged to a band of patriots, I bring his request to your kind attention, for whatever action you will be able to take in his favour.

The undersigned, Alberto Gredi of Augusto, respectfully begs for the intervention of your Royal Highness with the Allied Command, so that he may be assigned a certain number of cars, for long distance passenger transport. He adds that he has already informed the 'Ente provinciale del Turismo' which is to regulate the itineraries, timetable, and prices, so that the service may be convenient for and available to everyone.

It would be necessary to have the Allied command hand over the 'Autopullman' required (the German autopullmans taken during the war and put at the disposition of the American Red Cross for the transport of troops during rest periods, are at present available and would do).

The undersigned states that he was employed by the Farmers' confederation and had been working there for 16 years, ever since October 1943 when he was dismissed for refusing to go North, and chiefly for antifascism, so that his house was searched and himself under the surveillance of the police.

He also states that during the underground period, he belonged to the Iason band, as from card n. 361, deposited at the War Ministry.

Besides, the father of the undersigned could also find a job in this concern; he has been employed in the royal household for 47 years and is to be pensioned off next year.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister

I am grateful for your letter under reference 44291/II.I of the 1st Oct.

In general I agree with your proposals and the organization you suggest. I consider it opportune for me to emphasize two points before the details of the scheme are discussed.

Firstly, the proposals in your letter and the handing over from Allied Commission of the control of movement in no way affects the present disposition and control of Italian shipping. This matter, as you are aware, is being dealt with separately.

Secondly, allied military requirements will continue to take priority over all other movement and no military move will be postponed unless agreement has been obtained from the necessary Allied Military Authority.

As the time is now ripe for the setting up of your proposed technical committee will you please inform its President that he should get in touch with the Transportation Sub-Commission of Allied Commission to work out the details as early as possible.
