1. Italian Government has raised question of payment of transit fees due to Government of countries over whose lines pass long distance Allied Military telephone calls originated in Italy.
2. Under international agreement such fees are payable periodically in gold after balancing debits against credits. For month of October 1946, cost to Italian Government of transit fees for Allied Military calls was 12,775 dollars.
3. Payment of these transit fees is at present treated as an occupational cost. Italian Government has asked through Alcom that it may be relieved of this charge and stresses adverse effect of gold disbursements on Italian economy.
4. Consider that by offering Italians revised armistice terms and accompanying civil and military affairs agreements, which they rejected allies have already given them opportunity to escape from rigid application of present armistice terms. In view however of policy of US Government to further economic rehabilitation of Italy matter is referred to you for decision. Your instructions as to reply to be made to Italian Government are therefore requested.
5. Similar signal has been despatched by AFHQ bracket BA Bridge to Troopers London.

PARA 1. ITALIAN GOVERNMENT HAS RAISED QUESTION RE PAYMENT OF TRANSIT FEES DUE TO GOVERNMENTS OF COUNTRIES OVER WHOSE LINES PASS LONG DISTANCE ALLIED MILITARY TELEPHONE CALLS ORIGINATE IN ITALY.

PARA 2. UNDER INTERNATIONAL AGREEMENT SUCH FEES ARE PAYABLE PERIODICALLY IN GOLD AFTER BALANCING DEBITS AGAIN ONE ITL. FOR MONTH OF OCTOBER 1946 COST TO ITALIAN GOVERNMENT OF TRANSIT FEES FOR ALLIED MILITARY CALLS WAS 12,000,000 775 DOLLARS.

PARA 3. PAYMENT OF THESE TRANSIT FEES IS AT PRESENT TREATED AS AN OCCUPATIONAL COST. ITALIAN GOVERNMENT HAS ASKED THROUGH ALCON THAT IT MAY BE RELIEVED OF THIS CHARGE AND STRESSORS ADVERSE EFFECTS OF GOLD DISBURSEMENTS ON ITALIAN ECONOMY.

PARA 4. CONSIDER THAT BY OFFERING ITALIANS REVISED ARMISTICE TERMS AND ACCOMPANYING A CIVIL AND MILITARY AFFAIRS AGREEMENTS WHICH THEY REJECTED ALLIED HAVE ALREADY GIVEN THEM OPPORTUNITY TO ESCAPE FROM RIGID APPLICATIONS OF PRESENT ARMISTICE TERMS. IN VIEW HOWEVER OF POLICY OF HQG TO FURTHER ECONOMIC REHABILITATION OF ITALY MATTER HIS REFERS TO YOUR FOR DECISION. YOUR INSTRUCTIONS AS TO REPLY TO BE MADE TO ITALIAN GOVERNMENT ARE THEREFORE REQUESTED.

TO: The Executive Commissioner

1. Attached (105) is a proposed letter to the Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications about establishment of rates of charge for telephone service furnished by Azienda di Stato and the Concessionary Companies over telephone lines derequisitioned by Allied Military Forces.

2. The establishment of rates for Allied Military Forces at one-half the rates charged Italian civilian establishments, and agreement for charging Routine Military calls at very urgent rates, would, it is believed, provide reasonable compensation for the service. A very urgent call is charged at three times the charge for ordinary calls.

a. Thus, a routine military call at very urgent rates would actually be one and one-half times the normal charge for a routine civilian call.

b. If, as proposed in the American Financial Annex to the Civil Affairs agreement and the British Civil Affairs Agreement the service is paid in dollars or pounds at the rate 225 lira to the dollar, the Italians will be getting the equivalent of four times the rate for an ordinary civilian cable. ⁷

3. Presently Italcable charges the United States, the United Kingdom and UNRRA 22.5 lira a word for official telegrams. Italcable charges the Italian Government 42.5 lira a word, which is one-half the 85 lire a word for ordinary commercial telegrams.

- a. The Italian Government pays the full commercial rates for long distance telephone service and radiotelephone service. However, Italian Governmental Agencies pay one-half the commercial rate for local telephone service.
- b. The low rates for telegrams charged by Italcable is compensated for by the payment of balances due (which have resulted in payments to Italy on all settlement dates-) in gold francs.

1. Confirming conversations between representatives of Azienda di Stato and the Communications ^{DIVISION} ~~Sub-Commission~~, the Allied Military Forces will require priorities for its telephone service in accordance with the listing in the letter T.35.273. CS dated 25 September 1946.

104 2. It is proposed that rates for service furnished to the Allied Military Force be established at one-half the rates for similar civilian service.

3. If the rates are established as proposed in paragraph 2 above, it would be satisfactory for charges to be made for Allied Military Calls in accordance with the numerical position of the priority. For example: a Routine Allied Military Call, being number 10 in the order of priority could be charged as a very urgent call since its relative position is above other very urgent calls.

4. With this arrangement, the Concessionary Companies would, in our opinion, receive reasonable and fair compensation for service furnished to the Allied Military Forces.

SUBJECT: Telephone Priorities

TO : Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications
Att: (Azienda di Stato - Traffic Office)

1. Your Prot. n/550 September 1946, "Disposition on Interurban Telephone Communications asked for by the Allies" has been examined. In general the instructions contained therein comply with previous decisions. The Allied Military Forces, however, insist that (Priority(urgent) Allied Military calls) remain 5th in order of priority. Routine Allied military calls also must have higher priority than 16.

2. The following order of precedence is approved by the Allied Military Forces:

1. Air Force Crash Calls, Urgent or Clear the line Allied Military Calls.
2. Service calls.
3. Operational calls of Italian Armed Force.
4. Public Safety Calls.
5. Operational Priority (or Priority) Allied Military Calls.
6. Urgent International State Calls
7. Very Urgent State Calls
8. Urgent International Air Calls
9. Urgent International Service Calls
10. Routine Allied Military Calls.
11. Private Flash International Calls.
12. Urgent Private " "
13. Ordinary State " "
14. Ordinary Private and Service International Calls.

3. Your proposal to include airways navigation in the 3d priority "Operational calls of Italian Armed Forces", and to include calls of the head of the state in the 4th priority "Public Safety Calls", is approved.

4. Paragraph 6a should direct: Each interurban Office must compile monthly a list of the calls made by the Allied Military Forces and send a copy for verification to the Allied Fault Control Liaison Officer or responsible Signal Officer (of the United States Signal Corps, or British Royal Corps of Signals). Uncertain cases should be referred to the Chief Signal Officer, Allied Force Headquarters, Attention: Long Lines Liaison Office.

1. Within the period 18-21 September 1946 underground telephone cable in the vicinity of MIGNANO was cut and a section of 44 meters removed. At another point nearby a section of 20 meters was removed.

2. On 5 October 1946, on the Capua - Caserta overhead telephone line, 4 spans of wire was removed. On 6 October 1946 on the Ferentino - Zagarolo overhead telephone line 3 spans of wire at one point and 2 spans of wire at another point was removed. On 9 October 1946 on the overhead telephone line near Caserta 7 spans of wire was removed. All these lines are located along Highway Route number 6.

3. The seriousness of the deliberate removal of wire and cable has been discussed with the Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications, and, also, a letter has been sent to the Ministry requesting information as to the steps taken or contemplated to prevent further removals of wire and cable.

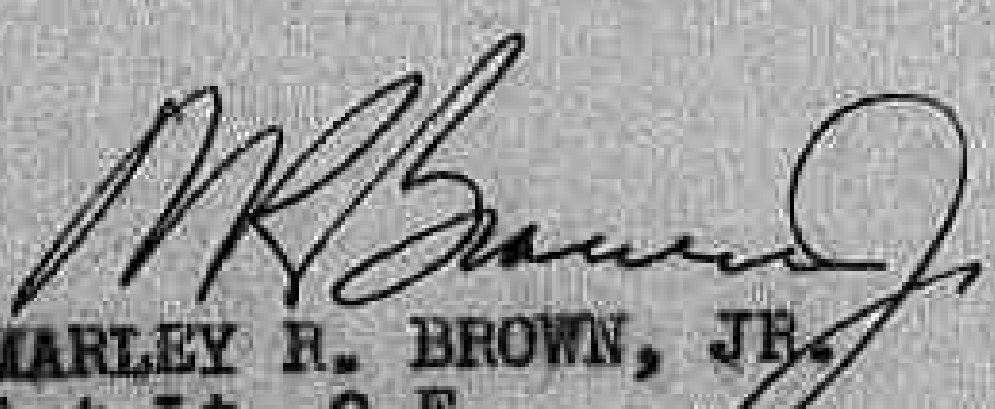

TO : Chiefs of all Staff Sections,
Commanders of all Major Commands, Separate Units and Installations

1. Recent monitoring of telephone conversations has shown that there is a considerable lack of security on the part of all ranks.
2. It should be noted that due to the release of personnel, civilian operators and installations are being increasingly utilized. It is, therefore, the duty of all personnel to observe all the security precautions and to be just as security minded now as they were during the actual operations.
3. All personnel must realize that the telephone is definitely an unclassified means of communication. An indiscreet telephone conversation in any part of this theater might give rise to unfounded rumors.
4. Unit commanders will include telephone security in the normal security indoctrination of personnel in their units. Special attention will be given to personnel recently arrived in this theater.
5. Disciplinary action will be taken against offenders when a breach of security of this nature is reported in the future.

2. Referring to enclosure 1, it will be noticed that on first glance there seems to be an inordinate number of civilian employees. However, the number of switchboard personnel is the minimum necessary to maintain 24 hour service at a standard demanded by ALCOM officers. The number of maintenance personnel can be reduced to three, and if large work orders are encountered, additional personnel can be obtained from TETI for the extra work at an hourly basis. The executive and secretary are necessary to coordinate the various phases of operation, and keep the records and accounts.

3. The other large expense, rent on equipment, is an estimate. The equipment is the property of the Italian Government. It has been assumed that it would charge the same as TETI, and the figure here was obtained from TETI engineers.

In reference to Rome Area Command letter ref. 483.2, Military Long Distance, 15 May 1946, the following action is recommended by the AC Signal Officer.

a. Unrestricted extensions on the AC switchboard held by American Joint Distribution Committee and Intergovernmental Committee on Refugees be replaced by civilian dial lines to be obtained from the Italian telephone agency TETI by these organizations. If they wish intra-building communication, it can be made on restricted extensions from AC switchboard. The change, once dial lines are obtained, can be made in 15 minutes.

b. UNRRA subscribers on AC switchboard should be advised that no direct long distance calls will be made from AC extensions, but that all long distance calls will be booked with the booking office as UNRRA calls.

1. The civilian organizations operating as "American Joint Distribution Committee" and "Intergovernmental Committee on Refugees" do not appear to be sub-commissions or sections of Allied Commission, and therefore no military responsibility with regard to military long distance service should be undertaken on the basis that these organizations already have extension service from the AC switchboard. It was confirmed with Signal Section, AFHQ that the above named organizations are not entitled to military service and are required to pay their own bills.

2. UNRRA subscribers may use the military LD network in Rome,

a. When the called party is a military number

b. When in exceptional instances chief operators of military LD exchanges sanction individual calls. Such exceptional calls may be caused by non-existence, interruption or congestion of civil routes.

To implement the above AFHQ directive, arrangements have been made by this Office with UNRRA to the effect that UNRRA calls will be accepted on demand but will all be booked with LD. Consequently all UNRRA personnel with extensions from the AC switchboard should be so advised.

Oddi and informed him that I did not consider that his explanation was adequate. Capt. Oddi pointed out that the call was 1 hour & 41 minutes in coming through, which certainly is an unusually long time.
 3. I told Capt. Oddi that neglect of this kind was a serious matter and that any repetition would probably result in disciplinary action being taken. I also informed him that it was incorrect for him to reply personally to the RAAC letter, and I suggest that this indorsement be destroyed.

TO : EXECUTIVE COMMISSIONER'S OFFICE.

1. Congestion on telephone lines within the AC building has become serious and is hampering communications from Headquarters. This has been brought to the attention of most subscribers by their inability to get an outside line when dialing "0".

2. There are two reasons for this congestion. One is the large number of unofficial calls, particularly by civilians. The other, and most important, is the excessive number of lines on the AC exchange. A reduction of 20 percent of lines not operating is necessary for proper traffic flow.

3. The AC telephone exchange has two blocks of lines. One, the unrestricted (800-999), the subscriber can call all numbers in the building, and he can also call all numbers available to the home exchange by dialing "0". The other block, the restricted (000-799), can call all three digit numbers in the building, but cannot call outside.

4. It is requested that you release unrestricted numbers in your section least urgently needed, and have telephones carrying a high percentage of intra-building traffic changed to restricted numbers.

SUBJECT: Telephone Service

TO : All Commands

1. During recent weeks a considerable number of "clear the line" and/or "urgent" telephone calls have been recorded.

2. "Clear the line" and/or "urgent" calls cause dislocation of the telephone service in that a demand for such a call constitutes authority to an operator to break down an existing connection and in that their setting up in any case interrupts the order of waiting calls and thereby causes additional delay to waiting subscribers. Further, the operator handling such a call has to devote his or her whole attention to it until the call is right through and can deal with no other calls while engaged in this manner; this again causes delay in answering subscribers and consequently in dealing with their calls.

3. Such calls will be placed only for the most urgent and immediate operational reasons. Every officer placing these calls must carefully weigh the necessity for immediate action against inconvenience and delay which is imposed on other important messages. Mere seniority of an officer is no justification for placing "clear the line" and/or "urgent" calls. However, officers other than General Officers will rarely have justification for placing such calls unless specifically so directed by those holding General Officer rank.

4. In the future when "clear the line" and/or "urgent" calls, except those made in person by officers of the grade of Major General or above, are made, the reasons for the urgency will be stated in general terms when the call is booked, to the officer in charge of the switchboard concerned.

5. It is pointed out that the "priority" and "operational priority" degrees of urgency will nearly always insure the rapid connection of a call.

Robb, this headquarters, on 22 November) arrangements are being completed to provide telephone communication between this Headquarters and the Filpot Exchange. To avoid any possibility of misunderstanding, the entire program is outlined herewith.

2. This headquarters will arrange for a circuit from this headquarters to the Chiassi terminus of the private circuit of the Valdarno Electric Co which has authorized us to share this circuit with them.

3. At the Siena terminus of this private circuit, Toti (through arrangement with the Siena director, Ing. Paolotti) will install a new private branch exchange of the type which will permit the switching of incoming calls from the private circuit to the Siena automatic exchange. The attendant at the electric company's cabin in Siena will be instructed as to the number to dial (20737 or 20738) in order to switch these private line calls through the Siena automatic exchange to the Filpot operator.

4. The routine for making a call will be as follows:

a. From Chianciano

- (1) When receiver is picked up, Chianciano operator will answer. Ask this operator for "Valdarno Chiassi".
- (2) When Valdarno Chiassi answers, ask for "Valdarno Siena".
- (3) When Valdarno Siena answers, ask for "Filpot" or request operator to dial 20737 or 20738.
- (4) When Filpot operator answers, request the military number or individual desired.

b. From military installation

- (1) Get Filpot operator and request him to dial number 4224 the Siena Valdarno terminus of the private circuit.
- (2) Ask Valdarno Siena for Valdarno Chiassi.
- (3) Ask Valdarno Chiassi for Chianciano.
- (4) Ask Chianciano operator for Piemonte Region, AMG.

In connection with the above routine, it should be noted that calls may be made to civilian subscribers in Siena by requesting such number instead of asking for "Filpot" or "20737". It also should be noted that any calls from this headquarters for military installations outside of Filpot (such as trunk line calls to lightning) will be on a recording and call-back basis. The call will be backed and when completed, the individual placing the call will be called back. Local Filpot calls will be completed without delay.

6. It must be recognized that the telephone circuit referred to herein, is a public line passing through numerous civilian switching centers, accordingly, all users will observe all security measures and avoid conversations on classified subjects.
