CORRESPONDENCE DISPATCH PROCEDURE.

1. The procedure outlined below will be effective Monday, 8 May 44.
2. (a). BEFORE delivery to the Message Center departments will envelope all correspondence for dispatch outside Main HQ, i.e., i.C.C., with the exception of unclassified material to the following formations:
 - A.F.H.Q. (M.G.S.)
 - HQ., A.A.I.
 - Rear HQ, A.C.C.,
 - AMG/ACC Regional Hqs.
 - AMG Army Hqs.
 - Peninsular Base Section.
- (b). Classified material to the above formations will be enclosed in one envelope only. Vide sub-para (c) and para 4 below.
- (c). Many departments correspond with the formations mentioned in sub-para (a) above, and all dispatches are transmitted from the Message Center in bulk under one cover. Double enveloping of classified material and single enveloping of the unclassified is therefore not only uneconomical but unnecessary.

3. Every package or envelope must be fully addressed and at the bottom left hand corner bear the reference number(s) or the enclosure(s). A suffix or prefix identifying the department of origin will always form part of the reference. Failure to conform with the instructions will only result in delay in transmission.

CORRESPONDENCE DISPATCH PROCEDURE.

1. The procedure outlined below will be effective Monday, 8 May 44.
2. (a). BEFORE delivery to the Message Center departments will envelope all correspondence for dispatch outside Main HQ., A.C.C., with the exception of unclassified material to the following formations:

A.F.H.Q. (M.G.S.)
HQ., A.A.I.
Rear Hq., A.C.C.,
AMC/ACC Regional Hqs.
AMC Army Hqs.
Peninsular Base Section.

- (b). Classified material to the above formations will be enclosed in one envelope only. Vide sub-para (c) and para 4 below.

- (c). Many departments correspond with the formations mentioned in sub-para (a) above, and all dispatches are transmitted from the Message Center in bulk under one cover. Double enveloping of classified material and single enveloping of the unclassified is therefore not only uneconomical but unnecessary.

3. Every package or envelope must be fully addressed and at the bottom left hand corner bear the reference number(s) or the enclosure(s). A suffix or prefix identifying the department of origin will always form part of the reference. Failure to conform with the instructions will only result in delay in transmission.

4. The following additional security requirements will be particularly noted.

- (a). TOP SECRET and SECRET communications will be sent in two envelopes. To assist the recipient in verifying that there has been no tampering in transit, the inner envelope will always be a new one. The inner envelope will be sealed and marked with the security category of the enclosure; if TOP SECRET it will also be marked "To be opened personally by" the holder of an appointment or the individual named. The outer envelope will not be marked with the category of the enclosure but will be blue crossed and the word "REGISTERED" written centrally at the top of the envelope. (but see sub-para 2(b) & (c) Above).

- (b). CONFIDENTIAL communications will be enclosed in two envelopes and the inner marked CONFIDENTIAL but not sealed. The outer envelope will be treated as described in preceding sub-para 4(a).

- (c). RESTRICTED and other unclassified communications will be dispatched in accordance with para 3 above (subject to sub-para 2(a)).

5. (a). The Message Center will give and take receipts for all TOP SECRET, SECRET, and CONFIDENTIAL packages. Receipts will NOT be given for packages or documents classified as RESTRICTED or unclassified.

(b). Departments should enclose with, and attach to, all TOP SECRET communications a receipt for signature and return by the recipient. Receipts may also be enclosed with any other documents, in respect of which, a department may desire direct acknowledgment by the recipient. Suitable forms of receipt may be obtained on application to the Adjutant's Department (Misc Section).

6. Without detriment to the needs of security (e.g. see para 4(a) above) no effort will be spared to exercise the strictest economy in the use of envelopes, by using gummed labels. In this way it will be possible to prolong the life of envelopes by their use again and again.

7. It will be appreciated that a most important and desirable result of the introduction of this procedure should be limitation of information to the minimum number of personnel and result in a standard of improved security.

1. Letter this headquarters, file as above, subject: "Non-Secret Short Title Unit Designations", dated 23 February 1944, is rescinded. Effective this date the use of non-secret short title unit designations is discontinued. In the future, either the full designation or an authorized abbreviation, as listed below, will be used in the heading and texts of messages to be transmitted by electrical means as well as in correspondence.

2. The list below is not intended to include all headquarters and units in the theater. It has been restricted to those to which traffic is particularly heavy and whose designation lends itself to an intelligible abbreviation. The list must be kept short enough to permit complete familiarity by all personnel who must use it. Therefore, additions to the list will be kept to the minimum.

3. The following abbreviations are authorized only in the interests of brevity. For convenience, the list is published in two parts; Part I lists units or organizations alphabetically, and Part II lists the abbreviations alphabetically.

TO : Lt. Col. E.B. Mayne, For SCAG AMG Fifth Army.

1. Reference ltr 205/14 March 20, 1944.
2. On Feb 18, Major Smith PBS, Quartermaster Class III, Major F.S. Fuller, and Lt. L.P. Arnold, AGC Agriculture Sub-Commission visited Mignano and contacted Capt. Goldsmith, CAO and informed him that a cooperative project between the PBS Quartermaster and AGC Agriculture was being prepared for the purpose of furnishing a supply of firewood to the Fifth Army. Suggestions and cooperation were solicited and obtained. Sites for operation were agreed upon.
3. Contract between PBS and Italian Contractor (Vincenzo Sgadri of Naples) was prepared and signed 22 February. This contract obligated contractor to harvest firewood for use by 5th. Army, work to be supervised by representative of Agriculture Sub-Commission (Lt. Arnold).
4. Feb. 23-Crew of workers was employed in Mignano and operations started within few days thereafter. In meantime, Lt. Arnold found that Capt. Goldsmith had been replaced by Major Sewell as CAO at Mignano.
5. AMGOT officials have been exceedingly helpful in establishing and facilitating the operation of this timber harvest project. Among other things your local officers helped develop the details involved in supplying supplementary rations authorized for workers on this project. They also cooperated in obtaining fodder necessary for the mules employed on the job.
6. Between 75 and 100 Italian workers are present employed. All were obtained from Mignano. Firewood is being delivered daily for use in 5th. Army hospitals and elsewhere. Because of terrain wood harvested must be transported across ravines by cable and also by mules to a

Herewith letter from the Adjutant here giving the authority - apparently American - for insertion of "Signed MacFarlane" in cables.

In my opinion "Commander or Chief of the Agency" can refer equally to either Heads of the Commission or Heads of Sub-Commissions and would thus appear to be an authority for adding the name of the Head of the office from whom the cables emanate only, and not for a second name as well.

In view of demands for economy in wording of signals it seems that to include the name of an authority who has not seen the signal is not in the best interest of the Service and that such inclusion should be reserved for occasions when it is desired to emphasise that the Chief Commissioner has himself initiated or authorised the signal.

1. As you are aware the official abbreviation for the Chief Administrative Officer at AFHQ has always been C.A.O. and that for the recently created post of Chief Administrative Officer at HQ A.A.I. is also C.A.O.

2. At a recent C.A.O.'s conference here the point was brought up that so far as military government is concerned the initials C.A.O. have been used to designate a Civil Affairs Officer and that while confusion was always likely to arise when the same initials denoted the Chief Administrative Officer here and a Civil Affairs Officer in the field the danger of confusion has been increased since the necessary appointment of a Chief Administrative Officer (C.A.O.) with HQ A.A.I.

3. In the circumstances it was desired that consideration should be given to the question of altering the abbreviated title of Civil Affairs Officer so that confusion could not arise.

4. Your comments on the above would be appreciated together with your suggestions to meet the point made above.

Offices of the A.C.C. are still forwarding documents indiscriminately to this Section of the Army Sub-Comm. It is emphasised that the ADVANCED H.Q. at Salerno deals with question of policy, political liaison and work with other Sub-Commissions of A.C.C. while the MAIN H.Q. at LEGHIE (near LEGGE) deals with the detailed reorganisation of the Italian Army.

A cable was sent from Main H.Q. on 13 Feb. addressed to all interested addressees. It has, however, been necessary to repeat it to FLAMBO, FREEDOM, FILFOF, and FAFIA. The latter was No. 2428 dated 3 Mar. Since that date, the Executive officer, Salerno, has framed a short notice in the Official Bulletin dated 13 Mar. On 14 Mar., there has been received from Information Division, Naples, a memorandum dated 31 Jan. by P89 on the Italian Army in Campania. A. FILEABLE AND ACTIONABLE FILING SYSTEM.

- 1 The requirements of every branch are different but the following suggestions can readily be adapted to any requirements.
- 2 Analyse the correspondence and determine the main heads into which the correspondence falls. To each head allot a number - which is an index number and not a file number.
- 3 To every subject which falls within the head allot a sub number e.g. if the number 57 is allotted to the subject "Italian Officials", all files dealing with Italian Officials will fall within that group and receive sub numbers e.g.
 - 57/ Italian Officials.
 - 1 Appointments
 - 2 Transfers etc.
- 4 A Policy file, which will contain nothing but the discussion with higher authority of questions of policy, the decisions reached and the instructions actually issued, may be distinguished by the addition of a letter A (or P for Policy if preferred) e.g. 57/1A. A special coloured cover is an advantage.
- 5 A Routine file which will contain all correspondence about the carrying out of the policy, enquiries and other routine administrative matters related to the subject may be distinguished by the addition of a letter B (or R for Routine if preferred). A special coloured cover is an advantage.
- 6 Action files. A new file is started and an individual number allotted for each distinct action e.g. the first appointment made are of Smith, Brown, Jones and Robinson, the files would be numbered 57/1.1, 57/1.2, 57/1.3, 57/1.4 and so on. Action files deal with particular incidents, they do not generally live very long, after not more than two or three weeks. Improvised paper covers are often sufficient as file covers.
- 7 Files are most conveniently stored vertically. If there are no filing cabinets, boxes can be made or improvised. Not only is this most convenient, but the cases take the office more mobile. 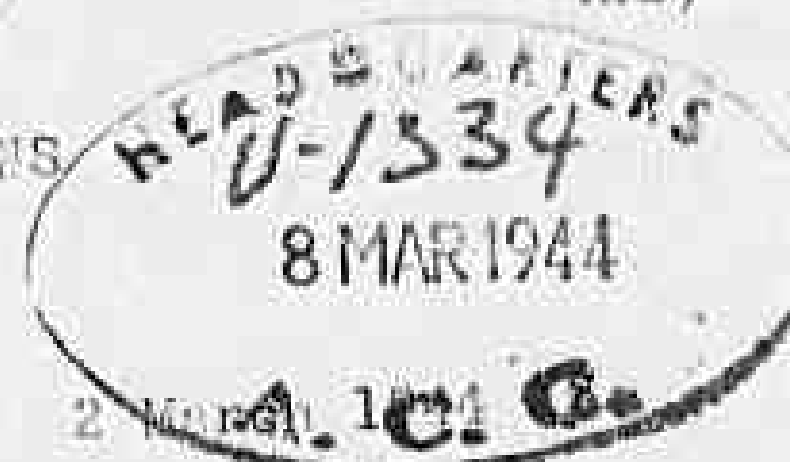

SUBJECT: Changes in AR 380-5 Affecting Security Classifications.

TO : All Concerned.

1. The Combined Chiefs of Staff have approved an agreement made between the American and British Services on the definition, classification, and handling of matters to be safeguarded. Procedures, names, definitions, and handling hereinafter set forth are to be put in effect by all War Department Offices and United States Army Headquarters at 0001Z, 15 March 1944.

2. Instructions to the same effect are being issued for the same effective date to the United States Navy and to the British Armed Forces.

3. It is contemplated that a complete revision of Army Regulations 380-5, embodying all the details of the agreement, will be printed and distributed by the War Department on or about 1 April 1944.

4. From 15 March 1944 to date of receipt of AR 380-5 revision, the policy hereinafter outlined will be followed by all concerned. No change in the classification of existing documents is necessitated by this agreement.

COMBINED SECURITY CLASSIFICATIONS AGREEMENT

5. Need for Classification. - To safeguard official matter, it must be examined and graded into categories so that it may be recognized and accorded proper handling. To grade matter accurately and uniformly, the following general policy and definitions have been agreed upon by the Combined Chiefs of Staff to become effective 15 March 1944. The detailed instructions based thereon will be issued by the several services concerned not later than 1 April 1944.

6. Definitions. - For the purpose of agreement, the following definitions apply:

- a. Documents - Any form of recorded information.
- b. Material - Any article, substance, or apparatus.
- c. Handling - Care in transmission and custody.
- d. Distribution - Extent of actual or authorized issue of specific matter.
- e. Cryptographic System - Code and/or cipher and instructions therefor.

f. Registered Matter (Document) - Any classified document or device registered usually by number and periodically accounted for.

g. Order of Battle - Important dispositions of our forces with the identities of the units and formations composing those forces in or adjacent to operational theaters.

h. Emblems of War - Any item used for war.

7. Categories. - Official matter requiring classification shall be examined and graded under one of the following categories:

- a. Top Secret (Signal abbreviation TOPSEC)
- b. Secret
- c. Confidential
- d. Restricted

8. The United States regards TOP SECRET as a subdivision of SECRET. On the other hand, the British regard TOP SECRET as a distinct category. Although this difference of view is recognized, it is immaterial to this agreement under which working uniformity is obtained by the adoption of agreed definitions, examples, and rules of treatment, for the handling of all classified matter.

9. Providing the following definitions and rules for handling are mutually accepted and rigorously implemented, the difficulties can be overcome.

10. Top Secret. - Certain secret documents, information, and material, the security aspect of which is paramount, and whose unauthorized disclosure would cause exceptionally grave damage to the nation shall be classified TOP SECRET.

11. The following are some examples of matter which will normally be graded TOP SECRET:

- a. Plans or particulars of future major or special operations.
- b. Particulars of important dispositions or impending moves of our forces or convoys in connection with a, above.
- c. Very important political documents dealing with such matters as negotiations for alliances and the like.
- d. Information of the methods used or success obtained by our Intelligence Services and Counter-Intelligence Services or which would imperil secret agents.

e. Critical information of new and important munitions of war, including approved scientific and technical developments.

f. Important particulars of cryptography and cryptanalysis.

12. Secret. - Documents, information, or material, the unauthorized disclosure of which would endanger the national security, cause serious injury to the interests or prestige of the nation, or any governmental activity thereof, or would be of great advantage to a foreign nation shall be classified SECRET.

13. The following are some examples of matter which will normally be graded SECRET:

a. Particulars of operations in progress.

b. Plans or particulars of operations not included under TOP SECRET.

c. Instructions regarding the employment of important new munitions of war.

d. Order of battle information and locations and moves affecting the order of battle.

e. Knowledge of enemy material and procedure, the value of which depends upon the enemy not knowing that we possess it.

f. Vital military information on important defenses.

g. Certain reports of operations containing information of vital interest to the enemy.

h. Adverse reports on general morale affecting major operations.

i. Important improvements to existing munitions of war until accepted for service.

j. Photographs of vulnerable points or vital installations under our control.

k. Certain development projects.

l. Important cryptographic devices unless assigned to a lower category.

14. Confidential. - Documents, information, or material, the unauthorized disclosure of which, while not endangering the national security, would be prejudicial to the interests or prestige of the nation, any governmental activity, an individual, or would cause administrative embarrassment, or difficulty, or be of advantage to a foreign nation shall be classified CONFIDENTIAL.

15. The following are some examples of matter which normally will be graded CONFIDENTIAL:

- a. Matters, investigations, and documents of a personal and disciplinary nature, the knowledge of which it is desirable to safeguard for administrative reasons.
- b. Routine operational and battle reports which do not contain information of vital interest to the enemy.
- c. Routine Intelligence reports.
- d. General military radio frequency allocations.
- e. Military coil signs, unless so collected together that they reveal the order of battle.
- f. Meteorological information of designated areas.
- g. Unit movements of non-operational significance in areas within or adjacent to operational theaters.
- h. Certain technical documents and manuals used for training, maintenance and inspection of important new munitions of war.
- i. General tactical lessons learned as a result of operations.
- j. Aerial photographs of territories under our control in or adjacent to operational theaters.

16. Restricted. - Documents, information, or material (other than TOP SECRET, SECRET, or CONFIDENTIAL) which should not be published or communicated to anyone except for official purposes shall be classified RESTRICTED.

17. The following are some examples of matter which will normally be graded RESTRICTED:

- a. Information of moves of non-operational significance in areas remote from theaters of war.
- b. Training and technical documents for official use only or not intended for release to the public.
- c. Certain routine documents relating to supply and procurement.
- d. Aerial photographs of territories under our control remote from operational theaters.

d. Photographs of enemy, enemy occupied or dominated areas except those which reveal secret sources.

f. Strength returns of units remote from operational theaters.

GENERAL PRINCIPLES

16. Grading. a. The designation of persons responsible for grading and re-grading will be a function of the proper authorities.

b. Each document should be graded according to its own content and not necessarily according to its relationship to another document. This also applies to extracts from graded documents.

c. The grading of a file or group of physically connected documents shall be that of the highest graded document therein.

19. Regrading. - It is the obligation of all authorities to keep classified matter constantly under review and to downgrade it as soon as conditions permit.

20. Transmission of Certain Messages by Electrical Means. - Messages which have been transmitted or are to be transmitted in a high grade cryptographic system of one nation will not be relayed or transmitted by the other nation between point of origin and destination by electrical means in clear language or unapproved "scrambler" system, or low-grade cryptographic system.

21. Handling (Treatment). - No person is entitled solely by virtue of his rank or position to acknowledge possession of classified matter. Such matter is entrusted only to those individuals whose official duties require such knowledge or possession.

22. SECRET. - Secret matter will be handled in accordance with the following rules:

a. The highest grade cryptographic systems available will be used for the transmission of secret messages.

b. Secret documents will be transmitted only by officially designated courier in double sealed envelopes, the inner one being marked SECRET, and will be opened only by the addressee or his authorized representative. Where officially designated courier service is not available, secret documents may be transmitted by registered mail service or airmail service superior to registered mail service, if the service is completely within national control.

c. Transmission and custody of these documents and material will normally be covered by a receipt system and registered documents and material will be accounted for. It is mandatory that registered documents be covered by a receipt system.

d. Secret messages will not be transmitted by electrical means in the clear, except over approved circuits and providing the rule in paragraph 20 is not violated.

electrical means in the clear.

c. It is mandatory that transmission and custody of such matter be
covered by a receipt system.

d. TOP SECRET documents will be handled only by persons specifically design-
ated and may not be disclosed to any person solely by virtue of his rank or office.

24. CONFIDENTIAL. - Confidential matter will be handled in accordance with
the following rules:

a. CONFIDENTIAL documents, except registered, will be transmitted by
approved official means. Registered confidential documents will be handled in the
same manner as registered secret documents.

b. It is the responsibility of the commissioned officer or equivalent
official holding custody of CONFIDENTIAL documents to insure that proper appropriate
security precautions are taken at all times.

25. RESTRICTED. - Restricted matter will be handled in accordance with the
following rules:

a. Restricted documents will be transmitted by such approved channels
as will provide a reasonable degree of security.

b. Registered restricted documents will be transmitted to and from
foreign countries in the same manner as registered secret documents.

I wish to bring to the notice of every officer personally a few aspects of the internal machinery of this Headquarters with respect to which their help is needed:-

1. Telegrams.

Outgoing telegrams amount to roughly 25 per day. When telegrams reach the Message Centre 4 copies of the literal text have to be typed. The telegram is then translated into telegraphic language of which 6 copies have to be made. The telegram is then sent to P.B.S. where it is enciphered and despatched. The same process is carried out at the receiving end.

It is appreciated that internal communications in this country are bad and that in order to ensure quick receipt and action on instructions, the use of the telegraph service is generally necessary. It is, however, probable that correspondence sent by Air Letter Service for A.F.H.Q. and other formations outside this theatre reaches its destination more speedily than if sent by telegraph and certainly involves far less work and manpower.

An Air Letter Service leaves for A.F.H.Q. daily and I must ask all officers to reduce their external telegraphic correspondence and to employ the A.L.S. Officer in charge of the Message Centre has orders to refer to me telegrams which appear to conflict with this policy.

2. Duplicating.

The average number of foolscap sheets issued by the duplicating office for this month is over 3000 a day, i.e., over 6 reams of paper. This is excessive and if present demands continue, shortage of paper will result in essential distribution being curtailed. The output of paper must be reduced considerably and immediately. The officer in charge has instructions to refer to the Establishment Branch any demands which he considers excessive.

1. Cables prepared for transmission to Hq, ACC, Brindisi will be addressed Fatima, Rear, and those for transmission to Hq, ACC, Salerno, will be addressed Fatima, Forward.
2. Six (6) copies of cables will be prepared in transmission text, four (4) in literal text for AG distribution. Extra copies may be prepared and marked to a particular Section or Sub Commission as required.
3. Cables addressed to "Freedom" will not repeat the code name in the body of the text. The text will show "to AFHQ", "to NATOUSA" (or to such other formation intended by the code "to Freedom") followed by the particular section for which the message is intended, (to AFHQ for MGS).
4. The classification of the message will be shown on top and bottom of sheet.
5. The Fargo cite number will be shown in upper right hand corner. Call Corporal Dionisio, extension 54, for serial number.
6. In the space provided for telephone number, Fargo telephone 10050 will be used.
7. A two-inch line will precede the typed message, which will be used by PBS for their cite number.

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE
RADIOS

The following operating procedure for radios is published for the guidance of all personnel of Headquarters, Peninsular Base Section and assigned or attached units, whose duties include preparing, processing or action on radios and other messages transmitted by electrical means. The policies herein described will be adhered to strictly. All previous directives or instructions of this Headquarters on this subject are rescinded.

I. INCOMING MESSAGES

1. Incoming messages addressed to Commanding General, Peninsular Base Section, will be processed by Signal Corps Message Center and then sent direct to the A.G. Radio Section.
2. Preparation of Message by Signal Corps Message Center.
 - a. Heading - Extract from body of message and place in heading information relative to headquarters of origin and to all headquarters to which the text indicated is pertinent for action and/or information; reference number and citation.
 - b. Body - Prepare message in normal form, using punctuation marks in place of "and", "or", etc.
3. Action by A.G. Radio Section.
 - a. Determine which staff sections have primary (action) or secondary (information) interest in the message.
 - b. Prepare sufficient copies of message, indicating which sections receive action and which information copies. Information copies will be kept to a minimum, consistent with assurance that each staff section interested receives one.
 - c. Deliver messages to the staff sections indicated, either by own messenger or through A.G. Message Center.
 - d. In event that a radio is referred to the wrong section for action, the recipient will notify the A.G. Radio Section of the error. The A.G. Radio Section will pick up the message, deliver a copy to the proper section and notify all sections that received copies of the message of the change.
 - e. When repetition of a message is directed or implied in the text, prepare a paraphrased message and forward to proper headquarters.
4. Action Copy. The section to which the message is referred for action is responsible for carrying through to completion whatever is required or implied, coordinating the work of all other sections involved.
5. Replies to Messages.
 - a. Messages requiring action will be answered promptly. No such message will remain unanswered more than 24 hours from time of receipt by the section. If necessary action cannot be completed within 24 hours, an answer will be sent within this period stating when it will be completed.
 - b. Replies calling for acknowledgment will be acknowledged immediately. The radio unit will determine whether acknowledgment is necessary, even though not specifically requested, bearing in mind the fact that advance information on what is being done and expected time of completion, will often be most helpful to the originator of the message.

5. Arabic numerals will be written out individually (358 will be written "three six eight"). Zero will be written zero and not naught.
6. Punctuation will be kept to a minimum necessary to insure clarity. When used, it will be spelled out except for authorized abbreviations.
7. If the address indicates various action and information addresses, they will also appear in the "inside address".
8. Text will include an "inside address". This address will either begin or end the text. It will state who the message is from and to whom it is sent. All messages originating in this headquarters are from "JTF-PS" or "CG JTF-PS". The name of the person composing the message will not be included, unless such person is not part of this headquarters or unless the inclusion of his name is essential to the clarity of the message. In such cases the name will be set off in parentheses (NAME (NAME)). Addressee will be designated either by naming the Commanding Officer of the headquarters to which the message is being sent or the official title, i.e., "TO JTF-PS", or "TO CG JTF-PS". In specific cases, where the particular individual or section is to be included, the name or section will be added. (JTF-PS TO JTF-PS (JTF-PS))
9. Originator's correspondence identification symbol will be cited in the text.
10. When it is necessary to include the contents of another message, extracts will be paraphrased. Verbatim quotations will not be made for retransmission.
11. a. All outgoing messages will be prepared in six copies. Three copies will be prepared for transmission as outlined above and three copies will be prepared in "literal text". Notation will be made on 3rd copy of transmission text (AG File Copy) as to number of the incoming message being answered. The number (AG File Number) appearing at the bottom of each incoming message will be the number used. (See Appendix C)
- b. In preparing the literal text copies of outgoing messages the following procedure will be followed:
 1. Heading will remain the same.
 2. Address will be the headquarters instead of the location of the headquarters.
 3. No "inside address".
 4. Single letters of the alphabet and groups of letters will not be spelled phonetically. Numbers will not be spelled out.
 5. Punctuation will be written normally.
 6. Message will be typed in lower case letters, using capitals where they would normally be used. (See Appendix D)
4. Approval.
 - a. The Chief of Section or Service originating the message will initial the AG File Copy. (3rd copy of transmission text)
 - b. In addition, the Adjutant General will clear for dispatch only messages which are also approved by and bear the written initials of one of the following: Commanding General, Executive, Asst. Executive, S-1, S-2, S-3, S-4, Finance Officer, and Adjutant General. Sections will accordingly route messages through the appropriate channels. The initials of the approving officer will appear on the AG File Copy.

5. "Follow-up" of Outgoing Messages.
It is the responsibility of the Section originating an outgoing message to insure that a reply is received within a reasonable time, whenever such reply is requested or called for by the contents of the message. When a reply or acknowledgment has not been received within four days after dispatch of message, the section concerned will prepare and send a tracer, requesting a prompt reply.

STEREOTYPED WORDS AND PHRASES

1. No word is inherently stereotyped. Words and phrases become stereotyped through repeated use in the same connection. The volume of cryptologic traffic now being handled makes it increasingly important that stereotyped terminology be avoided in the drafting of messages.

2. Certain words, such as phonetics, numerals and designations of rank, are extremely stereotyped and will not be used at the beginning or end of a message. The list of words following will not be used for beginnings or endings of classified messages:

- Compass directions (North, East, etc.)
- Correspondence symbols
- Months and Dates
- Numbers (One, Two, Three, etc.)
- Phonetics (Able, Baker, etc.)
- Ranks, Grades, Titles (Commanding General, Captain, Private, etc.)
- "Re" Words (Reurad, Retel, Request, Reply, etc.)
