1. PASTORALIA, KIVOS, and LEPIDONIA islands were expressly excluded from the territory handed back to the Italian Government on 11 JUN 44, and have remained under A.M.S. but under the direction of Regional Commissioner, Region A.M.S.C.

2. Allied Military Government on the islands has been conducted in PASTORALIA (population approx 10,000) by Lt CASPARINI and in KIVOS and LEPIDONIA (population also approx 10,000) by Lt PASCALINI.

3. Owing to distances and lack of transport (motor boat), it appears impracticable to administer two separate groups of islands by one officer. It is however wasteful of man-power to leave two A.M.S.C.s in these small territories which appear nevertheless to be important from a naval and strategic point of view.

4. It is requested that this question be given consideration and perhaps referred to higher authority. Owing to the strategic importance of these islands, a more satisfactory control might be maintained by Lt Governor MIRA who could dispatch officers to the islands at necessary intervals. There is already constant communication from MIRA to the islands for trade purposes. An alternative solution would be to administer the islands from PASTORALIA.

SUBJECT: Reasons for HQ Region IV remaining in Rome

FILE No: R4/323.3

1. I understand that the question of the possible move of HQ Region IV from Rome is under discussion. I have, since arrival in Rome, considered very carefully this possibility and I have come to the certain conclusion that such a move would cause serious inefficiency.
2. The Compartimento of Lazio (the provinces of Littoria, Frosinone, Roma, Rieti and Viterbo) forms in the civil life of Italy a geographical entity which in every aspect centers in Rome. In Rome are the head offices and senior officials of every State, Pari Statal or industrial organization which operates out of Rome into the surrounding country.
3. I attach a list of some only of the bodies, operating throughout Lazio, which have their head offices in Rome.
4. The Governate of Rome has been separated from the remainder of Region IV.
5. In many matters, however, the problems of the Governate and of Region IV will closely intertwine, and if chaos and friction are to be avoided the two Regional Commissioners and Staffs must be in constant touch. To use a homely parallel, for Region IV to attempt to run Lazio from Viterbo, Fiumi or Orvieto would be like trying to run Essex, Middlesex, Herts, Bucks, Kent, Surrey and Sussex from Canterbury. It wouldn't work.
6. I cannot believe that the small and very carefully pruned Headquarters Staff of Region IV presents a serious accommodation problem. I feel bound to urge that HQ Region IV remains in Rome.

DIRECTIVE TO THE PROVINCIAL COMMISSIONER:

1. You are being asked to take over a large task with a limited number of officers. You will only be able to achieve satisfactory results if you concentrate on essentials, avoid dissipation of energies and interest, and practice a rigid economy in men and material.
2. Your Province presents many features new in the history of A.C.C. Parts have been heavily ravaged by war, there has been a violent displacement of population, and an almost complete destruction of industry. Some of the inhabitants are undernourished and destitute of the bare necessities of life.
3. On the other hand the war has moved swiftly away to the north and it is likely that before long the armies will also have moved to northerly battles, leaving only a few scattered maintenance units strung along the main highway.
4. Problems of military security and the necessity for protecting army stores and installations from theft and pilferage will not bulk large.
5. Your efforts should therefore be bent towards reconstruction. Everything possible must be done towards restoring life to normalcy. Restrictive regulations should be reduced to a minimum. It will be necessary to transfer responsibility to Italian Officials and to encourage them to assume it.
6. The following will be your particular tasks:
 - a) To encourage agriculture and to secure the maximum return from the present harvest. This may involve special arrangements for getting labour on the fields.
 - b) To gather the required proportion of the crops into the Granai Pubblici.

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6. The following will be your particular tasks:

a) To encourage agriculture and to secure the maximum return from the present harvest. This may involve special arrangements for getting labour on the fields.

c) To clear debris from damaged villages and especially to remove all decaying matter. Clearance must take precedence over rebuilding and health must take precedence over amenities. The psychological value of a tidy main street cannot be over-emphasised.

d) To reestablish Italian Courts. Enforcement of law and order should be left to the Carabinieri and to Italian Magistrates. AMG Courts should only be used for serious offences and for offences against Allied Personnel and Property.

e) It is anticipated that "Defascistisation" will already have taken effect. If, however, there remain officials of doubtful antecedents, they must be removed.

7. The Regional Policy in respect of price regulation, control of rebuilding, control of prostitution, etc., will be to induce and encourage the Italian Authorities to apply their own laws. These laws exist and are adequate to deal with the situation if properly and firmly applied.

8. Every effort should be made to encourage the opening of branches of Banks, particular of the Banco di Italia, and the office of the Intendente di Finanzia, the latter two agencies are vital in the proper financing of Communes and Provinces. The opening of Post Offices for financial services only should be encouraged.

It is the policy of A.C.C. that new funds placed in circulation be held to a minimum in view of the dangers of inflation and that Communes and Provinces be financed through the Banco di Italia at the earliest possible moment.

9. As a part of the general policy of economy of force, you should group your officers in pairs or threes in three - or not more than four - localities in the Province. These subdivisions of your Province should be called 'Groups' of Communes (Aggruppamenti di Comuni). The use of this phrase will avoid the need for the words "District" or "Area". Both of these have technical military meanings.

10. The Headquarters Office of each group should be efficiently organized with two or three Allied Officers and an adequate Italian Staff. This Italian Staff should include Carabinieri, clerks, interpreters if necessary, mechanic to look after the cars. It may be found desirable to secure the paid services of an Italian Doctor or Engineer, but normally all technical or professional work should be done through Italian channels.

Any Red Cross workers in the territory should as a general rule live at "Group Headquarters".

11. From this "Group Headquarters", every day, one or more Allied Officers should go out on tour of the Communes of the group. Italian Officials will certainly be short of transport and it may be advisable on many occasions to take them with Allied Officers when they make tours. This policy of using Allied transport to help Italian Officials must also be followed at Provincial Headquarters.

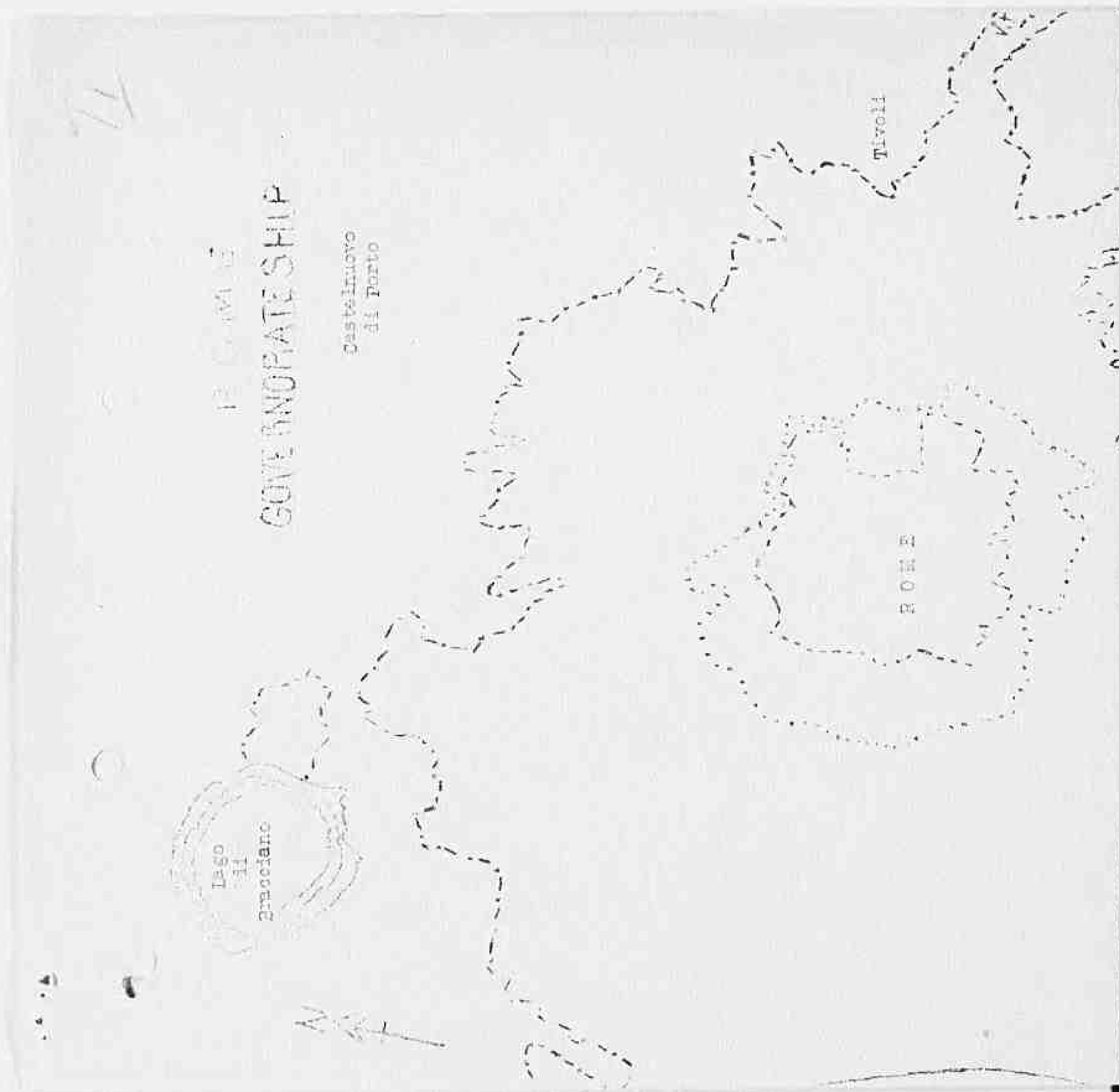

GRAIN DRIVEPastoral Letter of Archbishop of Acerenza & Matera, to be read in all Churches and Chapels of the Archdiocese.

TO All Parish Priests and Clergy of the Archdiocese.

While all the energies of responsible Authority, and of the more worthy sons of our ~~off-our~~ martyred Motherland are directed towards the re-establishing of normal civic life, we should be lacking in our duty as Pastor, if we abstained from sending, once more, through you who are so near the people and share intimately their anxieties and sacrifices, a word of exhortation to them to exercise the utmost conscientiousness in consigning all the grain of the coming harvest to the GRANAI DEL POPOLO.

This institution arises from the necessity of ensuring to the Nation the bread indispensable to its livelihood, and of preventing an increase in suffering and the danger of disorder.

1. Now that the occupation of Littoria Province is almost complete, among the problems which present themselves are certain major 'long-term' ones. The most important of these are 1) The Pontine floods, with which is closely connected 2) agricultural development and 3) Malaria control, also 4) Economics and Supply, (The latter is not intended to refer to the immediate distribution of food and medicaments, which is the function of AMG Fifth Army, but to the rehabilitation of civilian agencies and the reorganisation of the economic life of the Province).
2. AMG Fifth Army is primarily a 'spearhead' organisation and does not dispose of the necessary personnel to handle 'long-term' rehabilitation. Furthermore, if the tactical situation develops rapidly, the Province may pass out of Army Area at an early date.
3. I am writing therefore to propose that Region IV personnel take in hand the 4 questions mentioned above.
4. If you agree, it will be advisable for the personnel of Region IV concerned to proceed to the Province as soon as possible, (I understand your Agricultural and Medical Officer have already gone forward to study matters on the spot).
5. It is considered that these activities will need to be coordinated and that this can best be done through the Provincial Commissioner, who is at present based at Gaeta, but who will be installed in Littoria in a few days.

POLICY LETTER: Field Activities of Regional Staff.

TO : Provincial Commissioners and All Special Staff Officers, Region V

Status of Regional Staff on Regional Duty in Foggia and Other Provinces under Jurisdiction of Region V

In order to clarify the position of Region V special staff officers on duty in Foggia and other provinces, the following policy is set forth and will form the basis of all operational functions of Region V staff officers on required Regional duty in such provinces:

1. Region V staff officers continue as such wherever they may be sent on official Regional business; they do not accordingly lose their Regional status nor are their responsibilities altered by performing their duties in the provinces of the Region, however long their stay may be in such provinces.
2. Regional staff performing duties in a province are responsible to the Regional Commissioner for the proper execution of such duties and not to the Provincial Commissioner. They do not become staff officers of the province, nor shall they be required to perform any provincial special staff duty not in conformity with their mission while in such province, unless specifically required to do so by the Regional Commissioner.
3. Regional staff officers, when directed by the Regional Commissioner to proceed to Foggia or other Region province, will present themselves as soon as practicable after their arrival to the Provincial Commissioner and apprise him of their mission and the probable field of their proposed operations, together with duration of stay and location of temporary headquarters. They will also inform the PC that they are prepared to render desired assistance to him during their stay consistent with their mission or to furnish information obtainable to them in connection with their specialty.
4. As soon as practicable after completion of their duties, Regional staff officers will make a brief verbal or written report to the Provincial Commissioner of the result of their activities in the province.
5. The Provincial Commissioner will be expected to facilitate the operations of the Regional staff officers in his province by furnishing, if required, transportation, arranging conferences with civilians and otherwise furthering the full accomplishment of the Regional staff officers' mission.
6. The Regional Commissioner expects all staff officers of the Region and the Provincial Commissioners to aim at whole-hearted co-operation in carrying out the above-enunciated policy.

6. This project has been discussed with Brigadier Moseley, Commander 55 Area. He will, at a later date, be Area Commander for the above mentioned territory. He is in complete agreement.

SUBJECT: Administration of Regions.

TO : R.C.'s. Regions I, II, III VI and VII.

1. It is the Chief Commissioner's policy gradually to decrease the staffs of Allied Officers in Italian Government territory in order that their services may be available in forward Regions. The Combined Chiefs of Staff have imposed an extremely limited ceiling on the Commission and, as I explained at the last Regional Commissioners' conference, the ceiling is not likely to be increased as we advance through Italy and occupy more territory. If we are to do this job satisfactorily it means that Regional staffs in Italian Government territory will be progressively cut until very few officers remain.

2. It seems to me that officers will regard transfers forward with mixed feelings. There will be some who, having watched the present Italian administration grow from infancy up to its moderately satisfactory state, will maintain a natural and paternal interest in the progress of the child and will be loathe to leave it before it has advanced further towards maturity. There are others who, impatient of the frustration that often comes to those in an advisory capacity, are anxious to leave and to serve in an executive capacity under Military Government.

3. When selecting officers for transfer I want Regional Commissioners to exercise great care in ensuring that the officers left behind are those most fitted for the work of continuing advice and guidance. These will not necessarily always be those who wish to stay; those who are anxious to go forward may often be the best candidates for retention in Italian Government territory. Their duty must be made plain to them.

4. Remembering, therefore, that advisory work is far more difficult and needs infinitely more patience and experience than executive work, Regional Commissioners should study the problem in order that they may select the best men for the more difficult work.

"1. The organization is being delayed to a marked extent by the slowness with which personnel ordered have arrived. Among those who have not reported and for whom we have orders are Lt. Col. Massey from Region V, and Capt. Macypenny, Lieut. Arizzi and Lieut. Tipping, all of Region II. I would appreciate anything you can do to hasten the arrival of these officers. Dear Brigadier,

I returned here April 29th with a few members of my staff whom I could bring with me. The transport and the remaining members available at the time arrived Sunday, April 30th.

Most of the week has been used setting up the Headquarters ~~post~~ with reference to material and personnel requirements. I have gotten office space, billets and some clerical assistance. The clerical situation is not easy because three other Allied agencies were already here and have combed over the available personnel quite thoroughly. However, everyone is being helpful and we are making some progress in that direction.

I had Provincial Commissioners and their primary Staff Officers here yesterday for a conference which, by the way, Colonel Todd of Industry and Commerce attended because he happened to be here at the time. We threshed out many of our local problems and I was able to give the Provincial Commissioners the data collected at the last Regional Conference. As a result of this provincial conference I am confirming my previous opinion that there is a great deal to be done here before this region will run in a systematic and effective manner.

There was a disturbance in a small town in Reggio province in connection with May Day activities. One man who had stabbed a carabinieri was shot and killed. As you suggested and as tentatively arranged with Colonel Spicer, I am attending, on Tuesday, May 9th, the last day of the Administration School course. At the expense of considerable inconvenience I sent my Administrative Officer and Assistant to take the full course. While their absence handicapped me to a certain extent during this first week I felt that their absence could be better spared than later and that they will be much better prepared to perform their duties when they do arrive than they otherwise would have been.

With the efficient work of the Finance Officer who has been assigned to this Region, Major Hall, I expect that the deplorable situation with regard to supply accounting will be materially improved very shortly.

I realize the importance of having all such things regularized henceforth and will also use my staff to clear up past deficiencies so far as practicable.

2. This responsibility includes all aspects of civil administration and supply under AMG/AGC operation.

3. Any particular measures which the S.C.A., Fifth Army requires to be put into effect will be notified by AMG Fifth Army to the Regional Commissioner, Naples, or, if urgency demands, directly to the Principal Provincial Officer, Northern Division, for action.

4. Copies of reports of C.A.Gs of Region III dealing with conditions within Fifth Army area, also copies of proclamations and orders affecting the area, will be sent to H.Q., AMG Fifth Army (Field), for information.

To : Civil Affairs Branch.

1. I understand that there is confusion of thought regarding the administration of communes on the edge of 5 Army area and Region III area.
2. The responsibility for administration in Army areas is plain and there has never been any change, nor is any change contemplated on this matter. The SCAG of the 5th Army is responsible for the administration within the whole of the Army area.
3. As the Army rear line goes forward, however, the static Region in the rear of the Army necessarily takes over the administration. It is necessary, therefore, that officers of the static Region should be attached to the Army AG before the Army goes forward in order that there may be continuity of administration. Such officers could be withdrawn from the static Region, attached to the Army AG, and eventually returned to their parent Region.
4. There should be no confusion of thought on this principle which works perfectly reasonably and successfully between 8 Army AG and Region V. Will you please arrange for a meeting between yourself, Brig. Gen. Hume and Colonel Poletti, in order that this may be crystallised once and for all. I will be present if you think it necessary.
