Dear Colonel,

In answer to your note of 16 July (Ref 2/6 Subject: Security of Teachers Working for AGC) may I assure you that this Ministry will forthwith impart the requisite instructions to all its dependents so that the position of those functionaries, teachers and Italian employees who are in services with the Hqs' and offices of the Allied Military Government may be clarified.

In accordance with your own proposals, it will be determined so that all the career rights of these functionaries, teachers and employees (position, promotions, appointments, seniority, etc.) will not be in any way prejudiced by their temporary absence from the offices, schools and Italian institutes to which they belong.

I shall send you, as soon as possible, a copy of the orders issued upon this matter.

1. Regional Commissioner, Region III states that he believes that civil servants in Region III are using, or about to use, the attached order as a lever to be accorded similar treatment.
2. The matter was referred to Adm Sec for comment who state they discussed the matter with the Education Sub-Commission who have already had some discussions with an earlier Minister of Education on this point. They feel:-
 - (a) No ministry after restoration of territory would be willing to continue paying the teachers salary in addition to the salary received from the Allies, but
 - (b) while the teacher continues in employment by the Allies the Ministry would be willing to keep the teachers job open for them.
3. This is considered fair and just and para. 1 of Regional Order 16 will probably be revoked, after negotiation with the Minister of Education.
4. In the meantime it is suggested that if you are contemplating issuing an order on these lines, paragraph one should be omitted.

Reference your 171/38/CA dated 8 Jul.

1. A difficult point arises in that when Region III is restored, RO 16 comes to an end and so does the leave of absence and the guarantee of re-employment.
2. I have discussed the matter with the Education Sub-Commission who have had already some discussions with an earlier Minister of Education on this point. They feel
 - a. No ministry after restoration of territory would be willing to continue paying the teachers salary in addition to the salary received from the Allies but
 - b. while the teacher continues in employment by the Allies the Ministry would be willing to keep the teachers job open for them.
3. This seems to me fair and just and I have asked Education Sub-Commission to negotiate on this basis with the new Minister of Education.
4. When these negotiations are completed in a few days I will let you know and I suggest we revoke para 1 of RO 16.
5. In the meantime please do NOT let Ross Region issue an order which includes para 1. Paras 2 and 3 are of course OK.

Whereas our instructions of 1st February regarding payment of teachers working for the Allied Forces are hereby rescinded because they are not consistent with policies prevailing in Region 1 and 2;

In virtue of power conferred on me, I, CHARLES POLETTI, Lt. Colonel, Regional Commissioner, Region III

ORDER

1. All teachers "di Ruolo" who are now employed by the Allied Forces are to receive their state school salaries from 1st February 1944.
2. All teachers "di Ruolo" who are now employed by the Allied Forces are to receive from the Provveditore agli Studi a statement giving them a leave of absence until the termination of their employment by the Allied Forces and in which it is specifically stated that all such teachers will be reassumed into service (in the same school) in which they had previously served and at the same grade to which they would have been entitled had they been teaching regularly.
3. Any teachers who may be called into the service of the Allied Forces in the future shall receive similar treatment.
4. Any teachers not "di Ruolo" who were given definite assignments by the Provveditore agli Studi for the school year 1943-44, shall receive similar treatment.

1. Ref attached file, Finance Sub-Commission is most anxious to extend to Military Government territory the benefits of pension adjustments contained in REL No. 85 of 13 MAR 44. They are restrained from doing so by the absence in the law of safeguards to prevent Militant Fascist beneficiaries from enjoying such benefits.
2. The Italian Government has been requested to issue an appropriate supplementary decree embodying such a modification. When this is done, the provisions of the original and supplementary decrees will be extended to Military Government territory.
3. There has been some delay on the part of the Italian Government in complying with this request. However, until this modification is made, it is not considered proper for A.C.C. to recommend increases which would result in Militant Fascists obtaining pension increases as explained above.
4. The Italian Government is being energetically urged by the Finance Sub-Commission to take appropriate action.

With regard to these Signals I have consulted Economic Section on them. They have received all the Signals and are not even acknowledging them. They treat these Signals as one would a similar situation in our own Country where in an attempt to rush the Govt. into doing something they would send such communications to their local M.P.

Economic advised me that the question of increase of wages has been the subject of two Conferences already one on the 6th and the other on the 20th May. Discussions are still in progress but no agreement has been reached at the moment. The wages of these employees are so complicated and tricky that care must be taken. There are over 200 wage scales. What is to be avoided is inflation at all costs.

I am therefore taking no further action but think I can leave the matter safely in the hands of the Economic Section.

THE RESOURCES ASKED FOR AND REQUESTED BY THE ITALIAN GOVERNMENT UNDOUBTABLY NECESSARY. THE ALLIED COMMAND CANNOT BUT RECOGNIZE THE NEED OF THE MOMENT IF THE PERSONNEL WHO LIVE DIRECTLY ON ITS SALARY CONTINUE ITS WORK WITH CONFIDENCE THAT THE DESIRED RESOURCES WILL NOT BE FURTHER DENIED.

- (a) The grade of the official indicates his civil service level and is the basis for determining his salary. Prefects are always of the III and IV grade; Vice-Prefects are always of the V and VI grades. The Prefect determines what grade Director of Religious Affairs (VI, VII or VIII) he needs in his Province.
- (b) The class is determined by the size of the Province. First class provinces get higher grade Prefects, Vice-Prefects and Councillors usually.
- (c) The gross stipend is the basic salary.
- (d) The net stipend is the basic salary less taxes.
- (e) The net increase is provided by law (R.D.L. 5 Dec. 1943 n. 18/50) and is based on the net monthly stipend.
- (f) Columns 7 and 8 represent the salary actually received monthly and yearly, respectively, but does not include family and other allowances, which vary according to the size of the family.
