Acting Chief Commissioner.

I refer to your memorandum of October 20th. (at 10).

I note that you approve the designation of Colonel Behrens as Acting C.L.A. and Acting Director of the Legal Sub-Commission during the absence of temporary duty of Colonel Wilmer. But in view of your second paragraph it is suggested that he should continue to function as Deputy Director and C.L.A. in charge of the Legal Sub-Commission in the absence of the Director until we know whether Colonel Wilmer will be permanently detached from the Commission.

But I should record now a submission that you should reconsider your decision. Whatever may be Colonel Behrens' view the proposal has grave objections in the opinion of Brigadier Upjohn and myself on the grounds of efficiency. It is our opinion that Lt. Col. Grossman is not qualified to be Director of the Sub-Commission nor C.L.A. Lt. Col. Grossman himself has told Brigadier Upjohn his strong conviction that he should not be placed in charge of the Sub-Commission over Col. Behrens' head.

As regards parity - I pointed out in my 201/2/COS of 18 Oct 44. (at 9) that taking all senior posts into account we arrive at approximate parity. If, however, you point to lack of parity among Sub-Commissions which shows a preponderance of 12 - 8 in favour of British, then I must point to the present lack of parity among the senior appointments outside and above the Sub-Commissions which show a preponderance of Americans of 6 - 3. Can we not take the whole number of senior posts and maintain equilibrium?

1. A Signal has today been received from HQ, requesting that 33 surplus officers be sent to B.R.D. EXHIBIT NO for interview and re-allocation. I have discussed the position verbally with the AG, AG, HQ, and Dep. AG. Sec., and it is their view that the re-allocation of these officers cannot be undertaken on an individual basis, but that they must be collected at B.R.D., interviewed and re-assigned from there. I have been assured that both from the point of view of speed as well as of choice of future employment, this is the best method.

TO : Executive Commissioner.

The position is as follows:

1. Complete assignment by Special Orders has been made in accordance with original Liaison Team Cables and also your letter 7001/342/HC dated 29 Dec 45.
2. The particulars of all officers thus rendered surplus have been examined, and long-term officers, suitable by rank and function, have been allocated to Venezia Giulia and Udine.
3. The whole officer position in Venezia Giulia has been investigated during the recent visit of Col. H.P. Robertson. It is unsatisfactory as far as Legal and Finance Officers are concerned, but otherwise is satisfactory.
4. The attached list of surplus officers has been prepared, and is in the hands of AG and Dep. Mil. Sec at GHQ. They will send disposal instructions to us as soon as possible.
5. The attached list of surplus officers is as complete as I can make it at the moment but there will be other officers to be declared surplus after certain decisions have been made, e.g. Captured Enemy Material Officers.
6. I submit the following list of names as those on whom you will personally want to decide:-

I suggest therefore that we make use of their services as far as possible rather than condemn them to a useless wait in a Depot.

2. It is understood that regions will be given a reasonable time (2-3 weeks) after the turnback to terminate AEC operations and close station. SUBJECT: Priority of Personnel Assignment.

TO : The Chief Commissioner, Headquarters, Allied Commission,
APO 394.

1. A critical shortage of personnel, both officer and enlisted, exists within the Allied Commission in this Theater at present. The shortage is likely to continue for some time to come. It is therefore essential that a policy as to priority of assignment be established and adhered to. It is desired that the AC/AMG needs in Venezia Giulia, Bolzano and Udine shall be given first priority over all other AC requirements and, in case of conflict of demands among those areas, that priority shall be in the order in which they are listed above. The TO/WE strengths of these areas will be maintained at as near 100% as is practicable. In no case will the strengths be permitted to drop to the extent that the effectiveness of their military governments will be seriously affected.

2. It is recognized that it is impractical in detail to maintain parity between United States and British officers at all levels and in all areas, especially during this period of redeployment. It is however necessary that any unbalancing which may occur in the three provinces named in paragraph 1 above be corrected as speedily as possible.

3. There have been numerous complaints from XIII Corps concerning failure to replace U.S. officers who have been relieved and concerning a general shortage of U.S. AMG officers in Venezia Giulia. There have been several conferences between MTOUSA staff officers and the C.O. 2675th Regt (Prov) concerning these matters. It is recognized that it is improper for the C.O. 2675th Regt (Prov) on a unilateral basis and without your authority to reassign U.S. personnel within the Allied Commission. It is your responsibility to assure that the C.O. 2675th Regt (Prov) is given the necessary guidance and authority to effect personnel changes to maintain the parity and strength in U.S. personnel set forth in this letter. The initiative for correcting such complaints as noted above rests with you.

4. It is noted that there appears a tendency to relieve from duty with AC U.S. Class A volunteers or regular establishment officers when they are no longer required for the particular job on which they are working. Every attempt must be made to fit such personnel into other

MEMORANDUM TO: Executive Commissioner.

Excluding the Finance Sub-Commission, which is joint, and including the PNB as a Sub-Commission, the present distribution by nationalities of the directors of sub-commissions is 13 British and 8 American. If AFHQ adopts our recommendation to eliminate the Shipping S/C, the distribution would then be 12 British and 8 American.

In recent months, as directors have been relieved, we have departed from the former nationality designations as, for example, in the Legal S/C and Monuments and Fine Arts S/C, where American directors were relieved by British. Since due to re-deployment, the present distribution has swung back to be heavily British, it is vitally important that we restore a better balance. For this reason it is important to provide for American replacements as British directors leave, whenever this can be arranged.

Therefore, Brigadier Parkinson should not be relieved by a British officer, particularly when Colonel Page is senior to all British officers in the Sub-Commission.

SUBJECT: "Domestic" TO/WE

TO : Regional Commissioner, Abruzzi-Marche Region, AC

1. The Executive Commissioner has asked me to reply to your DO/1/ of 20 January. The delay in answering has been necessitated by a thorough study by G-1(B) of the problem suggested in your letter. To implement your recommendations, it would be necessary first to fix a "domestic" TO/WE for every region and subcommission. While this is not an insuperable task, under existing conditions of operation it is believed to be impractical for the reason that every time an officer was promoted he would probably have to be transferred to a different region in which a vacancy for his new rank existed or in which there was a vacancy for his new rank. On the British side, the appointments held by officers recommended for promotion are always taken into consideration by the promotion board and every effort is made to avoid anomalies.

2. Regarding reversion in rank of British officers, staff officers, as you know, cannot revert in the same way as regimental officers. As all British officers in AC hold staff appointments, there are only two ways in which they can lose temporary rank:

- (a) On leaving AC
- (b) Submission of an adverse report (194E)

Consequently, officers cannot be reverted in rank and remain in AC unless a 194E has been initiated and final support given to it by the C-in-C.

3. While your problem is sincerely appreciated, it is regretted that no solution along the lines you propose can be made under existing regulations.

My dear *Brigadier*

I have read your letter 7001/1/COS dated 12 January 1945 with great interest, and while I entirely agree that no one province is more important than any other, the fact that Provincial Commissioners are not necessarily of equal rank has caused, and is causing, more heartburning than almost anything else in our organisation. It all arises, of course, from the fact that in AMG ranks do not follow appointments as they do in the Army, and I would like to quote, in support of the foregoing remarks, 2 glaring instances in this Region.

The first is my RSO. By virtue of his appointment as RSO he surely should be senior to those PSOs who work under him in the provinces. Yet my RSO is a captain, and although I have made efforts to get him promoted, so far I have been unsuccessful. Under him there are 4 Majors, 5 Captains and 6 Lieuts, and it is obviously quite wrong that he should be placed in so invidious a position.

The second instance is Major Maunder, the P.C. of the three Provinces of Chieti, Pescara and Teramo. Again, despite my efforts to have him promoted, he still remains a Major with Lt. Colonels working under him.

This surely is all wrong, and I have felt all along that certain appointments, at any rate, should carry certain ranks. I therefore suggest that all PCs and the following Heads of Divisions in Regions be Lt. Colonels; Supplies, Public Health, Public Safety, Finance, Legal and Agriculture.

If a P.C. or Head of Division loses his job, no matter for what reason, the Army practice should be followed, and he should revert to his next lower rank until such time as he is reappointed.

I feel it should not be beyond the wit of our "A" people to make this possible, and it would, I am sure, have a beneficial effect throughout AMG if fellows knew that on being appointed to a certain position they would hold certain ranks, and that if they lost them, demotion would ensue.

I realise that the foregoing remarks cannot apply to American officers in our organisation, but in their case, of course, it does work both ways.

SUBJECT: Equality of Provinces.

TO : Distribution below.

1. Misunderstandings have arisen in the past when officers have been transferred from Province to Province.
2. The Chief Commissioner wishes it to be understood that from the point of view of assignment all Provinces are equal in AIG territory and Italian Government territory alike. Just as there is no elevation in a Provincial Commissioner, or Provincial Legal Officer, or other technical officer, is transferred from CAMBIA to LIVORNO, so there is no degradation if he is transferred from ANCONA to PUSIGNONE.

SUBJECT:- Patriots Branch.

1. Consequent on the departure of Col.C.D. McCarthy, Chief of Patriots Branch to take up an appointment in Mideast, I recommend that Col. I.C.P. Spicer, C.M.G. be appointed Chief of the Patriots Branch in addition to his present duties as Director of Local Government sub-commission.
2. If the above recommendation is sanctioned by the Chief Commissioner there will be a defacto merger of the Patriots Branch into the Local Government sub-commission and this I am sure is the proper course to adopt.
3. I do not, however, recommend that there be any merger on paper of the Patriots Branch for the reason that the recently formed Italian National Patriots Committee, of which the Prime Minister is Chairman, are delighted to think that they have a special Branch of this Commission dealing with their affairs, and they would feel some slight if the Branch were merged into some other sub-commission. This retention of a separate Branch on paper will not involve any additional personnel whatsoever.
4. May I please be informed as soon as possible if the above is approved as Col. McCarthy desires to introduce Col.Spicer to a number of officers and Italians who deal with Patriot matters before he leaves.

During the absence on temporary duty of Colonel Wilmer (a) it will be appropriate for his deputy, Colonel Behrens (a), to be designated as Acting Chief Legal Adviser and Acting Director of the Legal Sub-Commission.

Should Colonel Wilmer be detached from the Commission, I do not agree that a British officer be permanently appointed to relieve him, and in that eventuality propose to appoint Lieutenant Colonel Grossman. I understand that this would be acceptable to Colonel Behrens.

Your recommendation would make 12 British Sub-Commissions and 8 American Sub-Commissions, which I cannot accept. Of the 21 Sub-Commissions, 11 are British, 9 are American (assuming the Labor Sub-Commission continues to be under the direction of an American), and one (Finance) is Joint.

SUBJECT: Organisation - HQ ACC.

TO : Acting Chief Commissioner.

1. I know that you have been concerned recently over the lack of parity in the higher appointments of this Commission. The American press has drawn attention to this, with, of course, gross inaccuracies.
2. I have therefore reviewed all the senior posts at present held in this Commission of the rank of Director of Sub-Commission and upwards. As you will see from the attached list the score works out at 17 American to 18 British. This includes Patriots which will shortly disappear and Public Relations which is not really a Sub-Commission. If we eliminate these two, the score is 17 to 16 in favour of the Americans, or even if we exclude Foley.
3. My own information is that the COS are not at all worried about this question of parity. The facts show that there is no reason for any of us to be worried about it. If you agree I will see that the PRO gets these numbers across discreetly to the press who are our chief bother in the matter, and includes the fact in his weekly bulletin.

SUBJECT: Chief Legal Adviser.

TO : Acting Chief Commissioner.

1. Brigadier Upjohn's recommendation for a new Chief Legal Adviser in succession to Colonel Wilmer (A) is submitted.
2. In selecting a new Chief Legal Adviser, one of the most important appointments in the Commission, it is essential that we should choose the best man in the Commission regardless of nationality.
3. That officer is, without doubt, Colonel Behrens (B). Lt. Col. Grossman (A) is good, but not of the calibre to be made Chief Legal Adviser.
4. The fact that the appointment would make a change of nationality at the head of the Sub-Commission is unfortunate but in this case it must be remembered that the head of the Legal Sub-Commission was originally British and became American only by the accident of Brigadier Upjohn's promotion.
5. I therefore strongly recommend that you should appoint Colonel Behrens as Acting Director until such time as Colonel Wilmer's change of duty is made permanent, when you should confirm the appointment.

1. I have discussed with Col. Rowell the question of his successor as Director of the Education Sub Commission.
2. The only possible candidates for this position are Major Washburne or Major Murphy; none of the other officers either at H.Q. or in the field have the requisite calibre except possibly Captain Pratt (A), but in view of his rank it does not seem practicable to appoint him as Director.
3. Of Major Washburne and Major Murphy the claims of the former are much greater. He has a year's experience of the work and has done extremely well in the field. Major Murphy's claim is that he is a Roman Catholic and in my opinion he is properly placed in Region IV where he is in close contact with the Vatican. As you know he has only just come out here and it would be a severe slight on Major Washburne if he were to be put over him.
4. I discussed with Col. Rowell Major Washburne's fitness to deal with affairs on the Italian Government level, he agreed that Major Washburne's manner might well upset the Italian Government but he feels that if the position is clearly explained to Major Washburne that no undue difficulties should arise. Finally Col. Rowell suggested that we appoint Major Washburne Acting Director and review the position in six weeks to two months.
5. After considering the matter very carefully I agree with Col. Rowell's proposal and recommend that we follow the course suggested by him.
