403. PROHIBITION ON THE TRANSMISSION OF STEALING NOTES TO AND FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM

GRC 16. 755, S/A 30, dated 22 Sep 44, is repeated hereunder for the information and guidance of all concerned:-

1. ACI 538/42 requires all sterling bank notes in possession of officers and other ranks to be exchanged into local currency through official channels immediately on disembarkation overseas. Sterling may not in any circumstances be accepted or purchased abroad, except from official Army sources.

- (c) The concession applies to all ranks of Allied Forces. It does not apply to Merchant Navy and employed civilian personnel or the personnel of Red Cross and philanthropic bodies.

2. Duty free parcels must not weigh more than 5 lbs., including packing, nor may any parcel contain:-

- (a) drinkable spirits;
- (b) more than $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. total weight of tobacco, cigars or cigarettes (200 cigarettes or 50 cigars equal $\frac{1}{2}$ lb.); Tobacco, cigars or cigarettes marked "H.M. Ships only" or "H.M. Stores for H.M. Forces" may not be sent;
- (c) more than 2 lbs. of any one foodstuff;
- (d) any article purchased directly or indirectly from a N.A.A.F.I. (NFI) or other canteen, except articles which the sender can establish had their origin in a country other than in the U.K. or North America;
- (e) any foodstuffs, tobacco, cigarettes or chocolate issued as rations;
- (f) more than $\frac{1}{2}$ pint of scent.

3. Each concession parcel will bear a customs declaration label (LP 35492) obtainable by units on indent from the nearest Stationery Depot.

 - (e) any foodstuffs, tobacco, cigarettes or chocolate issued as rations;
 - (f) more than 1/2 pint of scent.
3. Each concession parcel will bear a customs declaration label (AB 64/92) obtainable by units on indent from the nearest Stationery Depot.
- Until special labels, value £4, £6 and £8 are available, troops may use two, three or four of the existing labels on the basis that each label is valued at £2. If the labels are not gummed, units will make arrangements for fixing them to parcels by means of adhesive paste or gum arabic, supplies of which may be obtained from the same source.
4. (a) The labels will be held in the custody of an officer. They will be issued on demand to Officers and Other Ranks or as laid down by the unit. Entries may be issued with labels at choice provided that no individual may be issued in any one year with labels totalling more than £8 in value.
- (b) Not more than four Duty Free parcels may be sent by any individual during a period of one year.
- (c) The value of the labels issued will be recorded by the issuing officer in AB 64 Part I for Other Ranks, on a blank page if available or on a gummed slip, inserted in the books.
- (d) The officer recording the issue will sign the Customs Label and insert the name of the individual to whom issued. The name of the unit will not be put on the label or on the outside of the parcel, either in writing or in the unit stamp. The label will be signed and dated by the sender and the contents of the parcel and value declared.
- (e) A simple record of receipts and issues of the Customs Labels will be maintained by each unit.
5. Normal censorship regulations will apply and the unit censor stamp impression will be made in the space indicated on the label. Units unable to obtain use of a censor stamp will furnish a certificate to that effect when the concession parcels are posted at an Army Post Office in the same way as for letters.

262. RETURN TO U.K. OF LONG SERVICE PERSONNEL

The following is extracted from GHO No. 661, S/N 33, dated 18 Aug 44, for the information and guidance of all concerned:-

1. As from the date of publication of this GHO the qualifying date for eligibility to return to U.K. will be that on which four-and-a-half years' unbroken service overseas is completed.

2. The qualifying period of overseas service will be calculated from date of embarkation U.K. Periods of leave or duty, not exceeding six months, spent in the U.K. during the four-and-a-half years are not taken to constitute a break for the purpose of eligibility: for the purpose of calculation, this period of leave or duty in U.K. will be counted as if it were service abroad.

3. For the purpose of this GHO "overseas" will, in addition to all overseas Commands, include service in:-

- (a) E.E.F.
- (b) R.A.E.F. (Norway)
- (c) Faroe Islands
- (d) Iceland.

4. Personnel commissioned or enlisted in the British Army overseas but whose normal residence is in U.K. will be considered eligible for evacuation to U.K. after four-and-a-half years service in the British Army.

5. Personnel will be eligible to be called forward by GHQ 2nd Echelon as soon as their overseas period is completed. In some cases personnel may necessarily be called shortly before or after the actual completion of the qualifying period. In the event of an officer or other rank who considers himself eligible not being called forward, he will notify his O.C., who will forward his name to GHQ 2nd Echelon stating the circumstances.

6. Personnel returned to the U.K. under this scheme will be posted to the Home Establishment for a period not less than three months, including disembarkation leave before being considered for posting to another theatre, and will then only be posted to North West Europe unless they volunteer for despatch to any other theatre.
7. The above exchange is voluntary on the part of those qualified. In all cases where an officer or other rank does not wish to take advantage of this repatriation, his name will be reported to GHQ 2nd Echelon accompanied by a signed certificate to that effect.
