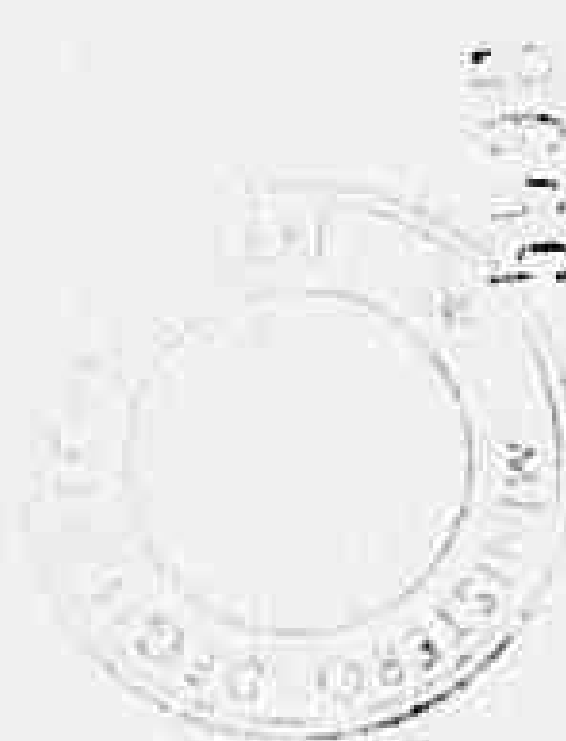

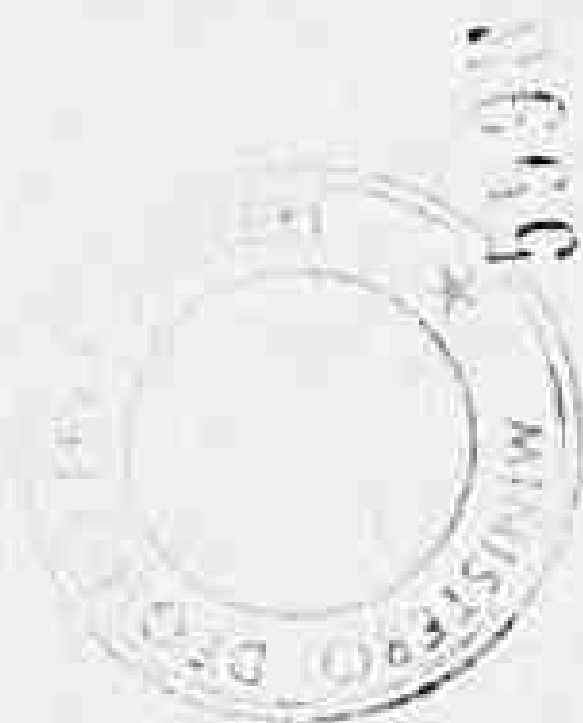

The Yugoslav Representative to the Advisory Council to Italy has forwarded the following letter to this Commission:

"After the occupation of our country the Germans confiscated illegally the silver fox farm "Osopje", the property of Sink Stevo from Skofja Loka. A certain Steiner who was nominated as manager of the farm, sold 50 best foxes to Cornelius Gensini, Rome, Via del Pietro No. 1. This purchase enabled Gensini to establish a farm at L'Aquila Pineta di Roio, Italy. Forut Sink, the son of the a/m Stevo Sink, who was war prisoner in Italy, worked in Gensini's farm. Gensini liberated him from the prisoner camp in order to make him work in the farm owing to the fact that he was familiar with this work.

The farm of Sink Stevo existed before the occupation. The prices of silver foxes in 1939 amounted to 10,000 dinars. As it has been already mentioned, the farm was illegally seized by the Germans, and bying 50 silver foxes Gensini acted in " mala fides " due to the fact that he knew that the foxes derived from our country, that they were the property of a Yugoslav citizen and that the Germans managed the farm illegally.

With regard to the above statement it is proposed that 50 best silver foxes should be restituted from Gensini's farm at L'Aquila Pineta di Roio to the farm of Sink Stevo at Skofja Loka. It would be appreciated if such a decision could be taken."

May this Commission please be advised of the action that you propose to take with regard to the last paragraph.

During the Italian occupation of our country the Italians took illegally the administration and the management of our aluminium factory 'Sibenik-Lozovac Ltd.' The factory was administered by the Italians Dr. Nerdia, engineer, Dr. Fabri Karlo, engineer and engineer Remolli. Just before Italy had capitulated on 5th September 1943, they loaded on the s.s. 'Langano' various goods-inventory supplies and larger quantities of coloured metals (specification herewith enclosed) and delivered all these materials at the following address:

Innocente Maglioni Adriatica, Venice
at Porto Marghera in the vicinity of Venice.

We have not other data available, except the above mentioned. The Italians never gave any certificate for the goods removed by them, nor left any trace in this connection in the files.

The above mentioned factory, as well as the inventory goods were located before the occupation at Sibenik-Lozovac, while the materials, i.e. raw-materials derive from our mines.

The Italians, as it has been already mentioned, administered our factory illegally, thus the removal of the above mentioned goods is to be considered as a typical loot.

It would be appreciated if a decision could be taken concerning the restitution of the removed goods by Italy.

In the course of the occupation of our country by the
Italians they assumed illegally the administration of
our factories of fertilizers "La Dalmatienne" at Šibenik
and Dugi Rat. During the whole occupation they removed
to Italy large quantities of various Yugoslav raw materials
as copper, tin, aluminium, lead, zinc, silver etc.

It is impossible at the present time to collect data on
the quantities of removed materials owing to the fact that
during the period of hostilities the records were destroyed
chiefly by the Italians themselves who endeavoured to leave
no traces of the looting of our property.

We succeeded, however, in finding some shipping schedules
which show that during the occupation supplies were shipped
to various firms in Italy. The list No 1 contains specifications
of materials, their quantities, the names of consignees in
Italy and dates of the shipment of materials as well as
data on the way they were shipped/.

When the Italians became aware that they were defeated,
they removed from the above mentioned factories during the
period April-September 1943 so to say everything that could
be removed.

It should be mentioned that it is impossible to attach to
the items confirmations of their removal, bills of lading
and similar documents as the Italians supplied nobody
with information as to what they were doing in our country.
This should be particularly referred to our property which
was removed by them shortly before Italy capitulated. It

factory at Dugi Rat were removed by ships the names

Before the occupation the above mentioned factories were located at Sibenik and Dugi Rat. Thus, installations and inventory items existed also before the occupation. As to materials, i.e. raw materials, they derive from our mines.

As it has already been mentioned the Italians administered illegally the above factories and managed them according to their wishes. Thus, our property was looted.

It would be appreciated if a decision could be taken regarding the restitution of our property removed by Italy.

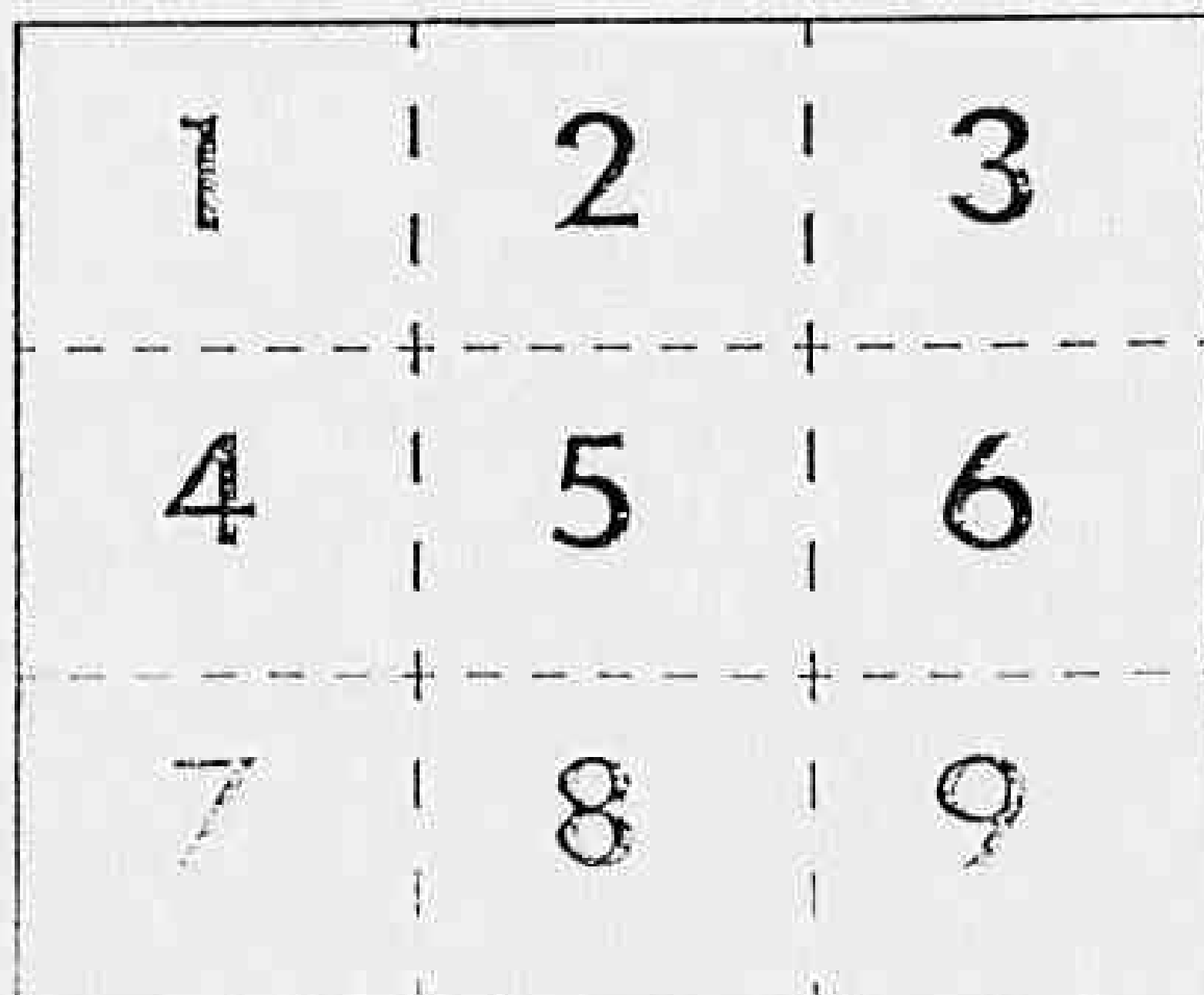
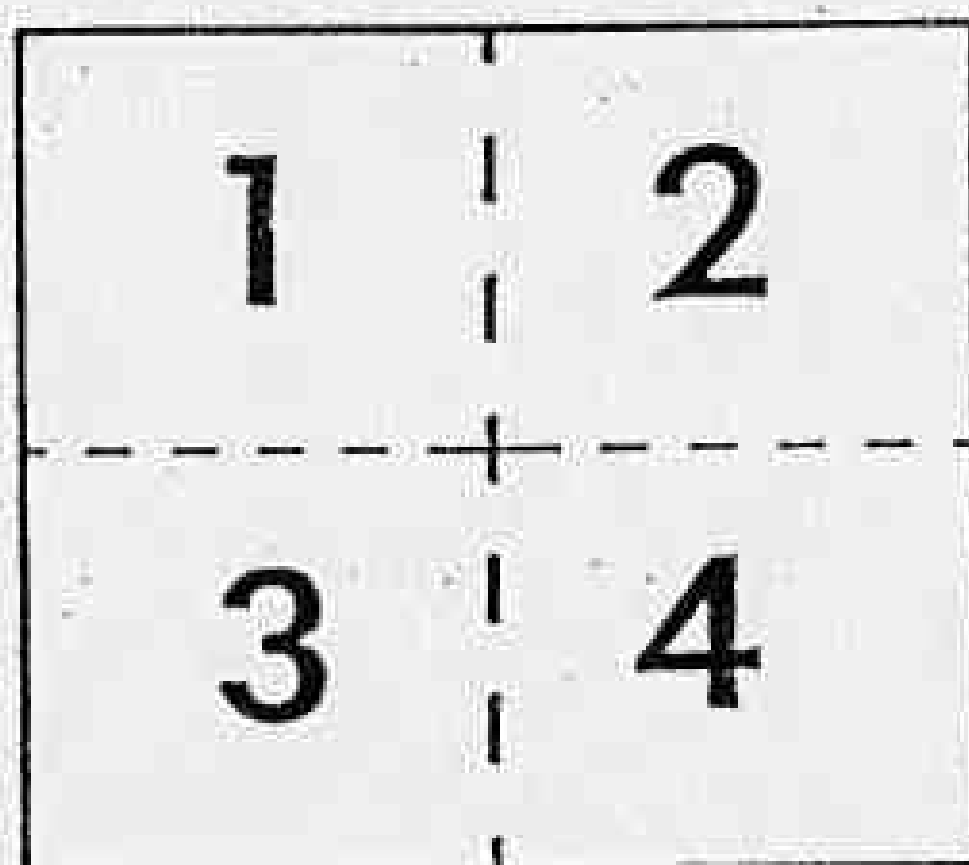
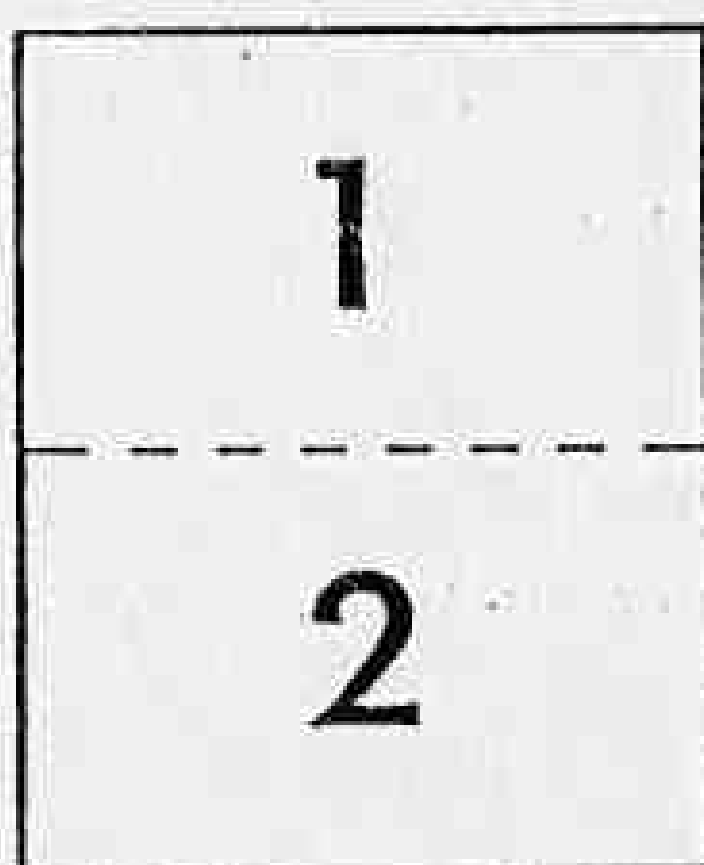

After the occupation of our country the Germans confiscated illegally the silver fox farm "Osojs", the property of Sink Steve from Skofja Loka. A certain Steiner who was nominated as manager of the farm, sold 50 best foxes to Cornelius Ganzini, Rome, via del Pietro He 1. This purchase enabled Ganzini to establish a farm at L'Aquila Pineta di Roio, Italy. Borut Sink, the son of the a/a. Steve Sink, who was war prisoner in Italy, worked in Ganzini's farm. Ganzini liberated him from the prisoner camp in order to make him work in the farm owing to the fact that he was familiar with this work.

The farm of Sink Steve existed before the occupation. The prices of silver foxes in 1937 amounted to 10,000 dinars. As it has been already mentioned, the farm was illegally seized by the Germans, and being 50 silver foxes Ganzini acted in "mala fides" due to the fact that he knew that the foxes derived from our country, that they were the property of a Yugoslav citizen and that the Germans managed the farm illegally.

With regard to the above statement it is proposed that 50 best silver foxes should be restituted from Ganzini's farm at L'Aquila Pineta di Roio to the farm of Sink Steve at Skofja Loka. It would be appreciated if such a decision could be taken.

1. Yugoslavia has refused to accept return of certain vessels from Italy on ground that they have not been reinstated to a condition as good as when they were captured. She bases her claims on Art 15 of Armistice terms.

2. View here is that Art 15 related solely to assembly of ships for use in the United Nation Shipping pool and not to the restoration of vessels to individual nations and that the words "necessary repairs" meant the repairs necessary to enable the ships to be assembled in the original condition of the ship. Contrast the use of the words "in good repair and in seaworthy condition" as used in Art 14.

RESTITUTION OF JUGOSLAV SHIPS.

The view of the British Government is that in point of form Allied Governments are perfectly entitled to claim under Article 15 of the Armistice, see the Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean's I.R.S. Med.46/1352/25/1 dated 26th March, 1946, to S.5 Section Allied Force Headquarters and the Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean's Med.46/1352/25/1 dated 30th April, 1946, to Naval Liaison Officer to SACMED.

2. It is not considered to be within the competence of the Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean, or even the United Kingdom Government, to lay down any arbitrary limits as to the extent of repairs which may be claimed, observing that Yugoslavia is a sovereign and independent state. Moreover, Yugoslavia will receive under the Treaty a certain lump sum from Italy as "reparations", and it is presumed that the cost of repairs to be borne by the Italian Government is covered by this sum.

3. There is a possibility, to which Navy Sub-Commission has drawn attention, that the diversion of a large amount of Italian repair labour and resources to the repair of Yugoslav ships may have an injurious effect on Italian economy. Although, as stated above, it is not considered possible to limit what the Yugoslavs may claim, it is presumably within the competence of the Allied Commission to minimise by control of priorities of materials and labour, etc., the amount of dislocation to Italian economy which may be caused.

More details should be given on the matter, namely, whether the Yugoslav Delegation means to refer to the Yugoslav stocks deposited in connection with the dinar exchange operations in the territories of Dalmatia and Montenegro which were occupied by the Italian forces.

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Under the a/m circumstances it should to be borne in mind that the above stated deposits, which were to be found at the Bank of Italy, Spalato Branch, were handed over to the Croat Bank of State. On the other hand the deposits which were lying at the Cattiane Branch were transferred to Italy and are kept in custody at the Central Office of Rome.

In order to ascertain whether among these latter stocks are comprised those deposited by the Drzavna Hipotekarna Banka, Cattiane Branch, it would be necessary to dispose of a list containing specifications as to the kind of stocks and their serial numbers.

Reference is made to the attached statement ~~made~~ read out by Dr. Smolaka to the A.C.I. meeting of 20 December 1946, and to the Executive Commissioner's memo.

The Navy S/C state:

1. The information given in paragraph 1 tallies with their records.
2. The word "restitution" has been used for months in correspondence dealing with Yugoslav ships, but it has not been used consistently in connection with these ships, or others. It has not been used in direct statements to the effect that "restitution of such and such ship can now be made" etc., but only as a synonym of "return of", "Hand back", or "hand over" in the subjects of letters. Its use originated more than 2 years ago through faulty translation.

The term has also been used by C-in-C Med.

As regards para 2(a) a copy of letter ref. AC/5622/IND dated 30 July is attached (Flag A).

This correspondence arose without the knowledge of this office. It was always understood that the letter ref. AC/5622/IND of 8 Feb. 46 (Flag B) was the last letter on this subject and the contents of this were passed to AMHQ who have in turn embodied the information in their draft reply to Dr. Smolaka (Flag C, item 1).

Dr. Smolaka has again raised this question in his letter 18.2/46 of 21 Dec. 46 (Flag D). I suggest that no action be taken on this letter until we receive a copy of SACMED's letter to the A.C.I. enclosing copies of the Appendix at Flag "C". When this is received we will be in a position to refer to SACMED'S ruling and state that there is nothing further that we can do.

As regards paras 2, b and c, these matter are being actively pursued by this office.
