SUBJECT: Transfer of Fishermen.

TO : Economic Section (for Agriculture Sub-Commission)

1. Ref. 50000/AGR of 18 April AGR/BPM/dht.

2. It is understood that neither the Royal Navy nor the Public Safety Sub-Commission have any objections to the transfer of up to 300 night fishermen with their gear from the Naples area to the Calabrian coast.

3. R.O. Region III has no objection to this transfer and you are therefore requested to inform the Agriculture Sub-Commission that they can proceed with the movement forthwith. No boats are to be removed from Region III.

4. The R.O. Region III is anxious to import the maximum available quantity of fish from other Regions to assist in the feeding problem in his Region. Fish brought into Naples Province, he states, is assured of equitable distribution (at controlled prices) through the Central Fishing Agency.

TO : Deputy Executive Commissioner,
R.C. and M.S. Section, HQ ACC Main.

1. Your letter 22/2/44 of 25 Apr.

2. This Regional HQ is agreeable to the proposed transfer from the Naples area to the Calabria coast of approximately 300 fishermen with experience of night fishing.

3. It is understood that the men would take with them their night fishing gear, which, in view of the Royal Navy's refusal to allow night fishing in the Naples area, cannot be used here. No boats however would be removed from Region 3.

4. We are anxious to import the maximum available quantity of fish from other Regions to relieve our feeding problem. Fish brought into Naples Province is assured of equitable distribution (at controlled prices) through the Central Fishing Agency.

SUBJECT: Transfer of fishermen from the Naples area to the Calabrian Coast

TO : Civil Affairs Section ACC THRU CHANNELS

1. There are a number of local fishermen, equipped with night fishing gear, who would be willing to move to the Calabrian Coast. Night fishing is prohibited in the Naples area due to the proximity to the war zone.

2. The harvesting of fish by the Lampara method (fishing with lights) would increase the production tremendously. Fish could then be brought to Naples and eventually to Rome to relieve the food shortage among the civilian population. Motor fishing craft already ply the waters from this area to the Calabrian Coast and bring tons of fish to Naples to supply Allied hospitals and the population.

3. Arrangements are being made to have at least two schooners assigned exclusively to the collection of fish in Calabria and for the collection of Tuna in Calabria and in Sicily. This Sub-Commission would like to be advised as to the procedure to follow in moving local fishermen, who want to make the change, to the Calabrian Coast.

4. On a recent survey trip the Fisheries Division of this Sub-Commission and the chief of the Fisheries Division of The Ministry of Agriculture investigated this possibility. They learned from the mayors of the fishing villages, Italian Naval authorities and others that at least 300 fishermen of this area could be adequately housed. This class of fishermen can adapt himself under almost any condition.
