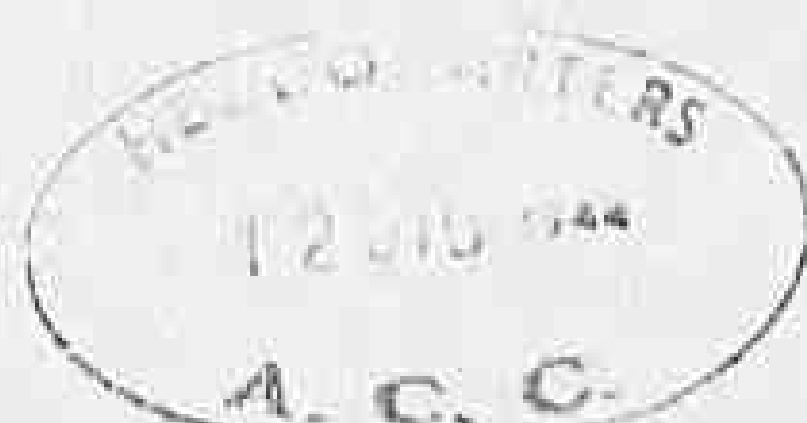

SUBJECT: Displaced Persons - Yugoslav Royalists.

TO : G.H.Q., M.E.F.

1. There are in South East Italy some 300 - 400 Yugoslav Royalist refugees who can be classified as "Cetniks" within the meaning of the term as previously applied in Italy. These persons are of similar category to the 405 Cetniks already evacuated to Mideast under the terms of your A1/85441 of 27 March.

2. In view of the intolerance shown by Partisan Yugoslavs towards Cetniks, and to avoid incidents which might take place between the rival parties in what is still an operational area, it is desired to evacuate to Mideast a further 300 Cetniks over and above the total of 500 agreed in your signal mentioned in para 1. An additional factor is that with the continuing liberation of territory in Italy larger numbers of Cetniks are expected to become the charge of the Allied Control Commission, thus increasing the burden on limited existing facilities.

3. It is requested that you will indicate whether further Cetniks up to a gross total of 800 may be evacuated from Italy to Mideast. The removal of these persons would materially alleviate the refugee problem which at this time gives cause for some concern.

1. I refer to MCB 383.7-2 of 9 May.
2. The information requested in your para 3 is as follows:
 - a) The 300 - 400 refugees can be classified as Chetniks.
 - b) Up to the date of this letter 405 Chetniks have been evacuated to Mideast from Italy.
 - c) The grounds on which I suggest you should base your applications for an increase over and above 500 already agreed to by Mideast are:
 - i. Italy is an operational area.
 - ii. As northern Italy is liberated larger numbers of Chetniks are likely to come within control of this Commission and in view of intolerance shown by Partisan Yugoslavs to Chetniks it is essential that any incident in this country be avoided.

3. With reference to your para 4, the Head of the Royal Yugoslav Mission attached to Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission has been asked to obtain agreement of the Royal Yugoslav Government to the evacuation of nationals as listed in IDP/320/60-1 of 19 April and I will advise you of their decision.

SUBJECT: Displaced Persons - Yugoslavs for evacuation to Mideast.

TO : HQ Allied Control Commission,
Attention RC and MG Section.

Reference is made to your 119/9/CA of 5 May.

1. It is noted that there are in S.E. Italy some 300-400 Yugoslav "Royalist" refugees whom it is desired to evacuate to Mideast. If these persons can be classified as Cetniks, (and the term "Cetnik" in its previous application to Yugoslav nationals in Italy was held to include those Yugoslavs who were supporters of the King and of the Royal Yugoslav Government outside Yugoslavia, as opposed to those Yugoslavs who were supporters of Marshal Tito and the Partisan Government) then Mideast have already agreed to accept 500 Cetniks (vide their cable A1/85441 of 27 March).

2. In your cable 2612 of 26 March it was stated that the number of Cetniks then held in Italy was 396, although the total was likely to increase shortly afterwards to 500. No information is available in this Headquarters as to the number of Cetniks who have been evacuated from Italy to date, and it is therefore impossible to compute how many of the total quota of 500 agreed by Mideast remain for evacuation.

3. The acceptance of Yugoslav Royalist or Cetnik supporters in Mideast raises both security and diplomatic questions, in addition to the problem of their maintenance. The original proposal that 500 Cetniks should be accepted in Egypt was made on the grounds that their presence in Italy constituted a danger to military security and operations, and was reluctantly agreed to by Mideast on this understanding. If then, the full quota of 500 has already been filled it will be necessary to justify any further request made to Mideast for the acceptance of additional numbers of Cetnik or Royalist Yugoslavs on similar grounds, or to advance reasons of comparable weight and importance. Before further action is taken by this Headquarters it is requested that information may be given on the following points:

a. Can the 300-400 refugees referred to in your

memorandum be classified as "Cetniks", within the meaning of the term as previously applied in Italy?

b. How many of the total of 500 Cetniks already agreed for acceptance by Mideast have been evacuated from Italy?

c. If it is desired to evacuate Royalist or Cetnik refugees additional to the total of 500 already agreed, on what grounds is it suggested that the requirement of this Headquarters to Mideast should be based?

(In this connection it should be noted that there would not appear to be sufficient justification for the presentation of such a request to Mideast for humanitarian reasons, or on the grounds of convenience).

4. Regarding the individuals named in para 3 of the communication by the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission forwarded with your memorandum. The proposal that these persons should be evacuated to Mideast was originated by Mr. Smiljanic, Deputy to Dr. Krek, Yugoslav Member of the Advisory Council for Italy, and was refused by Mideast because the request had been made without the approval or knowledge of the Royal Yugoslav Government. It is possible that these persons could be moved to Mideast irrespective of whether agreement is obtained to the evacuation of the 300-400 Royalists, but only on the condition precedent that the Royal Yugoslav Government agrees. It is suggested that either Dr. Krek or Mr. Smiljanic, or the Royal Yugoslav Mission with the Displaced Persons Sub-Commission, should be invited to refer the matter to their Government before an approach is again made by this Headquarters to Mideast.

SUBJECT :- Evacuation to Mideast - Royalist Yugoslavs.

TO :- Executive Commissioner,
Hq. A.C.C.

1. Reference your 117/27/CA of 22 April 44.

2. The request for evacuation to Mideast originally came from Royal Yugoslav Government through a representative with the advisory council A.F.H.Q. The Royal Yugoslav Military Mission attached to this Sub Commission are anxious that we should do all we can to obtain authority for their evacuation to Mideast, where no doubt they will be of more value to the Royal Yugoslav Government.

3. In addition there are still some three to four hundred Royalist Yugoslav refugees in S.E. Italy whom the Mission desire to evacuate to M.E. as soon as possible. It is requested that Mideast be asked whether they are prepared to accept up to 300 Royalists - men, women and children. At present we have 64 in our Royalist Camp at ARNESANO and, should Mideast agree to accept a further draft of Royalists, arrangements will be made to concentrate the refugees who are at present scattered and working in S.E. Italy.

SUBJECT: Recognition Yugoslav officers as officials
in the Royal Yugoslav Mission to the I.P.P.S.C.

TO : MAJOR T.H. BROWN,
Internees and Displaced Persons Sub-Commission.

1. In order to be spared transportation from Cairo to Italy, the Royal Yugoslav Military Mission to the I.P.P.S.C. came to Bari with two members only. It was calculated that other necessary personnel of the Mission could be found in Italy, for, it was known, that there were a lot of Yugoslav officers-ex P.'s and ex internees.

2. After my coming at Bari I took in my office the following officers:

— Captain DOMITRIJE CIROVIC, as Adjutant
— Captain DRASOLJUB STOJANOVIC, as Pay Master
— Captain DOMISAV RASIC, as Liaison officer

All these officers are Yugoslav ex P.'s.

Also I took corporal VUKOTA RASIC, as Ordinance.

That means the Royal Yugoslav Military Mission is composed of 5 officers in all-including me and Lt. Colonel Vukotitch.-and 1 N.C. officer.

3. I kindly ask that the above mentioned officers in Para 2 be officially recognise as officials in Royal Yugoslav Military Mission to the I.P.P.S.C.
