SUBJECT: Disposition of Personnel of Yugoslav Origin
at Present in Sicily

TO : Military Government Section, A.F.H.Q.

1. Personnel of Yugoslav origin, both military and civilian, in Sicily have been a source of continuous trouble and annoyance to the Allied Military Commands and to Allied Military Government. This situation is likely to continue until positive steps are taken to correct it.

2. After full investigation of the situation it is recommended:

(a) That the Italian High Command be directed to transfer military personnel of Yugoslav origin to Sardinia for inclusion in labor units destined for Corsica.

(b) That civilians of Yugoslav extraction be removed from Sicily; possibly for inclusion in Yugoslav military formations in the Middle East.

(c) That Lt. Plameneac, reportedly representing the Yugoslav Government and accredited by A.F.H.Q. and Dr. Macun, reportedly a member of the Yugoslav Ministry of Foreign Affairs, be removed from Sicily.

SUBJECT: Palermo Displaced Persons Camp

TO : A.C.C. Headquarters, Brindisi
Displaced Persons Subcommission, Attention Col. Kirkwood

1. After discussion separately with Lt. Col. Poletti and
Lt. Col. MacFarland, the attached correspondence is passed to you.

2. The two Yugoslav officers concerned are believed to be
Lt. Plamenec, accredited representative of the Yugoslav Government,
accredited by A.F.I.Q., and Dr. Macun, an internee, formerly a mem-
ber of the Yugoslav State Department.

3. It is considered that if these officers, as alleged, en-
couraged the desertion from the Italian Army of Italian soldiers of
Yugoslav blood, they should be removed from whatever position they
now hold.

4. It is also recommended that A.F.I.Q. be asked to authorize
and arrange the movement of all Yugoslav Nationals from the camp at
Palermo and if possible from the Island of Sicily.

5. It is understood that a Yugoslav Army is being collected and
trained in the Middle East Theater. Most of the Yugoslav inmates of
the Palermo Camp wish to join a combatant force under their own flag
and leaders.

6. With reference to paragraph 3 of basic letter, Lt. Col.
Poletti states that I.B.S. have asked instructions from No. 1
District as the "higher authority".

2. There is evidence that the two Yugoslav army officers at the camp instigated the movement to incite desertion by Italian soldiers of Yugoslav extraction serving with the SABAUDA Div.

SUBJECT: Italian Soldiers of YUGOSLAV Blood in Palermo Camp
for Allied Nationals.

TO : R.C.A.O.

1. On January 10, 1944 Region 1 assumed control of the Camp for Allied Nationals and learned that 78 Italian soldiers who had deserted from Italian forces stationed in Sicily had recently arrived at the Camp seeking the protection and care of Allied authorities.

2. The situation was immediately reported to the Island Base Section and to District 1. I.B.S. advised Region 1 to allow the Italian soldiers to stay in the Camp the evening of July 10 pending completion of their investigation of the facts.

3. On the afternoon of July 11 I.B.S. took custody of the Italian soldiers and are now holding them pending instructions from higher authority.

4. Because of the friction between the Italians of YUGOSLAV origin and the Italians it is recommended that the entire YUGOSLAV group now remaining at the Palermo Camp be removed from Sicily as soon as possible. There seems little doubt that this element of the Camp population has encouraged the desertions and will continue to be a disturbing influence as long as YUGOSLAV Nationals remain concentrated in Palermo.
