

In confirmation of telephone conversation on the above subject, Brig. TATES - General BROWNING, a.m. 15 December.

1. I had my first interview with the new Minister for War, BRUSIO, yesterday evening and amongst other things he raised the matter of the move of POLGORE.

2. He requested that the move should be postponed a fortnight until the first week in January, for the following reasons:-

- (a) That there had been so many changes since POLGORE was first told it would move in October last that morale had suffered.
- (b) That the move would be taking place just before Christmas, and in fact, might continue over Christmas in view of the weather, the shortage of drivers, etc.
- (c) That Christmas is an important festival and looms large in the eyes of Italians; consequently the move at this moment would cause wide-spread discontent and probably desertion or A.W.O.L.
- (d) The Minister's own position. He has just taken over, and his first act would be to order an unpopular move with possible trouble at the very start of his regime.

The Minister was very reasonable in the way he put forward this request, and asked me to represent the above to you, which, by the terms of my charter, I am bound to do.

3. I pointed out to the Minister that:-

- (a) There had been continuous and considerable Italian opposition from the start to any move of POLGORE from the SOLIANO area.
- (b) There was no political significance in this move. The Ind. Regt. would be remaining in the BOZIANO area, with elements of Priuli farther south. It was solely a matter of freeing POLGORE from guard commitments so that they could be withdrawn for training and that there was

not enough accommodation in the area to compete  
with the reliving Allied Troops and POLONE as well.

- (c) The whole matter was on train and that I very much  
doubted if A.P.H.Q. could see their way to upsetting  
arrangements already very far advanced, particularly  
as in a few weeks' time POLONE, owing to the weather,  
might not be able to move at all.
- (d) It was very late in the day for the Italians to ask  
for this postponement when they had known for many  
days past that this move was intended at once and  
the reconnaissance for accommodation south of the  
Apennines had been completed and agreed to by the  
Ministry of War representative in conjunction with  
M.M.I.A. and 3 District without any protest.



This move was to take place on the 15 November and the Groups should now be on its way to the Bressana-Torbole area for training. It was, however, never intended that all Italian Forces should be withdrawn from the Bolzano area and guard battalions are being maintained in the Bolzano-Trento and Belluno areas. In addition to these guard battalions, there will be also one combat battalion.

I trust that the above now makes the position quite clear. If there is any further information you require please let me know.

PARA 1. THE IMMINENT WITHDRAWAL FOR TRAINING OF THE FOLCORE GRUPPO FROM BOLZANO COUPLED WITH RETENTION OF AMG IN BOLZANO PROVINCE HAS CAUSED SPECULATION AND MAY CREATE A FALSE IMPRESSION OF UNITED NATIONS INTENTIONS.

PARA 2. YOU WILL THEREFORE ARRANGE WITH MMIA FOR ONE WELL DISCIPLINED BN FROM ANY OF FIVE GRUPPI TO BE ACCOMMODATED IN BOLZANO. BN SELECTED WILL BE UNDER OPERATIONAL COMMAND OF LOCAL ALLIED COMMANDER AS LONG AS AMG IS RETAINED IN BOLZANO.

PARA 3. IT IS TO BE EMPHASIZED THAT ABOVE IN NO WAY PREJUDICES THE HAND BACK OF 'INTERIM' ITALIAN ARMY TO ITALIAN GOVERNMENT CONTROL. THE BN SELECTED WILL BE REGARDED AS ON LOAN TO AFHQ AND MAY BE RELIEVED FROM TIME TO TIME.

My dear Dr. Prunus:

In reply to your letter 16/25392/64 of 9 November 1945, the Chief Commissioner has asked me to say that he has been informed that certain British troop units are presently being transferred to the Alto Adige to replace American formations which have been in that area since the German surrender. The Commission is not aware as yet that any change has been made in the deployment of Italian troops presently in that area, but should some relief take place it is most probable that it shall be by other Italian formations.

I appreciate the importance that the Italian Government attaches to the maintenance of Italian formations in the Alto Adige at this time and assure you that it is not the intention of the Allied authorities to take any action which would prejudice the existing situation.

It is reported that units of British troops have been transferred to Alto Adige from other regions of Northern Italy. Such movements are probably connected with the recent departure from Alto Adige of some American formations. However, in certain quarters of that region the strengthening of British garrisons is being interpreted and explained as preliminaries to the removal of Italian troops now stationed there. The aims of such interpretation are obvious, just as it is obvious that it contributes to render still more acute the deplorable state of anxiety and restlessness, which I had the occasion to point out to you.



1. I have to report that I had a conference on this subject on Saturday 3 November with Colonel A.J.L. Purves Commander 60 Sub Area and with Colonel S.W. Miller MC Provincial Commissioner Bolzano.

2. The withdrawal of Folgore Division to the Brescia Region for training will commence next week. Garibaldi Regiment will be the first to be relieved by a British Artillery Regiment in the Silandro area. Nembo will then be relieved, also by a British Artillery Regiment, in the Brunico area. Finally the divisional troops of Folgore will be withdrawn.

3. I also interviewed Colonel De Luca commanding the Bolzano Legion of Carabinieri. He is shortly receiving a reinforcement of 500 men. Thanks to very helpful cooperation on the part of Major General Heydeman G.O.C. No.2 District, cloth for uniforms has been made available so that the Carabinieri in this most important Province can appear well turned out.

4. The number of road blocks in the Province has been reduced from over forty to nine. These nine are operated by Carabinieri. Italian military personnel are also present to deal with Italian military vehicles.

The FOLCORE Gp do not wish to leave BOLZANO Area for various reasons, political and otherwise, and I feel certain that the best way to have them removed is to say that they should be concentrated for retraining so as to be under the closer observation of their Commander. Unfortunately, before they are withdrawn, I must either take over the guarding of the 150 dumps which they are now guarding or remove from the dumps all articles of value which are required by the British Army and destroy all the German weapons therein. These two matters are being attended to as rapidly as possible, but will certainly take some time. I hope that the British troops available will be able fairly rapidly to take over the most important dumps from the FOLCORE Gp and free the greater portion of that Group.



1. G.O.C. No. 2 District will, I think, have now received a copy of a letter from Headquarters, Allied Commission, reference 585/TC of 3rd October.

2. At the time of my meeting with Major General Heydemann at Bolzano on the evening of Friday 5th, I had been away from my Headquarters for two days. As a result, I had not received the copy of the Allied Commission Headquarters' letter which had been addressed to me. In the absence of authority from my Chiefs I did not therefore feel at liberty to discuss the question of moving Polgore.

3. I was, however, very glad to gather from General Heydemann's observations that he had himself come to the conclusion that such a move was necessary.

4. I should be very glad to come across to Milan to discuss the matter - from the point of view of the Allied Commission - if Major General Heydemann considers such a visit now necessary.



1. With further reference to my 850.12 of 30 Sept.  
Replying to your 585/EC of 27 Sept and AC/14191/4/PS of the  
same date.

2. I should like to call your attention to the second  
sentence in the first paragraph of Pastor Michael Damper's  
memorial. It quotes ~~to~~ a "Recent Allied Publication". This  
refers without doubt to an article which appeared in the  
"Stars and Stripes", itself a repeat of a Roman news item.  
No doubt this copy of the "Stars and Stripes" was widely  
known in the Sud-Tirol owing to the presence there of  
American troops. The Dementi which later appeared did not  
clearly deny the implication that some special treatment  
would be accorded to Bolzano, Belluno and Trento. I think  
it well to call this matter to your attention. There is no  
doubt that to many Italians, the "Stars and Stripes" and  
"Union Jack", are officially inspired Allied publications.

1. With further reference to my 850.12 of 30 Sept,  
addressed Executive Commissioner repeated to Public Safety

2. I have now received through the Provincial Com-
