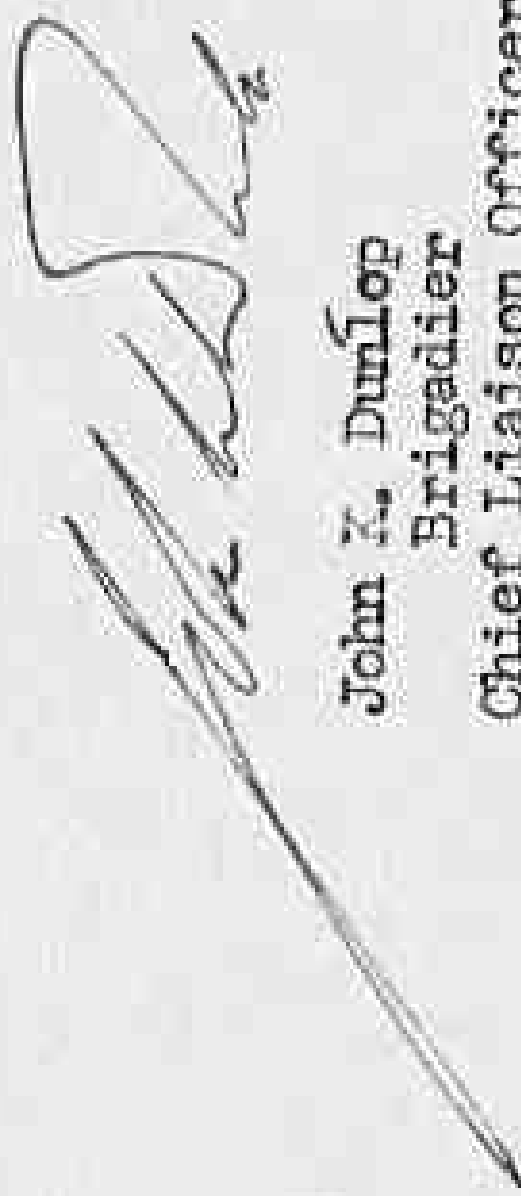

Thank you for your letter addressed to Admiral Stone, dated 26 May 1946, on the subject of Lt. Colonel Gardner. I am gratified to learn that Lt. Colonel Gardner is held in such esteem at Tenda and Briga and that he has earned the appreciation of the population by his impartial and correct attitude. This makes me all the more sorry that I have to remove Lt. Colonel Gardner, but unfortunately the number of senior officers which I have at my disposal is small and I urgently require his services elsewhere. I am compelled therefore to move Lt. Colonel Gardner and to replace him by an officer more junior in rank, but I am confident that the people of Tenda and Briga will soon come to value the new officer as they have valued Lt. Colonel Gardner and will at the same time realize that in no sense does the replacement of Lt. Colonel Gardner mean any change in the attitude of this Commission. The move is dictated purely and simply by manpower shortage and military necessity.

Dear Admiral Stone,

I have been informed that Lieutenant Colonel Gardner, who, as it is known, resides in Cuneo, is about to be removed and replaced by another officer.

I cannot conceal that such news, which has quickly become known at Tenda and Briga, has produced a painful impression among the population, which have always considered Colonel Gardner with great esteem and appreciation for his impartial and correct attitude.

Such a distressing impression is still increased inasmuch as it is well known that, on the occasion of a visit made by the Inter-Allied Commission to Tenda and Briga, Lieutenant Colonel Gardner, when questioned by said Commission, has expressed himself according to principles of justice and in conformity to his conscience of gentleman and soldier.

It would even appear that the very motives of his removal would be determined by such an attitude.

I venture to hope, dear Admiral, that said news is not correct, or, at least, that it is early enough to avert a final decision, which, should it lead to the British officer's replacement, would unluckily be interpreted in that zone as an abandonment, on the part of the Allied Commission, of that impartial attitude they have up to now shown, attitude which, we believe, we may still rely upon.

All the more that, as you are aware, at Tenda is actually present the French officer Franck, who is still carrying on active propaganda for the annexation of those territories to France.

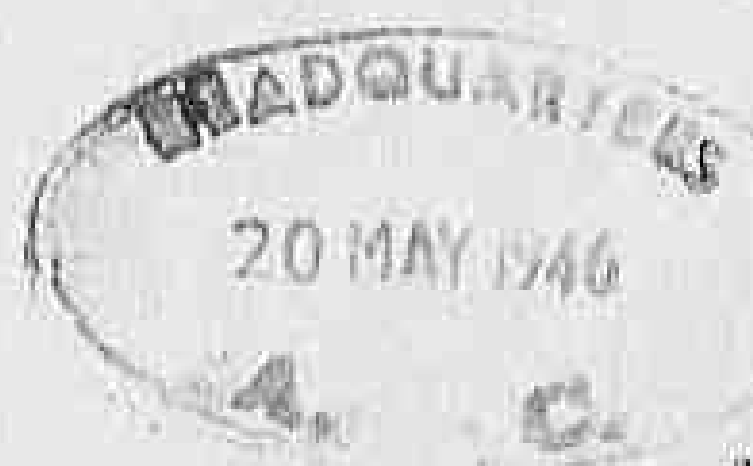

Very many thanks for your letter 177/EC of the 27 April and for your telephone message of yesterday. I am answering, in this letter, your last paragraph because I wish to write separate letters in respect of the first two.

As regards myself, I can assure you that I am, at all times, only too happy to do anything you want me to do. I have not received any message from the Control Commission Germany either affirmative or negative. This may well be linked with Geoffrey Hunt's message to the War Office that I would not be available till mid May. I think that if the Control Commission had definitely not wanted me they would let me know.

I believe that Arthur Hancock plans to return to Italy between the 11th and 15th May. The important thing, to me, would seem to be the retention of some senior officer here until after the 2nd of June or at any rate, until the situation, after the elections, is reasonably clear. 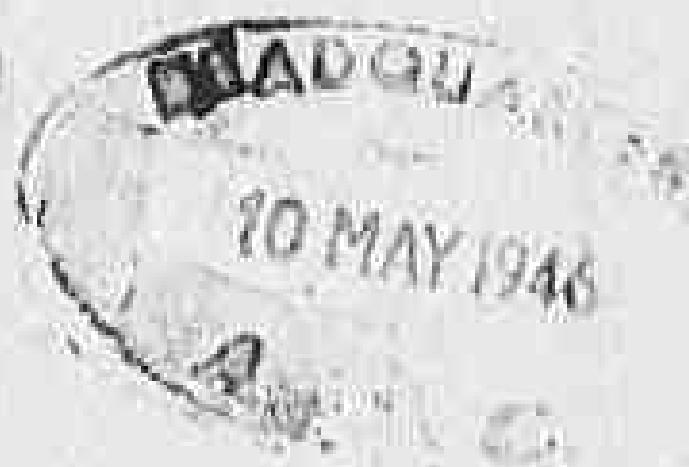

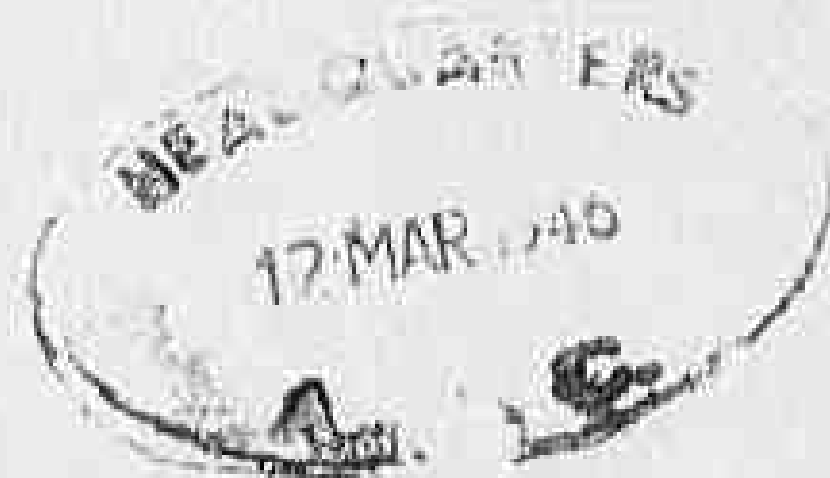

I have done my best to see what we could do about helping Bertelli. From what I have seen of the correspondence it appears that Bertelli will sign on for another year or two provided that a guarantee can be given that his wife will be allowed to join him and that he will be permitted to remain in Italy.

No one with any sense of responsibility could possibly give such guarantees. We could guarantee to do our best and no more. The number of applications for wives to come out is far in excess of the number allotted to us in the first place; secondly, it would be quite impossible to guarantee that anyone would remain in Italy. This Allied Commission may pack up in two or three months time and what happens to the A.C. officers Heaven knows. Already we have sixty surplus officers as a result of the handover in the North. I hope G-1(B) know what will be happening to these people - I am sure I do not!

You will see the position therefore is a little difficult but if Bertelli is satisfied with the guarantee that I will do my best I can assure him that he has that guarantee for what it is worth.

When are we going to see you in Rome?

1. Reference your FR/BJ/61/0 dated 9 Jan 46.
2. It is pointed out that officers wishing to defer their release cannot make conditions as to their deferment. (Vide para 3 of your letter). Conditions governing the bringing-out of wives and families are laid down in AGI 1175/45, but it is pointed out that the number of applications for families to come to C.F. is greatly in excess of the number of passages available.
3. Officers deferring their release for one or two years or until general demobilization are subject to the normal rules regarding transfer and posting (See Release Regs. para 326(b)), and no guarantee can be given to any officer deferring his release as to any specific employment in AMG/AC. It is now definite that Maj. Bertelli is surplus to AMG/AC requirements and his release book is enclosed herewith in order that he may be despatched to the Assembly Centre, Milan.
4. Your attention is drawn to the enclosed form-subject "Release Officers" for guidance.

Dear Fernan,

This time I come to you on behalf of Major C.A.P. BERTELLI who has been my one remaining officer in these last two months of Provincial Administration. Turner-Coles has gone to Genova so that there is no R.C. to put in a word for him on a higher level. B. has done excellent work with me and I would like to help him if I can. When Brigadier Lush was in Turin I went and saw him about Bertelli and, at the time, he seemed to take a sympathetic view in the matter.

On the 4th. of January a letter was written from Piemonte Regional H.Q. to the O.C. British Detachment at A.C., H.Q. regarding deferment of release of Major Bertelli.

B. is prepared to stay on another year or two providing his wife who is in England is allowed to join him in Italy. He would prefer a job as Liaison Officer in one of the Northern Regions but if establishments cannot be stretched any longer in that line then he would favour Economics or Transport in both of which he has already specialised.

Major Bertelli has been of great assistance to me, he is adaptable in any branch of A.M.G. activity and his knowledge of the language (he also speaks French well), of the Italian people and their characteristics should help to secure for him a proper assignment.

I shall be grateful should you be able to put in a special word recommending that Mrs. Bertelli be permitted to join her husband. Should it be necessary for Major Bertelli to be interviewed in Rome he could go there now as he is here awaiting his new assignment.
