TREATMENT OF ITALIAN PRISONERS IN YUGOSLAVIA.

Tito has received the whole Commission.....We have had a long conference especially regarding P.O.W. and he assured us that the Italian P.O.W. may soon return to their homes.....

Our Commission has been very successful. Just think, no one had before seen the P.O.W. Camp! We visited them with absolute freedom! Twice we visited the largest concentration Camp and we stayed and spoke to the prisoners. We also stayed to see a show of theirs. They are well treated. Each day they are given 600 grams of bread, 150 grams of meat and 150 grs. of vegetables. They have meat twice a day. The administration is by a commission of Italian Prisoners; this commission has also the authority to inflict punishments to prisoners who do not obey regulations.
