OPERATIONAL SITUATION AND PLANS

1. A statement regarding the present operational position and possibilities as to the future course of operations was made by CGS. He emphasised the need for the most strict security, and said that the information given out by him was intended for those present only and was not to be discussed with others.

MAINTENANCE AND ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

2. CAO dealt with these matters in two parts:-
 - (1) Up to the capture of the RIMINI - PISA line.
 - (2) After its capture.

UP TO RIMINI - PISA LINE

4522

3. System of Maintenance

- (a) Polish Corps will remain based on ORTONA till ANCONA is available. Its administrative, technical and logistic support will remain limited as at present. ORTONA - ANCONA railway and pipeline will not be repaired or laid.
- (b) Eighth Army's most condensed is being stocked now in the S. GEMINI - TERNI - MARMI Area. Its next PH will be opened North of ROME about 7 July. A new road head will be established well forward as soon as the position permits, probably in the ATEZZO Area. Distance from the position permits, probably in the ATEZZO Area. Attack on the RIMINI - PISA line could not be quickly completed. For this reason, about 100 t.p.d. supply through a forward West Coast port is required.

- (c) Fifth Army is now maintained through CIVITAVECCHIA, with a discharge of over 1,600 t.p.d. Its subsequent maintenance as it advances will be through PIOMBINO and possibly LEGHORN.

PORTS

4. (a) ANCONA. The early development of this port to maximum capacity is of the highest importance, particularly for the maintenance of forces in Northern ITALY. Initial target capacity of

3,000 t.p.d. rising to 6,000 t.p.d. eventually was agreed, subject to FOTALLI's view that the latter figure might prove high.

(b) PIOMBINO. Fifth Army hopes this port will be developed quickly to 5,000 t.p.d.

(c) FOLLIGNO. FOMIT stated that, in view of other commitments, the Navy cannot accept use of this port. An extension of PIOMBINO for Eighth Army would be acceptable. CAO will take up with Fifth Army.

(d) LEGHORN. An initial target of 5,000 t.p.d., rising to a final capacity of 10,000 t.p.d. was agreed.

An early decision as to its opening and use to support Fifth Army's attack on the PRIMI - PISA line will be made. CAO will discuss with Fifth Army and PES. Provision for a possible British requirement of about 800 t.p.d. will be made. A British Decks Operating Coy will be available.

(e) CIVITAVECCHIA. Apart from bulk petrol, will be used principally as the port for ROME, including civil supplies, after PIOMBINO is in operation.

(f) ANZIO. Will be closed as soon as stocks can be cleared. Rail will be through to ROME on 1 July.

5. ARMY REAR BOUNDARIES.

Eighth Army rear boundary will be moved forward North of ROME and South of its next rail head area as soon as established.

Fifth Army rear boundary, now South of CIVITAVECCHIA, will be moved forward to new lines as agreed between Fifth Army and PES and approved by AAI.

BULK PETROL.

6. Tankage for 2,000 tons will be ready at CIVITAVECCHIA between 2 and 7 July. Pipeline development North of ROME and allocation to Armies will be discussed by CAO with Armies and Pot Soc.

COAL - ROME.

4521

An early decision as to its opening and use to support Fifth Army's attack on the PIAPI - PISA line will be made. CAO will discuss with Fifth Army and PBS. Provision for a possible British requirement of about 800 tons will be made. British Docks Operating Coy will be available.

(o) CIVITAVECCHIA. Apart from bulk petrol, will be used principally as the port for ROME, including civil supplies, after PIOMBINO is in operation.

(f) ANZIO. Will be closed as soon as stocks can be cleared. Rail will be through to ROME on 1 July.

5. ARMY REAR BOUNDARIES.

Eighth Army rear boundary will be moved forward North of ROME and South of its next rail head area as soon as established.

Fifth Army rear boundary, now South of CIVITAVECCHIA, will be moved forward to new lines as agreed between Fifth Army and PBS and approved by AAI.

BULK PETROL.

Tankage for 2,000 tons will be ready at CIVITAVECCHIA between 2 and 7 July. Pipe-line development North of ROME and allocation to Armies will be discussed by CAO with Armies and Pet Soc.

COAL - ROME.

7. DCAO reported that the position is now satisfactory.

NO.1 DISTRICT.

8. (a) Rocco and HQ Location. Adv Ech will be complete in ITALY on 22 Ju. Arrangements for a liaison officer to be attached to HQ, Eighth Army, will be made with Eighth Army.

GOC, 1 District, will notify AAI his recommendation for location of his HQ.

(b) Boundary. RIETI province will be included in No.1 District. A change of No.1 District Southern boundary with 2 District to conform with the provincial boundary was suggested. GOC, 1 District, will consider this in conjunction with 2 District, and submit any proposals he may have.

(c) "B" Area. Will enter ANCONA as soon as possible after capture.

(a) 71 Sub Area. Is available now. It is at call by No.1 District to take over the TERNI - RIETI Area as soon as Eighth Army rear boundary moves North of these places.

- (d) Integration It was agreed that a Sub-Area or, with some discretion, Garrison HQ(HQ) will be required for FLORENCE. It will take over early and be placed temporarily under command until a way for that purpose. The employment of HQ 71 Garrison will be considered by LAL.
- (e) Sub-Area This Sub-Area now under No.2 District is at call by HQ 1 District. Its future role will be examined by 1 District in the light of the general necessity to employ static HQ in the most economical manner.
- (f) 21 Beach Group Will be available on release from ANZIO for controlling British stores in PICTURES Area and later LECHORN.

TOWN PLANS.

9. DIO will ensure that sufficient town plans are available to meet the requirements of 1 District.

ROME ADMINISTRATION.

10. Approval has now been given for the administration of ROME to be vested in one integrated HQ (US and B-) under General Johnson, the present Commander ROME Area. It will be directly under LAL.

NORTH OF ROME - PISA LINE.

11. C25 suggested that any discussion as to what would happen when the PISA - ROME line has been crossed assumes a decision which has not yet been given. The Command is anxious that this decision should not be prejudged.

CAC said that this was fully understood by him. He felt it to be necessary that administration staff should study the possibilities now, but no action could follow until this decision has been reached.

TOWN HAZARDS.

9. SAC will ensure that sufficient team resources are available to meet the requirements of a District.

ROME ADMINISTRATION.

10. Approval has now been given for the administration of ROME to be vested in one integrated HQ (US and IS) under General Johnson, the present Commander ROME Area. It will be directly under AAI.

NORTH OF ROME - ROMA LITE.

11. OSS suggested that any discussion as to what would happen when the PISA - ROME line had been crossed required a decision which has not yet been given. The Command is most anxious that this decision should not be prejudicial.

CIC said that this was fully understood by him. He felt it to be necessary that administration staff should study the possibilities now, but no action could follow until this decision has been reached.

TONNAGE REQUIREMENTS.

12. Initial requirements are estimated at:-

Armies 4,000 t.p.d. each
Air Force 3,300 "
Civil Supplies 2,000 "

Portuguese will say to about double these figures (particularly for civil supplies) on the basis of the completed and progress. The above is given as a guide to the scale of port requirements which will be required.

A forecast discussion of the above between ports is impracticable until future plans are clear.

N.E. PORTS.

13. There are no large ports North of ANCONA till VENICE, TRIESTE or FIUME become available. Forces operating in N.E. ITALY must, therefore, be based on ANCONA. Owing to the distance from the latter, the small port of RAVENNA is important.

N.W. PORTS.

14. LERFORN will be required for the maintenance of forces operating in the centre of Northern ITALY. SPEZIA will be a naval port. It may also be used for bulk petrol.

The maintenance of any substantial forces in N.W. ITALY will demand the use of GENOA. It will be required eventually for the import of civil

supplies, tonnage for which will be very heavy on the occupation of NORTHERN ITALY.

It will be not available from LIGNON into the POLARIS, GINCA must be used in winter, as the roads N.E. from LIGNON are liable to snow blocks.

NAPLES AND HELL PORTS.

15. (a) An early reduction in commitments and the closing of some ports is essential. The question of NAPLES will be examined by PBS.

BARLETTA will be closed when ANCONA is available.

BAR must remain open for Air Force supplies and TARANTO as a naval port and for personnel.

BRINDISI will be handed over to Italian administration as soon as possible.

- (b) Vehicle assembly units will be moved early to forward ports.

SICILY.

16. A Garrison HQ can be released now. A further reduction in commitments will soon follow, but an Administrative HQ will be required as long as substantial stocks of military stores remain in the island.

ADMINISTRATIVE LAYOUT NORTHERN ITALY.

17. A District HQ will be required in Northern ITALY. Its boundaries will be decided later. No.2 District will be moved. No.3 District will take over its present territory. Some change in No.1 District boundaries may be necessary. Either No.1 or No.2 District will cover the main group of British controlled ports.

RAILWAY DEVELOPMENT.

BARLETTA will be closed when ANCONA is available.

BARLETTA must remain open for Air Force supplies and MARANO as a naval port and for personnel.

BRINDISI will be handed over to Italian administration as soon as possible.

(b) Vehicle assembly units will be moved early to forward ports.

SICILY.

16. A Garrison HQ can be released now. A further reduction in commitments will soon follow, but an Administrative HQ will be required as long as substantial stocks of military stores remain in the island.

ADMINISTRATIVE ZONE - NORTHERN ITALY.

17. A District HQ will be required in Northern ITALY. Its boundaries will be decided later. No. 2 District will be moved. No. 3 District will take over its present territory. Some change in No. 1 District boundaries may be necessary. Either No. 1 or No. 2 District will cover the main group of British controlled ports.

RAILWAY DEVELOPMENT.

18. (a) Development of the railway N.W. from ANCONA will be of the highest importance.
(b) The line ORTE - FLORENCE is badly damaged. Estimate of period to repair the section ORTE - CHIUSI is six weeks, assuming no further demolitions.
(c) Lines from LEGHORN and later GENOA into the Po Valley will be required.
(d) DCMS was requested to study the question and report to the CAO.

ADV BASE INSTALLATIONS (BRITISH).

19. (a) Present policy is not to develop an advance base till forward ports are available and future plans are clear. Forward holdings South of such ports will not be undertaken.
(b) There will be no change in the control of base ports and installations until after the capture of the LIGURE - PISA Line. They will then be taken over by AFHQ.

MESSAGE FROM COM-10.

20. (X) expressed, on behalf of the Commander-in-Chief, his high appreciation of the very valuable work done by commandants present, or represented, and their staffs and services before and during the present offensive. It had contributed notably to its success.

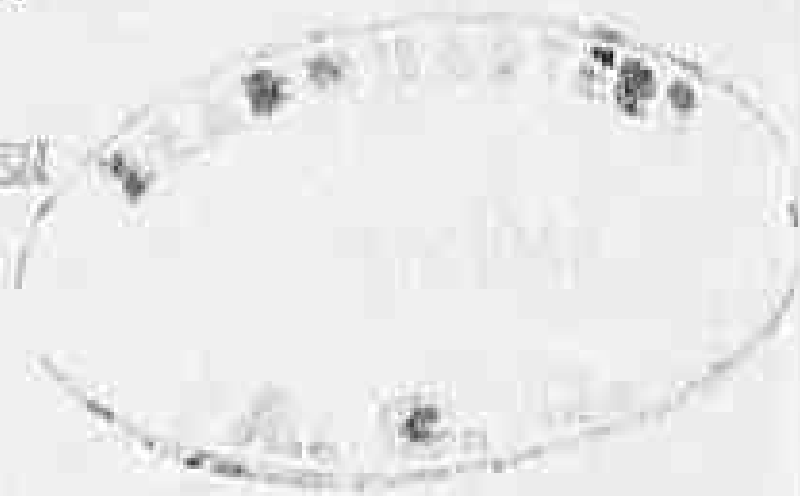

Reference is called to your letter of 15 May ACC/OIC/OT and to letter 16 May 14/74/CA, re Maj. A.C. Newell (A).

1. Maj. A.C. Newell, recently (April 25) reassigned to Region V, has not been definitely posted to this region as property control officer. Maj. Newell was originally assigned as a CAC to Region V, and was so used in Region II. Now on his return to Region V, which has very little property control work, his assignment to a definite duty becomes important.

2. It is my belief that Maj. Newell is well prepared and fully competent to handle all property control matters that may arise within this Region. Maj. Newell has stated that he would like an assignment carrying some work to do and if property control in this Region offers prospect of some definite work he would like such an assignment.

3. However, with the present shortage of officers, Maj. Newell's experience as a CAC would indicate that he should be employed in this role until such time as property control work requires the use of an officer exclusively on this work. If it is the intention to hold an officer available or in readiness for this work, it is recommended that Maj. Newell be transferred from the group of CAC officers assigned to Region V and held in reserve with ACC on call for property control work, should such develop in this Region. Or he may be held in reserve in Chiata Province, with the duty of acting as Regional Property Control Officer, while at the same time giving assistance to the Provincial Commissioner there.

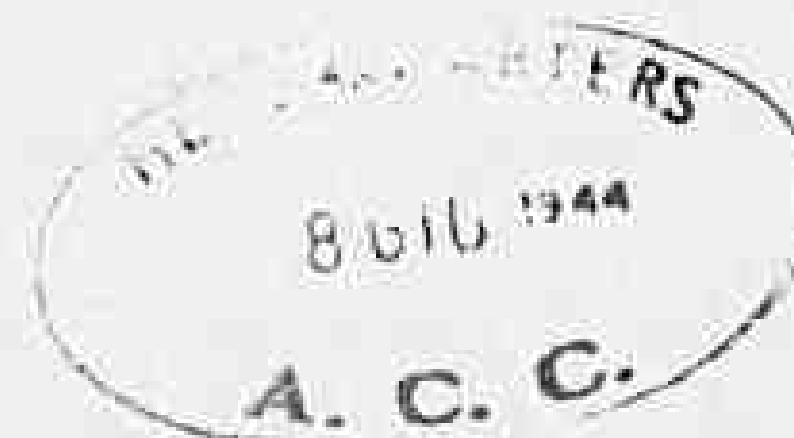

TO: (For Distribution)

It has been brought to the notice of the Chief Commissioner by the Italian Government that at a meeting held at Palermo on May 15-16, representatives of the Allied Control Commission encouraged physicians of Italy to move a resolution that a Ministry of Health be set up without delay.

While it is true that Major Simpson, in his remarks explained to the press that the meeting was called to discuss the proposal of setting up a Ministry of Health within the Italian Government to embrace all Italy, the order of the day was not prepared on the instigation of those members of the Allied Military Government present.

Will you please note for future guidance, that nothing should be done to suggest to the Italian Government that this sub-commission is in any way interfering with their internal administration.

In this connection, the Chief Commissioner is most insistent that the Italian Government should not be pressed for particular legislation, and that our task is to operate existing forms of government after the removal of undesirable elements and not to introduce reforms and changes.

24 May 1944

1. It was reported that the GROCE AZZURRO (a nursing organization) was operating in this area. It was considered as a Fascist drag and the R.C. directed further investigation of their supposed activities.

2. It was reported that tax collections were rising and in general conditions are highly satisfactory.

3. There was a temporary shortage of salt. This was caused by the lack of transportation. Shortage was a problem of distribution and transportation and of a temporary nature. The problem has been taken up with the Finance Sub-Commission ACC for the release of two salt warehouses under the control of the NAPLES port authorities. The release of warehouses will further the outlet of salt distribution.

4. Discussed the need of sulphuric acid for the re-charging of storage batteries which are used in the operation of the FUNICOLARE (Underground Tram Ways). Letter has been forwarded ACC requesting necessary supplies.

5. R.C. requested immediate action of the Labor Sub-Commission ACC for the double pay, May 1.

6. Present Directors of the Naples Stock Exchange are being dismissed and new directors appointed. Old directors are well known fascists.

7. The production of cigarettes and cigars have increased due to the receipt of paper and repair of machinery.

168,000 cigarettes were manufactured during the month of April.

The latest report reveals that 552,000 cigarettes are being manufactured daily. Cigar production has increased from 100,000 to 350,000 per day.

Authorized distribution shops through the province have been increased from 200 to 400. Each shop is allotted 600 packs of cigarettes per day for local consumption. It was felt that the full production was not getting to the public at the authorized prices. Investigation to be conducted to insure distribution.

8. The general rate for fares of trucks was considered. Consensus of all concerned was that in general prices were too low and with the new rate as fixed by the Italian Government which will go into effect 1 June 1944 will alleviate the general complaints. These new and higher rates are acceptable to contractors.

9. The general condition of Public Works is highly satisfactory.

10. A probable drinking of water shortage may exist in Naples. Steps have been taken to prevent such possibility. All washing of streets from hydrants has been discontinued and such washing is to be from other sources.

11. The Provincial Commissioner Benevento has had considerable trouble in securing bricks for sewage construction at Benevento although supposed official release had been obtained from ACC, 8th Army refused to lease bricks. Brig. Lush directed R.C. problem to be taken up with AAI thru liaison.

12. Due to the Army procuring 2/3 of the present manufacture of matches, the civilian supply has become critical. Steps are being taken to deter the army from requesting further supplies.

13. R.C. discussed the merits of a proposed order to fix and control the prices of potatoes within the region. Further, the order restricts the digging of potatoes until 15 June to enable the present crop to gather maturity. This will prevent further digging of potatoes for use by army units. This proposed order was discussed with the Agricultural Sub-Commission and was given approval as a regional venture.

14. The R.C. requested opinion as to the public reaction for the recent grain collection program. In general, Provincial Commissioners felt that the plan had not sufficient time to be dissminated by all of the populace to warrant a definite reaction.

The R.C. stated that certain agricultural directors had discussed the plan with him and all were in agreement of the following points:

- a. The administration of the collection of grain to be placed under direct control of the local director.
- b. The price was too low.
- b. Retention of grain for families was too low.
- c. Retention of grain for seed purposes was too low.

The R.C. directed all concerned that every maximum effort be made to defend the plan in its ~~entirety~~. That all field officers would make repeated visits during the period of collection so as to exemplify the presence of authority.

15. Discussion of the urgent need of tires for civilian vehicles.

Brig. Lush explained that the present situation was known by ~~4500~~ ⁴⁵⁰⁰ he would push Economic Section for action at AFHQ. That upon the arrival of Col. Spofford, G.5, AFHQ, he would discuss this pressing problem.

16. Brig. Lush explained the present policy of forwarding requisitions to ACC for approval. That it would be a basis of general control and policy.

17. That the problem of additional telephone service for local police be taken up with ACC.

18. That the boundaries of the Region had been extended and the remainder of the Naples province had been turned over to Region III.

19. In closing Brig. Lush expressed his appreciation to Col. Polletti and Region III for their services, ~~and~~ improvements, and known results.

4. The objects of the conference are principally two: to develop information and ideas useful to AGC and the Italian Government in the formation of policies; and to allow the interchange among Regional Welfare Officers of methods of meeting Welfare problems.

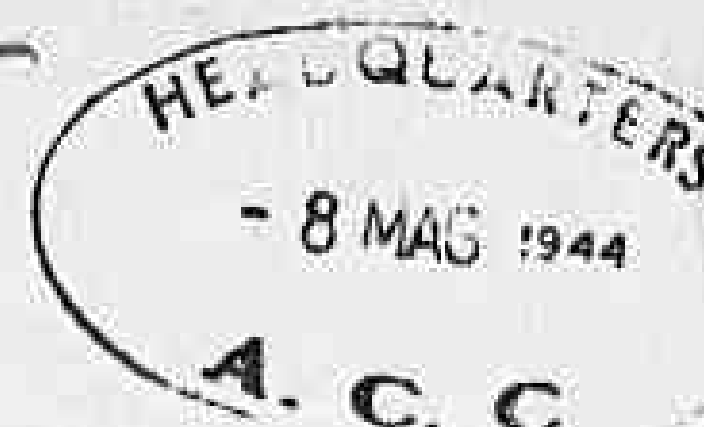

ACC ARCHIVES

1. It has been decided to establish within the Commission an organization to collect, arrange and have custody of official documents and records of the Commission's work.

2. An advisory committee has been appointed under whose direction the archivist will work.

3. The purpose of the archives is not to make selection or summaries of documents because it is thought that they will be of interest in the future. Archives are a natural accumulation of the documents made and used in the course of day to day work. They voice no opinion; they are the written facts on a particular case and their value is governed by the extent and carefulness of their preservation. The original and main source of archives are therefore the actual files accumulated and prepared by the different sections, sub-commissions, regions, etc., comprised within the Commission's organization.

4. It is appreciated that the greater part of the files which have grown up in the life of the Commission may still be in frequent use by the offices in which they originated. There is no desire that any section be pressed to relinquish custody of files which are still required for future reference.

5. At the same time plans need to be made for the receipt, cataloging, storage, and safe custody of such files as can be released by active organizations, one of the files of now defunct bodies such as AIG 15th Army Group.

6. It is hoped that the archives may be of real assistance to sections, etc., in a number of ways: notably in enabling them to relieve pressure on their space by elimination of papers not of permanent value and by taking over files which are seldom required for current work.

7. Files in the custody of the archivists will continue to be readily available whenever it is found necessary to consult them.

8. The administration of the archives is placed under the Secretary General, with whom all correspondence will be conducted. A representative from his office will visit you at an early date in order to discuss the disposal of material at present available.

ADDITIONAL

1. The following suggestions are made with the objects of simplifying files and of facilitating the work of sections and of the archivists. There is no desire to interfere in any way with the filing systems employed by the different offices; they save their own particular problems and each office is free to organize its filing system on the system most suited to its own convenience. A few general principles should, however, be borne in mind.

2. The work of classification will be greatly simplified if offices will arrange in the future for their papers to be filed with this object in mind. For example, a file of any particular subject might conveniently consist of two or three parts: (a) policy and procedure (b) working papers (c) unimportant routine papers. Category (a) would normally be sent latest to archives, category (b) should need slight sorting, and category (c) could probably be destroyed without further examination. (See paragraph 6 below).

3. A file is not merely a cover for binding papers, it is the record of a job or series of jobs. It should be as readily comprehensible as to a man to one unfamiliar with its content. It should be complete and at the same time free from redundant documents and the scraps of papers which are in the interests

4. Mechanical aids to filling are in short supply. In the interests of preservation, however, offices will take all steps possible to ensure that records are timely filed and firmly bound.

9. It will not be necessary to retain for the archives all papers which accumulate. It is not, however, part of the Executive duties to purge files sent to him for custody. Elimination of papers will be made by the office concerned before the files are sent to the Archives.

6. No papers will be destroyed without the sanction of the Advisory Committee. It is not intended that individual files shall be considered by the Committee, but it is proposed to handle them that way in consultation with officers in which the files originate and absence of files or documents may be destroyed without further reference to the Committee.

7. so far as concerns files which are actually ready for immediate transfer to the archives, offices will not be required to carry out the foregoing procedure. If, however, they can find time to tidy up the files before sending them in, this work will be of great value.

8. Files will be addressed to the Secretary General (Archives), Headquarters Allied Control Commission, HQ. Each bundle of files will contain a sheet showing the contents; i.e., file numbers and titles, and the office from which it is sent. If the office which originally submitted the files is different from the office now depositing them, a note to that effect will be made; e.g., "From Public Safety (Sub-Commission - Files supplied by 1st Army Group)." Any files or papers which it is proposed to destroy should be sent to the archives, showing all the above particulars and should, in addition, be separately bundled and marked "for destruction."

- 2) Lt/Col. Shipp opened the meeting with a discussion of the minutes of the Conference held on March 7, 1944. Major White considered that the phrase referring to the appointment of a lawyer in para 6 was too definite. The meeting concurred that the words "if possible" should be inserted after the word "lawyer". This was done and minutes were passed and signed by Lt/Col. Shipp.
- 3) Major Thompson conveyed a message from Col. Adams regretting that he was not able to be present. He added that Col. Adams considered himself as the member of the Committee for the Economic Section and that either he or his representative would attend.
- 4) Lt/Col. Shipp turned to point 2 of the Agenda, and Mr. Jenkinson pointed out that until the appointment of Archivists was implemented no further work was practically possible. Capt. Collins then stated, that he had permission to volunteer for the post with the reservation that he must continue to discharge part of his present duties. The Committee, after discussion, agreed that would be a very desirable arrangement, especially if, as was suggested, the Archives Section were annexed to the Sec. Gen's Dept instead of the Information Division. Lt/Col. Shipp suggested, and the Committee concurred, that Capt. Bennet (A), AGO, 5th Army would be a very suitable officer for the post of second Archivist. It was agreed that, if this were approved, the transfer of Capt. Bennet should take place at the earliest possible opportunity.
- 5) During a discussion on the future work of the Advisory Committee the hope was strongly expressed that Brigadier Lush would be able to retain his personal connection with the Committee as chairman, even though it might not be possible for him to attend all meetings.
- 6) A formal proposal that the Archives Section should be attached, not to the Information Division, but to the Secretary General's Dept. was agreed. It was pointed out that this would make easier Capt. Collins appointment, in this connection it was suggested that the appointment of an officer to assist him in his other duties might further facilitate the proposed arrangements.
- 7) The housing of the Archives Section was then discussed. It was agreed that a room would be necessary, measuring not less than approximately 20' x 30', having facilities for the security of documents, and if possible, near to the Sec. Gen's Dept.

In the same connection it was agreed that some clerical assistance, at least one clerk, would definitely be required.

- 3) After a discussion on the desirability and possibility of standardising form and system in the Archives of the various sections, the meeting agreed that Major White's memorandum should be circulated as a basis for definite proposals. Major White expressed his willingness to give all possible personal assistance in this matter. Mr. Jenkinson pointed out the extent to which the adoption of such a system would be helpful in solving the question of eliminating documents not of permanent value.
- 4) After further discussion of general points it was agreed that the next meeting should take place on Tuesday March 28 at 1100 hrs in the Conference Room.

A FLUID AND EFFICIENT FILING SYSTEM.

- 1 The requirements of every branch are different but the following system can readily be adapted to any requirements.
- 2 Analyse the correspondence and determine the main heads into which the correspondence falls. To each head allot a number - which is an index number and not a file number.
- 3 To every subject which falls within the head allot a sub number e.g. if the number 57 is allotted to the mainhead "Italian Officials", all files dealing with Italian Officials will fall within that group and receive sub numbers e.g.
 57/ Italian Officials.
 1 Appointments
 2 Transfers etc.
- 4 A Policy file, which will contain nothing but the discussion with higher authority of question of policy, the decisions reached and the instructions actually issued, may be distinguished by the addition of a letter A (or P for Policy if preferred) e.g. 57/1A. A special coloured cover is an advantage.
- 5 A Routine file which will contain all correspondence about the carrying out of the policy, enquiries and other routine administrative matters related to the subject may be distinguished by the addition of a letter B (or R for Routine if preferred). A special coloured cover is an advantage.
- 6 Action files. A new file is started and an individual number allotted for each distinct action e.g. the first appointments made are of Smith Brown, Jones and Robinson, the files would be numbered 57/1.1 57/1.2, 57/1.3, 57/1.4 and so on. Action files deal with particular incidents, they do not generally live very long, often not more than two or three weeks. Improvised paper covers are often sufficient as file covers.
- 7 Files are most conveniently stored vertically. If there are no filing cabinets, boxes can be made or improvised. Not only is this most convenient, but the cases make the office mobile. Action files die quickly, dead ones must be stored in separate boxes so that only LIVE files are behind the main head cards. This is important.
- 8 Index cards can be improvised out of half file covers inserted vertically in front of the files to which they refer. They should be cut down to stick out about 2" above the files and the number and main head printed thereon in bold letters. Not only do these cards serve as an index but they also act as guide cards. They indicate exactly the whereabouts of the group of any file required and enable it to be picked out at once.
- 9 Records. Each mainhead is given an index card. The sub-heads are written on successive lines and are followed by the letters or the policy or routine files opened, and the total number (in pencil so that it can be kept up to date) of the action files which have been opened.
- 10 The main Index Cards relating to Italian Officials might therefore look as follows:

HQ., to discuss A.C.C. signal dated 31 January, 1944, reference 310940Z, FALMUS (Action), and coordinate plans and action of representatives of allied armed forces in evolving formula for uniform noon-day and midnight meal for civilians employed at hard labor.
2. Conference attended by: Lt. Col. Smith, Chairman of Meeting; Colonel Lawley, Chairman, Warer Central Committee; A.F.H.Q. Adv. Adm. Sec.; Lt. Col. W. Lyde, Labor; A.F.H.Q. Adv. Adm. Sec.; Lt. Col.  - a. Fresh meat could not be served to workers as suggested in the signal because not locally available.

 - c. Reviled issues of food items will be made from Army and Navy stocks through regular channels. Provision of flour will be A.C.C. responsibility under Central arrangements. Consolidated monthly total of flour expended will be presented by Base Section, Area, or District Commanders to E.E.S. which will arrange immediate replacement. (Lt. Col. Legge, Chief, Food Sub-Commission, informed Lt. Col. Smith by phone that he would attempt to supply sugar, salt, and yeast for service to make bread, but could not promise same.)
 - d. Dried beans and peas may be issued and supplied, if available, in lieu of fresh vegetables, if latter unavailable in sufficient quantities.

3. All branches will serve same type of meal with workers getting same quantities. This will eliminate labor competition and conflict between different employing units. Military Railroad Service will not issue rice as originally contemplated since not available for workers elsewhere.

- f. Bread ration for the meal will be 1/3 pound per individual per day. Bread to be baked in 2 pound Army loaf form and cut into 1/3 pound rations. Workers will pay for the loaf at prices indicated in A.F.H.A. signal. Price will be 1.28 lire per 1/3 pound of bread (equivalent to 1/4 pound flour). Charge will be 6 lire for bread and vegetables, with continuance of 1 lire charge for currently issued bowl or cup.
- g. Meal to be supplied mid-shift and will go into effect at 8 a.m. shift Thursday, 10 February, 1944. This arrangement does not include Army combat zones.

- h. Only those workers performing hard labor for Military purposes are entitled to foregoing concessions. This is interpreted to include employees of contractors directly employed by Armed Forces.
- i. Labor Sub-Commissioner will now be central coordinating agency to aid in resolving differences of opinion which may arise among various employing units regarding food for workers and related matters.
