I. ESTABLISHMENT OF CIVIL AFFAIRS SECTION, FIFTH ARMY.

Announcement is made of the establishment of a general staff section for Civil Affairs in this headquarters to be known as the G-5 Section.

II. COMPOSITION OF G-5 SECTION, FIFTH ARMY.

The G-5 Section of this headquarters will be composed of an Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, and such commissioned and other personnel as may be required.

III. RESPONSIBILITIES OF G-5 SECTION, FIFTH ARMY.

The Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, will act as executive for the Army Commander on all matters in this area pertaining to civil affairs, including those relating to military government and other forms of civil administration, and those arising from relations with civil population, including refugees.

IV. DESIGNATION OF ASSISTANT CHIEF OF STAFF, G-5, FIFTH ARMY.

Announcement is made of the designation of Brigadier General EDGAR E. HUME, 04033, USA, as Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, Fifth Army, in addition to his other duties.

1. The limited available personnel, both Officer and E.O.O., of the Commission, with no immediate relief assured and the extensive requirements indicated to men the un-liberated regions of Italy, necessitates drastic elimination of all non-essential activities and the consolidation of Offices and Sub-Commissions of Headquarters, Allied Control Commission.

2. The Acting Chief Commissioner has appointed a Committee as follows :-

Brigadier H.S. LUSH, V.P. R.C. & E.O.O. Section - Chairman
Colonel G. UPJOHN, I/V.P. Admin Section - Member
Colonel H.W. WATKINS, - Member
Mr. A. ANTONINI, Executive Director, Econ. Section
Lt. Col. J.L. JONES, - Member
- Secretary

With the following terms of reference :-

To consider the re-organization of Headquarters, Allied Control Commission, with the mission of making the greatest possible number of Officers and E.O.O.s available for field assignments and with a view to securing optimum efficiency with the most economic employment of available manpower. Consideration will be given to effecting the elimination of all activities not absolutely required for the accomplishment of the mission of the A.C.C., and to the consolidation of Offices and Sub-Commissions where possible, consistent with the present situation.

3. The Committee met on Tuesday, 8th August 1944 and it was agreed that the four main points on which recommendations for possible reductions should be based are :

with the following terms of reference :-

To consider the re-organization of Headquarters, Allied Control Commission, with the mission of making the greatest possible number of Officers and W/Os available for field assignments and with a view to securing optimum efficiency with the most economic employment of available manpower. Consideration will be given to effecting the elimination of all activities not essential to the accomplishment of the mission of the A.C.C., and to the consolidation of offices and Sub-Commissions where possible, consistent with the present situation.

3. The Committee met on Tuesday, 28th August 1944 and it was agreed that the four main points on which recommendations for possible reductions should be based are :

- (a) Amalgamation of Sub-Commissions and Branches
- (b) Reduction of functions
- (c) Substitution of Italian or other local personnel for Allied personnel
- (d) Withdrawal of non-essential personnel.

4. It is the intention to ask Heads of Sub-Commissions and Branches to present their own recommendations by which the Acting Chief Commissioner's proposals will be met and for this purpose the Committee will sit each day from 0900 hrs to 1200 hrs commencing Friday, 11th August 1944.

5. When preparing their recommendations, Heads of Sub-Commissions should remember it is the policy of A.C.C. to transfer increasing responsibility upon the Italian Government, leaving members of Headquarters, Allied Control Commission to advise and supervise.

1. Effective as from 0001 hours, 20th July, 1944, the Provinces of NAPLES, BENEVENTO and AVULANO (Region III) and of CANTORASO and NOGGINA (Region V), will be handed over to the Italian Government.
2. Regional Commissioner, Region III will thereafter exercise supervision and control under AGC conditions throughout Region III with the exception of the Comune of NAPLES (which includes the City and Port of NAPLES) in which Allied Military Government will continue.
3. Regional Commissioner, Region V, will exercise similar supervision and control over the administration of CANTORASO Province while administering the remaining Provinces of ABRUZZI and the MARCHE under Allied Military Government.
4. As from the date defined above, NOGGINA Province (Provincial Commissioner, Colonel G. E. Tomperley) will be detached from Region V and will, temporarily, pass under direct command of AGC HQ. This Province, which lies in the compartimento of Apulia, will eventually pass to the command of Region II.

3. Regional Commissioner, Region V, will exercise similar supervision and control over the administration of CHIRIQUÍ Province while administering the remaining Provinces of AZUZZI and the MARCHE under Allied Military Government.

4. As from the date defined above, PAVIA Province (Provincial Commissioner, Colonel C.R. Temperley) will be detached from Region V and will, temporarily, pass under direct command of AGC HQ. This Province, which lies in the compartmento of Agaña, will eventually pass to the command of Region II.

5. Adjutants of staff, transport and supplies are now being prepared by the Regional Commissioner, Region V and Provincial Commissioner, POCOL, and will be submitted to the Sections concerned for approval.

6. This will not be made public until further orders.

1. In view of the coming harvesting season consideration should be given to the possibility of the evacuation of granaries and barns that may be at present occupied by troops. In order to provide cover for the new season's crops, such granaries and barns should be cleared where possible.
2. Where pasture or ground not under cultivation is available the release of these premises should be made as soon as possible. Where alternative covered accommodation is not available, it may be necessary to move troops into camp sites. In selecting such sites the principle contained in this H.Q. letter 2030/35/02 dated 25 May 44 will be followed. If however the only suitable sites are at present under cultivation, moves will be phased so as to allow the crops to be cut and gathered.
3. The grape harvest is gathered during the early part of September and plans will be developed now, for the timely clearance wherever possible of wine presses and cellars.

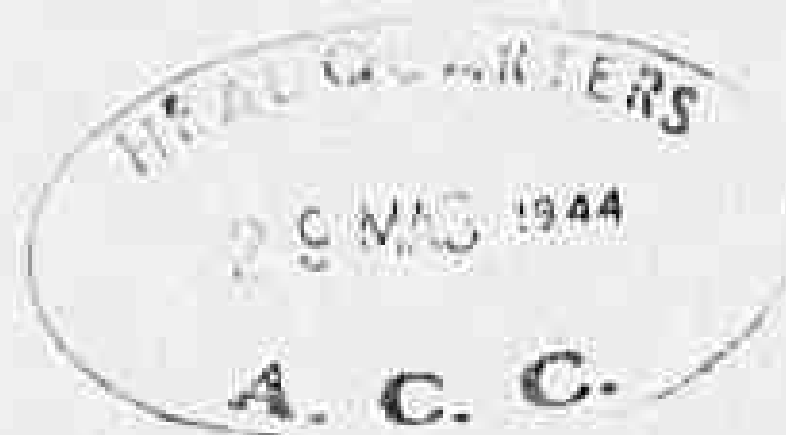

1. Reference Adm. Memo No. 21 of 24 Nov 43 and in connection with the survey being undertaken with a view to reducing our commitments in NORTH AFRICA.

The commitments in respect of the islands of PANTELLARIA and LAMPEDUSA have been reviewed and the future policy will be as follows:-

Subject: Consultation with Regional Commissioners on Matters of Policy.

To : Vice Presidents of Administrative Section, Economic Section and Political Section.

1. When considering matters of policy which affect the whole territory, such as the price of crops, wages, food prices, legislation, I wish Vice Presidents to ensure that the views of the Regional Commissioners are sought. Regional Commissioners after consultation with their staffs, administrative and technical, are in a better position than anyone in the field to advise Vice Presidents for they have a comprehensive responsibility, can weigh the value of the opinions given by various specialist officers in their Regions, and should have a general and intimate knowledge of conditions in those Regions.
2. When for instance the price to be paid for a crop has to be fixed, I should expect Regional Commissioners to be asked for their views in sufficient time for them to consult their Provincial Commissioners and technical officers. These views can then be considered by the Vice Presidents with their Sub-Commissions who will, of course, have obtained technical information from their representatives in the field.
3. The same procedure should be followed if important legislation is under consideration. Vice Presidents should not depend wholly on the technical advice of Sub-Commissions who are possibly not in a position to gauge the effect of their proposals in the Province.
4. Having obtained the Regional views and discussed them with their Sub-Commissions, Vice Presidents should submit their final recommendations in writing to me, with copies to other Vice Presidents, in order that the matter may, if I so rule, be discussed at a Vice Presidents' Meeting before my decision is given.

TO : Brigadier Lush.

1. Public Safety and Security are very closely allied and could profitably be combined, with a resultant saving in overhead personnel.

2. The Public Safety function is essentially executive in character, and executive power should be exercised through Regional and Provincial headquarters.

3. Direct relations with the Carabinieri could be maintained as easily from Naples as from Salerno--perhaps more conveniently, since the most difficult public safety problem is in fact here.

4. It must be remembered that the present division of our Headquarters is surely temporary. Our permanent organization would be predicated upon the assumption that the entire Commission will be eventually located at the seat of the Italian Government. No reason is apparent, why consolidation of these two branches would in any way prejudice the advisory functions of the Commission.

PROPOSED TRANSFER OF PUBLIC SAFETY SUB-COMMISSION
TO EXECUTIVE COMMISSIONERS SECTION

1. It would destroy the day-to-day contacts with Interior, Legal and Public Health with all of which Public Safety works closely.
2. It would remove the Subcommittee from the town in which all the ministers concerned are residents. Feala, Roche, Casati and Orlando.
3. It would create confusion inasmuch as a second Vice President would be dealing with the same Italian ministers on varying aspects of one question.
4. It would involve the decentralization of Public Safety work to Regional and Provincial officers. Under the Italian system such work is centralized.

The result would be either;

1. a dislocation, or more likely
2. that our Public Safety officers would cease to be of value in guiding the Italians.

In general the change would prejudice the ACC character of our work and tend to revert to AMG conditions which are out of date.

The question of the control of security intelligence should be considered separately.
