My dear Mr....,

You will be disappointed to receive news of the appointment of Aldisio as High Commissioner and the Acting Chief Commissioner wants me to tell you that your telegram of 10th July and your letter of 12th July did receive consideration at this Headquarters. Captain Stone was in the process of recommending to the Italian Government that an alternative for Musotto other than Aldisio should be found, but it developed that the alternative candidate would not accept the appointment and plans had proceeded too far with the six parties with regard to Aldisio to make a change.

I know that the appointment of A or B or C as High Commissioner will make no difference to you as a good civil servant in your efforts to get the administration of the Island on a decent basis. We shall always be faced with political considerations on the part of a political Government and others and it will not always be possible to guide the Government into what we consider correct channels.

Your letter regarding plans for the enforcement of the collection scheme is very satisfactory and I hope that the great efforts that you and your staff are making will gird the Italian authorities into action and produce successful results.

Let me know how things are going and if we can help you in any way from here either by action with the Italian Government or in any other way.

1. To your 3066 of 6 JUL I replied with my RCO 336 of 10 JUL. As reported in my RCO 014.12 of 10 JUN, there has been considerable political manoeuvring in Palermo to oust Musotto on no other grounds than the political ambitions of a certain group which radiates round La Loggia, a pro-fascist under-secretary of the ministry of finance. This group found a fortuitous ally in Aldisio when he was appointed minister of the interior in the former Badoglio government. As head of the Christian Democrat party in Sicily, Aldisio is prepared to go to any length to get members of his party into the key positions in communal and provincial administrations and to this end was prepared to come to terms with the La Loggia group in the conspiracy against Musotto. Patterella, who was a member of the Giunta Consultiva and is now under-secretary of state for the ministry of education in the Bonomi government, is an Aldisio satellite who is undoubtedly continuing the campaign in government circles against Musotto which Aldisio initiated. The latter, having fallen from grace after his brief tenure as minister of the interior, is now seeking to restore his prestige and at the same time achieve his political programme in Sicily by badgering General into appointing him High Commissioner at Musotto's expense.

2. Those of us who recall Aldisio since the earliest days of the occupation until his appointment last January as prefect of Caltanissetta, would not consider him either stronger or more energetic than the present High Commissioner. His actions are generally prompted and dominated by party interest and he is not averse to fishing in troubled waters.

3. I am strongly of the opinion that Musotto should be given a fair and square trial with the full support of the present Italian government. The original decree which put him in office needs revision; the Giunta Consultiva should be re-integrated and its functions clarified by appropriate regulations; the institution of the Alto Commissariato requires to be co-ordinated with other local government agencies through the ministries concerned, all of whom should channel their communications through the High Commissioner and not direct.

4. I discussed the question at some length with His Excellency V.E. Orlando during his visit to Palermo last week and he fully concurs with the view that a change of High Commissioner at this time is undesirable. He also considers that the present status of the Giunta Consultiva is unsatisfactory and intends, I believe, to talk over this and other civilian matters with Bonomi.

1. The naming for the High Commissioner is in full swing. On Tuesday 6th inst. Aldisio, Minister of the Interior, arrived here at 1300 hours by special plane and left after a stay of 6 hours. During this time he spent some 2 hours with Musotto and had a long session with the recently appointed prefect of Palermo, D'Antoni and the Rector of the University, AVV. Bavieri, both of whom were at Salerno and Naples last week.

2. Musotto reported to me immediately the details of his talk with Aldisio which was apparently confined to convening the Giunta Consultiva at an early date without Altomare (Messina) and Saitta (Catania), for whom Aldisio promised to telephone the names of substitutes; the eventual substitution of the prefect of Messina, Stanganelli, and prefect of Agrigento, Pancano, by career prefects; a complete change of the Giunta Comunale, Palermo. The two prefects and the Giunta Comunale, Palermo are all A.M.G. appointments and Musotto took the stand with Aldisio that any changes must be first agreed with A.C.C.

3. Late yesterday evening the object of Aldisio's talk with D'Antoni and Bavieri leaked out. The latter must have been offered the appointment of High Commissioner in place of Musotto and it is understood from an intercepted letter to Badoglio that he is prepared to accept. The enclosed communication from Bavieri to the Chief Commissioner may have some significance in this connection.

4. Before his recent visit to Salerno, AVV. Bavieri (red) called to me that he was originally offered the appointment of High Commissioner before Musotto and that he declined because he felt unequal to the task due to inexperience and was literally afraid of it.

5. Musotto, who is now acquainted with the foregoing circumstances, has asked my advice. I have reminded him that he is appointed by Royal Decree, that a new Government is being formed, that it will need a new Decree to replace him and that consequently he should stick to his post and call his Giunta Consultiva together without further delay to deal with

immediate business, particularly the harvesting of the wheat crop.

6. I am sending you these hurried early details just ascertained in order to catch this morning's plane leaving with A.C.C. personnel.

SUBJECT: Appointment of Italian Officials

TO : Deputy Executive Commissioner, R.C. & M.O. Section, A.C.C.

1. The Labor Sub-Commission, in consultation with the Finance Sub-Commission, has reviewed the qualifications of the three individuals whose names were submitted by the Italian Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Labor for appointment as Commissioners of three national social insurance agencies.

2. We approve the appointment of Rag. Renato Raselli as Commissioner of the National Institute for Insurance Against Accidents at Work and are advising Minister Corbino to this effect at once, because of the need for Rag. Raselli to take over his duties at the earliest possible date. His work in his present position as Inspector for the Institute is favorably known to both Sub-Commissions, and he has been vetted by Region III, A.C.C., in this connection.

3. We have definite question as to the qualifications of the other two candidates for the particular posts proposed. We are, accordingly, taking the matter up with Minister Corbino with a view to giving further consideration to their qualifications in relation to the duties they would be called upon to perform, before reaching a final decision.

In the light of this, we submit to this Commission the names chosen for the mentioned appointments and kindly ask for a prompt reply to this Ministry stating if the names are favourably viewed by this Commission.

1°)-Istituto Nazionale per Sociale Rilievo: Commissioner prof. Luigi Lordi, permanent instructor of financial and accounting methematics at the R.Naval Istituto Universitario.
2°)-Istituto Nazionale for the insurance against work accidents: Commissioner the Accountant Renato Bassoli, administrative department inspector of the Institute for the regions of Campania and Calabria.
3°)-Ente Nazionale for relief and care of the State employees: Commissioner prof. Alessandro Croziani, permanent instructor of law at the R.University of Naples.

The above mentioned commissioners would legally represent in liberated territory the institute or the agency to which they have been appointed and would substitute the administrative organs, exercising powers that according to institutional and successive laws, are proper to the agents themselves.

Decreto-Legge 7 luglio 1925, n.1173 e il disporre, a cura dello stesso Provveditorato e con le norme previste dal predetto R. Decreto-Legge, qualsiasi opera pubblica, anche in aggiunta o in sostituzione dell'attività delle pubbliche Amministrazioni e Istituzioni locali, o relativa alla sistemazione edilizia ed industriale di zone sinistrate e alla attuazione di piani regolatori parziali a queste inerenti.
Le approvazioni delle opere e dei piani restano in ogni caso demandate all'Alto Commissario, in deroga a tutte le vigenti disposizioni;

b) - Il promuovere la stipulazione di convenzioni e di concessioni da parte di enti locali in materia di pubblici servizi e disporre la revisione e, quando del caso, la rescissione di quelle in corso.

Nel caso di rescissione, le relative controversie sareanno deferite alla cognizione di un collegio arbitrale con sede in Palermo, presieduto dal Primo Presidente di quella Corte di Appello o da un magistrato di grado non inferiore al quarto, da lui delegato, e composto di due membri nominati dalle parti. Gli arbitri dovranno emettere la loro decisione nel termine di giorni novanta dalla domanda di arbitrato.

SUBJECT: Appointment of Italian High Commissioner for Sicily

TO : Executive Commissioner, Regional Control and Military Government Section, ACC (Naples)

1. Lt. Colonel Hancock and I are deeply concerned about the selection of the Italian High Commissioner for Sicily. In conference with us, the Chief Commissioner stated that he would personally talk to Badoglio in favor of Francesco Musotto. We feel that this matter is of the highest importance not only for ACC but also for the successful operation of the Italian Government in Sicily. The cooperation of Sicily is needed. Musotto has the strong support of the people, including all nine Prefects, large numbers of Mayors, other public officials, and all political parties. The Church considers him favorably.

2. His record is admirable and his selection would stand as evidence of the good faith of the Italian Government in its dealings with Sicily. It would insure efficient and intelligent administration by a universally respected Sicilian and would also preclude those difficulties at the time of the turnover anticipated by some. Furthermore, the people of Sicily expect the Musotto appointment and the Minister of the Interior has approved and encouraged it. If the Italian Government prevails in the first difference of opinion with ACC, the prestige of ACC will surely be impaired.

3. Musotto comes from humble parentage and received his education as the result of great sacrifice by his family. He took his law degree at the University of Palermo, qualified through Civil Service examinations for the Magistracy, and was duly appointed to the court at Palermo.

As an Infantry Officer he fought by the side of the Allies in the war of 1915-18, and was awarded the silver medal for conspicuous bravery on the field of battle at Monte Santo in 1917. In spite of being wounded by shrapnel he continued to lead his men forward and refused to be taken back to the medical aid station until finally being wounded more severely.

6

After the Armistice he returned to Palermo and resumed his seat on the judicial bench, and achieved the high office of Procuratore del Re, which he occupied until 1923, at which time he retired to take up private practice as a penal lawyer. His fame had now spread throughout Sicily, not only on account of his brilliance in the legal field but also of his complete fairness and honesty in a time when these attributes were the exception rather than the rule among those holding administrative and judicial posts.

In company with the great Vittorio Emanuele Orlando, to whom he was devoted, Musotto became a leading member of the Federation of World War Veterans. In 1924, as President of the Federation of Palermo, he was elected with Orlando to the Chamber of Deputies. The assassination of Matteotti and the consequent purge of the Social-Democratic Party by the Fascists aroused the profound opposition of Musotto and the Federation, and at the Congress of Assisi they expressed their dissatisfaction and passed a resolution demanding liberty and justice. As a result of this the entire Federation was forcibly dissolved by Mussolini and all those responsible for the resolution were persecuted in the usual Fascist manner. Musotto and Orlando retained their seats in the Chamber of Deputies and despite continued harassment from the Fascists continued their opposition to Mussolini and his Party.

In 1929 when the motion for the adoption of the Fascist Codes was presented, they and 9 other deputies voted against it. For this they were barred from the Chamber, and their seats were taken by Fascist Party members not elected by the people.

Musotto then attempted to carry on his former profession of lawyer, but the constant supervision and harassment to which he was subjected by orders of the Fascists made it practically impossible for him. On several occasions only the intervention of loyal friends saved him from actual physical violence on the part of the Blackshirts, and in June 1943 an order was issued by the Questore at Rome to arrest him and send him to the concentration camp at Abruzzi. However the succeeding state of emergency and the invasion by our forces prevented the order from being put into effect.

Since his election as Prefect of Palermo Musotto has closed his law chambers, even though now, in view of his past record and the removal of the fear of the Fascist Party, he has the opportunity of developing a tremendous practice. Being the high-principled man that he is, Musotto does not wish to make capital out of his position. In spite of all other considerations he asks only to be able to devote himself to

the improvement of the well-being of the non people from whom he is always proud of saying that he has come.

4. He is a conscientious and able public servant, thoroughly devoted to democratic liberal government. His selection would be in keeping with the principles of freedom and democracy proclaimed by the British and American governments.
