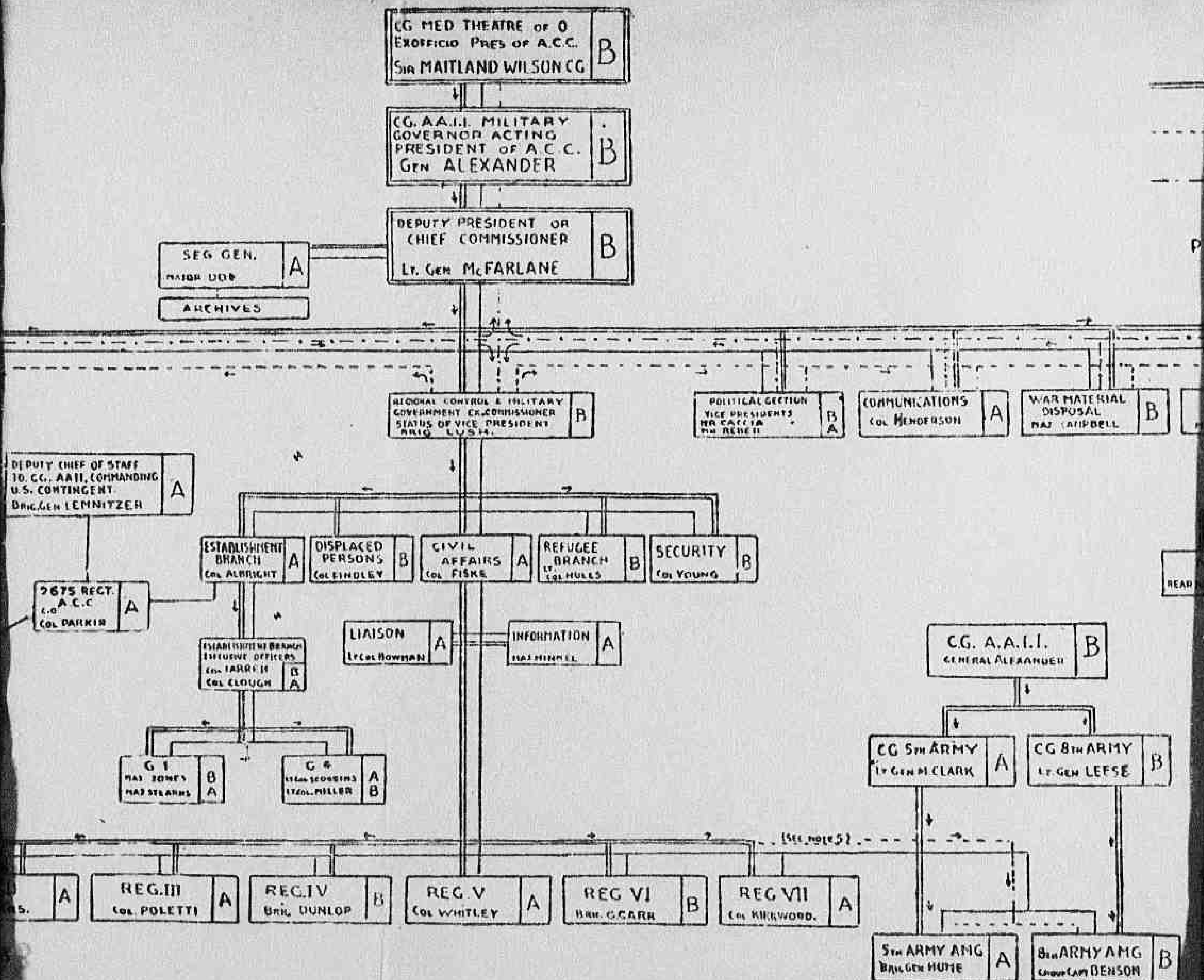

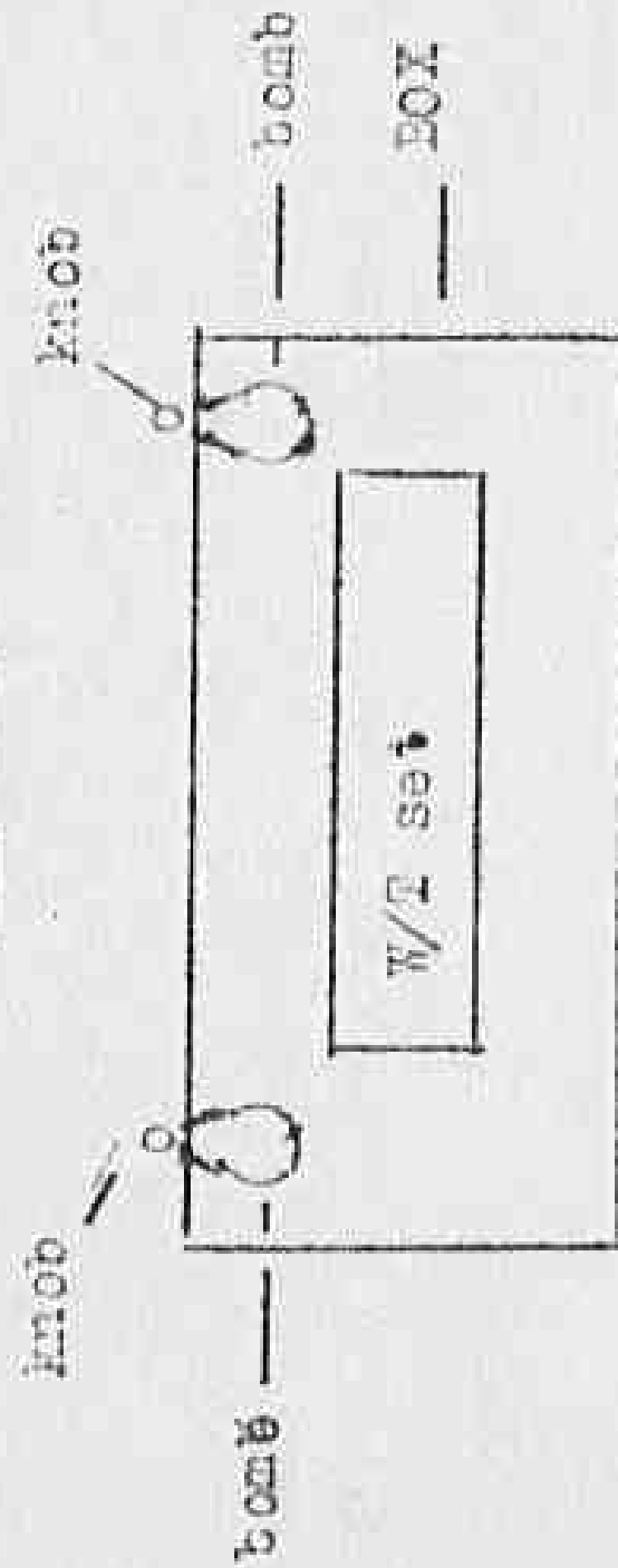

However, these knobs are actually connected to small bombs about the size of a hand grenade which are concealed inside the box and attached to the inside of the lid itself. When the knobs are pulled, the bombs are set off. In order to open this box safely, the lid should be opened by the two edges, thereby not setting off the bombs. After opening the lid, the two bombs may be disposed of intact. No further details are at present available.

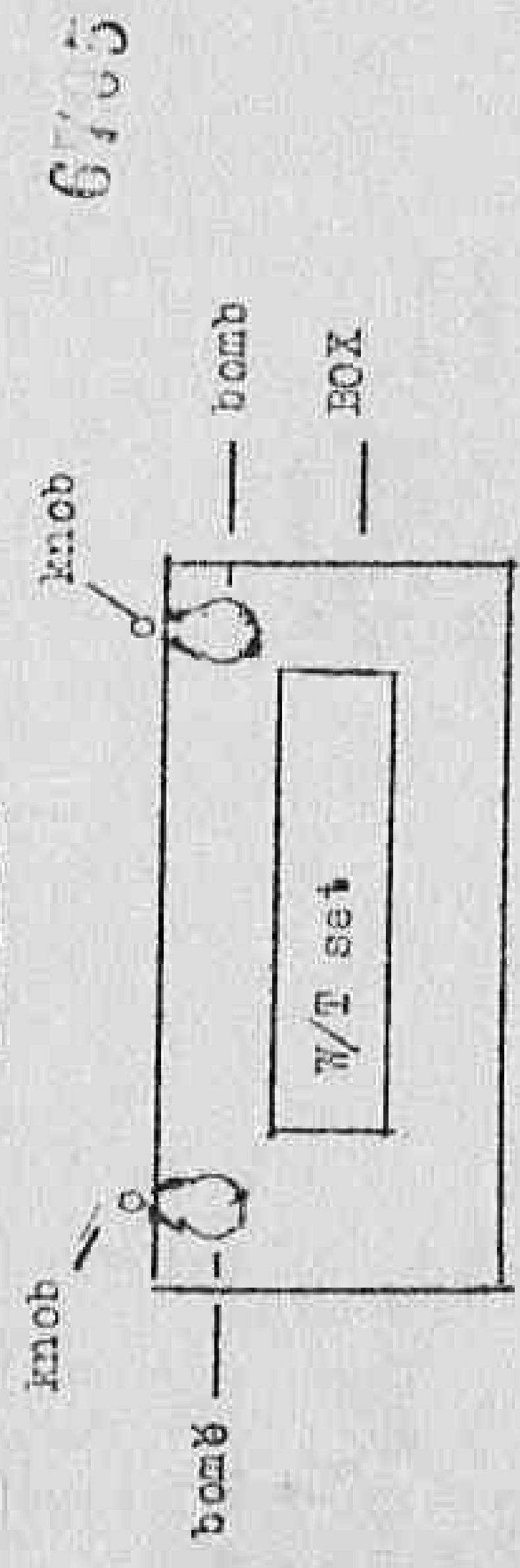

The following facts have been related by a reliable (Italian) person who can be named upon request:

1. It is common procedure at some Allied offices, especially those issuing permits (travel, transport etc.) to distribute numbers to the people queuing up in front of the office before the opening hour, giving the first person number one and so forth.
2. By the time the office opens for business, sometimes a hundred or more persons are in the line. Then the usher, instead of having the person holding ticket Nr. 1 enter first, calls out: "Who has a letter of recommendation from Colonel Poletti?", and the persons having such letters of recommendation are admitted first without consideration as to their position in the queue.
3. After all persons possessing these letters of recommendation have been admitted, the usher then asks the persons holding letters of recommendation issued by other Allied Officers to step forward.
4. After these have been taken care of, those persons with letters of recommendation from persons other than Allied Officers are admitted, so that sometimes persons not in possession of 2

a letter of recommendation have to wait all day and even to return the next day and wait all over again.

5. It is understood that upon bribing the usher with perhaps 500 Lire, it is always possible for a person without a letter of recommendation to be permitted to enter and see the Officer in charge.

6. In relation to the s/m procedure the following comment was made by another Italian (known Anti-fascist): "We wanted so much to do anything useful to the Allies, and consider it part of our duties to respect regulations to the fullest extent, but it is made impossible for us to do so and we have to resort to fascist methods."

Memorandum to Brigadier Gueterbock.

1. I agree that an Intelligence Branch is necessary.
2. As you say in paragraph 4 the bulk of Intelligence for ACC purposes will be procured from the field organisation, i.e. Regions. Subsidiary intelligence will come from Allied sources including those you mention in 5 a and military sources.
3. The Intelligence Branch must, in my opinion, be responsible to the Head of a Section - not to the Secretary General who has no executive powers and whose secretariat we must keep as small as possible. R.C. & M.C. Section deal with Regions and military formations, contains an I (b) branch and therefore seems to be clearly the Section into which Intelligence branch should be absorbed.
