SUBJECT : Provision of Personnel for Italian Army Units

TO : All Concerned.

Ref. this HQ letter, file ref. 922.2 dated 20 November 1944.

1. The Italian Army is now practically all employed either by the Allies or in its own authorised administration. It would appear that the provision of reinforcements (replacements) for existing units and the forming of new units can only be carried out by:

(a) Disbandment of non-essential units now in existence.

(b) Formation of Base Rgt. and Trg. Depots for the absorption of men enlisted from the civil population.

2. The Base Rgt. and Trg. Depots are now being planned, but the intake of recruits must be postponed until early in 1945 when stocks of clothing and equipment are expected to become available. Recruits will require at least one month of basic training, while tradesmen will require not less than two months of specialist training in addition. It is thus apparent that the application of para. 1 (a) above is the only means of meeting vitally important calls upon the Italian Army for the next three months.

3. Priority for the provision and reinforcement of units will be allotted as follows; subject to subsequent review:-

- (a) Units required in direct support of operations
- (b) Units employed for Dock Clearance and Railway Construction.
- (c) Units employed on road construction and maintenance.
- (d) Other service units.
- (e) Coast Bas.

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4. To provide for requirements under para.3 (a) above, there is an immediate demand for 2,000 men of good physique, fully equipped and well

- (a) Units required in direct support of operations
- (b) Units employed in Dock Clearance and Railway Construction.
- (c) Units employed on road construction and maintenance.
- (d) Other service units.
- (e) Guard Divs.

4. To provide for requirements under para.3 (a) above, there is an immediate demand for 2,000 men of good physique, fully equipped and well disciplined.

5. Will addressees please examine their present holding of Italian Army personnel and units with a view to the following:

- (a) Disbandment of non-essential units.
- (b) Disbandment of units not authorized by this HQ in Q12/322.5 of 17 November, and 3 December 1944.
- (c) Rft. of essential units by reduction of other similar units to cadre only.
- (d) Release of men suitable for requirement at para.3(a) on replacement by lower category men.
- (e) Release of tradesmen and specialists from non-specialist units on replacement by non-tradesmen and non-specialists.

6. In view of the urgency of the problem, preliminary replies are required by G-3 (Org-A) by 15 December '44, to show numbers that could be made available by para. 5 (a) and (b) above, and by 20 December to show detailed reorganisation and releases by trades that could be effected by para. 5 (c), (d) and (e).

7. The above proposals are designed to cover a temporary dearth of manpower and will not affect the long term plan for the formation of new units when the reinforcement (replacement) depots are established. For the present, it would appear necessary for every service to limit its holding of Italian Army units to the irreducible minimum.
