MOVEMENT OF HEADQUARTERS

1. Main Headquarters Region IX AMG, plus attached personnel will join Forward Headquarters Region IX on 24 September 1944. Main Headquarters will close at present location at 1200 hours on 24 September 1944, and open at new location at F. 0264, Sheet 13 at 1201 hours on 24 September 1944.

2. The movement will be accomplished as follows:

- Serial 1 - consisting of personnel, supplies and vehicles as shown in Appendix 1 will entruck at 0455 hours at Caserma on 24 September 1944, and move out at 0500 hours under command of Major Spahn.
- Serial 2 - consisting of personnel, supplies and vehicles as shown in Appendix 2 will entruck at 0555 hours at Officers Mess on 24 September 1944 and move off at 0600 hours under command of Major Carillo.
- Serial 3 - consisting of personnel supplies and vehicles as shown in Appendix 3 will entruck at 0655 hours at Officers Mess and move out at 0700 hours under command of Major Hough.
- Serial 4 - consisting of personnel supplies and equipment as shown in Appendix 4 will entruck at 0655 hours at Officers Mess on 26 September 1944, and move off at 0700 hours under command of Lt. Riccomini.

MOVEMENT OF HEADQUARTERS

1. Main Headquarters Region IX AMG, plus attached personnel will join Forward Headquarters Region IX on 24 September 1944. Main Headquarters will close at present location at 1200 hours on 24 September 1944, and open at new location at R 0264, Sheet 13 at 1201 hours on 24 September 1944.

2. The movement will be accomplished as follows:

- a. Serial 1 - consisting of personnel, supplies and vehicles as shown in Appendix 1 will entruck at 0455 hours at Caserma on 24 September 1944, and move out at 0500 hours under command of Major Spahn.
- b. Serial 2 - consisting of personnel, supplies and vehicles as shown in Appendix 2 will entruck at 0555 hours at Officers Mess on 24 September 1944 and move off at 0600 hours under command of Major Corillio.
- c. Serial 3 - consisting of personnel supplies and vehicles as shown in Appendix 3 will entruck at 0655 hours at Officers Mess and move out at 0700 hours under command of Major Hough.
- d. Serial 4 - consisting of personnel supplies and equipment as shown in Appendix 4 will entruck at 0655 hours at Officers Mess on 24 September 1944, and move off at 0700 hours under command of Lt. Riccomini.
3. All EM/OR personnel will be provided with haversack rations for the noon meal by the EM/OR mess, and the Officers' Mess will provide haversack rations for officer personnel.
4. Uniform will be worn as follows:
American Officers and Enlisted Men - Wool O.D.
British Officers and Other Rates - Battle Dress.
5. Route will be Route 71 to Route 69, Route 69 to Route 70, to Consuma, Italy, right at Consuma to Vallombrosa, Italy, to Saltino, Italy.
6. Additional instructions pertaining to this move may be issued as the situation demands by the respective Serial Commanders and by this Headquarters, either verbally or by memorandum to the personnel concerned.

TO : HQ. Allied Control Commission
 RC and MG Section.

1. There is no wish for this HQ to become tiresome by reason of its insistence but there are two matters on which we again approach you because our task could be made so very much easier by your acquiescence.

2. We again ask for permission to open up postal and telegraphic facilities in Terni and Viterbo Provinces. With our very reduced Staff and with the Prefects still working short-handed, the work of AMG would be aided considerably.

3. The second point, on which we understand that the first depends, is the old question of the Rear Army Control Line. We understand the desire to choose a convenient lateral physical feature but submit, with great respect, that as it is impossible to check more than the roads which cross the line (we know that there is no difficulty in getting anything but vehicles across between the posts) the convenience of a lateral road is theoretical, and that an administrative line is very little less trouble in practice. Taking an administrative line reduces the work of our depleted Staff enormously.

4. The ideal from our point of view will be when the Control Line runs along the northern boundaries of Grosseto and Perugia as, in order to supply Rome, these Provinces are very important. We realize that going that far is probably still quite out of the question and ask for the following compromise at least.

(a) Line to run along northern boundary of Terni and Viterbo and permission granted to this HQ to give permits for food trucks

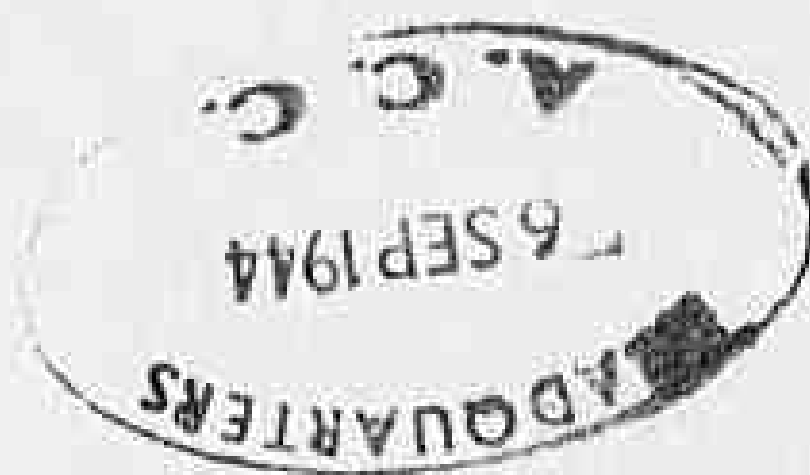

1. Siena Province lies largely outside 5th Army Area, but the city of Siena and the northern part of the province are at present still north of the rear Army boundary.

2. Much consideration has been given to the A.M.G. set-up that is best applicable to existing circumstances. While this Headquarters is unable to delegate its responsibility for any part of the Army area, it is thought that the administration of the Province of Siena should be handled as a whole by the Region. It is therefore proposed that administrative control of the province be handed to Region VIII with effect from 0001 hours 3rd September 1944, subject to the provision that all matters of policy which may in any way affect the responsibility of S.C.A.O. Fifth Army to the Army Commander must be referred to this Headquarters for decision. This applies in particular to matters such as civilian movement and communications in which the question of security is involved.

I am directed by the FLAS OFFICER WESTERN ITALY to bring the following facts to your notice with regard to the above Island, for your information and such action as you consider necessary.

2. About 14 days ago His Majesty's Ship "STORROWAY" put a landing party ashore on the Island of GIANNUERI where a total of eleven inhabitants were discovered, of whom 2 were males of military age and 5 were children. Two of the children showed signs of infantile paralysis and one had T.B. All of them appeared undernourished.
3. A small supply of corned beef and ships biscuits was landed from the Ship's stores to assist the population, who were in a pitiful state. It was learned that there is no supply of sugar on the island, nor any white flour or fats. A few milk cows and fowls were, however, found upon the island.
4. Threshing has now to be done by hand as the threshing machine was rendered useless by the Germans. Further evidence of German brutality was shown by the gutting of all houses of bedding, furniture and household utensils. Telephone and radio communications have been removed.
5. Rear-Admiral MORSE is of the opinion that the above facts should be brought immediately before you in order that steps may be taken to alleviate the sufferings of these unfortunate people.

Italy.

1. With effect from 0001 hrs 15 August 1944 the provinces of LITTORIA, FROSINONE and ROME, including the city of ROME, will be handed over to Italian government and jurisdiction.
2. Apart from certain reserved rights mentioned in paras 4 - 9 below, Allied Military Government in this territory comes to an end.
Proclamations and orders of the Military Governor are no longer operative and no such proclamations or orders can be issued in the future.
3. Officers of the Allied Control Commission in this territory will be present in an advisory and not in an executive capacity. One of their most important functions will be to act as Liaison between the Allied Forces and the Italian administrative officials. Normally all dealings with the Italian administration will be conducted through officers of the A.C.C.

4. Requisitioning

The Allied Forces retain the right to requisition private and public property and services. This right will be exercised sparingly, and only for reasons of genuine military necessity. It will be exercised invariably through the Italian authorities; in the case of the city of ROME the SINDACO. The usual formalities of requisitioning will be strictly followed.

5. Military Courts

Normally all crimes will be tried under Italian law in Italian courts. The Allied Forces, however, have reserved the right to try by Allied Military Courts Italians who commit acts seriously hostile to the Allied Forces. Such cases will be prepared and dealt with by A.C.C.

Consequent upon this reservation, the Allied Forces further reserve the power to arrest persons who are believed to have committed such offences.

Arrests of Italian officers or officials will only be carried out with the collaboration of the appropriate Italian officials, and normally only after agreement with the local A.C.C. officer.

6. Internment

The Allied Forces may continue to hold, or require the Italian Government to hold, in custody, military or civilian internees. If any person is required to be arrested for security or other reasons, the arrest should be carried out in collaboration with Italian officials, unless in any particular case it is thought that a request to the Italian police would be ineffectual. In any case the local A.C.C. officer must, except in emergency, be informed beforehand.

SECRET9. Use of Troops in Aid of the Civil Power

In the event of the Italian authorities requesting assistance in quelling civil disturbances, such requests should, except in emergency, be referred to this HQ. In any case it will be pointed out to the Italian authorities that the control of riots or disturbances is the responsibility of the Italian administration, and assistance will be refused unless it is necessary for the protection of Allied Military interests. Further, they will be warned that the territory in question will be made forthwith an Allied Military Zone. Whenever possible the local A.C.C. officer will be consulted before assistance is given.

Except in cases of extreme emergency which require immediate action by the Allied forces for their protection and security, all cases should be referred through this H.Q. to the Regional or Provincial Commissioner. In cases, in which for emergency reasons action is taken without prior reference, this H.Q. will be informed at the earliest possible moment.

10. Assistance to Italian Authorities

Apart from the powers and rights prescribed above, it is to be borne in mind that the transfer of territory to the Italian Government is made as part of the policy of the Allied Nations to re-establish responsible Government in Italy.

It is the duty of all Allied officers to do all in their power to assist central and local Government authorities to acquire and maintain authority; they must take steps to ensure that all ranks under their command avoid any thoughtless action which may undermine the authority and position of the police, the SINDACO, or the central Government.

TO : R.O. Region VIII (for P.L.O.).

11 AUG Read

1. The decision to make one Legal Officer responsible for both the Provinces of Pisa and Lucca is likely to cause considerable delay in the reorganization of the Italian legal system in those Provinces, and it is urgently requested that a second officer be made available to go into Lucca and thus permit Lieutenant Nevans to carry on the work in Pisa Province, on which he has already made an excellent start.

2. The liberation of Pisa City and the various towns in the Arno Valley to which Court personnel and records have been evacuated will mean a great deal of work for the P.L.O. Pisa, as practically the whole legal organization of the Province is concentrated in that area. If he is to do that work properly, he will not be able to give any time to legal affairs in Lucca at any rate for the first few weeks, whereas from the military standpoint it is quite likely that the two cities may be occupied within a few days of one another and his services may be required in Lucca almost immediately. In view of the special problems of Livorno and Piombino, the P.L.O. Livorno is unlikely to be available to help in Pisa Province at present.

3. While the difficulties occasioned by the shortage of legal officers are appreciated, it is considered essential that every Provincial team should have its own legal officer at any rate in the initial stages of occupation, when the task of reestablishing the Italian Courts is heaviest. Once these Courts are functioning, their work and the conduct of any A.M.C. Courts in the area can probably be satisfactorily supervised by one P.L.O. covering two Provinces, and other legal officers be released in this way to go forward to new Provinces.

4. If no additional Legal Officers can be made available from any other source, will you please consider whether any internal reorganization could be effected in Grosseto and Siena Provinces, which would release an officer to look after Lucca until such time as Lt. Nevans is ready to take that Province over as well as Pisa.

1. Owing to a shortage of legal officers, it has been decided by A.C.C. H.C. that the legal divisions with A.M.G. 5th and 8th Armies should be closed and the Senior Legal Officers withdrawn for other work. This decision, which becomes effective forthwith, renders necessary the following changes in the method of handling A.M.G. legal matters in 5th Army Area.

2. A.M.G. Courts.

(i) Summary: If CAOs need assistance in the trial of cases in Corps Areas, Corps SCAOs will call upon the Provincial Legal Officer of the Province, in which the offence occurred, who will take such action as the circumstances may demand. Behind the Corps boundary, the Provincial Legal Officer will continue to be responsible for the proper handling of all cases in the Army Area, either directly or through the Provincial CAOs.

(ii) Superior and General: Application for the convening of a Superior or a General Court in the Army Area will be made to this HQ which will refer to the appropriate Regional Legal Officer for the nomination of duly qualified officers and for compliance with the requirements of Article 2 of the Consolidated Instructions.

All records of trials held in areas under control of AMG 5th Army and all Applications for Review received will be forwarded as soon as practicable by the trial-Court direct to the Provincial Legal Officer of the Province within which the trial was held, and will be dealt with by him in accordance with such instructions as he may from time to time receive from the Regional Legal Officer of his Region.

4. Reports.

Monthly reports, and interim reports on Italian Courts and Judicial Officials will be submitted by Provincial Legal Officers through the usual channels to the Regional Legal Officer of the Region with copies to this H.C. for information. As no detailed legal reports will in future be rendered by this H.C. to A.C.C. H.C., all necessary information and statistics regarding legal activities in the Army Area will be transmitted to the Legal Sub-Commission through the Regional Legal Officer. Provincial Commissioners will keep this H.C. informed of progress made by reference in their situation reports.

5. General Matters.

Provincial Legal Officers should refer direct to their Regional Legal Officers for advice on any legal problems of a technical nature or on matters affecting the conduct or procedure of

A.M.G. or Italian Courts, keeping of Records, returns etc. There a question of policy in the Army Area is concerned, the matter will be referred to this HQ through the Provincial Commissioner for decision and any technical points involved will be taken up by this HQ with the Regional Legal Officer.

6. Supplies.

Corps S.C.P.O.s should apply to Provincial Legal Officers for supplies of any Legal Forms required but will continue to draw Proclamations & General Orders through this HQ. It will be borne in mind that only Proclamations Nos 1 - 4, Notices 1 & 2 and General Orders Nos. 1 and 26 will be posted in the Army Area unless express instructions are issued by this HQ.

My dear John.

Very many thanks for your typically charming letter of the 23rd of July, about the style to be employed for the second in command of a Region.

One point which, perhaps, I have omitted to make clear in the frequent raillery we have had on this subject, is that the style of "Deputy" was employed by me only after securing the approval of our late Chief Commissioner. I see from my diary that it was on 24 March 44 that I visited the Chief Commissioner on first taking over Region IV. On that occasion I explained to him how I intended to work with my senior American colleague, and that I should like to make his position clear by the use of the phrase "Deputy". General Mason MacFarlane, at that time, completely agreed. It is clear he did not leave any written instructions in this matter, and therefore our only evidence, is my own recollection of a long distant interview. I have never felt entirely satisfied with the use of the word "Executive" - it is a purely American term - indeed I believe I am right in saying that it is quite a modern innovation in the U.S. Army - Both the word and the position of the office holder are not easily translated into equivalents in the British Army, or for that matter, the Armies of France, Poland or Italy.

It may be assumed that my work in the future will be chiefly within an Eighth Army Area. I can foresee the necessity for frequent explanation that "Executive Officer" is not equivalent for a British Adjutant or GSO 1, but that it is in fact a second in command. I believe that the Brigadier General who now serves in most U.S. Infantry Divisions is not known as

the Divisional Executive Officer, but is the Assistant Divisional Commissioner. You will see this follows the same lines of thought as my own suggestion that the second in command of Regional Staff should be called "Deputy" or, if you like, "Assistant Regional Commissioner", using a terminology which is easily understood by both American and British Armies.

Having said all this, I assure you that I am a very well disciplined officer, and I shall do exactly what the Acting Chief Commissioner wants. Later on, perhaps, we might raise the question, as a matter of interest, at some Chief Commissioner's Conference.

1. I had an interesting farewell visit today from Emilio LUSSU who, as you may be aware, has been touring Sardinia for about a fortnight and I am sending you the following resume of the interview because I feel that Emilio LUSSU may make much political capital out of his visit.
2. Emilio LUSSU has not been in Sardinia since 1927 and though he admitted that to some extent he was comparing the Sardinia of today with the island as he knew it many years ago he insisted that most miserable conditions existed in the island at the present time and that conditions were far worse than on the mainland.
3. His remarks fell under the following main headings:-
 - (a) Lack of shoes and clothing.
 - (b) Malaria and lack of drugs and of treatment facilities.
 - (c) Fascism and corruption.
 - (d) Italian Army.
 - (e) Starvation.

Shoes and Clothing. LUSSU described conditions as pitiable. Very many workers, particularly miners and agricultural workers, were without shoes. There was an appalling scarcity of clothing among women and children in many of the villages.

2. Emilio LUSSU has not been in Sardinia since 1927 and though he admitted that to some extent he was comparing the Sardinia of today with the island as he knew it many years ago he insisted that most miserable conditions existed in the island at the present time and that conditions were far worse than on the mainland.

- (e) Starvation.

Shoes and Clothing. LUSSU described conditions as pitiable. Very many workers, particularly miners and agricultural workers, were without shoes. There was an appalling scarcity of clothing among women and children in many of the villages.

I agreed with LUSSU that boot and shoe conditions were bad but I did not feel that the picture was as bad as the one he painted. Most workers appeared to have some form of shoes even though they might only be wooden sandals or old shoes in bad state of repair.

I explained that the situation was known to all authorities concerned but in view of supplies required for the prosecution of the war it was unlikely that shoes in any quantity would become available to civilians at this stage.

As regards clothing I informed him that 23 tons of American Red Cross clothing were on the point of being distributed free to the population and that this would alleviate the situation to some extent. I did not agree that the state of affairs was as bad as he said.

Malaria. LUSSU insisted that malaria conditions were very bad particularly in certain areas. He stressed the absence of quinine and lack of clinics for dealing with malaria. I convinced him that quinine was not now available. As regards substitutes I explained that available supplies did not permit of a general distribution to the civil population for repressive treatment. As regards clinics he agreed that allowing for the exigencies of war the situation was no worse than it was before the war. I pointed out to him that this year, based on Italian statistics, the malaria incidence so far was appreciably lower than in recent years.

Fascism and Corruption. LUSSU stated that corruption was rife and with this opinion I was in full agreement. He considered this was largely due to Fascism which had had, in this respect, a most disastrous effect on Sardinia. He stated that there were still numbers of ex-Fascists in office which I agreed, but I stated that this was a matter for the Italian Government and as far as A.C.C. here was concerned every endeavour was being made to get

action taken. He also considered that the presence of the Italian Army had a very bad effect on the General and moral situation.

Italian Army. LUSSU was very euphatic about the extremely low standard of the Italian Army and of the state of corruption which existed in it both under the fascist regime and now. He did not have a good word for the Army from the Ministry of War downwards. He was particularly bitter against the Officer class. He expressed the view that the whole Army must be changed both as regards ~~the~~ personnel and ~~the~~ uniform. He felt that the presence of the Army in Sardinia was highly undesirable and that no more than one Division should be quartered there. I drew his attention to the increasing rate at which units of the Italian Army were now being transferred to the mainland.

Starvation. LUSSU said that conditions were very bad and that in many places people were starving. When pressed he agreed that the people generally were getting their bread ration but that the existing ration of 150 grms of bread (plus pasta) was quite insufficient. He agreed that the situation would be improved when the increased ration came into force. He fully appreciated the difficulty or impossibility of supplying such items as sugar, olive oil and soap, etc.

When pressed as to where the bad starvation areas were so that I could visit them I could get nowhere and he always harked back to the matter of lack of shoes and clothing.

5. As you may be aware, Emilio LUSSU is a popular idol here. He frequently stressed that with him this matter was not a political one. He stated that he realised that it was the Italian Government who must purify and revitalise the Island.

I formed the opinion that Emilio LUSSU may attempt to make extensive political capital out of his visit to his beloved Sardinia and that he will make full use of any amelioration in conditions here subsequent to his visit.

On assumption of these new responsibilities it will be necessary for the Regional Commissioner to set up his Headquarters in a separate building from Rome Area Command and I should be glad of your agreement to the transfer of ROME Region HQ from your HQ on 21st July. Transfer by this date will give Colonel Poletti time to make preparations for his enlarged Region. I have understood you to say that, as soon as HQ. A.G.C. was settled in ROME, you would agree to such division.

SUBJECT: Responsibility for Viterbo Province.

TO : A.G., Region IV.

1. Reference our cable of today's date responsibility for the administration of Viterbo Province is turned over to you w.e.f. midday 19th June 44, subject to the conditions set out below in paras. 2 & 3.

2. The Corps SCAG retains complete control over the five communes of Acquafredda, Broccano, Osnano, Grotte di Castro and San Lorenzo Nuovo, so long as these communes remain in Corps area. (This is only expected to be another two or three days.) When these communes cease to be in Corps area they will be turned over to Provincial and Regional control on the same basis as the rest of the Province.

3. The Army rear boundary at present runs along Route 1 via from Civitavecchia to Viterbo leaving the Northern half of the Province inside the Army area. Until the Army rear boundary moves forward the SCAG AND Fifth Army retains the right to issue such operational orders in this area as may at anytime be necessary to implement the wishes of the Army Commander. Copies of any such orders will be sent to the Regional Commissioner.
