LEAVE PASSES

Read

With reference to Air Ministry letter 143 dated 25th August 1944 on the above subject.

2. A signal was dispatched to HQ 5th & 8th Armies and a reply has now been received from 5th Army stating it is Sub Commission may countersign passes for personnel on indefinite leave and discharged to proceed into 5th Army Area up to line of 50 NORTHING. No one however is to be allowed into the Arn Valley or to Livorno & Florence.

3. No reply has been received from 8th Army.

4. The R/C & M/G Section of HQ ACC contend that once the personnel of the I.A.P. are discharged they are civilians and as such all movement should be controlled by that Section, and further that the Civil Affairs Branch and the Refugee & Displaced Persons Sub Commission are also interested.

5. This contention commends itself to this Sub Commission as a much more satisfactory method of dealing with this problem, because although 5th & 8th Army may give the consent to such movement, it should be remembered, the Civil Administration of ACC or ACC for the area into which personnel are being discharged are responsible for feeding, housing, etc; of such personnel and have the right to refuse to accept any further civilians into any particular area.

SUBJECT: Unauthorized Wearing of Italian Uniform by Italians.

TO : See Distribution.

1. The memorandum below in paragraph 3 has been sent to the Italian Minister of War. There is reason to believe that there still exist large numbers of Italian officers and soldiers who, though not officially a part of the Italian Army, continue to wear the uniform and to act as though they were in fact officers and soldiers. In some cases they may organize themselves into groups and attach themselves to allied units and perform some service in order to obtain the privileges normally accruing to bona fide Italian soldiers. Cases have been reported where funds have been advanced to Italian officers who were not known to the Italian War Ministry and not members of the Italian Army.

2. It is the responsibility of allied commanders of all grades to assure themselves that Italian officers and soldiers who may be with allied units are in fact bona fide members of the Italian Army. Any who may be found illegally wearing the uniform or in any way acting illegally as bona fide soldiers should immediately be reported to the nearest authorized Italian commander.

3.a. It is desired that all members of the active Italian Army as recognized by the Allies and carried on the rolls of the Italian Army be required to wear the proper uniform at all times, and be required to carry the proper identification cards. This, of course, does not include security and special personnel who normally work in civilian clothing.

b. From reports received it is apparent that many people who are in fact civilians as far as the present army is concerned are wearing the uniform of the Italian Army. It should be made plain to all concerned that former officers and men of the Italian Army are not permitted to wear the uniform. This applies to all people who are not now carried on the rolls of the Active Army. Army identification cards should not be issued to such people.

SUBJECT : Italian Army - Viterbo.

TO : Army Sub-Commission.

1. It has been brought to our attention by Region IV that an unofficial Military District exists at Viterbo. This HQ. was apparently set up with the approval of the then Provincial Commissioner to deal with the many soldiers (including Patriots) who could not be moved south owing to the "Standstill" order which was enforced north of Rome.
2. At the time it was made quite clear that the establishment had no official standing until the "District" was unofficially set up again. The person in Command "unofficially" would appear to be a Colonelle TABELL.
3. This officer did much useful work in handling patriots, collecting Military Equipment etc. Payment from Military Funds available locally was authorised by the Provincial Commissioner to Regular Officers and NCO's and was done with full agreement of the Regional Commissioner as from June 1.
4. We shall be obliged if you will go into the matter with Italian Military Authorities and get the position regularised.

1. There are some 7,000 Italian troops of the Garibaldi Division in the Balkans, 5,000 of which are operating under Marshal Tito and the remaining 2,000 have dispersed into the countryside as individuals with Partisan Peasants.
2. A recent report received from HQ SO(M) states that these Italians are worried about not being able to communicate with their relatives.
3. Subject to agreement by Marshal Tito, it is suggested that a simple means of communication with their families in Italy could be arranged in the form of a simple letter card, giving only essential family information.
4. Please take up the question of the provision of these cards with the Italian authorities.
5. Meanwhile, representations are being made to Marshal Tito for his approval to the scheme,

TO : Hq Allied Control Commission, RC and MG Section

1. May the appropriate Sub-Commission be instructed to force action in the matter of the Italian Military at Viterbo.

2. The position is that an unofficial Military District exists. This was set up with the approval of the undersigned who was then Provincial Commissioner.

This was done to deal with the many soldiers in the area who could not be moved south owing to the "standstill" order which was enforced North of Rome.

3. At the time it was made quite clear that the establishment had no official standing until the "District" was officially set up again. Repeated requests for action were made to HQ Region IV (prior to 31 July) for action and also to the Italian authorities by Colonel Taibell who holds the unofficial command.

4. This office did much useful work in handling Patriots collecting Military equipment, etc.

5. Payment from Military Funds available locally was authorised by the Provincial Commissioner to Regular Officers and NCOs. This was done with full agreement of the Regional Commissioner as from June 1.

6. The whole position is, however, irregular.

SUBJECT: Italian Army

TO : Distribution Below

1. Under the Short Armistice Terms the Commander-in-Chief has the full right to impose measures of disarmament, demobilization and demilitarization on the Italian armed forces. The re-organization of the Italian Army under these terms is under the control of the Army Sub-Commission (ASIA) acting under direct orders of the Commander-in-Chief.

2. The strength of the Italian Army has, since the Armistice, been fixed at a certain reduced figure which the Italian Ministry of War will not exceed, and all members of the Italian Army who may be found on the progress of the Allies Northwards are therefore being treated as either demobilized but entitled to volunteer again for service if the ceiling permits, or demobilized but liable to conscription in areas where the conscription law is in force.

3. Arrangements have been made by S.M.I.A. for representatives of the Ministry of War and the General Staff to be attached to Armies and to enter newly liberated Regions for the following purposes:

- a. To locate, inventory, and arrange for the safeguarding of Italian Army property and records. Civilian guards, except members of the Carabinieri or G.C. P.F. are to be employed for safeguarding military installations, as necessary. No Italian Army personnel will be stationed at such installations.
- b. To screen members of the Italian Army who volunteer for service and to return such personnel to recognized enlistment centers through refugee channels.

4. It is NOT the policy of the ALLIES to open up any military headquarters, depots, district headquarters, or other Italian Army installations in newly liberated areas on the basis of the pre-war layout. Such installations will only be authorized on a basis of military necessity, depending on the distribution of the Italian Army.

5. Certain units of the Italian Army are operating under Allied Command in the newly liberated areas. The Italian parties specified in para. 3 above are attached to these units, and operate under Allied Command. S.M.I.A. has liaison officers with 5 and 8 Armies and Polcorps.

Members of the Italian Army met on our progress Northwards must therefore be informed that they are treated as demobilized and therefore as civilians, but are entitled to volunteer for service in accordance with para 2 hereof. Such members must NOT be dealt with as soldiers and must not be allowed to set up or render any military installations of any nature in liberated territory.

7. The above excludes the question of Patriots, for dealing with whom a special and comprehensive policy has already been issued.

1. With reference to Brig. Lush's letter (Ref.6/202/CA) of 11th July, 1944, I have to report as follows:

An organisation known as "Armata Rossa" had early in June, 1944, an office at Corso Rinascimento and another at Largo Benedetto Marcello in Rome. The head of these offices was a person named Poca Antonino. Outside these places red flags were hung and placards posted inviting recruits for the Italian Red Army. Notices were also found in various shop windows, the owners of which said they had been coerced into exhibiting these notices by "Reds".

The situation was developing very fast when undesirable characters and others posing as communist patriots were committing many irregularities. It was felt desirable in the interests of the public order to stamp these acts out and firstly to eliminate the source of the so-called "Armata Rossa". Legal advice was sought as we were not aware if any authority had been given the authors of the movement to function.

It was decided on legal advice that the offices etc. should be closed and the persons responsible for the organisation prosecuted and this was done.

The above named Poca and two others were arrested and brought before the Allied Military Court for violation of Proc.1 Art.5, Section 34 and 45, and on 30th June 1944, Poca (who had been bailed in the sum of Lire 25,000) was sentenced to 3 months imprisonment - sentence suspended.

His two colleagues were not tried and their cases suspended by Court order sine die.

This prosecution completely suppressed the Armata Rossa operations in Rome, and no further activity anywhere in the Rome Governatorato Area has been reported.
