In order that there may be sufficient petrol to go forward to the Armies, it will be essential that the consumption of petrol in the ROME Area shall be kept to a minimum. Strict control will be exercised over consumption as follows:-

(a) While ROME is under command of CG., FIFTH ARMY

M.T. petrol issues in the ROME Area will be controlled by FIFTH ARMY and will be made from the stocks (packaged or bulk) available to FIFTH ARMY, i.e. approximately 50% of the 6 inch line from NAPLES ($\frac{1}{2}$ x 1500 t.p.d.) plus packaged petrol imported through ANZIO.

(b) When ROME passes under command HQ., AAI

M.T. petrol issues for Allied Control Commission and civil requirements will be made in accordance with allocations to ACC, in regard to which an initial instruction has already been received from HQ., ACC.

M.T. petrol issues for all other purposes in the ROME Garrison will be strictly controlled by CG., ROME Area, who will make recommendations to this HQ as to the quantities which he considers to be necessary for the purpose.

SUBJECT: Analysis of Air Attacks on Communication Targets in Italy.

TO: Allied Control Commission. MAILER.

1. It is of the utmost importance for the planning of future operations that this Headquarters should be able to determine the total effect of the present air offensive against communications in Italy.

2. There undoubtedly exists in ROME State records of damage and effect. Records of damage to railways and railway installations, and traffic records are probably to be found in the Headquarters of the Italian State Railways. Other useful records should be found at U.S.P.A. Headquarters. Such records would be of very great value to this Headquarters.

3. As soon as ROME is in our hands it is important that these records should be made available as quickly as possible and that they should not be damaged or mislaid in any way. It is suggested therefore that you should assign an officer to accompany an officer of this Headquarters to ROME immediately upon its occupation, and that these officers should be provided with the authority necessary to obtain these records.

SUBJECT: Roma Provincial Team, Region IV.

1. It appears that Roma Province will be within the zone of operation of both 5th and 8th Armies.

2. For that reason, it will not be possible to place the entire Provincial Team "under command" of one army as has been possible in the case of Littoria, Grosinone and Rieti and as may be possible in the cases of Viterbo and Perugia.

3. It appears likely that the Velletri Area will be within 5th Army boundary and that the Tivoli Area will be within 8th Army boundary. The two small Teams allotted to these two towns and surrounding communes will therefore be allotted, when called forward, to 5th Army AMG (Field) and 8th Army AMG respectively.

4. The officers allotted to the northern part of the Province (Civitavecchia) and the Provincial HQ. will remain under Regional control at present.

SUBJECT: Conditions In Rome

TO : HQ ACC (Attention: Brig. Lush)

1. An ISLD Report (source believed good) received here 26 April contains an appreciation of the present general situation in Rome. This is summarized for information as follows:

a. Tension between military and political bodies has been relaxed and no longer danger of civil war.

b. Danger of anarchy is, however, very evident owing to existing starvation conditions. Mass meetings have taken place ending in large scale demonstrations outside St. Peter's. The critical food situation may lead to serious disorders immediately Germans leave Rome.

c. In view of relatively small force on whom DECEIVABLE knows he can count, and in view of grave responsibility attached to taking action against population (amongst whom many are actuated only by starvation), considered most essential that food for city should arrive immediately after Allied troops.

d. Deceivenga would appreciate receiving general outline from Allied Command of what measures it is prepared to take to meet situation, as with this knowledge he would hope to be able to maintain civil order during critical interim period.

1. Location of Warehouses in use for Storage:

The most important warehouses are in the following areas.

a. General Area.

The boundaries of this area run from the Via Portuguesa to the station of railway between Westmore and Ostense stations, and from Ostense station to the Bagilio, of S.F. de, thence to the River.

In this area are the General Warehouses and the most important silos in the city.

No details are available as to the number and capacity of the silos, but they are of modern construction and very large.

b. General Storage Area.

bounded by Via Orellana Vecchia and Viale Carlo San Lorenzo.

The warehouses in this area are not so important as those in the Ostense area. Some of them were destroyed or damaged in the Allied air-raid on the 19th July 1945. During this raid the large "Portonella" silos, which provided for the greater part of the population, were destroyed.

Besides those in the above mentioned areas, there are numerous de-centralized wholesale warehouses spread over the city.

2. Location of Warehouses at present used for the distribution of food.

There are no details as to the location of these warehouses. Before passing into the hands of the retailers, all goods are transferred from the General Warehouses to the Wholesale Batches dispersed over the city.

1. Economic Review.

Before September 1943 a very significant part of the American Government's foreign policy was the economic aid to the United Kingdom, which had been the main objective of the American Government.

From the information received (and DECEMBER 1943), it seems that the kitchens are continuing to function, and the number has increased, especially in the power quarters.

The number of cantines run by business concerns for their staffs has also increased.

A new Economic Kitchen has been opened near the station.

4. Amortizations and preparations for demolition of power mills, stores and warehouses.

No warehouses, mills or buildings had been destroyed up to the 31st DECEMBER 1943, except for the "Pantones" mills and warehouses which were completely destroyed in the Allied air-raid of 19th JUNE 1943.

No precise information is available as to possible preparations for demolition of mills. It can be foreseen, however, judging by the destruction wrought by the Germans in JERSEY and district, that the mills, stores and warehouses in ROE are also destined to be destroyed or burnt.

5. Buildings constructed in "E.42" zone (A.W. suggested for the ABLE Exhibition which was to have taken place in 1943.)

Location of "E.42". It is bounded on the EAST by the ROE-ROE railway; on the NORTH by the Colonia Hill, two Pantages; on the SOUTH by Via Grotta Peretta, and on the WEST by the Cascina di Grotta Peretta.

In 1944 the "Palazzo degli Uffici" was completed (three floors and about 900 rooms).

The following buildings had only their external structure completed:-

Palazzo della Civiltà (five floors).
Palazzo della Scienze (six floors).

Immediately adjacent to this zone, villages for the working classes, housing about 5000 people, had been built.

After the war had been suspended (JANUARY 1942), these villages were used as billets for troops, and for stores of materials.

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On the ground which was to be made into route leading to "E. 12", via: Via Impassabile and Via Duto. Lighter (the area between the Circovallization Line, Via Impassabile and Via Duto) eight buildings have been constructed which were for use during the period of the exhibition.

By the 1st September 1943 the external structure of these buildings had been completed.

1. Executive Memorandum No.33 of 27 Feb 44 defines this party as "Rome Sub-Region".
2. Fifth Army have forbidden the use of the word "Rome" for security reasons and their parallel organisation is "City Administrative Section".
3. The Rome Party works in very close conjunction with CAS and General Hume states that he adopted the title AMG 5th Army (CAS) at the request of General Johnson and General Clark.
4. The suggestion was made that the title should be changed from "Rome Sub-Region" to "City Sub-Region" but General Hume prefers "CAS".
5. An official amendment is necessary to Executive Memorandum No.33 in view of 5th Army security objections to the title "Rome Sub-Region". The suggested amendment is as follows:

[All references in Executive Memorandum No.33 of 27 Feb 44, para.1 to ROME Sub-Region should be deleted and "City Sub-Region" substituted therefor.]

Robertson) and his staff, including all AOC personnel assigned to SALERNO Province at that date, will come under the command of Regional Commissioner, Region III. Details of personnel will be sent to G-1, AOC HQ, for record.

The attention of Regional Commissioner, Region III is directed to the fact that the Province of SALERNO forms part of the territory turned over to the Italian Government on 13th February 1944, and that control will be of an advisory and not of an executive nature.

Transport vehicles, office equipment, supplies, etc. will similarly be transferred and handling over certificates will be furnished with details to G-4 AOC HQ for record.

3. PONZA ISLAND.

The Western group of the PONTINE Islands of which PONZA is the largest, will be transferred from Region IV (Province of Littoria) to Region III (Province of NAPLES). The island is already being administered by Region III and the change is, therefore, merely for the purpose of record.

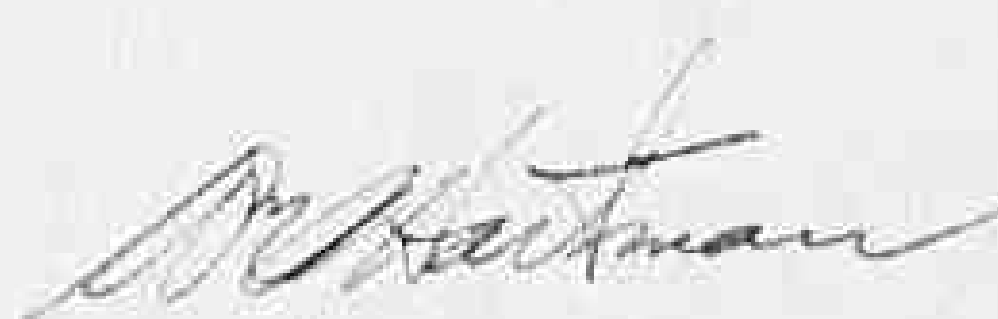

The necessity has arisen recently in connection with ROME planning, as the result of a report that the Germans have disbanded all the Carabinieri in the city, to build up a reserve force of 2,500 Carabinieri for the policing of the city.

2. It happens that in this particular case the necessary numbers can be found without great difficulty and without disorganization of the Carabinieri in occupied Italy. This is chiefly due to the fact that there is in Sardinia a surplus of 1,500 Carabinieri who were previously used in Corsica and are now no longer required there.

3. When preparations have to be made to take over the many other cities in Italy north of ROME it will not be easy to find a reserve, especially if the Germans pursue the same policy as they have done in ROME. It is therefore considered advisable to obtain without delay any Carabinieri who are available from all sources. In conversation with General Picche, C.O.C., CC.RR in Italy, he suggested there were almost certain to be Carabinieri among the P.O.W. who were captured in recent operations in Tunisia. It is thought that there may also be a number still remaining in P.O.W. camps scattered along the North African coast from the Libyan and Tripoli campaigns.

4. I should be glad if a survey could at once be made to find out how many of these Carabinieri can be transferred to Italy forthwith to meet such an emergency and if plans could be made to ship them to some town in Southern Italy where they can be held as a reserve.

5. I should be glad if this could be treated as a matter of urgency.

1. RULE FINDING.
Chief Commissioner outlined certain changes. General Robertson made point that whatever plan was made for administration, General Hughes should not be appointed. Suggested that C. in C. should wire A.P.H.C. to this effect.
2. TURKISH DECADE.
Suggested that document should be sent to him but agreed to dated draft.
3. CENTRAL ECONOMIC COMMITTEE.
Agreed that there should be a meeting twice monthly between some heads of economic sub-commissions and D/CAO's staff. D/CAO to preside. Chief Commissioner will speak to Mr. Grady on this point. Meeting to be a clearing house for military and civil requirements.
4. LABOUR.
D/CAO said that ANIC was sending Italian POW in labour Coys to Italy. Agreed that General Robertson would write to ANIC saying that he had consulted the Chief Commissioner and that in view of deadlock over POW in political sphere, the proposed action should be prevented. Chief Commissioner would also wire on political issue.
5. TRANSPORT.
Chief Commissioner asked that Transport Units provided for civil needs should be kept together as far as possible as units.

1. The VATICAN City State will be accorded the normal rights of a Neutral and
treated as an Independent Neutral State.

2. A number of other Churches and buildings in ROME outside the boundaries of
the Holy City which are on the property of the Holy See must also be avoided by
Allied Troops.

These buildings are not a part of the Vatican City and, strictly speaking,
have no international status as neutral territory. However these properties are
entitled to full diplomatic immunity under the Lateran Treaty and therefore must
be treated in exactly the same way as the Vatican City itself.

3. Although during the assault on ROME every precaution to avoid violating
the territory of the Vatican City must be taken, the diplomatic immunity of
Vatican properties in ROME, outside the VATICAN CITY territory, will not be
allowed to interfere with military operations.

4. In order to insure that the neutrality of the Vatican State is respected,
guards will be posted at the boundaries as agreed with the Vatican authorities.
The buildings described in Para 3 above must also have guards posted at their
entrances and troops must be warned that these properties, although outside the
Vatican City, belong to the Holy See and must be treated accordingly.

After the period of the assault these buildings, through arrangements with
the Vatican authorities, will be clearly marked so that Allied troops can readily
identify them.
