- b. Vicinity of Anzio. This area includes a strip of land about three miles wide surrounding the old stabilized line of the beachhead which roughly ran from the sea to della Molletta, Carrocato, Cas. Garano, Cisterna di Littoria and Littoria to the sea.

II. Under the provisions of AR 105-25, par 11 - Messages are classified as follows to indicate the relative order in which they should be transmitted:

a. Urgent: This classification is restricted to military and naval use only and is used in combat or when combat real or simulated is imminent. Urgent messages are sent immediately upon receipt, or immediately after urgent messages previously received have been transmitted. They are given right-of-way over all messages of lower classification. The "Urgent" classification has no counterpart in domestic commercial message classification.

b. Operational priorities: This classification is for use only on important messages pertaining directly to operations which should not be classified "urgent" but must be delivered as expeditiously as possible to be acted upon properly. Messengers from the Adjutant's Department call at hourly intervals throughout the day to deliver and collect mail. They leave Message Center to effect final delivery and collection at 1700 hours daily and are receiving then at many offices practically the whole outgoing correspondence for the day.

The following instructions will govern the collection and retention of captured enemy materiel by military personnel of this theater:

a. Military personnel are not permitted to collect for personal souvenirs, retain, ship, mail, sell, or give away any of the following:

- Airplane or balloon instruments or controls
- Sinoculars
- Empty brass or copper shells (weighing more than 2 lbs)
- Enemy documents
- Explosives
- Fire control instruments and accessories
- Name plates removed from captured equipment
- Fire arms
- Critical instruments and accessories
- Articles whose combined length and girth is more than 5 ft or of a weight in excess of 20 lbs

b. Much valuable intelligence data has been lost through the destruction and stripping of name plates from captured enemy materiel and retention of documents, weapons, radios and other items as trophies. Necessary action will be taken by all commands to insure that all personnel are instructed that enemy materiel is not to be stripped of identification marks or equipment, or documents to be taken by souvenir hunters until clearance is given by the proper headquarters.

2. No person, other than the following, will at any time be permitted to drive any W.D. vehicle except in an operational emergency.

- (a) The properly appointed driver or drivers.
- (b) Officers and NCOs of the unit responsible for the maintenance of the vehicle on change.
- (c) Those duly appointed to testing, inspecting and instructional duties.
- (d) Men under instruction on journeys specially authorized for that purpose.

3. When, owing to fatigue or other reasons, the driver is not in a fit state to carry out his duties, motor-cars may be driven on duty journeys by Officers, other than those referred to above, provided that:-

- (a) Such officers are fully qualified to drive.
- (b) The driver allotted to the vehicle always accompanies his vehicle.

4. Any officer or other rank who in future contravenes this order will be subject to disciplinary action. All local orders will republish the substance of this GPO and COs will bring to the notice of all ranks that under King's Regulations, 1945, para. 681(a), a Court-Martial may pay regard to the fact that this warning has been issued when awarding sentence.
