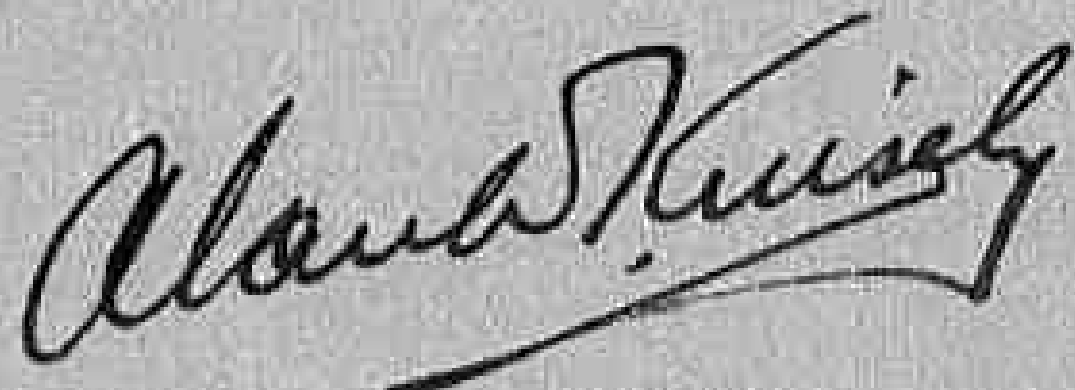

SUBJECT: Funds of South-Tyrol emigres.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission, APO 394
Attn: Exec. Com.

1. Enclosed is a copy of CEM/92/16 of 12 Feb.
2. While it is agreed that the funds in question should be blocked, it is considered that the CEM Branch should have no concern with the blocking of bank accounts or with negotiations with the French for disposal or transfer of funds.
3. The Bank in question is a Trustee Bank holding the value of the estates of optants who had left or were leaving Italy for Austria or Germany. As such, the funds would not appear to be seizable except with the appended liability of accounting to those entitled.
4. It is not understood why part only of the funds have been transferred to AFA, and with what object part has been retained in Bolzano, or how that part has been calculated.
5. It is considered that the whole of the funds should be put under the protection of AFA who, it is presumed, are aware or will be informed of the Trust attaching thereto.
6. It is not understood how the French can have any interest in these funds.
7. Will you please take such steps as may be necessary to place the whole of the funds under the protection of AFA and arrange for the French to be informed that any claim on the funds should be submitted through diplomatic channels.

1. The CMB Section, Bolzano, blocked the accounts of the D.U.T. (Deutsche Umsiedelungs-Treuhand) Bolzano.
2. The D.U.T. was the Italian-German Bank dealing with the sales between South-Tyrolean farmers emigrating to Austria and the Italian Government.
3. At the time of the German capitulation there were approximately Lit 160.000.000 in the D.U.T. account of Cassa di Risparmio, Banca d'Italia and Banca del Lavoro, Bolzano.
4. Lit 99.000.000 were transferred to AFG No. 1 a/c Rome by the Allied Military Government Finance Officer. The remainder was blocked by CEM Section, Bolzano.
5. These funds were credits for the South-Tyrolean farmers who emigrated to Austria as the counter balance of their South-Tyrolean farms.
6. As the French occupational troops in Northern-Tyrol are already demanding this money as Austrian credit (French CEM) may a ruling please be given as to correct disposition.

Reference your AC/4079/1/L of 9 February 1946.

1. It has been understood that the total of cases awaiting review was of the order of 10,000 or more but in view of the figures in your AC/4079/1/L of 9 February the task of reviewing the surprisingly low figure of some 500 cases does not seem beyond the reasonable capacity of ALCOM in the time remaining to it.

2. The proposal that persons sentenced by AMG Courts shall in future benefit by remission for good conduct in the same way and to the same extent as persons sentenced by Italian Courts, is receiving consideration.

3. The grant of this concession would have a considerable affect on the figures contained in para 3(a) of your letter. Can you estimate the number of persons who would be more or less immediately affected? A precise number is not required.

4. This Headquarters cannot accept your earlier proposal for a wholesale reduction of sentences based upon a uniform estimate of the deterrent element. It is understood however that the deterrent factor has not, in the view of your legal adviser, always been reasonably applied. If this is the fact this Headquarters agrees that an individual review of cases is desirable so that a reasonable and uniform scale of sentence may result.

5. The figures contained in para 3(b) of your letter would be somewhat reduced by remission for good conduct. Taking this into consideration your views are requested as to whether an individual review of the remaining cases is a physical possibility in the time which remains before ALCOM may be abolished. If possible an estimated date for the completion of such a review should be given.

6. In order to obtain a better understanding of the position would be helpful if you could supply an approximate analysis of the

number of sentences by groups of say, sentences up to 4, 7, 10, 15, 20, over 20 years and life, and also by the principal classes of offences. (It would be most helpful if these two could be combined in a cross table). It would also be of assistance if you could state the number of cases which experience has shown can be reviewed weekly on the average.

7. Your proposal that a conference should be held to discuss the subject will be considered in light of the information asked for above.

SUBJECT : Routing of Correspondence.

Both ASAA and AFA will continue to be located in Rome and attached to the Allied Commission.

2. It is desirable that correspondence pertaining to Allied Supply Accounting Agency and Allied Financial Agency matters be addressed directly to these Agencies instead of through the message center of the Finance Sub-Commission as at present.

3. It is therefore requested that all correspondence and documents on matters of civilian supply accounting be addressed to the Allied Supply Accounting Agency. Much of such correspondence was formerly addressed to the Chief

2. It is desirable that correspondence pertaining **4462** to Allied Supply Accounting Agency and Allied Financial Agency matters be addressed directly to these Agencies instead of through the message center of the Finance Sub-Commission as at present.

3. It is therefore requested that all correspondence and documents on matters of civilian supply accounting be addressed to the Allied Supply Accounting Agency. Much of such correspondence was formerly addressed to the Chief Accountant, Allied Commission, and should now be readressed.

4. All correspondence on the following questions should in future be addressed to the Allied Financial Agency:

- (a) the supply of lire currency to the Allied Forces
- (b) redemption of counterfeit notes
- (c) destruction of mutilated or foul currency
- (d) seized or confiscated enemy funds
- (e) funds taken from Allied ex POW.

5. In addition, questions relating to the expenditure of AC/AMG funds will continue to be handled by the Financial Accounting Unit of the Allied Financial Agency. Therefore AC/AMG Sub Accountants' reports, etc., will be addressed to AFA.
