Dear Resident Minister's Office,

Your letter 43/32/0 of the 9th April enclosing a report on the Darch family in Italy.

We see from this report that an allowance of 9,350 lire is being paid monthly to the family and this amount may be increased to 12,000 lire a month.

We have now heard from Mr. Darch's solicitors that the former considers this sum to be greatly in excess of his family's actual needs, which, according to a report he has received from a friend in Italy, who has been in contact with Mrs. Darch, amount to only 1,350 lire a month.

Perhaps you could ask the Allied military authorities in Italy to investigate the truth of this statement, and if found correct to reduce Mrs. Darch's allowance accordingly.

In this connection, it appears that, although in special circumstances it may be necessary to issue the full maximum rate of relief for each member of a family living together, in practice the payment of the full adult rate for the head of the family and a half rate for each of the children has usually been found to be adequate.

As there seems to be now some prospect of Allied Forces reaching Rome in the not too distant future, I am venturing to ask you whether you think there are any military channels through which news could be had (after the occupation of the city) of my son-in-law, Professor Mario Praz, who holds, or was holding until lately, an important post as professor of English at Rome University, and has always been both a liberal and a convinced friend of England, as was shown among other things by his marrying an English wife and arranging that his child should be born in England, which, I believe, makes her technically and British subject.

I am saying to approach the P.O. on the subject, pointing out Praz's fitness to be employed by AMGOT, but as I suppose some time elapses after the occupation of a city before civil administration takes over, I want to find out if there is any way by which such a man as he is, with his English family, could be contacted by the military authorities - possibly saved from destruction - before AMGOT takes over.

I should be grateful for any advice or information you could give me, as I do not know what procedure is followed upon the military occupation of an enemy capital.

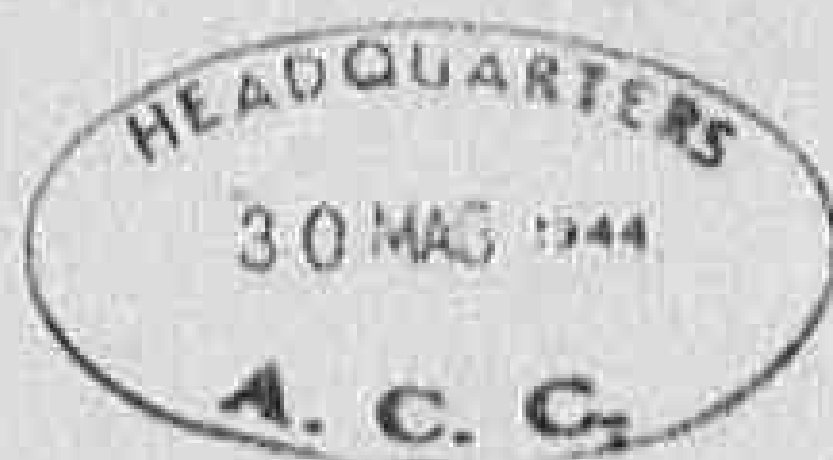

1. In my view, the best and most convenient instruction which can be issued with regard to the making of enquiries about Italian Nationals is that enquiries respecting.

(a) Italian CIVILIANS believed to be located in Allied controlled territory should be addressed to the Public Safety Sub-Commission here, and

(b) that ALL other enquiries should be addressed to the RC and MG Section.

2. If this is done the enquiries which may be addressed to you are.

(a) in respect of Italians located in enemy controlled areas (which may be passed to the International Red Cross) or

(b) in respect of members of the Italian Forces either serving or POW's. (which may be passed to the Military Section.-)

3. Where a question of release of a POW arises because his services are required I think that the Sub-Commission requiring his services should have the handling of the question of release. (For example, the case of a local Government official should be dealt with by the Interior Sub-Commission; the case of a member of the judiciary by the Legal Sub-Commission and similarly for other technical experts.)
