1. THERE IS URGENT OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENT OUT OF TEMPORARY NATURE ONLY FOR ADDITIONAL CIVIL AFFAIRS PERSONNEL FOR NORTHERN ITALY. THERE IS ALSO URGENT NEED TO HAVE PROVIDED FOR CIVIL AFFAIRS PERSONNEL FOR ALGERIA IN EVENT OF DETERIORATING CONDITIONS ARISING MAY 769
2. UNDERSTOOD FROM YOU THAT CA MANPOWER CRILING OF OFFICERS FOR MIDEAST IS 600 FOR BALKANS AND 642 FOR ANTICIPA TROOPINGS. PRESENT WAR ESTABLISHMENTS AUTHORIZED FOR SA SAID TOTAL 222 CA OFFICERS AND 204 MILITARY OFFICERS. LATER UNDERSTOOD FROM YOU NOT INCLUDED IN CA MANPOWER CRILING. IN ADDITION THERE IS ALSO A WE FOR POOL OF 209 CA OFFICERS FOR BALKANS.
3. ANTICIPATED CA REQUIREMENT FOR BALKANS NOT LIKELY TO BE MATERIALLY INCREASED ABOVE 222 OFFICERS.
4. REQUEST IMMEDIATE AUTHORIZATION BE GIVEN FOR TRANSFER OF MANPOWER CRILING OF 250 OFFICERS FROM MIDEAST TO CEF. THIS WILL LEAVE MIDEAST AN ALLOTMENT OF 350 OFFICERS FOR BALKANS.
5. THIS INCREASE OF MANPOWER TO CEF WILL PROVIDE FOR OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS IN NORTHERN ITALY AND SUBSEQUENTLY HELP TO PROVIDE EXPERIENCED PERSONNEL FOR THE SUPPORT OF ALGERIA.
6. REQUESTING THAT THIS TRANSFER OF CA MANPOWER ALLOTMENT OF 250 OFFICERS BE AUTHORIZED NOW AND NOT DELAYED UNTIL THE QUESTION OF TRANSFER OF ENTIRE BALKAN MANPOWER CRILING TO CEF HAS BEEN SETTLED. LATER ACTION DEPENDENT ON CHAIN OF COMMAND WILL BE IN CONSIDERATION.

SUBJECT: Finance Officers for Pina and Pistola.

TO: A.C., Region VIII (for A.P.O.)

1. It is requested that you reconsider your decision to have one Finance Officer handle both Pina and Pistola Provinces. It is particularly impracticable to join two so widely separated provinces under one F.O., but the following reasons would apply to any two provinces.
2. The F.O.'s duties in each province cover (a) communal finances (b) provincial finances, (c) state finances (including parastatal entities), (d) post office financial operations, (e) bank reopening, blocked accounts, safe-deposit box openings, etc., (f) the Amasi financing program, (g) revenue matters of province, province and state, (h) a variety of other tasks such as aid to British and U.S. Nationals, social insurance, currency questions, etc.
3. Of the functions listed, only the first one can be handled in the early phase and that only as the territory is liberated; and a few of the others can be touched upon. When the provincial capital is taken the full weight of all the various tasks will come upon the F.O. As almost all are of a frequently recurring nature, his continuous presence in the Province is imperative. Such condition will continue for many weeks. Any prolonged absence might have serious consequences on necessary activities, such as the Amasi financing program, applications for unblocking accounts, approvals of unforeseen urgent expenditures, developments in the banking and post office financial situation which need constant watching, revenue questions involving tax dated and deferrals where delay in decisions might cause expensive complications, etc. The F.O.'s in the provinces, e.g., Grosseto, Viterbo, etc., can attest to the fact that the days are scarcely long enough to do their work. Moreover, new orders and inquiries from Finance Sub-Commission are often of such a nature as to require quick action and are based on the assumption that an F.O. is present in each province at all times. At a later stage it may be possible to combine two provinces under one F.O., but all our experience so far would indicate that such a combination in the first few months after occupation would almost certainly result in neither province receiving proper and necessary attention. Lt. O'Toole's first duty will presumably be to devote himself to the work in Pina Province. He has been doing excellent work there, but it is submitted that he or any other F.O. in his place will need all the time available for many weeks.
4. It is strongly recommended, therefore, that ACC HQ, Finance Sub-Commission be asked to call up an additional F.O. from the southern areas where no doubt officers can be spread much more thinly.

MEMORANDUM TO: Col. Farren.

The following is a summary of what I understood to be the conclusions reached, and instructions received, at our conference yesterday with the Executive Commissioner:

1. You are to prepare (with a copy for me) two complete separate lists of earmarked officers:

- a. Officers to be permanently assigned to Region IX, and
- b. Officers to be assigned to Region IX, with the understanding that when Region XII is occupied, they will be ordered forward.

2. You will proceed at once to select, obtain clearance for, and order forward, sufficient Provincial Commissioners, Provincial officers and specialists, to constitute three provincial teams (including a team for Region IX's largest and "capital" province) such officers to arrive with kit and equipment, ready for duty, not later than the date specified by the Executive Commissioner.

I suggest that among the most pressing immediate personnel needs, which should be given first attention are:

1. At least one additional Provincial Commissioner, as such.

2. One additional officer of provincial commissioner caliber, preferably with experience as provincial officer in a devastated metropolitan area.

3. One officer capable of sustaining the responsibilities of Regional Civilian Supply Officer (Lt. Col. Rack has been earmarked for this duty, and I very strongly desire that no change be made in this selection).

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4. One (Civilian Supply) Transportation Officer. (Lt. Molfatto was originally ticketed for this position, but upon his arrival all concerned, including Lt. Col. Bourdass, Major Wether, and Capt. Moretti, were satisfied that he has not the necessary experience nor technical qualifications. He has been accepted and assigned to a headquarters organic supply position. A substitute as Transportation Officer is needed at once.

5. One Regional Legal Officer (this is essential if necessary proclamations and orders are to be obtained and arranged, and the Regional Commissioner properly advised as to his legal duties immediately upon entry into the Region).

6. One Regional Public Health Officer (Major Snedeker has been earmarked, is highly acceptable, and is believed to be presently available).

I am proceeding to Orvieto today but will return early next week to keep you further.

Since Albright's conversation with you yesterday, we have talked over the situation fully and have arranged to make Colonel Laboon available to you for Livorno as we discussed some time ago. I am sending him to you now with this letter and with an extract copy of his order assigning him to Region VIII. I am sorry that there has been so much uncertainty about the assignment of your personnel but this posting will now stick.

With regard to Florence, Hale will remain with you as you have requested. We have no desire to force on you as Provincial Commissioner anyone you do not want. We have complete confidence in your judgment with respect to the assignment of officers of your Region and since the responsibility is yours, the authority is likewise yours. We simply want to be as helpful as possible in getting you the proper men for the job.

1. Major Ralph L. ROLPH, (B) 79099, RE, reported here 8 July, 1944, two weeks after it was arranged that he be assigned as Provincial Commissioner of FIRENZE.
2. In the meantime, the FIRENZE Province Team had been called forward by AMB 8th Army and Col. HENRY A. MALE (A) O-166213, who had done all the preliminary work with the FIRENZE Team, had taken it forward.
3. Col. MALE's work so far has been entirely satisfactory to date; and I do not think he should be relieved and replaced by a much junior officer at this late date.
4. Therefore request that the special order relieving Col. MALE from Region VIII be revoked; that he be assigned as Provincial Commissioner, FIRENZE; and that Major ROLPH be assigned as Provincial Commissioner, PISTOLA Province. Major ROLPH will, in the meantime, be used temporarily as CAD of the city of FIRENZE.
5. Col. G. T. JONES (B), being ordered here as Provincial Commissioner, of LIVORNO, has not reported. More than half of LIVORNO Province is in Allied possession. The LIVORNO team is working in that Province. To comply with the suggestion of Col. PIERRE that an American officer be used in LIVORNO because of necessary contacts with PIS, I have transferred Lt.-Col. EDGAR C. MORTS, (A) O-172786 from Provincial Commissioner of PISA to Provincial Commissioner of LIVORNO. Request confirmation of this action.
6. Request Col. G. T. JONES be assigned as Provincial Commissioner of LUGO instead of LIVORNO.
7. I have assigned Lt.-Col. THOMAS W. J. WALTERS, (B) 27998/1, as Provincial Commissioner PISA Province. The PISA Province team is now working in that Province. Request confirmation of this appointment.

Dear Brigadier Lush,

This is written to let you know the general situation in Reg. VIII.

ARZIZO was taken yesterday and the ARZIZO Team, which had already been sent north under AMB 5th Army is, no doubt, in ARZIZO today.

The SIERA Team has its Hq in SIERA. Lt-Col. QUINN-STEIN with two other Provincial Officers have a District in the south-east portion of SIERA. The rest of the Province is directly under AMB 5th Army but the provincial team is assisting them.

I visited SIERA yesterday and found the provincial team were located and started on their duties. A French Corps has occupied the town almost entirely, but they were good enough to "move over" sufficiently to provide office space and billets for the provincial team. It will be difficult to find a suitable location for the Region Hq. in SIERA till the French Corps Hq or, at least, many of the French Corps troops move forward. The city is without water and lights, but otherwise relatively undamaged.

Mercury mines in SIERA Province which have been inspected show that there is considerable mercury available for shipment. It is recommended that this be shipped as early as practicable in order that it may not be lost. French troops took a considerable quantity of this, although I am at a loss to understand what they can do with it at this time. Two of the mercury mines are undamaged - others require electric power.

Lt.-Col. HAMILTON and his team are demotoring in GROSSETO Province most of which has been turned over to the Provincial Team. They have many problems but they are able to make progress with practically all of them. I visited GROSSETO on Monday. The big problem is to try to save the grain crop and progress is being made to that end. The city has light for a few hours a day and there is enough electric power to run two flour mills by rationing electric power available. More power is expected in a few days.

In GROSSETO there is quite a quantity of last years oats and approximately 4,000 tons of last years wheat available. Inquiry has been made as to what price has to be paid for last year's wheat. Request that this be followed up and let me receive an early reply.

Our teams for PISA and LIVORNO are being used under direction of AMB 5th Army. You will recall on June 29th it was agreed that Lt.-Col. RALPH and Lt.-Col. LABOON were to be sent here as Provincial Commissioners for PISTOIA and LIVORNO respectively. Because they have not yet reported and because Col. FISKE stated it was essential to have an American officer as Provincial Commissioner for LIVORNO, I have transferred Lt.-Col. HOBBS from

PISA to LIVORNO superseding Major SHIRK who is left there as a Provincial Officer, and I have assigned Lt.-Col. WALTERS, British, as Provincial Commissioner, PISA. We are in these provinces and I was being pressed very strongly by AME 5th Army to provide Provincial Commissioners. It is obvious that they are needed now.

Relative to FLORENCE, Lt.-Col. HALEM still has not reported. The FLORENCE Team has been ordered forward by AME 5th Army, so I have sent it forward under Col. HALEM as Provincial Commissioner.

If Col. HALEM and Lt.-Col. MOORE get well started on their duties I do not desire to relieve them so long as they perform satisfactorily. However, at the present rate of advance it will not be long before additional provinces will be occupied and I will need to use additional Provincial Commissioners.

The food situation, so far, has not been very pressing because we find that larger cities either have food stocks or can obtain grain from this year's harvest. Milling is being interfered with by the destruction of the electric supply. As soon as the port of LIVORNO is in full operation we will need our trucks for civil supply to move the harvest and to acquire our stocks for FLORENCE, PISA and other large cities.

Providing us with the additional 40 trucks for civil supply, which have already been allotted by G-4, but not delivered, is a matter of first importance in order that this Region may be able to meet its requirements as we advance. We have had to use most of the trucks already allotted to us to serve agricultural supplies and materials necessary for collecting the harvest in CROCIANO.

The carabinieri furnished us so far, although very poorly equipped, have more than justified themselves both in FLORENCE and in SIENA. In SIENA there was absolutely no civil police of any kind when the troops arrived. The carabinieri which we brought in took over the situation promptly and did an excellent job in the initial stages. There was, of course, no carabinieri in SIENA and the partisans had removed all of the Questore because of their Fascist leanings. Both 5th and 6th Armies are putting in additional urgent requests for carabinieri. I understand 100 are available in NAPLES and 150 can be obtained from the replacement ~~pool~~ in ROME. The ROME carabinieri, however, are not armed or equipped to maintain themselves. We may take the bodies anyway and do what we can to arm them from captured material or arms surrendered by the civil population. They need blankets, cooking utensils and eating utensils. On leaving Abyssinia he reverted to his civil position and has recently been Superintendent of Police in Nairobi. He was an extremely efficient police officer.

I got back here on Tuesday last and immediately set about trying to get the various people up here of whom we spoke. Some of the news is good and some is not so good. The following is the position:

Miss de Bend.

We will be willing to take her and have written officially by fast air to AMHQ with a copy to you asking for her release and transport to Italy as soon as possible.

1st Col. Kenyon-Clancy.

I have handed his name to the Executive Officer here but regret that at the moment there is a waiting list and he must take his turn. I should think that this might be a month or two. Brig. Lash is keen to have Kenyon-Clancy but our hands are tied by the regulations and our establishment is at present full.

The other two people whose names I promised to take up are not directly your concern but I wonder if you will be good enough to pass the information on to them.

Miss Green.

I handed her name to Sir Clifford Heathcote-Smith who is a Director of the Inter-Governmental Committee for Refugees and he is going to write to her and offer her a salary. Between you and me I do not think that she will get as much as she is hoping for.

Major Moulton.

You may remember him as he was Superintendent of Police in Addis Ababa for a long time. I have always thought there was a grave miscarriage of justice in his case and he asked me whether I could get him up here. He thought that the Commissioner of Police would probably release him if necessary. He is now, as you probably know, in charge of Nairobi Police Station and I wonder if you could tell him from me that his position is the same as Col. Kenyon-Clancy's.

I thoroughly enjoyed my trip and had a very good journey back. I only waited one day in Cairo. The advance seems to be getting quicker and quicker here and nobody thinks they will stop short of the Pisa - Rimini line. That will mean that we shall be fairly stretched although we are pulling people out of S. Italy as fast as we can.

1. The rapidity of the advance of the Allied armies in Italy makes it imperative to anticipate immediate occupation of all Regions up to the Rimini-FISA line (Regions I - VIII) and the early occupation of the whole of Italy, including Regions IX, X, XI and XII.
2. In Appendix 'A' attached, Column II shows the proposed strengths of Regions and Army Areas in Phase II, i.e., up to the Rimini-FISA line. Immediate steps are being taken to implement the proposed strength of Region VIII by reducing other Regions, as is shown in the detailed distribution in Appendix 'B'. Column III in Appendix 'A' shows the figures for Regions I - XII and Army Areas 12 and when the whole of Italy is occupied and on the assumption that no reinforcements for ACC will be forthcoming, an assumption which is practically a certainty.
3. Column III is also based on the assumption that Regions III and IV, and possibly Regions V, VIII and IX will have been handed back to the Italian Government.

Immediate steps are being taken to implement the proposed strength of Region VIII by reducing other Regions, as is shown in the detailed distribution in Appendix "B". Column III in Appendix "A" shows the figures for Regions I - XII and Army Areas if and when the whole of Italy is occupied and on the assumption that no reinforcements for AGO will be forthcoming, an assumption which is practically a certainty.
3. Column III is also based on the assumption that Regions III and IV, and possibly Regions I, VIII and IX will have been handed back to the Italian Government.
4. Appendix "C" shows the provisional breakdown of provincial and specialist staffs within the Regions for Phase III. The first regional totals (most of which have been discussed with Sub-Commissions) vary slightly from Column III in Appendix "A" and I would emphasize the importance of providing strong staffs in the industrial Regions (which may also produce a security problem) compared with the more rural Regions of Central and Southern Italy, which will be administered by the Italian Government. Appendix "C" is essentially a draft and I would ask Vice Presidents to give it their immediate attention and make suggestions and alterations which in their opinion will distribute the staff in the best manner. I would add here that of the main Sub-Commissions, two-thirds of the specialist officers are in the field and one-third at AGO HQ.
5. Generally speaking, officers from Regions I, II and V will be used for Regions IX and XII while officers from Regions VI, VII and IV, and RHE Region, will be used for Regions X and XI.
6. Vice Presidents are asked to transmit their suggestions by noon, 15th June, and in consultation with the Establishment Officer to nominate the specialist officers in the field.
7. Regional Commissioners will then be directed to reduce their staffs accordingly and unless there are serious objections, to comply with the nominations made by the Vice Presidents.

I have given instructions that replacements for Ginette and Kerdley, about whom you spoke to me this morning, shall be sent to you. I made this decision because you are in the middle of operations and whatever have been the circumstances leading up to their return their places must be filled.

But I must bring to your attention, and that of General Hase, the irregular methods you have employed with these two officers.

I understand from my Establishment Officer that Major Kerdley was sent to 5 Army on their request that a new American Corps in addition to 4th Corps was to be organized. The Establishment Officer went to great pains to find the best man he could get hold of. He was interviewed and accepted enthusiastically by yourself. After great difficulty we cleared him with his Headquarters on your verbal orders without any letter or any explanation from you, nor any request for a replacement. I cannot think that you gave him a proper trial and how ever busy you may have been in the field your method of returning him to Headquarters was quite wrong.

With regard to Ginette, I understand that you ordered him to go to Region IV. This in itself is irregular. You cannot order officers to go from your Army to Region. Again no written report has been received as to why he is unsatisfactory.

The Establishment Officer and myself are only too pleased to help you in every way with regard to personnel but however busy you may be with operations you must remember that personnel affairs must be handled in a proper manner if you are going to avoid losing personnel and also losing the confidence of this Headquarters that you are prepared to reciprocate the assistance that is given to you.

If you had been able to come to the recent Regional Commissioners' meeting or send a representative, you would have perhaps been able to understand a good deal more of the difficulties with which this Commission is faced and will continue to be faced if the senior officers act in personnel matters in an arbitrary manner.

1. There appears to be some considerable misunderstanding over the position of Major MONK.
2. During the last month 32 officers have been withdrawn from Region I. As a consequence, following telephonic agreement with Executive Commissioner, it was decided to amalgamate certain provinces viz. MESSINA with SYRACUSA; CATANIA with CALTANISSETTA and, more recently, TRAPANI with PALERMO. This also entailed amalgamation of the work of the supply officers in the three combined provinces.
3. The question was discussed with Lt Col CLOUGH during his visit to this Headquarters, and in explaining the need for 30 officers from Region I he requested the posting to the mainland of as many as possible senior American officers suitable for Provincial Commissioners or R.C.A.M.C. work. Major MONK's name was discussed. An order for his departure was received and later cancelled, and he has since been held pending fresh instructions not being considered as likely to be available for work in Region I. At the same time Major MONK has personally strongly urged the favour of a transfer from Region I to the Mainland.
4. At the time of the decision to remove Major CHAYTON to work at Headquarters R.C.A.M.C., the question of his successor was left open and the name of Major MONK was never discussed with me. Major BRINK has been acting chief of my Economic and Supply Division and his work is proving most satisfactory. Provincial Commissioner CATANIA confirms my own opinion that Major MONK by temperament is not so well fitted for the post of Regional Supply Officer, though his work as Provincial Supply Officer and later as Acting Provincial Commissioner has always been excellent.
5. In view of the fact as known to this Headquarters that Major MONK was on the list for transfer to the mainland,

It was decided that Major YUNG, released from supply office NAKUSA on its assignment, should take over from Major MORG. This was done, Major YUNG took over and is now efficiently functioning in NAKUSA, while Major MORG has been awaiting orders for his expected transfer.

6. Meanwhile the position became complicated by the arrival of Captain LANGE with an appointment by your Headquarters direct to GATUNIA. This appointment had not been previously discussed with this Headquarters, and my economic and supply division was unaware of the officer's arrival on orders until he appeared in GATUNIA. As Major YUNG is already performing as supply officer for this province it is proposed to post Captain LANGE to the vacancy in GATUNIA and NAKUSA.

7. Yesterday, a further officer, Major McGraw, has arrived without warning, and with orders to take over the work of supply officer MORGENTHAU. I do not feel I can release Captain DE THOMAS at this time.

8. As stated in my 20/433 of 30 MAY para 6, provincial supply officers in the past have been responsible to Headquarters and supply for food, agriculture and all supply items. During the next 30 day intensive period of work needed in each province to start Italian food and agriculture organizations for the collection and distribution of the all-important next harvest, I feel that changes in provincial supply officers should be avoided whenever possible. It is with knowledge of the delicate problems involved in GATUNIA that I recommend that Captain DE THOMAS be not removed. At this time few supply officers in any province, without knowledge of the island problems, would find their work very difficult and perhaps of little value.

9. I do ask most strongly that appointments be not made by divisions direct to provinces in my region without reference to me. After all, I naturally have special knowledge of the characteristics and capabilities of officers on my staff, and also know the probable psychological and local effects on team-spirit of transfers within the region. In any appointment of specialists it is essential to have full concurrence of the local regional divisional head, as well as agreement between the division concerned at Headquarters and the Establishment section.

10. In addition, suggested as I am in drastic staff reduction under the present necessary policy, these can only be done by means of amalgamations between provinces and with maximum team co-operation among the few officers left. I am loyally releasing the maximum number of officers for this policy, and am forming lists for future releases according to priority; but for this I require full power of manoeuvre within the region, though of course in co-operation with Heads of divisions.

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11. I therefore request approval for the following proposals:

- a. Major H. DRING Regional Supply Officer
- b. Provincial Supply Officers
 - GAZANIA Maj YOUNG
 - STRAKUS & RAGUSA Maj A.G. SUTTON
 - CAITANISSETTA & ENNA Capt LAXER
 - PALEMO & TRAPANI Lieut BULLOCK
 - AGRIGENTO Capt DE THIERO
 - MESSINA 1st Lt BRIDEN
- c. Major MONK and Major MCCLELLAN to be released for employment on Mainland.

12. With your co-operation, I feel the above will simplify the process of reduction in staff which is forced upon me. The proposals have approval of my Acting Regional Supply Officer.

2. I approved Lt. Viti's application for duty as Agriculture Officer because he was dissatisfied here and I was willing to let him go, with replacement, if anyone wanted him; but not because I considered him qualified for duty as Region Agriculture Officer. As an Assistant Agriculture Officer in some Province with important agriculture interests he could be used; but he is not capable of carrying on an agricultural program on his own, even in Calabria.

3. I have two agriculture officers here now. One, Major Watts, is scheduled for another important agriculture assignment. Lieut. Morton should be left here until he can be replaced by a competent officer who has been oriented in the agriculture situation here.

1. It appears that Rome Province will be within the zone of operation of both 5th and 8th Armies.
2. For that reason, it will not be possible to place the entire Provincial Team "under command" of one army as has been possible in the case of Littoria, Frosinone and Rieti and as may be possible in the cases of Fiviera and Perugia.
3. It appears likely that the Velletri Area will be within 5th Army boundary and that the Tivoli Area will be within 8th Army boundary. The two small Teams allotted to these two towns and surrounding communes will therefore be allotted, when called forward, to 5th Army A.G. (Field) and 8th Army A.G. respectively.
4. The officers allotted to the northern part of the Province (Civitavecchia) and the Provincial H. will remain under Regional control at present.

Efforts are being made at this Headquarters to secure Daugert and Werner; to expedite the transfer of Captain Cunliffe; to stimulate the approval of applications of officers over 38 who have applied to return to the United States; and to work out a system for handling the problem of officers who are surplus in their particular fields.

1. I have made a careful study of the manpower problem in consultation with other Vice Presidents.
2. You will remember that the ceiling is intended to cover occupation up to the RIVINI-PISA line. The total minimum figure thrown out as a result of our discussions was 1107 officers compared with our ceiling of 1222. Even this figure has been achieved only at the expense of the numbers of CAO's and CAO's required for the Regions. I therefore asked all Sections to effect a reduction of 7% in order to meet our ceiling - and I reduced Displaced Persons from 50 to 35. I also assumed that we should be able to persuade APHQ to remove 15 American officers in the Army Sub-Commission from our ceiling (as has been done in all British officers).

4. The Economic and R.C. & E.C. Sections were able to accept these figures. The Administrative Section tells me that they cannot fulfill their duties if their strength is less than 289 officers: the Telecommunications Sub-Commission require 20 instead of 15.

We are therefore 14 (and if we fall over the Army Sub-Commission 19) officers above our ceiling.

We have no room for new commitments.

5. I do not think that we can carry out the functions of A.C.C. with a strength of less than 1222 for the following reasons. Firstly, I am becoming convinced that in metropolitan administration, controlled by an Anglo-American organization, we are compelled to use more specialist officers (i.e. members of Sub-Commissions), to perform functions which in colonial administration would be carried out by Provincial Officers (CAO's etc.) Distribution of food, organization of transport, control of labour, are typical instances. Secondly, the military authorities (AAI, etc.) are rightly placing upon Sub-Commissions of A.C.C., particularly in the Economic Section, an increasing responsibility in every field, e.g., roads, electric power, railways, etc. Thirdly, allied troops are so numerous in occupied and liberated Italy that the standards of all material work must be higher than that to which the Italians are accustomed: constant supervision is therefore necessary.

6. The ranks of the Sub-Commissions are therefore swollen. The proportion of specialists to provincial officers is, of course, more in liberated Italy than in territory under AMG and the specialists in the former area are only there because without their presence some work vital to Allied interests would break down. The population must be fed, roads and bridges must be mended, railways and power houses must be operated, labour must be controlled, agricultural and mining production must be increased, distribution of supplies must be controlled. The Italians appear unable to supervise these natural activities at the tempo required by the Allied war effort without physical guidance and control of allied officers. Once the tempo can be diminished, the guidance and control can be relaxed. On the basis of the figures recommended provincial officers in liberated territory will be reduced to a bare minimum; there can, at any rate be no suggestion that we are continuing allied military government in liberated Italy.

7. The issue for decision at your Vice President's meeting is:-

(a) whether we should ask for the ceiling to be increased in order to fulfill the requirements of the Administrative Section and Telecommunications Sub-Commission and carry a possible reserve (on paper, not necessarily in "bodies") for future unanticipated commitments, e.g., an enormous increase in refugees or a breakdown in government by the Italians and the reintegration of AMG; or

(b) whether we should accept the 1273 as final with the reduction in the Administrative and possible other Sections which this entails.

8. If we were to adopt (a) we shall at any rate be able to accept new responsibilities without continual anxiety as to manpower and continual changes and upheavals of personnel. In this case I should recommend that we should ask for a ceiling of not less than 1273 (of which some 25 posts would not be filled at once).

If (b) is selected, then I would suggest the following distribution

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(on paper, not necessarily in "bodies") for future anticipated commitments, e.g., an enormous increase in refugees or a breakdown in government by the Italians and the reinstitution of AGI; or

(b) whether we should accept the 1222 as final with the reduction in the Administrative and possible other Sections which this entails.

8. If we were to adopt (a) we shall at any rate be able to accept new responsibilities without continual anxiety as to manpower and continual changes and upheavals of personnel. In this case I should recommend that we should ask for a ceiling of not less than 1270 (of which some 25 posts would not be filled at once).

SUBJECT : Medical Personnel.

TO : RC and MG Section (Through Adm. Sec.)

During a recent visit to Bari, I discussed the question of personnel with the Director of the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission and his Senior Medical Officer, and while admittedly his demands are on the large side, the set-up is of such a nature that more personnel are required than would be in different circumstances. The term camp, of which there are nine, with a holding capacity of say 22,000, is misleading. One of these is composed of two or three villages some distance apart which makes the administration more difficult than if one were dealing with a similar number of persons within the same confine. As you point out in your memo Allied personnel should be reduced to a minimum, and as far as doctors are concerned, this Sub-Commission has none available, nor are there any others in sight. Six Italian doctors were sent to Bari last week. Yesterday I rang up the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission and the medical situation is now fairly satisfactory. I do not think at the moment with the numbers passing through that the staff of doctors is excessive.

They have two hygiene officers and I consider that they are necessary but the demand for nine sanitary N.C.O.'s, while highly desirable, cannot be entertained as they are not available. It is therefore suggested that a short course of instruction in elementary camp sanitation be instituted and suitable Yugoslav personnel trained and given power to enforce sanitary measures. This may be difficult, but there is no alternative.

The request for eight nurses should be met as far as possible as there will shortly be 300 hospital beds and I agree that a proportion should hold a mid-wife's certificate. As the Army nurses may be recalled at short notice, I suggest that steps should be taken to find out if some Italian Sisters (Religious Orders) would be available if required.

As medical supplies are issued now, dispensers would not appear necessary. They are not being used by the Refugee Sub-Commission which is dealing with a similar problem. As most of the 170 civilian personnel can be obtained locally this request need not be further considered.

I suggested to Mr. Gibson yesterday that 6 of his staff who are now available might be assigned to the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission and 6 to the Refugee Sub-Commission but he informed me that permission would have to be obtained from ACP first and I should be glad if this could be arranged.

Some of these men have nursing experience and when they have had instruction in disinfection and have undergone a 14 days course in camp sanitation, which is being arranged, they would be a valuable addition to the staff of the Sub-Commissions referred to above.

I feel that the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission is doing excellent work as far as the Medical and Welfare side is concerned and I was particularly impressed by the Reception Camp.
