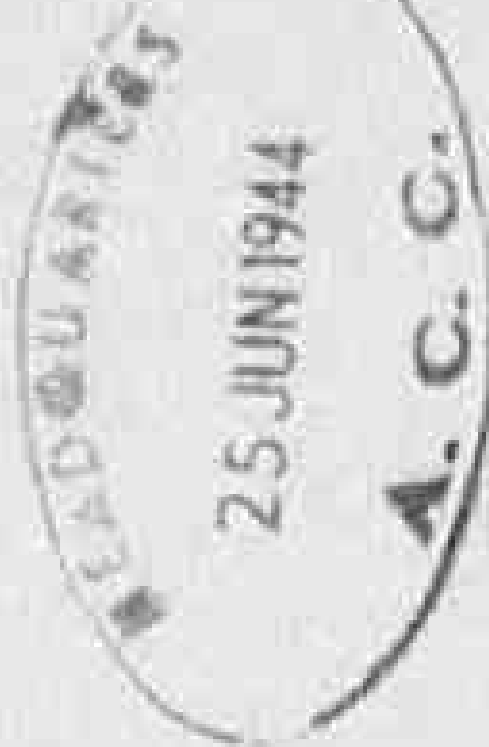

With reference to letter Ref 266/12/Ca dated 26 May 1944 and supply of 5000 copies of General Order No 25 received yesterday. The immediate publication of this Order in the Army Area does not appear appropriate in view of existing fluid conditions and the rapid advance of the armies. It is therefore proposed to defer the posting of the Order until conditions revert to static or an industrial region is reached, where the question of political activity is likely to be more urgent.
