

CONTROL OF EQUINE ENCEPSIS (Malaria).

1. Cases have occurred recently of carriers of horses and mules belonging to cavalry units. These infections may be due to the following causes and measures will be carried out, inc. to prevent the spread of the disease among civilian animals the same will be employed to such.

2. The Italian Law provides for the issuance of instructions and proper arrangement of the organization of medical services pertaining to the disease.

3. Instructions to all territory will be issued, as follows:

- (a) All animals infected with plasmodia will be destroyed immediately.
- (b) Infected animals by owners of infected animals will be paid in the amount of the damage properly imposed of.
- (c) A supply of malaria has been received from the Quarantine and may be requisitioned in the same manner as other supplies.

- (d) Under no circumstances will the destruction of infected animals be delayed. Command Veterinary will be given the authority to destroy infected animals immediately, without waiting for a license from the prospect.

4. The Italian Minister of the Interior is issuing similar instructions to the districts in accordance with Schedule "A".

prevent the spread of this disease to military and some civilian animals the measures indicated will be carried out.

2. The Italian laws provide for the immediate destruction and proper disposal of the carcasses of animals infected with glanders. Provincial and Comunal Veterinarians are familiar with the regulations pertaining to this disease.

3. Prefects in the territory will be instructed, as follows:

- (a) All animals infected with glanders will be destroyed immediately and the carcasses properly disposed of.
- (b) Infected animals by owners or infested animals will be paid in the same manner as was done prior to the Allied occupation.
- (c) A supply of McMillan has been requested for use by the Veterinary supplies.
- (d) Under no circumstances will the destruction of infected animals be delayed. Provincial Veterinarians will be given the authority to destroy infected animals immediately, without waiting for a decision from the Prefect.

APPENDIX "A"

To Mr. Profetti in England July,  
High Commissioner, Sydney,  
Australia.

Several cases of glanders have been detected in the Province of Rosedale, Please instruct all military veterinarians to which closely and search out suspect cases. Report directly to this Ministry about suspected and confirmed diagnosis.

For the Minister.

SECRETIVE "B"

MICHAEL (Glanders and Farcy)

Art. 60. On glanders being reported the Minister will immediately put into force the measures laid down in Art. 7 and at once report the outbreak to the Director.

Horses diagnosed as suffering from glanders will be destroyed without fail as provided by Art. 765 of the consolidated Sanitary Law enacted by Royal Decree of 27 July 1934 No. 1565.

Horses showing suspicious symptoms or suspect of contact will be submitted to special veterinary examination.

Where the result of such examination is positive and other horses likely to spread infection exist the animal will be slaughtered or driven off from herd until it is provided with the treatment set forth.

If the result is either indeterminate or positive without other signs and there is no danger of spreading infection (except glanders) the horse's off fore hoof will be treated with the lotion in Art. (synthetic worn) and burns will be covered with a waterproof antiseptic ointment until cured.

- a. Symptoms of the disease are clearly so as to require no special protection.
- b. The animal may become lame in which case it will be placed under special veterinary supervision.

Animals under observation may be used ~~safely~~ for normal work but shall not be taken to any market, fair, exhibition, public or stable or home through nor carried by any train, truck, ship, etc.

In ascertaining the value of an animal to be destroyed on account of glanders there will be taken into account the size which the diseased has reached or the value of the same, which the animal could render if its owner

Horses diagnosed as suffering from glanders will be destroyed without trial as provided by Art. 265 of the consolidated Sanitary Law enacted by Royal Decree of 27 July 1934 No. 1265.

Borses showing suspicious symptoms or suspected of contact with horses submitted to special veterinary examination.

Where the result of such examination is positive and upon expert's finding to agreed infection, exist, the animal will be slaughtered as above.

If the result is other than negative or doubtful without open sore and there is no danger of spreading infection (Latent carriers) the horse's off fore hoof will be branded with the letters 'M' (negative sorer) and this horse will be placed under strict veterinary observation until:

- a. Symptoms of the disease are disclosed so as to require the animal's destruction.
- b. The animal has been found in which case it will be freed from further veterinary supervision.

Animals under observation may be used ~~safely~~ for normal work but will not be taken to any market, fair, exhibition, public stable or horse trough nor carried by any train, van, ship, etc.

In calculating the value of an animal to be destroyed on account of glanders there will be taken into account the age which the horse has reached and the value of the services which the animal could render its owner if it were not destroyed.

Proceeds of slaughtered animals will be dealt with in accordance with Art. 7 (number 6). They will not be retained.

A practitioner whose declaring a horse to be liable will be required under Art. 11 when all tendered or numbered animals have either destroyed or certified in writing by the veterinarian to be free from infection.

In accordance with the provisions of Art. 38 any compensation required upon the private animal will be referred to the judge who will determine the treatment.

Art. 61. The Prefect will not exercise his authority over the Director of the State Veterinary Service in his vicinity of any outbreak of Glanders and of the covering of disease from infection.

SUBJECT : Control of Equine Glanders (Morbus).

TO : Regional Commissioners, Regions I, II, III, V, VI, VII,  
S.C.A.O.'s 5th and 8th Armies.

1 Six cases of Glanders in civilian horses and mules have occurred within the past month in one province on the mainland. The consequences to the military and civilian animals may be serious unless effective control measures are employed as soon as possible.

2 The Italian laws provide for the immediate destruction and proper disposal of the carcass of animals infected with Glanders. Provincial and communal veterinarians are familiar with the regulations pertaining to this disease. Those prefetti in ANC territory will be instructed as follows:

- (1) All animals infected with Glanders will be destroyed immediately and the carcasses properly disposed of.
- (2) Indemnity claims by owners of infected animals will be paid in the same manner as was done prior to the Allied occupation.
- (3) A supply of Mallein has been requested for use by the Veterinarians and may be requisitioned in the same manner as are veterinary supplies.
- (4) Under no circumstances will the destruction of infected animals be delayed. Communal veterinarians will be given the authority to destroy infected animals immediately without waiting for a decree from the prefetto.

3 The Italian Minister of the Interior is issuing similar instructions to the prefetti in Allied Control Commission Territory, a copy of which is attached. A translation of the Italian law pertaining to the disease is inclosed.

S. Morva ( moccio e farcino ).

Art. 60. - Having received the denunciation of morva, the Podesta adopts immediately the necessary measures as by art. 7, referring without any delay to the Prefect.

The horses recognized as affected with morva are destroyed as by art. 265 of the Unic test on Health-law, approved by the R. decree 27 July 1934, n. 1265.

Those animals presenting suspected symptoms and those suspected of contamination must be subject to the proper diagnostic exam.

For the animals that the diagnosis has proved positive and that present wounds to retain them dangerous for the diffusion of the infection, will be destroyed as stated above.

Those who's exam has also proved positive, but have no wounds are not considered dangerous of contamination (morva chiuse) as well as those who's exam has proved uncertain, will be branded with the letters S.M. (Suspected Morva) on their right anterior hoof, and will be placed under strict veterinary observation until:

- a) That the illness has given such manifestations as to render it necessary to have the animal destroyed.
- b) That the animals are immune to morva, in which case they will be acquitted from any veterinary tie.

During the observation period these animals can be used, alone, for ordinary work, on condition however that they will not be brought to any market place, fairs, exhibitions, public stables, public horse-trough, nor transported on any trains, trolley bus, ships etc.

The value of the morvosa animals to be destroyed will be determined on basis of the gravity and state of the illness, keeping special account of the economic utility, which the animal could still give to its owner, if it was not destroyed.

For the treatment of the carcases of the morvosa animals, will be observed in art. 7 (n.6) of the present regulations, as it has been forbidden to skin the animals.

When the Prefects decree has been issued on the infected zone, by the rule in Art. 11, this will be revoked when all the infected animals will have been destroyed and those suspected will have been declared sound as by written statement by the Veterinary.

Conformably to what is disposed in art. 38 the technical cures done on the part of their owners must be denounced to the Podesta, who will have the result controlled.

Art. 61. Of the manifestation of the cases of Morva as well as the ceasing of the infection, the Podesta will promptly inform the military authority interested and the direction of the Stables-Depot of the State.
