1. Attention has been drawn to the contents and the distribution of the monthly intelligence summary issued by MMIA.
2. The primary purpose of this summary when it was originally instituted was to provide a check on information received from other Italian sources concerning the Italian army.
3. The material included in this summary should therefore be confined to such intelligence as has a direct bearing on the Italian army and should not include political subjects unless they affect the morale or security of the Italian armed forces.
4. Since the information included in these summaries can only be uncollected information, no distribution of the summary other than to G-2, AFHQ, should be made.

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I enclose copy of letter which I have addressed to the Land Forces Sub-Commission on the subject of the Intelligence Summaries emanating from them. The issue of Intelligence Summaries to external formations by a Sub-division of a IFA, which is itself responsible for a comprehensive report, transgresses in my opinion all the axioms of the distribution of information.

The Allied Commission produces a monthly report which covers all the political aspects and non-military subjects covered in these Intelligence Summaries produced by the Land Forces Sub-Commission. They should not, therefore, in my opinion be called upon to produce intelligence other than that which is of direct bearing on the Italian Army.

As a result of my letter I have been informed by Col. Kerr that these Summaries have been produced at the request of G-2 AFHQ who wish to use them as a check on information provided through other channels by 808 CS Bn. If this is so, then this should be clearly stated in the heading of the Summaries and the distribution should be confined to G-2 AFHQ who, presumably, wish to check the information. There should be no external distribution and above all, no distribution to the War Office and the US Embassy. We cannot have reports from Sub-Commissions being given external distribution when they may very well conflict with the views of the Allied Commission as a whole.

I should be most grateful if you would give orders that these Summaries are no longer to be called "Intelligence Summaries" but called exactly what they are, which is presumably a cross-check of other information; that the source should be definitely described and that it should be made quite plain that they are not intelligence reports of the Allied Commission. I should also be grateful if you would give directions that the distribution of these reports is limited to G-2 AFHQ.

SUBJECT: Reports.

TO : Land Forces Sub-Com (MCLA).

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1. My attention has been drawn to Intelligence Summary No.3 (Int/207/1 dated 15 Mar 46) issued by your Sub-Commission.

2. This summary contains reports or headings on Politics, Public Security, Fascist Activity, and the activity of some (but not all) Political Parties, Political Friction, Illegal Immigration, which have only an indirect bearing on the Italian Army. Such reports which have a wide external distribution should be included in the monthly report of the Allied Commission and should not emanate from a Sub-Commission. It may well be, for instance, that the reports of the MLI's are at variance with those of the Chief Liaison Officers. It is important that we should collate all the information possible but that we should coordinate such information before dissemination.

3. I should be glad, therefore, if you would confine the reports in your summary to matters affecting the Italian Army, e.g., Political Activity among Troops, Relations between Troops and Civilians, Morale, Frontier Activity, and would pass to the Executive Committee other reports received from MLI's on other subjects of general interest, e.g., Activity of Political Parties, Political Friction, Illegal Immigration, Public Security, for inclusion in the main report of the Allied Commission.

4. I note that a copy is sent direct to War Office, London but not to War Department Washington, and to US Embassy Rome but not to the British Embassy. Finally, no copy is sent to any section of your parent body the Allied Commission. This seems anomalous.

Based on periodical reports from BLUs att to ITALIAN Territorial Region HQs up to 28 Feb 46.

1. GENERAL SUMMARY

(a) Politics

No increase in activity or interest among tps. propaganda against the call-up, and the retention under arms of the 1921 and 1922 classes is directed to undermining confidence of tps in officers and higher comd.

(b) Relations between tps and civilians

Slight improvement in Army prestige. Considerable improvement in morale and confidence in CC.FR.

(c) Morale

Poor conditions of service continue to lower morale. Where new clothing and weapons are issued morale shows an immediate uplift.

(d) Frontier activity

Illegal crossing of all frontiers is prevalent.

(e) Public Security

No decrease in amount of crime. Slight increase in CC.FR activity to cope with the situation.

(f) Traffic in arms

Continues in NOVARA area.

2. Fascist Activity

BOLOGNA

- The neo-fascist organization, Squadra d'Azione Mussolini does not appear to grow but continues to distribute propaganda in Emilia. Manifestos were issued by the party in FERRARA.

SICILY

- Fascist movement although still in the early stages of reorganization has lately spread to the PALERMO

- (a) Politics
No increase in activity or interest among fascists. Propaganda against the call-up, and the retention under arms of the 1921 and 1922 classes is directed to undermining confidence of fascists in officers and higher command.
 - (b) Relations between fascists and civilians
Slight improvement in Army prestige. Considerable improvement in morale and confidence in CO.FE.

Poor conditions of service continue to lower morale. More new clothing and weapons are issued morale shows an immediate uplift.
 - (d) Frontier activity
Illegal crossing of all frontiers is prevalent.
 - (e) Public Security

 - (f) Traffic in arms
Continues in NOVARA area.
2. Fascist Activity
BOLOGNA - The neo-fascist organization, Squadra divisione Mussolini does not appear to grow but continues to distribute propaganda in Emilia. Manifestos were issued by the party in FERRARA.
SICILY - Fascist movement although still in the early stages of reorganization has lately spread to the PALERMO area. There have been no large scale meetings.
 3. Communist Activity
Nothing to report.
 4. Left wing Activity
Nothing to report.
 5. Political Activity of Centre
Nothing to report.

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6. Political Friction

- TURIN - In the valleys of NOVARA Slav elements are in close touch with ITALIANS of the extreme left parties, and illegal wireless transmission is going on in the area.
- In the VAL DI SUSA active propaganda pro annexation to FRANCE continues. Dissatisfaction caused by the food problem, inefficiency of public services, high taxes and bad economical conditions are exploited. There are twelve known propaganda agents in the VAL DI SUSA.
- The pro-independence party, Union Valdostain, has posted proclamations in the VAL D'AOSTA calling the people of the valley to make a last effort to obtain an international guarantee of their rights.
- BOLOGNO - The delay in formulating the peace treaty is causing anxiety and the controversy between the ITALIAN and the AUSTRIAN newspapers is becoming more bitter.
- ROME - Public alarmed at massing of TIPO's forces on YUGO SLAV frontier. Feeling against YUGOSLAVIA increasing because of her claiming TRIESTE and hostility towards AUSTRIA on account of her claim to the ALTO ADIGE. Resentment against FRANCE who desires VERFIMICELLI. SWITZERLAND has expelled a number of ITALIANS who had resided there many years for no apparent reason.
- RAPI - The commandant and staff at the Royal Military Academy at LEONE appear to be very monarchist in their attitude judging by their conversation.
- SICILY - General political situation somewhat quieter but much trouble is expected when the elections are held. The separatist movement aided by the Banda GIULIANO is still increasing considerably. During the past two weeks 600-700 suspected bandits have been arrested. Capt. MIZZOLA of the E.V.I.S. was arrested. Casualties suffered by the CO.FR and Army have decreased. Battle zones reported to have moved from the CATANIA and PALERMO areas to PRIZZI in centre of island.
- The Democratic Christian party is increasing.

7. Political Activity among Sp

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7. Political Activity among Tps

- Few military take an active part in party politics, and Ose units have the situation well in hand, enjoying the respect of their tps. The political campaign against the call-up has lowered the morale of the older classes who fear their release will be postponed. There is hostility towards YUGO-SLAVIA and bitter feeling against SICILIAN separatists. Newspapers of the Left parties and certain members of the extremists by subversive articles and lectures are trying to arouse the tps and population to disturbances. The Army appears free of subversive elements.

- Very little political activity is evident. Attempts made to provide an equivalent of AECG are having a good effect. No outward signs of subversive elements.

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- Politics begin to find hearing among tps, but it is chiefly the 1921 and 22 classes who listen to accusations against the Ministry of War and their subordinates, voiced by the extremist left wing elements who attempt to undermine the confidence of the tps in their own. These attempts have recently been successful and only the release of the above classes will rectify the situation.
- The daily "UNITA" uses any incident to abuse officers and war Minister in its attempts to upset the confidence of the soldier in his superiors. An unknown party called a demonstration on 3 May in MILAN to protest against call-up.
- Socialist party at VERONA started a campaign against call-up, otherwise no subversive propaganda is evident.
- Tps are very un-politically minded. Some posters against the call-up have been exhibited.
- A Sgt of the 8 Inf Regt who made a speech of a Communist nature at VITERBO was severely punished.

6. Relations between tps and civilians

- Propaganda against the call-up by the Socialist party has hindered the good relations between tps and people. In the LOSWA and BILLIA areas the relations between tps and civilians are unsatisfactory despite invitations to entertainments. Tps are despised by partisans, but the latter do not enjoy the people's respect on account of their bullying attitude.
- Relations between tps and civil police are unsatisfactory throughout a great part of the Region. The CC.II enjoy the people's esteem.
- Anti-army propaganda has intensified during the last ten days in the TRENTO press. Scandalous articles have appeared against CORTINA and the Army in general. The worst offender was the "SEMPRE AVANTI" run by CALOSSO, an Italian who used to broadcast from LONDON and is now in ITALY. This propaganda is having a harmful effect on the military and educated civilians deprecate it.
- Relations satisfactory. Public are becoming used to Army and consider it a necessity. Prestige of CC.II in GENOA is rising but in outlying districts their prestige is still low.

MILAN - Relations good. Public opinion of CC.II good, relations cordial. Propaganda against call-up is evident. 2496

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- FLORENCE**

This propaganda is having a harmful effect on the military and educated civilians deprecate it.
- GENOVA**
 - Relations satisfactory. Public are becoming used to Army and consider it a necessity. Prestige of CC.BB in GENOVA is rising but in outlying districts their prestige is still low.
- MILAN**
 - Relations good. Public opinion of CC.BB good, relations cordial. Propaganda against call-up is evident, particularly in small centers.
- BOLZANO**
 - CC.BB popular and respected by majority of population.
- TOLENA**
 - The population is not conscious that any Army exists as the recent governments have done nothing to change the opinion of the people that the Army is a lawless organization, and poorly equipped. The Director of REGGIO EMILIA was surprised that a disciplined body of soldiers such as the Granatieri Paracadutisti in his town. The poor bearing and discipline of the 6th Guard on forming 6 Inf Regt, has given the CC.BB the impression that the Army lacks the solidarity to make it reliable in civil disturbances.

FLORINCE

The de-requisitioning of civilian property by the Italian Army has removed the only source of friction between the Army and the population. Relations between the POLCOSE Div and the civilians have steadily improved.

ROME

- Unchanged.

BARI

A spectator who loudly made insulting remarks about the Army during a ceremonial march of the 3/9 Inf Regt through BARI was arrested by order of the bn comd and handed over to the DC. The local paper reported the incident as "displeasing behavior" on the part of the spectator. During a football match at WAMI civilians seated near two ITALIAN soldiers made loud derogatory remarks about them. The two soldiers of the 1/9 Inf Regt beat up two of the civilians and anti-Army talk ceased. On neither occasion did the crowd support the individuals causing the incidents and they continue to be friendly with the Gps.

9. MoraleTURIN

- Gftrs resent the lack of consideration for the Army and are affected by their economic treatment on which they can barely live. The Gps are depressed on account of the poor clothing and equipment so far issued and of the negligible progress made in their welfare.

GENOVA

- PAV, accommodation and rations continue to affect morale, and the substitution of ITALIAN products for those of ALLIED origin also had an adverse effect. The ITALIAN Army is ignorant of the world shortage of food and of the sacrifices of the United Nations to provide food for the needy peoples of the world.

FLORINCE

- Generally improving. POLCOSE Div, morale good, and GARIBOLDI Regt left for SICILY in excellent spirits.

10. Frontier ActivityTURIN

- People are illegally migrating along the whole of the FRENCH and SWISS borders. SWISS authorities are concerned about this and the illegal trading carried on by well-armed bands. The SWISS have increased their frontier Gps whereas the GUARDIE DI FRONTIERA are unable to cope with the situation due to lack of men and means.

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9. Morale

TURIN

- Officers resent the lack of consideration for the Army and are affected by their economic treatment on which they can barely live. The tps are depressed on account of the poor clothing and equipment so far issued and of the negligible progress made in their welfare.

GENOVA

- Pay, accommodation and rations continue to affect morale, and the substitution of ITALIAN products for those of ALLIED origin also had an adverse effect. The ITALIAN Army is ignorant of the world shortages of food and of the sacrifices of the United Nations to provide food for the needy peoples of the world.

FLORENCE

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GENOVA

- Minor disturbances in the SAN REMO and IMPERIA areas where FRENCH flags have been displayed. Arrests made at a small pro-FRENCH demonstration showed that the incidents were caused by students who were ignorant of the party they represented and its policy. In the said areas subversive propaganda tries to prove that if the areas were under FRENCH control the ports of SAN REMO and IMPERIA would be in full operation with employment for all. A Royal Navy flotilla engaged in air-sea-sweeping in this locality has upset the propaganda. The Paper "IL LAVORO NUOVO" of GENOVA reports that the inhabitants of VENTIMIGLIA desire to be under FRANCE. A report states that FRENCH officers of the Repatriation Gp were stopped on the ITALIAN side of the frontier and their vehicles and baggage searched.

BOLZANO - Secret crossing of the frontier continues; many arrests have been made, and organization of Finance Guards is improving.

11. Illegal Immigration
Nothing to report.

12. Public Security

TURIN - Crime is still increasing in PIEMONTE. Another armed robbery has been carried out by auxiliary police agents and public security will never be assured in this region until these bad elements, mostly undesirable ruffians, are removed. The population fears disturbances at the future elections. Two well-known gangsters, arrested for concealing arms dumps in the BACCINO area and now released on parole, are reported to be in the VALLE ANTIGORIO area. An ex leader of the Action Party and a card of a Communist Pdo have also arrived in the same area.

GENOVA - Decrease in robberies and murders, increase in thefts and petty crimes. Special police stations formed in GENOVA where mobile squads can be called up by dialling a number on the automatic phone are working well.

MILAN - Situation good. Outstanding case of banditry cleared up. Personnel of Questura of MILAN completely changed and changes in the personnel of other provinces in the area will be made immediately.

BOLZANO - Slight decrease in number of crimes apparently due to more energetic action by CC.RR and Public Security.

BOLZANO - Crimes in SELLIA continue at their previous level. In February more than 100 incidents of murder, abduction and robbery occurred. At POSTUMAGGIORE (VERBA) the arrest of some criminals caused a demonstration by about 200 persons, members of the Communist party, to which the criminals belonged. The CC.RR were accused of being Konradists and of having arrested the criminals for political reasons.

FLORENCE - Slight decrease in crimes and offenses. 2:93

BARI - 1145 robberies were committed in February and 319 arrests were made. Around individuals of small armed bands committed 25

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At PORTOMAGGIORE (PERUGIA) the arrest of some criminals caused a demonstration by about 200 persons, members of the Communist party, to which the criminals belonged. The CC, DR were accused of being monarchists and of having arrested the criminals for political reasons.

- Slight decrease in crimes and offenses, **2,93**

- 1145 robberies were committed in February and 349 arrests were made. Armed individuals or small armed bands committed 25 robberies with violence but no arrests have been made.

13. Illegal Arms

- Illegal traffic in arms continues in the NOVARA area, particularly in the VIL SASSARA, VAL GRANDE, PIERRE DEL GONTE, PIEDIMULERA and VOUREU, and in those localities without troops or police.
