12. IMPORTATION OF ARTICLES MADE FROM BIRD FEATHERS AND OF CERTAIN LIVE BIRDS AND ANIMALS:

The following is extracted from WD Memorandum No. W850-44, dated 5 April 1944, for the information and guidance of all concerned.

1. In order to discourage military personnel from spending their money for certain types of souvenirs and live birds which cannot be delivered to their relatives and friends, but which must be seized by customs officers upon arrival in the United States, it is desired that you inform all personnel under your command concerning the laws which prohibit the importation into the United States of articles made from the plumage of wild birds and certain live birds and mammals.

2. (1) a. No foreign animals may be brought alive into the United States without proper permits and because of their known destructiveness to agriculture or their danger to public health, permits for certain species are not issued.

b. The pertinent provisions of law are as follows:
That the importation of birds of paradise, pigeons, egret, plumes, or so-called egret plumes, and the feathers, quills, heads, wings, tails, skins, or parts of skins, of wild birds, either raw or manufactured and not for scientific or educational purposes, is hereby prohibited; but this provision shall not apply to the feathers or plumes of ostriches or to the feathers or plumes of domestic fowls of any kind: Act 17 June 1930 (40 Stat. 590; 19 U. S. C. sec 1001 par 1718).

The importation into the United States, or any Territory or District thereof, of the mongrel, the so-called "Wing foxes" or fruit bats, the English sparrow, the starling, and such other birds and animals as the Secretary of the Interior may from time to time declare to be injurious to the interests of agriculture or horticulture, is hereby prohibited; and all such birds and animals shall, upon arrival at any part of the United States, be destroyed or returned at the expense of the owner. No person shall import into the United States, or into any Territory or District thereof, any foreign wild animal or bird, except under special permit from the Secretary of the Interior. Act 4 March 1909 (35 Stat. 1137; 18 U.S.C. sec. 351.)

In addition to the forms of animal life mentioned in the above citation, which may not be imported into the United States, all members of the parrot family are now prohibited because of their potential damage to public health. (adj)

GENERAL ROUTING ORDER - 17

31 December 1949

710. CABLE SERVICE BETWEEN NORTH AFRICA, C.M.F. AND UNITED KINGDOM

Soldiers of His Majesty's Forces in this Command may send and receive cables to and from the United Kingdom through official channels by one of the following methods.

I. CONCESSION (C.S.N.) TELEGRAMS

1. C.S.N. Telegrams may be sent under the following conditions:

- (a) They will relate solely to urgent family or business matters.
- (b) The addressee of a message will be a soldier's wife, child, parent, nearest relative, or the person responsible for his business affairs.
- (c) The text of the message will not exceed twelve words, nor contain terms of endearment, compliments, greetings, etc.
- (d) The message will contain no reference to a formation or unit, or the location of the soldier. Thus it may not be used to rectify the change of the soldier's address.
- (e) No soldier may send more than one message in any calendar month. The message will be consigned by the unit commander, who will ensure that the above conditions are fulfilled, and that the message is of real urgency and connected with family or business matters. Unit commanders will exercise strict control of the numbers of cables passing through their hands, as the facilities which exist for the transmission of C.S.N. Telegrams are limited.

The undertaking will not be regarded as one to be made use of at all costs.

(f) Considerable delay has been caused through incorrect procedure being adopted.

If the conditions are not met in para. I and II of this C.S.N. are not fulfilled, Signal Offices and C.S.N. and Receiver will return the message to the originator. C.S.N. Telegrams will not be addressed to the police, or to addressees outside the United Kingdom. (Note: This is outside the United Kingdom.)

(g) The charges for this telegram service will be on francs or two lire per word for the text of the message, and on francs or two lire per word for the address with a maximum of five francs or ten lire when the address exceeds five words.

(h) Similar arrangements are being met for relatives in the United Kingdom to send such messages to this theater.

2. Procedure and Accounting.

Messages will be prepared in duplicate on ordinary service Message Forms, A.F. 12136. Both copies of the message will be inscribed with the originator's name, number, and the full title of his unit (not for transmission in the message). The Unit Censoring Officer will endorse both copies as being for repayment, boldly, on both sides of the message form, c.c. (On Repayment (15 francs or 30 Lire)).

The original message will be sent with the despatch book referred to below to the nearest Army Signal Office for despatch.

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(c) No soldier may send more than one message in any calendar month. The message will be entered by the unit commander, who will ensure that the above conditions are fulfilled, and that the message is of real urgency and connected with family or business matters. Unit commanders will exercise strict control of the number of cables passing through their hands, as the facilities which exist for the transmission of C.S.M. telegrams are limited.

The requirement will not be regarded as one to be made use of at all costs.

(f) Considerable delay has been caused through incorrect procedure being adopted.

If the conditions are not met in respect of I and II of this G.R.C. any not fulfilled, Signal Officers and S.S.O. 2nd Section will return the message to the originator. C.S.M. telegrams will not be addressed to the police, or to addresses outside the United Kingdom. (Note: This is outside the United Kingdom.)

(g) The charges for this telegram service will be one franc or two lire per word for the text of the message, and one franc or two lire per word for the address with a maximum of five francs or ten lire when the address exceeds five words.

(h) Similar arrangements are being made for relatives in the United Kingdom to send such messages to this theater.

2. Procedure and Accounting.

Messages will be prepared in duplicate on ordinary Service Message Form, A.F. 52136. Both copies of the message will be inscribed with the originator's name, number, and the full title of his unit (not for transmission in the message). The Unit Counting Officer will undertake both copies as being for repayment, boldly, on both sides of the message form, e.g. (On Repayment (15 francs or 30 lire)).

The original message will be sent with the despatch book referred to below to the nearest Army Signal Office for despatch.

The duplicate will be retained by the unit as a voucher to support the cash collected from the soldier. The cash received will be paid into the unit imprest account and shown on a receipt form.

In addition a separate record will be kept by units in a despatch book, which will be prepared as follows:

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Messages will only be accepted by signals on the production of this despatch book, and a receipt for the message will be given in column 6.

At the end of each month column 5 will be scrawled, checked, and agreed with the unit's credits paid into the Unit Imprest Account, and the duplicate copies of messages will be forwarded with the unit Imprest Account to No. 2 Command Pay Office.

The money reported back will be not available for credit by the Command Paymaster, No. 2 Command Pay Office, when called for.

3. Censorship by Base Censor.

(a) The originator's name and unit (see sub-para. 2 above) will be transmitted with the message as far as the base censor.

(b) Army Signal Offices will not accept messages not inscribed with the name of the originator and his unit is thus imprest account the money collected is brought to account.

(c) When the message is not passed for onward transmission by the base censor, Signals will inform the originating unit by Signal message so that the originator can be notified.

(d) Information through Signals that a message has been refused by the base censor does not constitute an authority for a refund of cash to the originator.

This authority is the responsibility of the Command Paymaster, who will provide from Signals a copy of all messages not passed by the base censor and will then authorize the unit to take a refund to the originator.

4. Messages from the United Kingdom after receipt in this Command will be delivered to addressees through Signal channels.

II. COMMISSIONER TELEGRAMS

1. These are official messages and will be forwarded FREE OF CHARGE under the following conditions:

(a) To the United Kingdom. The message may only contain a request from the soldier regarding the whereabouts and safety of his wife or nearest relative, from whom he has received no communication for three months.

Unit commanders will satisfy themselves that the soldier's request is genuine, and that he has not, in fact, received any communication for three months.

(b) From the United Kingdom. The message may only contain a notification of the death of a soldier's wife, child or parent, birth of child and condition of the mother after the birth, and in certain cases of serious illness of wife, child, parent or nearest relative.

2. Messages will comply with censorship regulations. They will be despatched through A.D.L.S. or D.A.L.S. to G.H.Q. 2nd Echelon, the envelope being clearly marked (Despatch-Commissioner Telegrams.)

(c) When the message is not passed for onward transmission by the base censor, Signals will inform the originating unit by Signal message so that the originator can be notified.

(d) Information through Signals that a message has been refused by the base censor does NOT constitute an authority for a refund of cash to the originator.

This authority is the responsibility of the Command Paymaster, who will issue a copy of all messages not passed by the base censor and will then authorize the unit to make a refund to the originator.

4. Messages from the United Kingdom after receipt in this Command will be delivered to addressees through Signal channels.

III. COMMISSIONS AND PROMOTIONS

1. These are official messages and will be forwarded FREE OF CHARGE under the following conditions:

(a) To the United Kingdom. The message may only contain a request from the soldier concerning the whereabouts and safety of his wife or nearest relative, free when he has received no notification for three months.

Unit commanders will certify themselves that the soldier's request is genuine, and that he has not, in fact, received any notification for three months.

(b) From the United Kingdom. The message may only contain a notification of the birth of a soldier's wife, child or parent, birth of child and death of the mother after the birth, and in certain cases of serious illness of wife, child, parent or nearest relative.

2. Messages will comply with censorship regulations. They will be despatched through A.D.L.S. or L.A.L.S. to C.H.Q. 2nd Echelon, the envelope being clearly marked (Warrent-Competition Telegrams.)

3. C.H.Q. 2nd Echelon will, so far as is possible, ensure that the conditions of sub-para. 1 (a) are fulfilled and transfer the message to Signals for onward transmission.

4. AWARD OF SOLDIER'S MEDAL (POSTHUMOUS):

The following is extracted from General Order # 21, HQ MATCOM, dated 19 March 1944, with respect to a former Officer of this organization.

"GLENN G. GRISWOLD, 0593023, Captain, Corps of Engineers, United States Army, For heroism on 26 December 1943, at Naples, Italy. Captain Griswold as Civil Defense Officer of the City of Naples under Allied Military Government made a personal reconnaissance of a fire which was then raging in a grotto at that location used by the Chemical Warfare Service, United States Army, as a place for storage of munitions. Military and civilian firemen were rushing to combat the blaze but Captain Griswold ordered them to a place of safety after a preliminary inspection of the grotto. While a more thorough inspection of the grotto was being made by him without regard for his safety, a severe explosion occurred and he was killed. By the prompt, efficient and courageous action of his officer the lives of many firemen present were saved. Next of kin: Mrs Lucille H. 2. In future, therefore, MD vehicles (including motorcycles) will never be left unattended except:

- b. in absence of other urgent necessity.
- c. in circumstances in which immobilization has been authorized (see par 2 below)

3. All units having MD vehicles will arrange for their vehicles to be guarded day and night. Small units who have difficulty in finding their own guard may arrange, if possible, to park their vehicles with those of a unit where a guard is mounted.

4. When on duty, it is the driver's responsibility to ensure that arrangements are made for his vehicle to be safe-guarded at all times.

He must ensure that any car park or MD's motorcycle park in which he leaves his vehicle is officially authorized and guarded.

5. The Military Police will not be used to guard vehicles of units other than their own. The duty as "car parks", etc, is to control traffic and the parking of vehicles, and the fact that they are present does not relieve any driver from his responsibility for safeguarding his own vehicle.

6. The practice of immobilizing vehicles often leads to mechanical inefficiency and damage.

This method of safeguarding vehicles will no longer be used, except by officers permitted to do so under par 2 below, or when ordered by Divisional or higher Hq in an operational area.

7. Disciplinary action will be taken against drivers who leave their vehicles unattended, except as in par 2 a, b, and c above; and where as a result the vehicle, or any MD property contained therein is lost, the offender will normally be tried by Court Martial.

2. (a) Certain Officers have been supplied with MD requisitioned vehicles for which no military drivers have been provided.

Where compliance with the terms of this OEO would hinder such officers in the proper performance of their duties, they will apply to their Sec, or equivalent HQ for a written permit to leave their vehicles unattended when no other arrangements can be made.

(1) This permit will be in the following form:-

- (i) (Rank and name) of (Unit or Department) is authorized to leave MD/requisitioned vehicle number.....un-attended while he is carrying out military duties, provided that:
 - (1) there is a military driver or other person in whose care the vehicle could be left,
 - (ii) there is no military unit within reasonable distance under whose escort the vehicle could be placed,
 - (iii) the vehicles is both locked (if possible) and immobilized.

The permit will be signed by or on behalf of the Sec, etc, Commander, and will be stamped with the R. stamp.

(c) Such a permit will not be issued unless the authorizing officer is satisfied that the vehicle can be immobilized.

(d) It will be carried by the driver and produced on request of a Military Policeman or other proper authority.

(e) Possession of such a permit does not absolve an officer from making the best possible arrangements to have his car guarded at all times, nor does it affect his responsibility for the safety of any MD property or documents, etc, which may be in the vehicle.

(f) No permits will be issued in respect of motorcycles, which will never be left unattended except as in par 2 above.

3. Particulars of MD vehicles lost by theft will be immediately reported by write (a) to their formation AFM/DafM, and (b) direct to AFHQ (Q(AZ)).
