SUBJECT: Accommodation Policy - KORE

HQ, ALLIED ARMY IN KORE

AM/5057A(P)

11 Jun 44

24. KORE Allied Area Command

1. This HQ Letter 5056/A(P) of 11 Jun 44 is cancelled and replaced by instructions contained herein.
2. The Commander-in-Chief has decided that no officers (except an enlisted man by paragraph 4 below) or men of the Allied Armies in KORE will live in huts or stay there overnight unless their work makes it essential that they should do so.
3. On the other hand, the Commander-in-Chief is anxious that as many men as possible should see KORE and enjoy the many cultural attractions which it has to offer. He therefore approves of the establishment of leave centers in the vicinity of KORE, provided that they are not within the City limits. Those who are concerned with the establishment of such leave centers should approach the KORE Area for the allocation of suitable sites. Particular care is also connected must be taken in regard to malaria.
- The Commander-in-Chief also approves of the development of welfare facilities within KORE, in order that officers and men who are visiting in any way have somewhere to go for their meals, etc. but clubs of this nature will be allowed at an hour fixed by the KORE Area.
4. Owing to the fact that suitable accommodation cannot immediately be provided outside KORE for officers who are given short leave to visit the City, approval is given for the present for a limited number of officers on short leave to be accommodated in hotels in KORE. This is a temporary measure, and steps must be taken as soon as possible to provide alternative accommodation outside the City.
5. Residential leave centers for enlisted men/other ranks will be established outside the City limits of KORE.
6. No villas, apartments or other accommodation will be reserved or requisitioned except for those officers whose duties require that they should live in KORE. The only exception to this rule is the reservation of a very limited amount of accommodation for distinguished visitors.

6. No villas, apartments or other accommodations will be reserved or reservations made for these officers whose duties require that they should live in the city. The only exception to this rule is the reservation of a very limited number of accommodations for distinguished visitors.

7. The number of officers and men who may visit the city on any day (leave) is limited to the numbers listed below by date from time to time. 3417
From 1 July 44, the allotment is fixed as follows:

WHITE Army.....5,000 per day
WHITE Army.....2,000 per day
NAVAF.....100 per day.

8. All units visiting SMO on any base will arrive not earlier than 0700 hours and will leave the city by 2000 hours. Portations uncovered are responsible for all arrangements in connection with these visits, in co-operation with CG AGES Area.

9. This office letter 300/AG/17 Jan 44 (not to all) is cancelled. (cont.)
arrange to be done will be divided into three classes:-

- (a) Those run by the Allied Forces.
- (b) Those approved for use by the Allied Forces.
- (c) Those which are out of bounds to the Allied Forces.

CG AGES will arrange that all restaurants in category (a) are listed in his groups and that numbers are fixed outside them. All visits visiting in force a unit in any of the restaurants in class (b) will be given a voucher. These vouchers will be printed under arrangements made by CG AGES Area and will be distributed to formations on demand by them. Not more than one voucher may be given to a man on one day. The vouchers taken by the restaurant proprietor will be the basis for compensating issues of food to his own Allied sources.

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The provisions of this paragraph will become effective as soon as the Joint Army has been able to make arrangements for the transfer of personnel and equipment to the Joint Army with their family members, wives, and children.

10. No headquarters will be attempted within the day limits of the arrival of the approval of this HQ. The following have been approved:

- HQ 2000 Army;
- HQ Allied Central Command;
- HQ British IV, Allied Western Command;
- HQ 1st Allied Army in Italy (including Canadian Section and other units that have been approved);
- HQ 1st;
- HQ 1st.

+ These headquarters are being established in order to maintain a continuous operational capability. In the process of operations some will not be possible for some time. However they will be moved outside of the area and some will be moved into the area.

SUBJECT: Visit of Undersecretary of the Ministry of Industry
Commerce and Labor

TO : Economic Section

1. The Undersecretary of the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labor today paid a courtesy visit to the Director of this Subcommission.

2. He pointed out that the building which formerly housed the Ministry of Corporations, which will be the natural seat for the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labor, has been taken over by ACC. He therefore asked that the building in the Piazza Balanisia, which was also formerly used by the Ministry of Corporations, and the building opposite ACC HQ in the Via Veneto, formerly occupied by the Ministry of Popular Culture, may be earmarked for use by the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labor when it moves to Rome.

3. He is also anxious to send forward three functionaries as representatives of this Ministry so that they may be available in Rome to act as liaison officers with this and other subcommissions interested.

4. He also asks that every effort be made to ensure that the telephones are not removed from the two buildings referred to above, and that such records as may be available dealing with matters of interest to this Ministry may be carefully preserved for their use.

Subject: Settlement in Rome of the Supreme Command.

As this A.C.C. is aware, the Supreme Command/in charge of officers lodging have been sent to Rome in order to make arrangements for the settlement of the above Command in the city.

While for the seat of the Command it was possible to obtain the Baracchini building, considering that the Vidoni building - former seat of the Command - is still occupied by a French Command, it was not possible, on the contrary, and in spite of all searches made in the matter, to find proper apartments for the lodging of officers.

Steps have been taken with the Allied Authorities in Rome with a view to have available a decent hotel capable of accommodating some 70 officers as well as the staff of the Chief of the General Staff, Marshal KSHNS.

For this purpose, one of the following Hotels was requested to the above Authorities:

Albergo Boston
Albergo Imperiale.

Said Authorities, while showing full appreciation of the exigencies of this Supreme Command and stating to be willing to facilitate the settlement as far as possible, have pointed out ~~that it is~~ ^{it is} ~~advisable~~ ^{advisable} that this request be submitted to this A.C.C.

Therefore, this Command would very much like steps to be taken with a view that one of the above hotels or at least some other one of similar capacity and category, to be placed at the disposal of the Supreme Command.

Should it not be possible, it would be appreciated that at least a portion of a decent hotel, only partially occupied by Allied Authorities, be made available.

MEMORANDUM TO: Col. PISKE, (through Regional Commissioner

SUBJECT : Ministry of Italian Africa.
(Reference letter 3 June 1944 from Marshal
Badoglio).

It was realized that the occupation of the
Ministry of Italian Africa would have grave political re-
percussions and the Commanding General, Rome Area was ad-
vised by me accordingly before the building was occupied.

The building is used as a HQ and Barracks
for a battalion of Military Police, who are needed in the
Centre of Rome. No administrative work is carried out there.
Its temporary use as a Military Police HQ was approved by
the Commanding General after discussion with Mr. REBER.

It was originally intended that neither the
Italians nor Allies should use the building.

I do not think it is practicable to use the
building both for military purposes and for the Ministry of
Italian Africa.

I suggest therefore that a representative of
the Italian Government should be asked to come to Rome to
discuss alternative accommodation for the Ministry.

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THE INCIDENT / THE COUNCIL

Salerno, June 3, 1942

My dear General:

In the meeting, which took place in the presence of Italian and Allied technicians, to examine the situation of the offices of the R. Ministries in Rome, the palazzo della Consulta, at Piazza del Quirinale, seat of the Italian Africa Department, is said to have been reserved, according to what has been reported to me, for eventual occupation by the Allied Administration.

It is unnecessary that I emphasize the grave political significance which might be attributed, particularly at this time, to occupation of this Palace by Allied Forces or Offices, the only one among the ministerial offices which would be eliminated. Furthermore, I think that also on the part of the Allies there is agreement on the necessity of avoiding a gesture which might lend itself to inferences easily exploitable by enemy propaganda.

On the other hand, the Ministry for Italian Africa already has over two hundred Italian officials and employees who provide in addition to study of old matters still underway, for payment of allowances to families of colonial officials as well as assistance for refugees from African soil and distribution of subsidies, established by prevailing legislation.

In consideration of the above, I would be grateful to you, my dear General, if you could arrange that also the Ministry for Italian Africa would be subjected to the same treatment as the other Ministries, reserving for it the use of the palazzo della Consulta, where for years it had its offices.

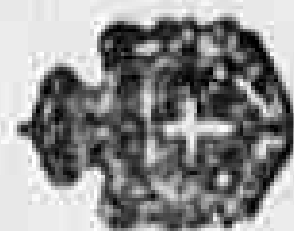

TWO ALTERNATIVES SO FAR PRESENTED. FIRST AIR MINISTRY SECOND FASCIST SCHOOLS NEAR MONTE DELLA FARNESINA BUT UNDERSTAND FIFTH ARMY WANT THESE FOR REST CENTRE FOR WHICH IT MAY BE MORE SUITABLE. 1. The Allied Control Commission asks that space be allotted in Rome for the Commission, the Italian Government and the Advisory Council in accordance with the following plan:

(a) Italian Government

(1) Italian Government buildings to be reserved for the Italian Government, as shown in Appendix "A".

(2) Italian troops to be quartered in Rome, as shown in Appendix "B".

(3) Assistance to be rendered the Italian Government in providing living accommodations for members of the Government in the event that it is not practicable for them to find quarters otherwise.

(b) Advisory Council

Members of the Advisory Council to occupy their respective embassies, legations and consulates. In addition it is desired that the Villa Milano, which is the private residence of Ambassador Kirk, and the Palazzo Regina Margherita, which is being considered as an appropriate site for the eventual American Embassy, be likewise reserved.

(c) Allied Control Commission

(1) Offices: The Ministero delle Corporazioni building on Via Veneto, or alternatively, the newly built offices of the Istituto Nazionale delle Assicurazioni, Via XIII Marzo.

(b) Advisory Council

Members of the Advisory Council to occupy their respective embassies, legations and consulates. In addition it is desired that the Villa Milano, which is the private residence of Ambassador Kirk, and the Palazzo Regina Margherita, which is being considered as an appropriate site for the eventual American Embassy, be likewise reserved.

(c) Allied Control Commission

- (1) Offices: The Ministero delle Corporazioni building on Via Veneto, or alternatively, the newly built offices of the Istituto Nazionale delle Assicurazioni, Via XIII Marzo.
- (2) Officers Billets: The Commission desires to operate one first class hotel, preferably the Excelsior or the Grand for the billeting of the senior officers of the Commission and for the accommodation of the large number of visiting dignitaries of all nationalities which the Commission anticipates will eventually arrive in Rome and for which accommodations will be sought through the Commission. It is also desired to operate a single mess for all officers of the Commission, and for this purpose the existing messing facilities in the Palazzo Barberini are desired. The Palazzo Barberini will also provide living accommodations for several of the Commission's General officers. In addition to these requirements, it is requested that the Villa Medici be reserved for the Chief Commissioner; that the Villa Taverna, the residence of the American Ambassador, be reserved for a senior American member of the Commission; and that a further eight villas suitable for occupancy by the Commission's vice presidents, senior Army, Navy, and Air Force officers and Commission members other than Anglo-American, be reserved. For this purpose the following are suggested:

24/08 MILANO: Approximately 1000 MG/US, British, American and Italian will require accommodations. This accommodation should be found in the vicinity of the offices of the Commission, in order to reduce the transportation involved. Some of the peninsulas in the Loderio area are suggested.

(4)

Transportation - Storage - Printing: One large store room in the vicinity of the billets of the MG/US. One large parking area for approximately 500 vehicles. A garage for the maintenance of these vehicles and a printing press for the Commission's publications.

Host Camps: The Commission desires to reserve the beach at Castel Piuma for officers, and the adjoining beach for MG/US, and nearby accommodations for billeting fifty officers and fifty MG; also the Acque Albate (rivoli) and the Golf Club - Acquasanta.

2. It is appreciated that the Villa Medici, the Palazzo Barberini and the Palazzo Legation Margherita are classified as national monuments, but since these buildings can best be preserved by proper company of a permanent character, it is requested that they be made available for the specific purposes listed.

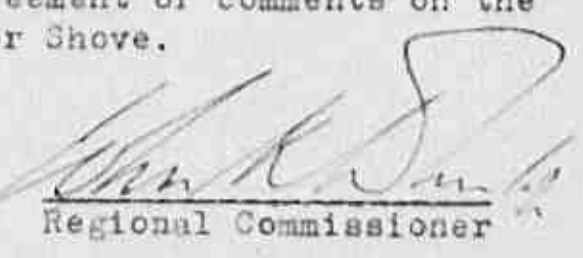
1. This letter is in confirmation of a series of discussions (Lush-Dunlop, Dunlop-Ames and Gevers-Ames). It is agreed that Major A. J. Shove is going forward with the Rome Sub-Region party under command AMG 5 Army CAS.

2. It is proposed that, on arrival in Rome, Maj. Shove's duties will be:

(A) To advise Commanding General CAS on all matters concerning the accommodation requirements of Italian civilian organizations.

(B) To take over from Commanding General CAS the total of all buildings allotted to Allied Control Commission, including AMG, and to sub-allot such buildings between:
H.Q. ACC, 5 Army AMG, H.Q. Region 4, H.Q. Rome Sub-Region, 2139
H.Q. Roma Province.

3. May I please have your agreement or comments on the above proposed instructions to Major Shove.
