1. I am directed to inform you that the ration strength of the Italian Army, as defined below, shall be limited to three hundred and forty one thousand one hundred and seventy all ranks. This figure of 341,170 EXCLUDES:-

- (a) CARABINIERI and GUARDIA DI FINANZA in civil employ (as opposed to those in Italian Army formations) whose ration strength on MAINLAND, SICILY and SARDINIA will be provided from time to time by discussion with HQ ALLIED CONTROL COMMISSION
- (b) ITALIAN ARMY required for Anti Aircraft Artillery and any Coast Defence Artillery in SICILY and SARDINIA. Also ITALIAN ARMY required in CORSECA. Both these categories are under review by Allied Force Headquarters who will announce a policy in due course.

2. For your information I am to say that a proposal has been forwarded to AFHQ to extend the authorised ration ceiling to include Security Police (Polizia di Pubblica Sicurezza) and Fire Brigades (Brigade Pompiere). If this is approved it will be necessary for the Minister of Interior to furnish you, for inclusion in periodical strength states, the authorised totals entitled to rations: as agreed from time to time with Public Security Sub Commission, ACC. Further information will follow in due course.

(b) ITALIAN ARMY required for Anti Aircraft Artillery and any Coast Defense Artillery in SICILY and SARDINIA. Also ITALIAN ARMY required in CORSIKA. Both these categories are under review by Allied Force Headquarters who will announce a policy in due course.

2. For your information I am to say that a proposal has been forwarded to AFHQ to extend the authorised ration ceiling to include Security Police (Polizia di Pubblica Sicurezza) and Fire Brigades (Reparti Pompieri). If this is approved it will be necessary for the Minister of Interior to furnish you, for inclusion in periodical strength states, the authorised totals entitled to rations: as agreed from time to time with Public Security Sub Commission, ACC. Further information will follow in due course.

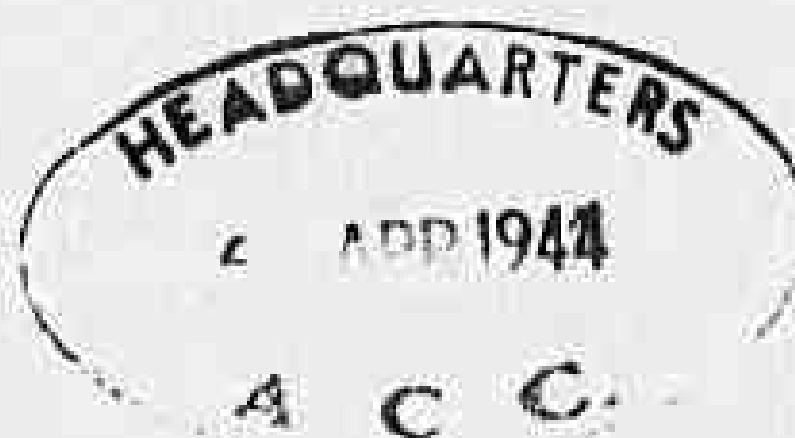

1. The number of Italian Troops who will be effectively employed under present plans, and therefore require to be supplied, is estimated at 500,000.

- (a) A summary of the principal categories is at Appendix "A"
- (b) The proposed dispositions of combat and internal security formations are given at Appendix "B". Those are on the lines indicated in your P/109 of 3 Oct and AG C91-411-1 Italian GCI-AGM of 10 Feb, and the total number of troops involved is approximately the same.

It should be made clear to the Italian authorities that the internal security formations may be required to guard Allied installations, or for other similar duties.

- (c) A list of the Italian Service troops employed and to be employed by the Allies is at Appendix "C". This shows how they are at present allotted, but this allocation is frequently varied to meet changes in the tasks and composition of the various Allied Formations. Those shown as unallotted are units not yet formed or not yet arrived from SARDINIA.

- (d) The Italian Central Organisation, Static Formations and Services shown in Appendix "D" are being examined in detail but it is not anticipated that any reductions found practicable will appreciably affect the grand total.

- (e) The Fire Brigades have been included, since they are uniformed bodies whose maintenance and efficiency is essential to the Allies.

- (f) The Italian Navy total of 75,000 is being examined and it is hoped to reduce it eventually to about 50,000.

- (g) No figure has been included for 44 Units now for CD Units in SICILY and SARDINIA. These are employed under AFHQ and it is not known how many it is proposed to retain. Troops employed in CORSICA have been excluded for the same reason.

It should be made clear to the Italian authorities that the internal security formations may be required to guard Allied installations, or for other similar duties.

(c) A list of the Italian Service troops employed and to be employed by the Allies is at Appendix "C". This shows how they are at present allotted, but this allocation is frequently varied to meet changes in the tasks and composition of the various Allied Formations. Those shown as unallotted are units not yet formed or not yet arrived from SARDINIA.

(d) The Italian Central Organisation, Static Formations and Services shown in Appendix "D" are being examined in detail but it is not anticipated that any reductions found practicable will appreciably affect the grand total.

(e) The Fire Brigades have been included, since they are uniformed bodies whose maintenance and efficiency is essential to the Allies.

(f) The Italian Navy total of 75,000 is being examined and it is hoped to reduce it eventually to about 50,000.

(g) No figure has been included for M. Units nor for CD Units in SICILY and SARDINIA. These are employed under AFHQ and it is not known how many it is proposed to retain. Troops employed in CORSICA have been excluded for the same reason.

2. Action is in hand to redistribute troops in accordance with Appendix "B" and to form the remaining units required by Appendix "C". The principal cause of delay is movement from SARDINIA.

3. It is recommended that the Army Sub-Commission (MILA) of AGC should be the authority for handling problems of requirements, issues and record keeping. 1. The following policy regarding the Italian Army and its resources is announced. So much of P/109 of 3 October, letter this headquarters, file AG 400.93-1 GCT-AGM, subject "Italian Equipment", dated 2 December 1943, and any other instructions as are in conflict herewith, are rescinded. The Deputy President, Allied Control Commission, in collaboration with Commander-in-Chief, Allied Central Mediterranean Force, will issue the detailed instructions necessary to implement this policy.

2. The Italians will assemble the following units:

a. The division to be organized and placed in combat as soon as practicable.

b. Two additional Divisions which are to be trained, armed and equipped for combat at a later date, depending on our requirements and the general supply situation. Pending our decision to place them in combat, they will be at the disposal of the Italian Government, who will locate them as directed by C-in-C, Allied Central Mediterranean Force to meet the needs of internal security (e.g., CALABRIA).

c. The DAPINO Brigade and NEMBO Division will be included in one or the other of the divisions referred to in (a) or (b) above.

d. A total ration strength of 32,000 for these three divisions has already been agreed between Allied Central Mediterranean Force and Marshal MESSE.

3. The Italian division now in SICILY (SABAUDA Division) will remain intact and be equipped from Italian resources on a scale commensurate with its mission of internal security.

4. In order to meet the requirements of paragraphs 2 and 3 above, the Italians may call forward the necessary uniforms and equipment from SARDINIA. Priorities of shipping bids will be established by Allied Central Mediterranean Force in the normal manner.

5. Captured Italian military resources in SICILY have been allocated to the OSS/SOE and will not be available to the Italians except as declared excess by the OSS/SOE.

6. Italian military resources on the mainland will be reserved for use by Italian troops and released to the Italians forthwith. The Italians will inventory and keep the Allied Control Commission and Allied Central Mediterranean Force fully informed of the status of their resources.

7. a. For administrative details governing rations and clothing for the Italian Armed Forces see Administrative Memo No 2, this headquarters, dated 10 January 1944, and letter to Headquarters Allied Control Commission dated 9 January 1944, subject, "Supply Organization - Italian Military", file AG 400-1 (Italy) GDS-AGM.

b. The total number of personnel to be maintained under the procedure referred to in sub-paragraph (a) will not exceed the ceiling of 500,000 including Army, Navy, Air and Carabinieri. The figure of 500,000 is a maximum and in view of the increasing demands upon Allied resources every effort will be made to effect progressive reductions of the total.

c. The Italian combat divisions will, insofar as possible, be equipped from Italian resources. Essential items which cannot be supplied from these sources should be reported to this headquarters with a view to securing the approval of the Combined Chiefs of Staff for issue.

8. As a matter of general policy it is impractical at this time to release any Italian Prisoners of War, either officers or men, now held in service units in North Africa. The release of a limited number of non-specialist officers will be made, at the discretion of this headquarters, upon request. Requests may be made for any officer prisoners in the United States.

9. Subject to the above, the labor requirements of CORSICA, and the defense requirements of SARDINIA, the remainder of the Italian forces are at the disposal of Allied Central Mediterranean Force, which, in conjunction with the Allied Control Commission, will be responsible for the assignment of elements of the Italian Army as required by its subordinate commands and separate commands, including Air and Naval, in the mainland of ITALY as well as in SICILY and SARDINIA.

10. The Military Mission with the Italian Army (MMIA) becomes the Land Forces Sub-Commission of the Allied Control Commission. The Land Forces Sub-Commission of the Allied Control Commission is designated as the agency for receiving and implementing, in accordance with the terms of this

1. Reference your letter of 29 Jan 44 and conversation at Naples (Brigadier LUSH - Brigadier DUNLOP speaking), we have discussed this matter with Colonel SIMMONS, U.S. Army Liaison Officer here from Military Division, A.C.C. We are in entire agreement with your wish to reduce arrivals at the Port of Naples.
2. At the same time we have in the island between 8,000 and 10,000 Italian soldiers of the time expired classes whose homes are in the South of Italy under Allied control. It appears, for all reasons, desirable that these men should be able to return to their homes in order to work on the land and carry out their ordinary trades. For that purpose we are telegraphing you today to ask whether it would be possible to land these men at Brindisi or Taranto.
3. In any case we shall do our utmost to give you earliest possible advice of any proposed sailings.

By "disbanded" is meant illegally discharged and thus still liable for service. This information is required as the policy of use of such troops is now under consideration by Allied Force Headquarters. It will be appreciated if the information can be supplied under 2 headings:-

- a. Total number in Sicily.
- b. Total number employed by Allied Forces.

As these men are indistinguishable from civilians, it is hoped that at least an approximate estimate can be furnished through Allied Military Government channels.

1. Reference your HPSO14/1 dated 18 Jan 44 referring to a communication received from the SCAPO CATANIA on the employment of PW in a Special Police Force.
2. You seem to have been under a misapprehension as to the scope and object of this organization.
3. It is pointed out that the employment of specially selected Italian military personnel at present held as Prisoners of War, is strictly confined to auxiliaries to the British Military Police. In this sphere they have already proved their usefulness.
4. Intention is that these men shall be employed in conjunction with the Corps of British Military Police, whom they will be required to assist in dealing with the military and civil population. Their duties may include the arrest of criminals, the protection of property and control of civilian and military motor traffic, all of which may normally fall to the lot of Military Police.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE COMMANDING GENERAL:

Subject: Italian Army in Germany.

Reference confidential memorandum to the Commanding General S.G.S.B.I. this Headquarters dated 31 January 1944. The following additional information is available.

1. The further increase of Italian units in Germany and Naples is shown in the attached Strength Report (Annex 1).
2. The Ulli Group (last authorized group) is in further process of re-organization in S. Agata del Goti region. (Annex 2)
3. General Basso has organized his command along more definite lines (Annex 3). Consequently the functioning of his command is gradually gaining in efficiency. The organization of his staff remains the same (memorandum to the Commanding General S.G.S.B.I. this Headquarters dated 16 December 1943). There are however changes in personnel (Annex 4).
4. The demobilization of some classes has been started. The 1906 class is being totally demobilized. The classes 1907, 08, 09, 10, 11 and 12 are being sent home on unlimited leave.
5. Plans are being made to call up the 1913 and younger classes.
6. The Italian Command started by demobilizing inhabitants of Allied-occupied Italy, giving first priority to farmers and those whose families are at present living in the liberated provinces.
7. It is difficult to evaluate the effects of the demobilization of the older classes and planned mobilization of younger classes. It may, however, be assumed that the release from military duty of the older classes, homesick and disgusted with their army life after four or more years with a continually defeated army, will have a salutary effect on the morale of the Armed forces. On the other hand, the planned mobilization of younger classes may give rise to new difficulties on account of the political and social trends prevailing among the majority of the people, including the prospective draftsmen, which

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conflict with the hierarchical character of the present army.

8. General Basso is increasingly concerned about his difficulties in establishing a smooth and businesslike relation with Allied authorities. The increasing number of such authorities, and the often conflicting interpretations of Allied instructions concerning the Italian Army, leave him puzzled and unable, as he explains to his collaborators, to fulfill his mission. He has to maintain contact with and conform to requests from 5 Army, 2nd S. Hq, 57 Area, 94 Sub Area and lately with the Military Mission to the Italian Army. General Basso's aim is to satisfy all the Allied requests, but at present he feels that while dealing with so many Allied agencies and conflicting requests, no plan guaranteeing continuity can be established. He also feels that the chances for building up combat units (his prime ambition) are greatly handicapped by the breaking up of larger units into small guard and labor detachments, even if destined for the nucleus of the Italian combat group. Such is General Basso's frame of mind, according to information obtained by this Section from reliable sources. His problems, understandable enough under the circumstances, add to the confusion in the Italian Army and represent an additional factor adversely affecting its morale.

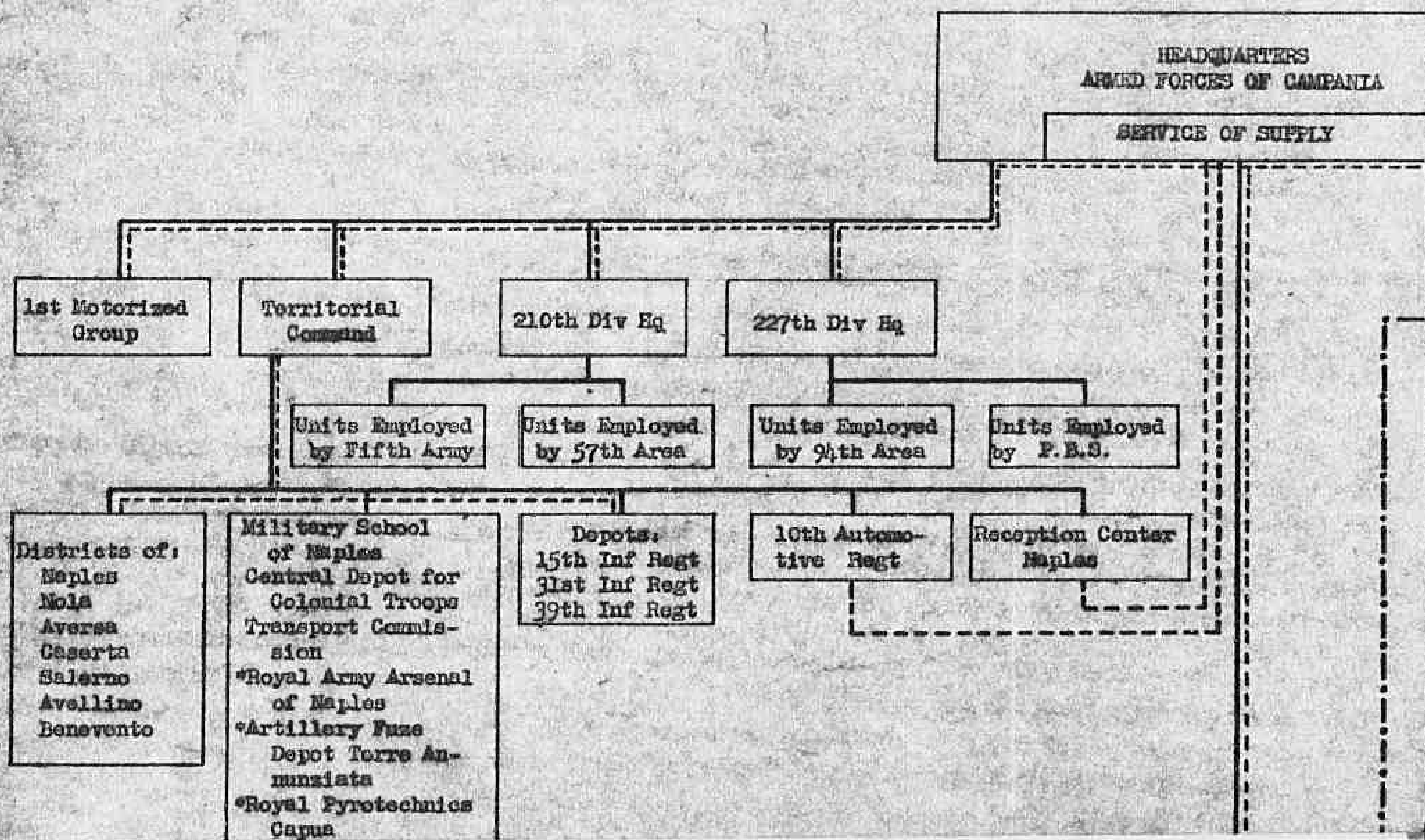

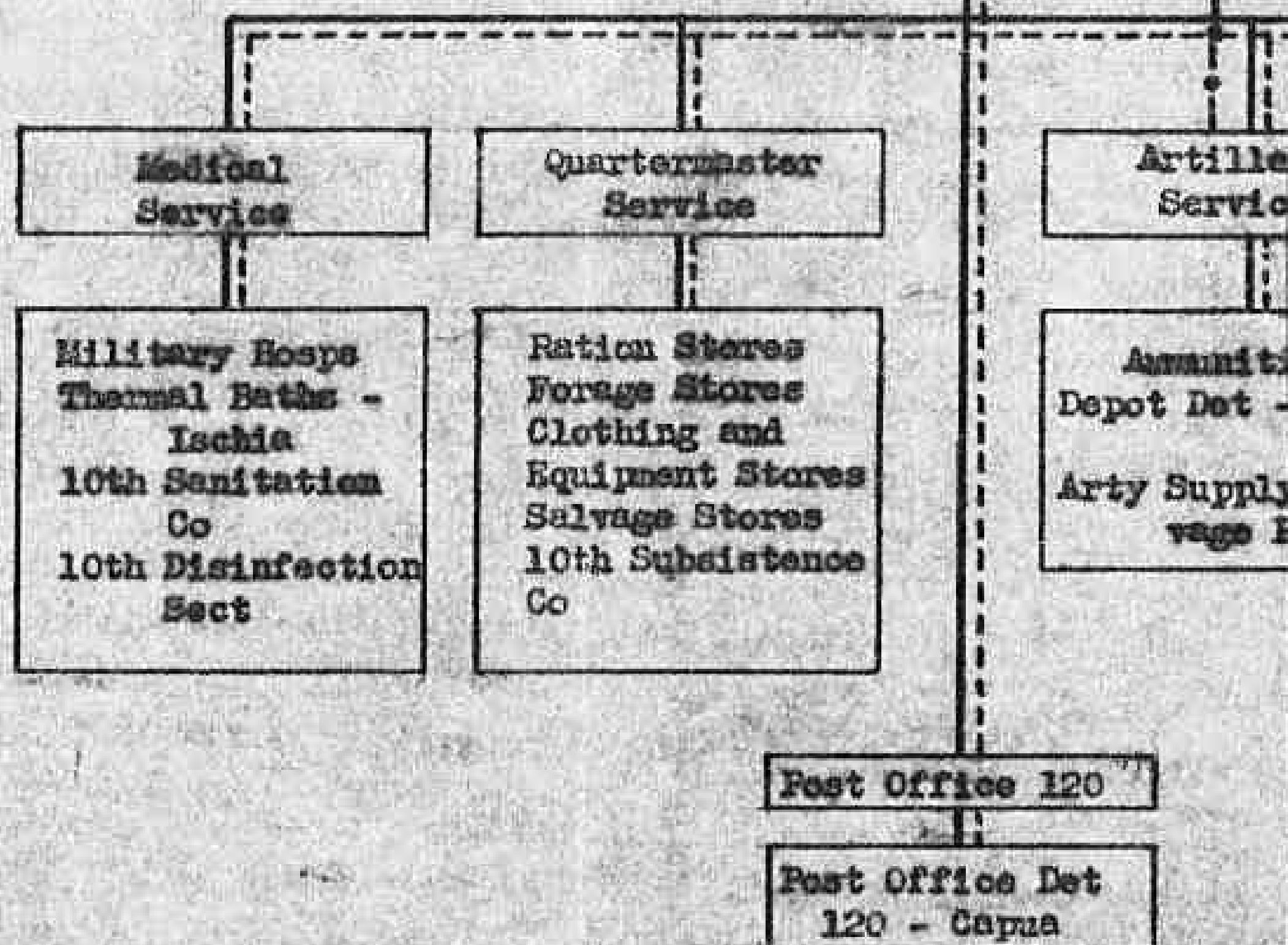

HQ Allied Central Mediterranean Force have given authority to increase the number of CONGEDATI permitted to return per month to their homes in each FOGGIA and NAPLES Provinces to three hundred. This triples the number authorised in our I/101 of 16 Dec 43, sent to all addressees above.

2. The procedure regarding entry to the two Provinces remains the same. ITALIAN demobilising authorities must apply to the S.C.A.O. (Senior Civil Affairs Officer) A.M.C. of the Province concerned for permission for entry of the CONGEDATI domiciled therein. Such applications must be made before demobilisation, and quote authority "HQ A.C.M.F. letter 8653/7/BCS of 29 Jan 44".

3. Leave for ITALIAN Military personnel into FOGGIA Province is still inadmissible.
