Dear Admiral Stone,

I understand that the definite recall of the Chief Liaison Officer (Major Tannock of the British Army), who has resided at Tenda since that province was being restored to the Italian Administration, has been decided.

The work and activities of Major Tannock have been very useful indeed and I deem that a prolongation of his stay there, while giving an opportunity to the Allied Authorities to continue to avail themselves of a direct source of information, would also greatly contribute to maintain in that zone an atmosphere of calm and distension in view of the forthcoming events.

I would therefore greatly appreciate it if you could submit to the Allied Authorities the opportunity that the recall of Major Tannock be postponed for a few weeks more.

Major TANNOCK, AC Liaison Officer TENDA, phoned me this afternoon from CUNEO. He stated that the Prefect of CUNEO had been to ROME and had made a protest against the withdrawal of the ACLO from TENDA and pressed the Italian Government to try and get this altered.

I told Major TANNOCK we knew nothing of this and had queried the withdrawal with AFHQ and that they had confirmed that the order must stand. It was unlikely that any representation from the Italian Government would make AFHQ alter their decision but I felt sure that the Chief Commissioner would forward any such representation and recommend it. Major TANNOCK stated that wires were taking 5 days and letters 10 days to get through and he was afraid that if there was some change it might not be possible to notify him in time.

He said he would telephone me on Monday next to find out if there had been any further developments.

Your telegram No. 4147 of 12th July re closing down has just been telephoned from Treviso and I wish to report as follows:-

1. In spite of pressure by the Prefect (and by me on Lt. Col. Fothergill) the Rome Government has not yet notified their approval to the Bolzano Authorities to take over the D.P. Camp. Time is getting on.

2. In view of certain work given to Maj. Hare (Public Safety) and the expected arrival of a team of officers to hand over outstanding CEM materials and vehicles to ARAR, I cannot see how either our offices or our Mess can close down until their work here is finished. They must live somewhere and the Mess is the only place apart from expensive hotels.

3. The team of officers will be strange to the country, and to their job, and will, I think, need guidance if they are to do their work properly. They will have no contacts, won't know the location of dumps etc., and this and other handicaps will appear to you.

4. I do not know how long their work will last, but at the risk of exposing myself to comment, I suggest to you I should be allowed to stay here until such time as Bolzano can be handed over clean. This, I think, may be towards the end of August but it depends on developments.

I feel that both jobs going on here need background, and this can be produced by continuing this office (unofficially if necessary) until our work is done.

With reference to Bolzano Liaison Group's telegram H/4663 of even date saying that they cannot close down on July 31st, I have the following remarks from the point of view of this Section:

I know of no reason why the Italian Government should not take over the Displaced Persons Camp before July 31st - in any case the closing down of the Liaison Group could be used as a lever to compel action on their part.

As regards Public Safety, there is no problem so far as I know which necessitates the continuance of the Public Safety Liaison Office at Bolzano. If there is some reason for Major Hare to remain in Bolzano for any special purpose after July 31st, this can be no reason for not closing down the Liaison Office and Group as a whole.

Dear Brig^l Lush.

1. I am writing with reference to the closing down order, telegram 4147 of 12th July, and would like you to consider small modifications to the timings. Naples was the first big AMG centre and the Commune itself was still AMG until the beginning of this year so there are still an extraordinarily large number of questions which somehow or another get referred to us and are open.
2. There is also one big financial question to be disposed of that is the fines and bails fund amounting to over 3 million Lire which we hold. It is still a live fund with payments going out from time to time so we want to hand it over properly.
3. I have told the Prefect and others I don't want any more correspondence but it will not be possible to stop everything in a week. I suggest the following:
- (a) - This HQ. to close down as from midnight 31st July.
 - (b) - A final rear party consisting of myself, (Capt. Venus if he reports here), Mrs. Damiani, Signorina De Luca (telegram and files), Signor De Stefano accountant, Sgt. Gray, driver Valiant, Staff car, one req. car, P.U. to remain until the 10th of August to close accounts and final correspondence, check inventories, etc. There are large undertakings such as UNRRA and the British Information office with offices taken over from us whose inventories we have to clear. After so long a career, I think A.C. should close down with dignity and not be too hurried.

You may assure the War Office as I shall assure the War Establishment Committee that the ideal dual nature of these groups will soon be achieved - to the detriment of good reporting. But what will you?

Thank you for your letter (7002/10) of 30 April 1946. We have issued instructions telling III District and ALII Corps that action on the withdrawal on the Liaison Groups is being suspended pending further instructions from C.S.S. PERHAPS, I understand, already knows this. Can we do anything to reduce the British strength of the existing groups? You will remember that when we discussed the reorganization under PAN 050 you thought that the job could be done by one Civil Affairs officer and one Public Safety officer in each group. Perhaps you will let me know your views about this. We are continually being badgered by the War Office about our manpower ceiling and it is important that we should not employ more officers than are absolutely necessary even for a few weeks.

I was sorry I was not able to come and see you when I was in Rome on Saturday. I did not get there until 8:00 that morning and being Saturday I was most anxious to get down here before the office closed.

The Admiral tells me that when implementation of FAM 650 was considered he told General Harbison that he would not persist in pressing for Liaison Groups. 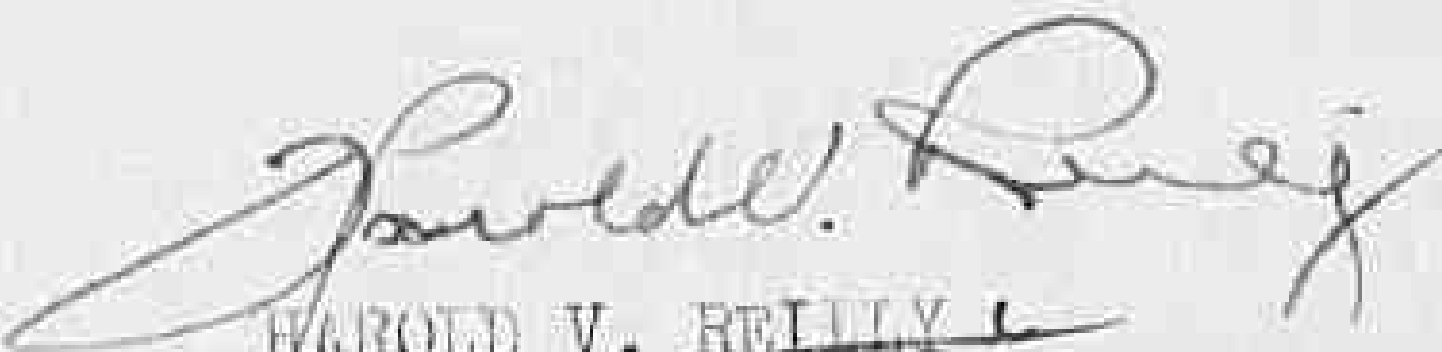

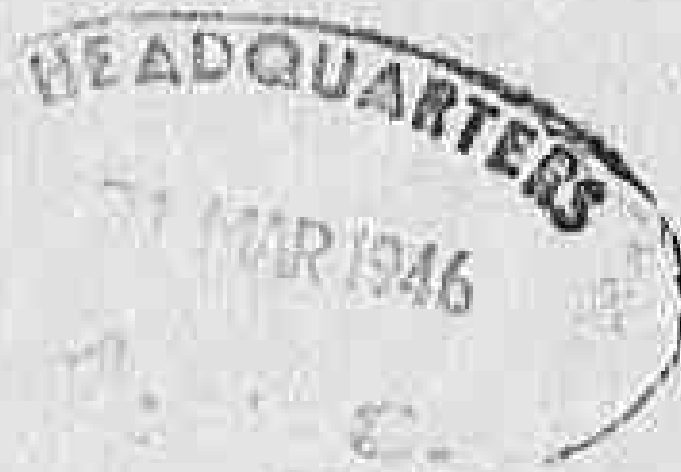
