ITALIAN LOCAL GOVERNMENTS.

1. The present position with regard to the organization of Italian Provincial and Central Administration in Italian Government Territory and Military Government Territory (with the exception of 5th and 8th Army AUSA areas) is as follows:

2. In Italian Government Territory local government is now regulated by Royal Decree No. 111, published in the Gazzetta Ufficiale on 22 April 1946. All Regional Orders dealing with the reorganization of local government ceased automatically to be effective in any territory on the date on which such territory was restored to the jurisdiction of the Italian Government.

3. In Military Government Territory (with the exception of 5th and 8th Army AUSA areas) Royal Decree No. 111 was made applicable by virtue of the Executive Commissioner's endorsement published in the Gazzetta Ufficiale of 10 May 1946. The actual operation of the Royal Decree dates from the time a copy of the Gazzetta Ufficiale is actually handed to the Prefect by the Allied Control Commission, or by such other method as may otherwise be in the future.

4. With a view to uniformity and continuity of the same pattern of local government throughout Italy, those of the provisions of the Royal Decree No. 111 which are applicable to 5th and 8th Army AUSA areas should be revised, but Royal Decree No. 111 in a temporary measure, passed in a war emergency but pending the restoration of elections.

5. Schedule 'A' is an Administrative Instruction for the guidance of Senior Civil Affairs Officers, Regional Commissioners and the Prefects under their respective commands. It outlines the system of local government to be followed.

6. Schedule 'B' is a list of Italian local government.

7. Schedule 'C' is a list of administrative ranks of Civil Servants.

1. The present position with regard to the organization of Italian Provincial and Central Administration in Italian Government Territory and Military Government Territory (with the exception of 5th and 8th Army ABG areas) is as follows:

a. In Italian Government Territory local government is now regulated by Royal Decree No. 111, published in the Gazzetta Ufficiale on 22 April 1944. All Regional Orders dealing with the reorganization of local government ceased automatically to be effective in any territory on the date on which such territory was referred to the jurisdiction of the Italian Government.

b. In Military Government Territory (with the exception of 5th and 8th Army ABG areas) Royal Decree No. 111 was made applicable by virtue of the Executive Committee's endorsement published in the Gazzetta Ufficiale of 10 July 1944. The actual operation of the Royal Decree dates from the time a copy of the Gazzetta Ufficiale is actually handed to the Prefect by the Allied Control Commission, or by such other method as may authorize in the future.

2. With a view to uniformity and continuity of the same pattern of local government throughout Italy, those of the provisions of the Royal Decree 111 outlined in Schedule "A", as can be applied to 5th and 8th Army ABG areas, shall be so applied as soon as possible. It should be noted, however, that Royal Decree No. 111 is a transitory measure, passed as a war emergency gap pending the restoration of elections.

3. a. Schedule "A" is an Administrative Instruction for the guidance of Senior Civil Affairs Officers, Regional Commissioners and the officers under their respective commands. It outlines the pattern of local government to be followed.

b. Schedule "B" is a chart of Italian local government.

c. Schedule "C" is a list of Administrative Ranks of Civil Servants.

d. Schedule "D" is the Italian translation of Royal Decree No. 111.

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION NO.

SUBJECT: Reorganization of Provincial and Central Administration.

TO : All Senior Civil Affairs Officers, Regional Officers and Officers under their respective commands.

1. The various government officers and organs herein mentioned derive their powers and functions from certain fundamental laws embodied in a Unified Text of Municipal and Provincial Laws of 1915 No. 148 with certain modifications made by the Royal Decree of December 30, 1925, No. 2839.

2. Provincial Administration is to be organized as follows:

a. The highest position in provincial administration is that of Prefect. Next in order come the Vice-Prefect (Vice Prefetto Vicario) and Vice Prefect Inspector (Vice Prefetto Ispettore). The Vice Prefect Vicario acts in the absence of the Prefect with the latter's powers. The Vice Prefect Inspector is charged with the inspection of conditions of local government throughout the provinces.

b. When the post of Prefect is vacant, and a suitable civil service career official of the necessary grade and qualifications is available, he should be appointed with the title "prefetto". If no such career official is available, a person must be nominated to the position who, possesses the requisite executive ability and does not have an objectionable political background. His title should be "prefetto Regente". The same principle applies when a vacancy exists for a Vice-Prefect when no suitable career official is available for appointment. Executive Memorandum No 12 sets forth the procedure in detail.

3. In both instances, nominations supported by information as to the qualifications of nominees, are to be submitted to the Senior Civil Affairs Officer or to the Regional Commissioner for transmission through (R.C. & N.S. Section 57) 08 Branch) channels to the Administrative Section for notification to the Italian Government and for approval by Allied Central Commission.

4. The principal organs of provincial government which are to be revived in consultation with the Prefect are the following:

a. COMISSIOIS DI PREFETTURA ("Prefectural Council"): It is normally composed of the Prefect or his substitute, the president, and two senior Councilors ("Consiglieri") of the Prefecture. Its powers and functions are principally advisory and are regulated by specific laws, although the Prefect may request the opinion of the Council on any matter. It also has certain functions relating to the approval of

3. In both instances, nominations supported by information as to qualifications of nominees, are to be submitted to the Senior Civil Affairs Officer or to the Regional Commissioner for transmission through (R.C. & M.C. Section 5708 Branch) channels to the Administrative Section for notification to the Italian Government and for approval by Allied Control Commission.

4. The principal organs of provincial government which are to be revived in consultation with the Prefect are the following:

a. CONSIGLIO DI PREFETTURA - ("Prefectural Council"): It is normally composed of the Prefect or his substitute, the president, and two senior Councillors ("Consiglieri") of the Prefecture. Its powers and functions are principally advisory and are regulated by specific laws, although the Prefect may request the opinion of the Council on any matter. It also has certain functions relating to the approval of accounts of communes and certain institutions, in which capacity its composition is enlarged to include additional officials.

b. GIUNTA PROVINCIALE AMMINISTRATIVA - ("Provincial Administrative Board"): It is composed of ten members with the Prefect or Vice Prefetto Vicario as President of the Board, and includes the following officials of the Prefecture: A Vice Prefect Inspector, two Councillors, the Chief Accountant ("Regisatore Capo") or his substitute and the Intendant of Finance. ("Intendente di Finanza") or his substitute. The remaining four regular and two substitute members, are citizen appointees chosen from experts in legal administrative or technical matters, nominated by the Delegazione Provinciale, whose it has been possible to constitute such body and confirmed by the Prefect subject to approval of the Allied Control Commission. The Giunta Provinciale Amministrativa has powers of review over communal administration.

The following persons cannot be members of the Giunta Provinciale Amministrativa:

- I. The President, Vice-President and members of the Deputazioni Provinciali.
 - II. Mayors and Aldermen of Comuni.
 - III. Said Provincial and Central Functionaries.
 - IV. Relatives up to the second degree; and first degree relatives of the Provincial tax-collector and tax-receiver.
- C. DEPUTAZIONE PROVINCIALE - ("Provincial Deputation"): This body is revived to replace the fascist-created Reparto, the latter body being now abolished. In Pre-fascist provincial Government, the Deputation was normally appointed by, and from among, the members of a larger elected body known as the Comitato Provinciale ("Provincial Council"). For present purpose since the elective Consiglio is not possible at this time, the Deputation is to be nominated by the Prefect and approved by the Allied Control Commission. It consists of a President and unpaid regular and substitute citizen members. The numerical composition of the Deputazioni Provinciali varies according to the population as follows:

The President is also the Head of Provincial Administration ("Capo dell'Amministrazione Provinciale"). He convokes, presides over, prepares the agenda for, and executes the decisions of the Deputazione Provinciale. The President, subject to the approval of the Prefect, may appoint a Vice-President from among the Provincial Deputies who assists him and substitutes for him in his absence. The President may entrust the duties with special administrative duties.

5. Municipal Administration is to be organized as follows:

- a. SINDACO: In place of "Podestà" the descriptive title of "Sindaco" (Mayor) must be adopted where a commune has a Giunta Comunale and "Comissario Prefettorio" where there is no such local body. New appointments or changes in the position of Mayor will be made by the Prefect, if in office, and approved by the Allied Control Commission. Appointments of Vice-Sindacato to be similarly effected.
- b. The Mayor may entrust to the Alderman (Assessore) special duties in connection with the municipal Administration. The Mayor convokes, presides over, prepares the agenda for, and executes the decisions taken by the Giunta Municipale.
- c. SEGREARIO MUNICIPALE (Town Clerk): This official is a civil servant and cannot be appointed mayor, or be lightly dismissed. The Prefect has full power to effect transfers, retirements, and appointments of Town Clerks, and changes should be effected only through him under the standing procedure which must be closely followed.

The President is also the Head of Provincial Administration ("Cape doll" Administrations Provinciales). He convokes, presides over, prepares the agenda for, and executes the decisions of the Deputations Provinciales. The President, subject to the approval of the Prefect, may appoint a Vice-President from among the Provincial Deputies who assists him and substitutes for him in his absence. The President may entrust the deputies with special administrative duties.

Municipal Administration is to be organized as follows:

a. SINDACO: In place of "Podestà" the democratic title of "Sindaco" (Mayor) must be adopted where a comune has a Giunta Comunale and "Comissario Prefettizio" where there is no such local body. New appointments or changes in the position of Mayor will be made by the Prefect, if in office, and approved by the Allied Central Commission. Appointments of Vice-Sindacare to be similarly effected.

b. The Mayor may entrust to the Alderman (Assessori) special duties in connection with the municipal administration. The Mayor convokes, presides over, prepares the agenda for, and executes the decisions taken by the Giunta Municipale.

c. SECRETARIO COMUNALE (Town Clerk): This official is a civil servant and cannot be appointed mayor, or be lightly dismissed. The Prefect has full power to effect transfers, retirements, and appointments of Town Clerks, and changes should be effected only through him under the standing procedure which must be closely followed.

d. GIUNTA COMUNALE ("Municipal Board of Aldermen"): This body is revised to replace the fascist-created Consiglio Comunale. Normally, as in the case of the Provincial Deputation, its members, called "Assessori" ("Aldermen") should be selected by, and from among the members of, an elected Consiglio Comunale ("Municipal Council"). Under present emergency conditions the members of the Giunta Comunale are appointed and removed by the Prefect, if in office, with the approval of the Allied Military Government. The Giunta Comunale should be established as early as conditions so permit. The numerical composition of the Giunta varies according to population and is as follows:

6. Substitute or alternate members of any of the aforementioned agencies do not take part in their meetings except in the absence of the regular members.


7. In the selection of members of the above agencies, consideration should be given to various shades of political opinion according to their local strength. Labor and agriculture as well as industry and the professions, moreover, must be adequately represented. Persons who held such positions in the Fascist Party as specified in Article I of Royal Decree of December 28, 1943, No. 29/B are barred from office.

8. For the purposes of securing a proper understanding and a uniform application of these instructions, as well as other matters affecting local government, meetings of all Provincial Commissioners will be held at regular intervals. Similar meetings of all Prefects will also be held in order to assure a uniform application of the patterns of local government herein set forth.

9. In conformity with the above, from now onwards, all Provincial and Municipal Decrees and Orders must be issued in the name of the Prefect or local Mayor respectively and bear only the "VISTO" of the Allied Military Government Officer concerned.

 CHART OF ITALIAN LOCAL GOVERNMENT




LEGEND

ROYAL DECREE - LAW OF APRIL 4th, 1934 No. 111

Transitory Rules for the Administration of Communes and Provinces.

VITTORIO EMANUELE III

By Grace of God and by the Will of the Nation
King of Italy

Whereas Art. 16. of the Law of January 19th, 1933, No. 129;
Whereas the Unified Text of the Communal and Provincial Law approved by Royal Decree
of March 3rd, 1934, No. 383;

Whereas the Royal Decree Law of October 30th, 1933, No. 2/3;
Having considered that it is necessary to issue transitory rules for the administra-
tion of Communes and Provinces while waiting to establish administrative
elections;

Considering the state of emergency in consequence of the war;
After having heard the Council of the Ministers;
On the proposal of the Minister of Interior;

WE HAVE DECREED AND WE DEGREE

Art. 1

Each commune has a mayor (Sindaco) and a board of aldermen (Giunta Municipale).
The mayor (Sindaco) and the aldermen (Assessori Municipale) are appointed by
the Prefect.

They may be removed by the Prefect for not having complied with the duties of
their office or for reasons of public order.

Against any measures of removal or appeal is allowed jurisdictionally or administra-
tively.

Art. 2

The mayor (Sindaco), in the case of absence or inability to appear, is substi-
tuted by the alderman, designated as such (Assessore Delegato), who will be appointed
by the decision of the Mayor (Sindaco) subject to approval of the Prefect.

The mayor (Sindaco) may, moreover, entrust to the alderman (Assessore) special
duties in connection with the administration of the commune.

The mayor (Sindaco) convokes and presides over the board of aldermen (Giunta
Municipale), arranging the matters to be discussed at each meeting, and ³¹⁰⁴ discusses
the decisions taken by the board.

Art. 3

The board of aldermen (Giunta Municipale) is empowered to deliberate on the
matters over which the Unified Text of February 4th, 1915, No. 118, as modified by R.
D. of December 30th, 1923, No. 2839, established the authority of the board of al-
dermen (Giunta Municipale) and of the Communal Council (Consiglio Municipale), withi-

tion of Communes and Provinces while waiting to establish administrative elections;

Considering the state of emergency in consequence of the war; After having heard the Council of the Ministers; On the proposal of the Minister of Interior;

WE HAVE DECREED AND WE ORDER

Art. 1

Each commune has a mayor (Sindaco) and a board of aldermen (Giunta Municipale). The mayor (Sindaco) and the aldermen (Assessori Municipale) are appointed by the Prefect.

They may be removed by the Prefect for not having complied with the duties of their office or for reasons of public order.

Against any measures of removal no appeal is allowed juridically or administratively.

Art. 2

The mayor (Sindaco), in the case of absence or inability to appear, is substituted by the aldermen, delegated as such (Assessori Delegato), who will be appointed by the decision of the mayor (Sindaco) subject to approval of the Prefect.

The mayor (Sindaco) may, moreover, entrust to the aldermen (Assessori) special duties in connection with the administration of the commune.

The mayor (Sindaco) convokes and presides over the board of aldermen (Giunta Municipale), arranging the matters to be discussed at each meeting, and ~~substitutes~~ ⁵¹⁰⁴ the decisions taken by the board.

Art. 3

The board of aldermen (Giunta Municipale) is empowered to deliberate on the matters over which the Unified Text of February 4th, 1915, No. 148, as modified by R. D. of December 30th, 1923, No. 2839, established the authority of the board of aldermen (Giunta Municipale) and of the Communal Council (Consiglio Municipale), without prejudice to the provisions of special laws in force.

Art. 4

The administration of each province is composed of a President (Presidente) and a Provincial Deputation (Deputazioni Provinciali).

The President (Presidente) and the provincial deputies (Deputati Provinciali) are appointed by the Prefect. The provisions of paragraph 3 of Art. 1 apply to them.

Art. 5

The president (Presidente) may appoint a Vice-President (Vice Presidente) from among the provincial deputies (Deputati Provinciali), and he may entrust them with special duties in connection with the administration of the province.

The vice president (Vice Presidente) assists the president (Presidente) and substitutes for him when absent or prevented by a justified reason.

Art. 5 (Cont'd)

The appointment of the Vice President (Vice Presidente) must be approved by the Prefect. The President (Presidente), moreover, convokes and presides over the provincial Deputation (Deputazione Provinciale) arranging the matters to be discussed at each meeting, and executes the decisions taken by the Provincial Deputation (Deputazione Provinciale).

Art. 6

The Provincial Deputation (Deputazione Provinciale) is empowered to deliberate on all matters over which the Unified Text of February 4th, 1915, No. 148, as modified by Royal Decree of December 30th, 1923, No. 2839, established the authority of the Provincial Deputation (Deputazione Provinciale) and of the Provincial Council (Consiglio Provinciale), without prejudice to the provisions of the special laws in force.

Art. 7

Besides the cases provided by the Unified Text of February 4th, 1915, No. 48 those persons cannot be appointed to the office of mayor (Sindaco), president (Presidente), alderman (assessore Comunale), provincial deputy (Deputato Provinciale), or elective member (Membro Elettivo) of the Giunta Provinciale Administrative (G.P.A.) who came under any of the provisions of Art. 1 of the Royal Decree of December 28th, 1943, No. 2978.

Art. 8

The composition, convocation, and functioning of the Board of Aldermen (Giunta Comunale) and of the Provincial Deputation (Deputazione Provinciale) are governed by the provisions of the Unified Text of February 4th, 1915, No. 148, as modified by Royal Decree of December 30th, 1923, No. 2839.

The decisions of the mayor (Sindaco), Board of Aldermen (Giunta Municipale), President (Presidente) and of the Provincial Deputation (Deputazione Provinciale) are subject to the control of legality and of importance conferred on the Organs of the Government by the provisions of the laws in effect.

Art. 9

The Provincial Administrative Board (Giunta Provinciale Amministrativa) is composed of the Prefect or his deputy, who presides, of the Provincial Inspector, (Intendente Provinciale), of the Finance superintendent (Intendente del Finanze), of two councillors of the Prefecture (Consiglieri di Prefettura) appointed at the beginning of every year by the Prefect, of the Chief Accountant of the Prefecture (Capo della Prefettura), of four regular members (Membri Effettivi) and two substitute members chosen from among persons expert in judicial, administrative and technical matters, appointed by the decision of the provincial deputation (Deputazione Provinciale), subject to approval of the Prefect.

The Prefect and the finance superintendent (Intendente di Finanze) respectively designate as substitutes, a councillor of the Prefecture (Consigliere di Prefettura), an official of the accounting office of the Prefecture, and an official of the Provincial Office of Taxes (Intendenza).

The Substitutes do not take part in the meetings of the board unless there is an insufficient number of the regular members in the respective category.

A quorum of five members is sufficient to render valid the decisions of the

Art. 5

The decisions of the mayor (Sindaco), Board of Aldermen (Giunta Municipale), President (Presidente) and of the Provincial Deputation (Deputazione Provinciale) are subject to the control of legality and of importance conferred on the Organs of the Government by the provisions of the laws in effect.

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The Prefect and the finance superintendent (Intendente di Finanze) respectively designate as substitutes, a councillor of the Prefecture (Consigliere di Prefettura), an official of the accountancy office of the Prefecture, and an official of the Provincial Office of Taxes (Intendenza).

The Substitutes do not take part in the meetings of the board unless there is an insufficient number of the regular members in the respective category.

A quorum of five members is sufficient to render valid the decisions of the Giunta Provinciale Amministrativa in administrative session (in sede amministrativa). For an equality of votes, the President's vote prevails.

Art. 10

The following persons cannot be members of the Giunta Provinciale Amministrativa:

- a) The President, the Vice President and the members of the Provincial Deputation (Deputazione Provinciale).
- b) The Mayors (Sindaci) and the Aldermen (Assessori) of the communes of the province;
- c) Provincial and communal functionaries and employees as well as accountants and those persons of public institutions of assistance and charity who receive wages or salaries.
- d) Those persons who do not possess the required qualifications for being appointed "Assessori" in conformity to the regulation in force concerning the "Organi di Governo" (Grand Jury).

Art. 10 (Cont'd)

9. Relatives up to the second degree of relationship, and relatives of the Provincial tax-collector and tax-receiver in the first degree while he is fulfilling the office of the "Destinaria" and of the "Receveditoria", (Provincial Administration of Taxes).

Art. 11

In the case of the dissolution of the Provincial Deputation (Deputaciones Provinciales) the elective members of the Junta Provincial Administrativa go out of office but are empowered to act until the appointment of the new members.

The elective members who without justified motive do not attend three consecutive meetings lose their office. The dismissal is resolved by the Junta itself on the proposal of the President (Presidente) after having heard the interested persons.

The vacancies resulting among the elective members are filled by the senior substitute elective member.

When there are no substitutes left, new ones are appointed by the Deputation (Deputaciones).

Art. 12

To the elective members of the Junta Provincial Administrativa a fee for each meeting attended by them is paid, the amount of which to be determined by Decree of the Minister of Interior.

The respective expenses are charged to the Provincial Administration.

Art. 13

The regulations of the Unified Text of March 3rd, 1934 No. 387, and subsequent legislation in variance or incompatible with the present decree are abrogated.

The Prefects will provide for the appointment of the aldermen (Assesores Comarcales) and of the Provincial Deputies (Deputados Provinciales) within 60 days that this decree becomes effective.

The Provincial Deputations (Deputaciones Provinciales) will provide, within a month after their installation in office, for the appointment of the elective members of the Junta Provincial Administrativa in substitution of the members in office appointed by the Ministry.

Art. 14

The present decree which will become effective on the day following its publication in the "Gazette Oficial del Reino", Special Series, will be promulgated by the Legislative Assemblies for conversion into law.

The Minister of Interior, the Proposer is authorized to present the respective bill of the Law.

We order, to whatsoever concerned, to observe this present decree and to see that it will be observed as a Law of the State.

The elective members who without justified motive do not attend three consecutive meetings lose their office. The dismissal is resolved by the Giunta itself on the proposal of the President (Presidente) after having heard the interested persons.

The vacancies resulting among the elective members are filled by the senior substitute elective member.

When there are no substitutes left, new ones are appointed by the Deputazione (Deputazioni).

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The Minister of Interior, the proposer is authorized to present the respective bill of the Law.

We order, to whomsoever concerned, to observe this present decree and to see that it will be observed as a Law of the State.

1. Executive Memorandum No. 39 had originally been published as an instruction to Regional Commissioners in order that the pattern of Italian local government envisaged by Region Order in Region I be followed in other regions.
2. Italian local government is now regulated by Royal Decree No. 111 and was implemented for application in Military Government Territory (with the exception of 5th and 8th Army AMG areas) by endorsement of the Executive Commissioner. In effect this had made Executive Memorandum No. 39 inoperative.
3. Royal Decree No. 111 made slight changes in the form of local government set forth in Executive Memorandum No. 39.
4. It is essential for the guidance of ACC officers and particularly those in the 5th and 8th Army AMG areas that instructions be issued as to the pattern of Italian local government to be established if uniformity and continuity are to be attained.
5. Legal Sub-Commission has been consulted on the draft of the new Executive Memorandum and its suggestions have been agreed upon and incorporated in the draft submitted herewith for your approval and for issue.
6. May the covering letter sending out the revised memo make it clear that it supercedes the previous issue (undated in the Handbook).

1. At the Regional Commissioner's Conference on 30 May 1944, the Executive Commissioner stated he felt ~~and~~ sufficient attention was being given to the rehabilitation of Italian Local Government, and that ACC and AMG Officers in Regions were inclined to regard the functioning of local governments as of secondary importance.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT

1. The Italian Government is undertaking a reorganization of Provincial and Communal Administration throughout the territory under its control.
2. In pursuance of this object certain instructions have been issued to all Prefects in such territory.
3. With a view to uniformity throughout occupied Italy and to assist the smooth working after further transfers of territory, the Interior Sub-Commission advises that those of the provisions of the instructions referred to in paragraph 2 above as can be applied to territory under Allied Military Government shall be so applied.
4. Schedule "A" with its appendices A, B, and C is an Administrative Instruction as issued by Region I, and is self-explanatory. Appendix A of the Schedule is to be issued forthwith as a general order in all Regions under Military Government. Paragraph II of the Region I administrative instruction will not apply to Regions under Military Government.

Old Political Rule Revived

NAPLES, March 14—Initial steps to re-establish liberal and democratic forms of local government in the Naples area were taken today by the Allied Control Commission which ordered abolition of the Fascist provincial political system.

The ACC mandated similar to ones introduced in Italy some months ago, abolishes the local governments, devised of 1934 and restores, with certain temporary restrictions, the legality of laws of 1915 when Italy was still under a liberal democratic constitution.

The pre-Fascist system provided for elected municipal and provincial governments similar to those found in the United States and Britain. In accordance, however, with Allied policy for Italy, popular elections will not be held until the political and military situation here is clarified.

Until elections can be held, prefects of the provinces will fill vacancies in the local administrations by appointment but they have been advised by the ACC prior to "hear" the various political tendencies of the community. Also, labor and agriculturists as well as industry and the professions are barred from posts in the new local governments.

Correction

An account of Italian local government reforms, which appeared in The Stars and Stripes of March 15, 1944, erroneously stated that various occupational groups are barred from municipal or provincial posts. The ACC order specifically directed that those groups be included in the local governments. Those barred from posts are former Fascist party office holders.

Reference your 160/15/CA, 8 March, and with particular reference to paragraphs 4 and 5.

1. The proposal that officers from regions should be attached to the Interior Subcommittee is a most valuable one and this has already been discussed with Lt. Colonel Spicer. I do, however, wish to submit that in the case of Region 6, with its very small officer strength, an attachment for two weeks of one officer is a heavy strain on our machinery. TO : All Provincial Commissioners.

1. In order to restore Provincial and Municipal Administration to a pre-Fascist level, and in the interest of securing uniformity in the form and structure of local government, the following instructions are laid down for immediate application in each individual province.

The various government officers and organs herein mentioned derive their powers and functions from certain fundamental laws embodied in a Unified Text of Municipal and Provincial Laws of 1915, N. 148, it is necessary to revise certain provisions of these laws which were superseded or repealed under fascism. It will be found that local officials are conversant with the legislation and procedure in regard to local government bodies, and, upon issuance of the attached General Order (appendix A.), can proceed with its immediate execution.
 3. The key position in provincial administration is that of Prefect. Next in order come the Vice-Prefect and Vice-Prefect Inspector (Vice-Préfets-Inspecteurs). Then the post of Prefect is vacant, and suitable civil service officials of the necessary grade for the position are not available; a person must be nominated to the position who, besides the requisite executive ability, should have a suitable political background. The same principle applies when a vacancy exists for a Vice-Prefect and no suitable career official is available for appointment.

Normally, as in the case of the Provincial Deputation, its members, called "assessori" ("Aldermen"), would be selected by, and from among the members of, an elected Consiglio Comunale ("Municipal Council"). present emergency conditions, the Giunta Comunale is to be nominated by the Mayor with the concurrence of the Provincial Commissioner or Provincial Officer, and the appointments confirmed by the Prefect of the Province. The numerical composition of the Giunta varies according to population as follows:

In order to cope with exceptional conditions, however, Provincial ~~Senators~~ Commissioners may consider it advisable to increase the number at their discretion. The above-mentioned Unified Text of 1915 defines the appointment, powers, duties, and responsibilities of Mayors and Town Councils.

9. In the selection of members of the above agencies, consideration should be given to various shades of political opinion. Labor and agriculture, including the small farmers, must be adequately represented.

10. For the purpose of securing a proper understanding and a uniform application of these instructions, as well as other matters affecting local government, meetings of all Provincial Commissioners will be held at regular intervals. Similar meetings of all Prefects will also be held in order to assure a uniform application of the attached General Order (Appendix A) which is being issued to all Prefects in this Region.

11. In conformity with the above, from now onwards, all Provincial and Municipal Decrees and Orders must be issued in the name of the Prefect or local Mayor respectively and bear only the "VISTO" of the Provincial Commissioner or Provincial Officer concerned.

8. 

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANIZATION

Interior Sub-commission Course and Regional Contact Officers

The Interior Sub-commission advises the Minister of Interior on Local Government; it also advises the Chief Commissioner, and Executive Commissioner, through the Vice President, Administrative Section, similarly, in territories under A.M.G.

The primary duty of regional and provincial commissioners and their staff officers is to insure that local government is carried out efficiently by the Italian administrative officials in all its aspects. It is therefore necessary that regional commissioners and their staff should be in the closest contact with Interior sub-commission and should know the policy to be adopted with regard to local government throughout liberated territories.

It is essential that the Administrative Section, of which the Interior Sub-commission is part, should be fully informed of conditions in regions in particular in regard to the development and activities of local government.

With this end in view, it is proposed that a short course should be held at Rear Headquarters, Salerno, of 4 days' duration.

From each region, 1-2-6, 3-4-5, 5th and 8th Army groups, 2 representative and suitable officers should be selected to attend this course. It is suggested that for the period of the course, they should be accommodated at the transit hotel, Diana, owing to the lack of accommodation in the ACC Mess and billets. 5759

I attach a suggested syllabus of the course. Precise of lectures and documents appertaining thereto will be placed in the hands of each officer for his future guidance.

The Acting Director will make a personal study of each officer attending this course. It will be his best endeavour to present, in this short course, an overall view of local government and both the background and future of local government, to the officers attending.

Officers, on completion of the course, will return to the units from which they were nominated. Thereafter, an officer in each region as selected by the Acting Director of Interior Sub-commission, with the approval of the Regional Commissioner, will, although working directly under the Regional Commissioner, be a contact officer with whom Interior Sub-commission can communicate, and who can communicate with the Interior Sub-commission.

This selected Regional Officer should be, moreover, in a position to advise the regional or provincial commissioner on matters affecting the detail and developments of local government activities within regional areas. Regional reports will be made to the Interior Sub-commission through the Regional Commissioner, and copies of such reports will be sent directly to the Executive Commissioner.

The duty of the selected officer will be to give his undivided attention to the subject of local government and to advise his regional commissioner either directly, or as and when specially directed, by the Interior Sub-Commission, in regard to local government matters.

Such officers will be instructed, whenever opportunity occurs, to attend meetings of the various local government bodies, to report on them, and, further, to report particularly in regard to questions of removals or appointments of local government officials, in regard to the release of prisoners of war required for local government work; where especially called upon to make reports in connection with Church affairs where they are of concern to this Sub-Commission.

It is clearly understood that such officers will be regional officers, and not officers of ACC Headquarters, but will, nevertheless, make it their specific duty to keep the Interior Sub-Commission in complete touch with local government matters in their areas and to encourage their developments on approved lines. The officer nominated will be part and parcel of Regional Commissioner's Headquarters staff and would deal with him in the first instance on all matters affecting local government as stated above; reports, however, would be made to the Interior Sub-commission concomitantly.

If it is decided that further courses are necessary, steps will be taken through proper channels, with the approval of the Chief Commissioner, to convene such courses.

Following upon this short course, which would be difficult to repeat, it is suggested that for periods of 15 days, one officer of each region and 5th and 8th Army groups should be attached to the Interior Sub-commission Headquarters, where they will practically handle all documents passing through this Headquarters, and will, additionally, be lectured in regard to specialist subjects by the staff of this Sub-commission.

The attachments will commence shortly after the conclusion of the course, and the return of the course officers to their units.

The details of reporting are to be arranged as soon as the above is approved.

The Interior Sub-commission will consist of the following W/E:

- Director
- Executive Officer
- 6 Staff Officers (2 for internal administration)
- 1 Church Affairs Officer
- 2 Italian Government Liaison Officers.

3

Regional Commissioners will nominate such officers to attend the courses whom they consider most suitable for this type of work, and who, in the future, will be members of the Regional Commissioner's Headquarters staff. They should be nominated with the clear understanding on the part of the Regional Officer that local government work, on the staff of the Regional Headquarters, will be their role.

Officers of the Interior Sub-commission will visit the regions as frequently as possible, and they will give regional and provincial commissioners all information in regard to the development of local government which may be required and is necessary.

It cannot be overemphasized that regular reporting to the Director of the Interior Sub-commission will be one of the primary duties of the Local Government representative on Region staff.

DIRECTIVE

of

INTERIOR SUB COMMISSION

(A) Mission

The restoration of an efficient and honest administration of the country's internal affairs to be carried out by the Ministry of the Interior having regard to the general functions of the Allied Control Commission and in particular to

- (1) the abolition of the fascist system
- (2) the enforcement of the Armistice terms and of the surrender agreements or other arrangements relating thereto.

(B) Major Functions

1. (1) To review as and when deemed necessary all appointments made to and the conditions of service under the Central, Provincial, and Communal administration.
 - (2) To determine whether the organization and control of services which function under the Ministry are adequate for and in accordance with the purposes and conditions of A. above.
 - (3) To ensure, where there is departure from or failure to observe such conditions that the necessary steps are taken to effect compliance therewith.
- II. To ensure that an efficient system of Provincial and Communal administration is organized and conducted in such form as is necessary to give effect to A. above, together with any amendments or alterations of such system which may be required for that purpose.
- III. To secure uniformity throughout all areas in regard to the system of local government referred to in II above.
- IV. To take all necessary action in regard to the financial policies and plans of local government agencies insofar as they concern the Ministry.
- V. To ensure that the Ministry of Interior adopts an impartial and proper relationship with regard to religious bodies and to secure the just administration of government funds connected therewith.
- VI. To consider and report on applications for the release of such Italian prisoners of war as are necessary and required for specific work connected with the Government of Italy, or Allied Control Commission Administration.
