My dear Mr. Vice Minister,

I have been requested by the Headquarters, United States and Theater of Operations, United States Army, to inform you that the agencies of your Government which have purchased surplus Army motor vehicles have desired to procure any replacement parts for the maintenance of these vehicles. Since the parts desired were not available from my supplies, a request was made to the U.S. Army Department to make arrangements in the United States so that your agencies could order the required parts direct from the manufacturers. It was also requested that if this arrangement could not be worked out by the U.S. Department, then the manufacturers be asked as to the times they would require for furnishing drawings and specifications of the required parts to your government agencies in order that these items might be locally manufactured in Italy.

The reply from the U.S. Department stated that it is desirable for normal commercial channels of trade to be re-established between the United States and Italy, and for that reason it was suggested that your government should make their inquiries through commercial channels for the purchase of all vehicular spare parts that are not available from my supplies in this theater.

I am therefore advising you that your requests for prices and orders for actual delivery of spare parts should be submitted to the proper United States manufacturer and that proper United States part numbers and descriptive nomenclature must be used. Commercial sales action are referred to give you a general idea as to determining the proper commercial and part numbers and nomenclature to be used in correspondence on this subject.

1. The agencies of the Italian Government which have purchased surplus Army motor vehicles have desired to procure many replacement parts for the maintenance of these vehicles. Chief, French Military Missions in ItalyReference is made to your letter No. 706/DN.O dated 8 January
1946, subject as above.

1. The whole of Italy, with the exception of the two provinces of UDINE and VENEZIA GIULIA, is now under the jurisdiction of the Italian Government. There are no AMG officers remaining as such in this territory. The few liaison officers still retained are limited in their functions and may not interfere with the Italian administration nor give advice to its officials.

2. You will perceive, therefore, that the Allied Command in Italy is no longer in a position to bring pressure to bear on the Italian Government in matters such as you have raised. The recovery of French vehicles in Italian hands must be a matter for direct negotiation between the French and the Italian authorities.

3. Monies arising from the sale of material of French origin are the subject of deliberations in Washington. No decision on this point can therefore be given at present. However, all such sums are properly recorded and their disposition will present no difficulties once their fate has been decided.

4. These questions were discussed at AFHQ on 12 February 1946 at a meeting with Comdt. Lamson and Comdt. Destortes. At this meeting the provisions of the foregoing paragraphs were conveyed to your representatives.

Disposal of repatriated and purchased property of Italian origin by transfer to authorized Italian Government agencies presents a serious problem unless fullest cooperation is secured from the Italian Government. Reference is made to COMINT order 3-369 of 20 August and 10847 of 15 October.

It is imperative, in the interest of the Allied military program and the Italian economy, that all equipment of Italian origin of no further need to the military forces be promptly accepted by the Italian Government. Failure of acceptance will result in a needless waste of resources.

Request that strong representations be made to the Italian Government on a sufficiently high level to insure that authorized Government agencies are promptly and fully established at agreed locations and are properly manned and equipped to accept all offerings. From 74 AF US thru 65 AFHQ.

Reference is made to cable C 269 dated 28 August current and your reply thereto in AT USA cable C 16720 of 4 September.

Disposal of requisitioned Italian vehicles cannot be accomplished in accord with provisions of Par 3 of AFM U.S. supply directive number 70. Italian Government agencies designated by Inspector General della Motorizzazione decline to accept vehicles in either PRINCIPAL or LEHIGH on grounds that they have insufficient personnel and facilities to perform their mission. Although agencies are willing to sign a statement of refusal required by Par 13 of supply directive number 70, this Headquarters feels that serious shortages of transportation in Italy makes it extremely desirable that Italian Government take vigorous action to establish competent organization and sufficient facilities to accept requisitioned vehicles. If a statement of refusal is signed by Italian agencies, present condition of vehicles would make it necessary in best interests of US Army to salvage them rather than declare surplus to HQG.

Request AGO to direct to consult with Italian Government officials and advise this Headquarters of results of conference as soon as possible.

SUBJECT : Contract between AC and Italian Transport Firms. OCT - 8 1945
TO : Prof. Filippo Vassalli, Dean of the Faculty of Rome.

1. Reference above subject, your memorandum thereon is duly acknowledged and content-noted.

2. A translation of the documents was forwarded to War Materials Disposal and Transportation Sub-Commissions for their consideration and necessary action. No answer has yet been received but it should be forthcoming in a day or so.

3. CLA (Colonel Behrens) before departing for U.K. left a note to explain that a form of contract had been drafted by him for the signature of AC and the firms you represent with a view to disposing of their claims against the commission. This therefore confirms your statement.

4. Colonel Behrens indicated also that he had personally requested you to consider and approve the contract. He also stated that both sub-commissions concerned had agreed to the contract and undertaken to sign it.

5. The motives which are causing the delay in the signature of the contract are not known to this sub-commission but no doubt War Materials Disposal and Transportation sub-commissions are attending to the matter, and it is understood that the Executive Commissioner had been informed at the time of the reason why the Chief Legal Advisor had recommended that such contract be entered into by AC.

6. In the absence of the undersigned will you please see Judge Musgrave Thomas to whom the file of this matter has been handed.

RESTRICTIONS.

Uneconomically repairable and salvage vehicles listed in 5th ARMY cable 7892 will be transferred direct to ALLIED COMMISSION for Italian Government which will take over vehicles at VENICE and supply guards commencing 27 August. Thereafter one thousand per week will be taken over as availabilities are reported.

5th ARMY will prepare 6 copies of shipping tickets to be signed by AC representative. These will list vehicles by War Department registration numbers and will indicate code classification of groups of vehicles, reference telephone conversation Lt Col CLARK-Major NOLAN. Forward 5 copies of signed shipping tickets to PIRASSE.

PIRASSE will furnish remainder of vehicles to make two zero thousand tons lift for AC using list in cable 7892 as an estimate of portion to be supplied by 5th ARMY. Direct contact with AC by PIRASSE regarding pick up of balance of vehicles is authorized. Actual signed shipping tickets delivered by 5th ARMY will be used in computing final total of vehicles to be delivered to AC by PIRASSE.

Dear Mr. Minister:

Confirming our conversation of 25 June 1945, the Allies placed an order for 2,000 trucks of 2½ tons capacity - giving a total lift of 5,000 tons for use by the Italian Government. This order was later changed to 260 trucks of 10 ton and 1600 trucks of 1½ ton capacity, giving a lift of 5,000 tons.

These trucks are being transferred to the Italian Government which is assigning them to ISR for operation. To date 500 of these trucks have been delivered to the Italian Government. Delivery can be increased if the ISR can accept them more rapidly.

There are now approximately 650 Allied trucks operating in Truck Pools in the Southern and Abruzzi-Marche Regions. These trucks have been used since the inception of the Truck Pools to carry civil supplies only.

On 16 June 1945, an officer of the Allied Commission, accompanied by a representative of the Ministry of Transport and the Ministry of the Treasury left for Campobasso on initial stage of transferring all of the trucks in those Truck Pools to the Italian Government. The transfer of the trucks in Campobasso and Foggia have already been completed. The transfer of the balance of these 650 trucks should be effected by 1 August.

The Allied Commission have been operating approximately 2,000 captured trucks in Sicily, 600 of which are runners. This organization has been operating under the name of INT - AC, Sicily. All of the property of the INT - Sicily was transferred from the Allied Commission to the Italian Government on 25 June 1945.

In addition, there are approximately 2,244 trucks in AC Special Truck Operating Group, composed of the 1700 - 1½ ton trucks, most of which have been delivered and approximately 580 - 2½ to 3 ton trucks supplied from military sources. It is proposed

These above enumerated vehicles will be transferred to the Italian Government with the understanding that the U.S.A. and U.K. Governments reserve the right to raise a charge in dollars and sterling against the Italian Government. It is also with the understanding that any lifts required by AC will be given first priority for transport by the Italian Government or such other agency or person who may control the operation of those vehicles.

Your acceptance of this tentative program and the conditions of transfer will be greatly appreciated.

1. Reference is made to previous correspondence on the above subject. It is felt
that a summary of the whole lamentable history may be useful. 10.

2. We originally suggested to AFHQ per Economic Section letter EG/49, of 24 April
1944, that WD vehicles should be sold to the Italian Government in certain cases. Nothing
much seems to have happened until 17 Nov. 1944 when we again wrote to AFHQ per AC/TN/G-5
letter, referring back to the previous letter and asking once more for authority to sell
the vehicles. After a decent interval this apparently resulted in AFHQ's signal of 30
January 1945, FX 17652, to AGWAR, Washington which asked for authority to sell the
vehicles. AGWAR telegram # 34123 of 6 February was received in reply; it stated briefly
that military vehicles should not be sold to the Italian Government, but that such vehicles
should be disposed of to the Italian Government in the same manner as other civil affairs
items are made available to that government; it added that after submitting requirements
in the established manner, prior approval of items, quantities and types should be obtained
from CCAC. When the copy of this signal was received at AC Hqs, the Chief of Staff phoned
hell about the delay there had been in dealing with the question; this was on 13 February.

3. In this Sub-Commission's memorandum of 19 February 1945 addressed to you under
the present reference, we suggested that the manner referred to by the Chief of Staff in
Washington was presumably the ordinary requisitioning system and that "under this system
we should requisition the necessary number of trucks thru AFHQ, G-5, in the same way as
we do for other items necessary for the prevention of disease and unrest." We recommended
that the expression "turned over to the Italian Government against receiving report in the
same manner as other imported subsistence items" should be used. 11

4. The next step forward was LAC airmail 108 dated 10 March from AFHQ to CCAC,
Washington. This airmail again requested that we should sell certain enumerated vehicles
to the Italian Government; the word "sell" was again used and even underlined, altho
Washington had previously objected to such a procedure.

5. The whole question has been in hand for just a year, and the last signal from
AFHQ was sent over a month ago, it seems we might reasonably press AFHQ to send a chaser
to Washington. Until we can transfer these vehicles to the Italian Government, we cannot
withdraw the officers now safeguarding WD property. These officers will shortly be badly
needed in the North, but at the present rate of progreasthere seems to be little chance
of securing their release.

I have received two ~~Aide-Memoires~~ from your Ministry dated 20th February about

(1) second-hand lorries for Italy from Britain:

(2) vehicles which may be available to Italy after the war.

It is not clear from the first ~~Aide-Memoire~~ on what programme the 1500 lorries which, according to Count Corandini, might be handed over, would figure. But in any case for the time being there is no chance of any second-hand lorries being supplied to Italy except on military programmes. Any civilian demands would carry too low a priority for any lorries whether new or second-hand to be supplied to Italy during the present squeeze on all transport. I do not, therefore, see any alternative to Italy's requirements for lorries being dealt with, except through Allied Military channels.

I should be glad at any time to discuss with you either of the subjects raised in the two ~~Aide-Memoires~~ and I look forward to seeing the plan referred to in the second ~~Aide-Memoire~~.

The Italian Embassy in London, have been informed by a high-ranking personality of the British Government about the possibility that lorries and/or other means of transport could be allocated to Italy, from the materials which will be available after the end of the war.

It was therefore suggested that Italy should propose a plan of her minimum requirements, in order to obtain since this moment a share of these materials, before they are allocated to other countries, equally interested to the distribution of said materials.

The Italian Government deems necessary to point out that the situation of their means of transport is already extremely bad and in the next future it will become even worse. Therefore, they will take steps to outline such a plan, that in due time will be submitted to the attention of the proper Authorities.

In the meantime, the Italian Government would appreciate if the British Authorities could kindly do their utmost to facilitate the favourable conclusion of this very important matter, framing this proposed allegation in the distribution of the transport materials that will eventually be available after the war is over.

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8. At present the W.D. vehicles on loan to the A.C. are the responsibility of individual A.C. officers. With the withdrawal of allied officers from substantial portions of liberated Italy there are, in many areas, no military personnel who can be held responsible for W.D. transportation. This administrative problem presents difficulties in effecting the withdrawal of military personnel from such areas which would be overcome by sale of the vehicles to the Italian government.

9. It is recommended that authority be granted to sell military vehicles and maintenance parts to the Italian Government in conformity with the foregoing proposal.

10. This recommendation is agreed by both U.S. and British authorities.

The first indication of action by AFHQ was receipt of the information copy of their signal PI 17652 of 30 January to AGWAR and TROOPERS (copy marked "C").
3. The manner referred to by the CCS is presumably the ordinary requisitioning system. Under this system we should requisition the necessary number of trucks through AFHQ, G-5, in the same way as we do for other items necessary for the prevention of disease and unrest. In this particular case we could state in justification that trucks were necessary to haul commodities essential under the disease and unrest formula, that trucks are in fact now doing such work, that AGWAR telegram of 8 February instructs us to deal with the transfer of vehicles in this way, and that unless we do in fact make this transfer we cannot withdraw truck pool officers from King's Italy in accordance with the latest policy.
4. It seems that the CCS' main objection is to the word "sell" in paragraph 3-A of AFHQ telegram of 30 January. It is possible that the proposal could have been acceptable if AFHQ had used the phrase "turned over to the Italian Government against receiving report in the same manner as other imported items;" such vehicles would then be a charge against the Italian Government account in accordance with the establishing procedure laid down in TM 220.
5. It is now proposed to submit a requisition for vehicles up to the number actually employed in truck pools in King's Italy as outlined in paragraph 3 above. At the same time we will submit an indent for a six months supply of spare parts for these vehicles.

SUBJ CT: Transport for ACC Civilian Supplies.

TO : AFHQ, Military Government Section.

1. Reference AFHQ(ADM. Adm. Echo) 36/21/3 of 8 Feb 44, Transport for ACC, it is recommended that the British and American trucks allocated for the distribution of civilian supplies be sold for cash to the Italian Government at landed cost. Spare parts subsequently supplied will also be sold at landed cost. The total number of the trucks will ultimately be 1000 but a certain number of them particularly in AMG territory, will probably be operated by, and remain the property of, ACC.
2. The sale of these vehicles is recommended for the following reasons:-
 - a. Owing to shortage of personnel, these trucks must be organized and run by Italian civilian organizations.
 - b. Maintenance and operational care will be at a minimum unless the profit motive can be introduced. Italian managers and drivers will not take maximum care of these vehicles if they are ACC property, particularly if all repairs are carried out, and spare parts supplied, without cost.
 - c. A Tariff on a quintal/kilometer basis for carrying goods has been agreed with the Italian Government for application at present in Region II King's Italy.
 - d. Should the sale of these vehicles to the Italian Government be approved they, in turn, will re-sell the vehicles to Italian civilian organizations on a basis of 50% cash and a three years' amortisation plan for the balance. Only organizations with pre-war experience in transportation will be given the opportunity of purchasing these trucks and they must possess garages equipped to carry out all repairs except possibly 4th or 5th echelon. In time, however, even 4th and 5th Echelon repairs will be entirely carried out by the civil organizations under ACC supervision.
 - e. The Italian Government will still be held responsible to ACC for the condition and running of the trucks and will be required accordingly to have complete control over the private operators. ACC will continue to inspect the vehicles regularly, supervise all maintenance, control the location and movements of the trucks and keep up the standard of operation generally.
 - f. The contract of sale to private operators by the Italian Government will be subject to ACC approval. Such a sale will have the effect of reviving private companies who were engaged in operating

road haulage in pre-occupation Italy. The State owns the majority of the railways but took no interest in road transport. If these private haulage companies can be reactivated, they will help to eliminate any break between the cessation of ACC transportation activities and take-over by the Italian Government.

a. Limited ACC transportation personnel will make supervision over a wide territory very difficult unless the Italian Government can be brought in and made responsible under the terms of the sale.

b. As already indicated in Para (a), lack of personal interest by the Italians concerned will probably result in rapid deterioration of the vehicles. If urgently needed for operational purposes, they are more likely to be in good condition if the Italian companies are called on to put up 50% of the cost of the trucks and have to maintain repayment of the balance over a period of three years.

c. Should the Allied Forces have urgent need for the vehicles, and consider such need outweighs the necessity of feeding the civilian population, the trucks can be requisitioned by the Allied Forces and repurchased by ACC from the Italian Government.

d. The sale of the vehicles has the economic advantage of helping to curb inflation as, when the Italian Government sells to private operators, the money paid will be withdrawn from circulation.

e. The sale of the vehicles to the Italian Government has a certain publicity value, as each truck can be specially painted and become familiar on the roads as those sold to the Italians by the Allied Governments.

f. Summing up; the sale of the vehicles through the Italian Government to Italian operating companies will result in more efficient operation, longer life of the trucks and equipment, and a monetary return to the Allied for material that must be expended in any case.

g. While Finance Sub-Commission advises that the trucks should be sold, both Finance and Legal Sub-commissions state that the sale of these trucks and spare parts can only be made with approval from higher authority. It is, therefore, requested that a decision be forthcoming with the least possible delay so that this HQ may determine under what permanent arrangement the trucks are to be operated by the Italians.

SUBJECT: Disposal of Military Vehicles to the Italian Government.

TO : A/DCOS, Economic Section.

1. I refer to ACTAR telegram W.34123 of 8 February, paraphrase attached.

2. It appears to me that this question has been the subject of communication between this Commission and AFHQ since 24th January 1944. It is a matter of vital interest, particularly in view of the new CCS directive. It appears that CCS have rejected the proposals to sell the vehicles to the Italian Government and have directed that they should be disposed of in the same manner as other civil affairs items after complicated reference and notification to the CCS, a proposal for which will take months to obtain.

3. What is the manner referred to by the CCS?

4. I should like this matter taken up on a matter of principle and for the attention of AFHQ to be drawn to the delay of nine months in obtaining an adverse decision on a matter vital to the economy of Italy. Can I have a memorandum fully documented on this subject.

1. Distribution of local and imported commodities for civil population in this theatre has been a continuing problem. Maximum use of indigenous vehicles is being made, but these 5 to 10 year old trucks are in very many instances lacking in tires, tubes and batteries, as well as major repair parts. Tires, tubes and batteries, approved by combined chief of staff for procurement through service channels, have been requisitioned, and some furnished from theatre stocks. Military vehicles, to the extent of 550 trucks, 2½ ton 6 x 6 and 100 trailers cargo, 1 ton, from US ARMY, and 550-3 ton lorries from BRITISH ARMY have been loaned to AC for civil transport requirements. As territory is expanded and indigenous vehicles fail through use, an ever increasing demand is inevitable as indicated by LAC airgrams 95 and 96 to combined chief of staff.

2. Certain Allied Military vehicles, including those in para 1, have, in the light of operational efficiency, outlasted their military usefulness, either in this area, or for reshipment elsewhere.

3. A. It is proposed to sell to the Italian Government, for controlled use in movement of essential supplies, those Allied Military vehicles enumerated in para 1, plus any other which it may be found necessary to furnish, and can be spared from theatre stocks or salvage.

B. The sale of vehicles to be when, in the opinion of the Supreme Allied Commander, the Italian Governmental organisations have demonstrated their ability to efficiently operate and maintain them.

C. It is further proposed to furnish repair parts from military sources, on a priority below the military requirements.

4. This proposal is agreed by US and BRITISH.

5. It is recommended that authority be granted to sell military vehicles and maintenance parts to the Italian Government in accordance with the above proposals.

SUBJECT: Sale of W.D. Vehicles.

TO : G-5 Section, Allied Force Headquarters, APO 512.

1. Reference is made to Paragraph 4(f) Report of AFHQ Combined Inspection Team Subject "Proposals for the Improvement of ACC Transportation" dated 30 October 1944.

2. In view of the progress of the war in Europe and Italy, it is desired to bring to your attention the need for authorisation to sell to the Italian Government the Allied W.D. vehicles in use for the transport of food and other civil supply, ref. RES/49 of 24 April 1944.

3. Whereas, in the first instance it was pointed out that the sale of vehicles thru the Italian Government to Italian operating companies would, because of the responsibility of private ownership, result in more efficient operation, longer life of the vehicle, and a monetary return to the Allies for material that must be expended in any case, it is now advisable to invite your attention to additional factors that have a bearing on this matter. It will not be possible to remove the above mentioned vehicles at the cessation of hostilities without causing an economic collapse in Italy as other road transport is in such short supply. It will be an extended period before local manufacture of trucks may be resumed in sufficiently substantial quantities.

4. At the present time British and American Ordnance are charged with third and fourth echelon maintenance and supply of spare parts. With the movement of Army installations forward, it will become necessary to relieve the armies of these maintenance responsibilities. It should now be possible to derequisition garage and repair shops so that they can be returned to their owners and become available for maintenance of these subject vehicles.

5. With the sale of the vehicles there will also be required authority for sale of spare parts secured either from British and American stocks in this theatre or by requisition from US and UK for the account of the Italian Government. If the plan of sale is approved, it should not be difficult to determine sale prices. This might be done by making use of the classifications, which already apply to W.D. vehicles in considering their condition with respect to battle worthiness, as a measure of the depreciation to be charged off as against the landed cost.

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6. If the Allies wish to concern themselves with Italian internal transportation as the cessation of hostilities with Germany, it can be done thru the mechanism of the Ente Nazionale Autotrasporti Cose which has recently been established by governmental decree as a national organisation to control and regulate road transportation.

7. It is felt that there is a need for early determination of policy as it would certainly be incongruous to continue the operation of subject vehicles on the present basis after the cessation of hostilities.

It is understood that discussions are now under way as to the eventual policy of selling to the Italian Government those War Department vehicles now in the theater which will not be suitable for a redeployment to other theaters. It is considered essential that a firm decision be reached on this matter as early as possible, for many other policies rest upon this decision. For example, no recommendation can logically be made relative to methods of holding and distributing War Department spares and tires within the AGC until it is known whether War Department vehicles currently in the theater will be ultimately turned over to civilians or retained by the military.

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
