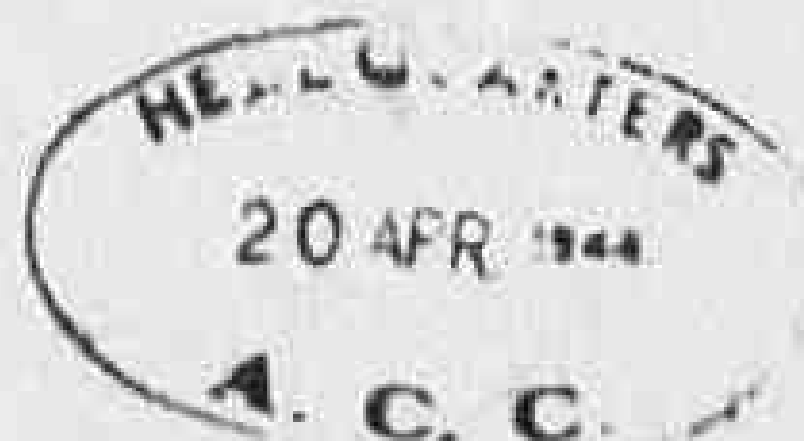

ORDINAL ORDER NO. 20

MOTOR VEHICLE CIRCULATION PERMITS, AND AUTHORIZATIONS FOR SUPPLIES OF PETROLEUM PRODUCTS FOR MOTOR VEHICLES AND OTHER USES

I, Maurice Stanley Lish, O.B.E., M.C., Brigadier, Executive Commissioner
of the Allied Control Commission, hereby order as follows:-

ARTICLE I

Restriction on Use of Motor Vehicles.

Section 1. No person shall use any motor vehicle, on any road or allow any motor vehicle belonging to him to be used on any road unless such motor vehicle is licensed in accordance with Italian law, and a permit for such motor vehicle to be used and an authorization for supplies of petroleum products have been issued in accordance with the provisions of this Order, or by the Italian Government in accordance with Italian law in respect of unoccupied territory.

Section 2. The permit issued shall be displayed in a position so as to be clearly visible to a person standing in front of the motor vehicle.

Section 3. Permits and authorizations as specified in Section 1 above issued by the Italian Government will be valid in occupied territory.

Section 4. The provisions of this Order shall not apply to Allied or Italian Naval, Military or Air Force vehicles duly marked as such in accordance with the respective existing Naval, Military, or Air Force Regulations.

ARTICLE II

Permits and Authorizations for Supplies of Petroleum Products

Section 1. Permits for motor vehicles to be used and authorizations for supplies of petroleum products under this Order will be issued by the Allied Military Government at such times and places in each province as may be publicly notified.

Section 2. Permits issued hereunder will be valid for periods not exceeding four months each, subject nevertheless to earlier cancellation at any time by the Allied Government.

Section 3. Every permit and every authorization, together with any unused coupons, shall be surrendered to the office of issue within five (5) days after the date of expiration thereof or within five (5) days after the dispatch of notice of cancellation, which ever shall be earliest in point of time. Whenever any person to whom any permit and any authorization shall have been previously issued shall cease to be the owner of the motor vehicle with respect to which such permit and authorization were issued, such permit and authorization shall immediately

Section 2. The permit issued shall be displayed in a position so as to be clearly visible to a person standing in front of the motor vehicle.

Section 3. Permits and authorizations as specified in Section 1 above issued by the Italian Government will be valid in occupied territory.

Section 4. The provisions of this Order shall not apply to Allied or Italian Naval, Military or Air Force vehicles duly marked as such in accordance with the respective existing Naval, Military, or Air Force regulations.

ARTICLE II

Permits and Authorizations for Supplies of Petroleum Products

Section 1. Permits for motor vehicles to be used and authorizations for supplies of petroleum products under this Order will be issued by the Allied Military Government at such times and places in each province as may be publicly notified.

Section 2. Permits issued hereunder will be valid for periods not exceeding four months each, subject nevertheless to earlier cancellation at any time by the Allied Government.

Section 3. Every permit and every authorization, together with any unused coupons, shall be surrendered to the office of issue within five (5) days after the date of expiration, renewal or within five (5) days after the date of notice of cancellation, whichever shall be earliest in point of time. However any person to whom any permit and any authorization shall have been previously issued shall cease to be the owner of the motor vehicle with respect to which such permit and authorization were issued, such permit and authorization shall immediately become invalid and he shall surrender them to the office of issue within five (5) days after the termination of his ownership of such motor vehicle.

Section 4. A fee of Lire 50, or such other fee as may from time to time be prescribed, shall be charged for each permit issued under the provisions of this Order.

ARTICLE III

Coupons and Authorized Suppliers

Section 1. The Coupons attached to an authorization shall be valid only for the period and in respect of the motor vehicle shown on the authorization.

Section 2. In the case of "Other Users of Petroleum Products" as set out in Article V hereof the authorization may be in "Block" instead of "Coupon" form.

Section 3. Petroleum products shall be supplied only by Confinco Italiano Petroli, who have been appointed as Petroleum Distributors, or such other suppliers as may be appointed by the Allied Military Government.

90
Section 1. No person shall be detected from an authorization only by the suppliers of the time of supply of petroleum products. The amount of the supply shall not exceed the amount for which the particular coupon or "Block" authorization is valid.

Section 2. No person shall acquire or supply any petroleum products other than under authority expressly given by the Allied Military Government, or by the Italian Government.

ARTICLE IV

Restrictions Against Sale of Fuel

Section 1. No person shall use any motor vehicle or allow any motor vehicle belonging to him to be used for any purpose other than that authorized in the permit issued for such motor vehicle.

Section 2. No person shall waste any petroleum products in any manner whatsoever.

ARTICLE V

Other Uses of Petroleum Products

Section 1. The provisions of this Order with respect to the necessity for procuring an authorization, before obtaining supplies of petroleum products and the other provisions of this Order with respect to authorizations, shall be applicable not only to users of motor vehicles of all kinds used on roads, or elsewhere, but also to all non-vehicular users, such users including but not being limited to industrial, agricultural, marine and fishing users, and to wholesale dealers in mercantile, sex or pharmaceutical petroleum products who distribute to individual retail consumers.

Section 2. The provisions of this Article shall not apply to persons acquiring a supply of petroleum products for private household consumption from an authorized dealer, save that no person may acquire more than one half litre at any one time.

ARTICLE VI

Penalties

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Order shall, on conviction by an Allied Military Court, be liable to imprisonment or fine, or both, as the Court may determine, and in lieu of or in addition to any other lawful punishment the Court may, on such conviction, order the forfeiture to the Allied Military Government of any motor vehicle or petroleum products concerned.

ARTICLE VII

Definition

ARTICLE V

Other Kinds of Petroleum Products

Section 1. The provisions of this Order with respect to the necessity for procuring an authorization, before obtaining supplies of petroleum products and the other provisions of this Order with respect to authorizations, shall be applicable not only to users of other vehicles of all kinds used on roads, or elsewhere, but also to all non-vehicular users, such users including but not being limited to industrial, agricultural, marine and fishing users, and to wholesale dealers in kerosene, gas or pharmaceutical petroleum products who distribute to individuals retail consumers.

Section 2. The provisions of this Article shall not apply to persons requiring a supply of petroleum products for private household consumption from an authorized dealer, save that no person may acquire more than one half litre at any one time.

ARTICLE VI

Penalties

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Order shall, on conviction by an Allied Military Court, be liable to imprisonment or fine, or both, as the Court may determine, and in lieu of or in addition to any other lawful punishment the Court may, on such conviction, order the forfeiture to the Allied Military Government of any motor vehicle or petroleum products concerned.

ARTICLE VII

Definition

The term "motor vehicle" as used in this Order means any vehicle which is mechanically propelled.

ARTICLE VIII

Effective Date of this Order

This Order will become effective in all provinces, or parts thereof within the Occupied Territory on the number of day on the date of its first publication therein.

SUBJECT: Modification of Firearms Proclamation.

TO : R.C. Region III.

Reference your letter of 26 March 1944 on above subject.

1. This matter was submitted to the C.L.O., Legal Sub-Commission. By letter dated 6 April the C.L.O. advises this matter was recently discussed at a conference attended by the C.L.O., D.C.L.O., R.L.Os., and S.L.Os. of Armies, as well as other legal officers, and that it was unanimously agreed that it would be unwise to issue the order suggested by you.
2. The C.L.O. also advises: "the offence created by Proclamation No.2, Article I (5) is to have possession of fire arms etc.....'except in accordance with a permit of the Allied Military Government'. The desired object could, therefore, be achieved by a system of permits, and this is the course adopted in Region I, where farmers who had handed in firearms were permitted to withdraw one shotgun and to have up to 10 cartridges."
3. It is therefore considered the issue of the order requested is unnecessary, since the desired result is attainable as suggested by the C.L.O.

1. It is felt that paragraph 3 of the Chief Legal Officer's letter addressed to you on this subject; dated 5 April 1944, reference ACC/4027/2/L, may perhaps have expressed the views with which this Sub-Commission was not entirely in accord.

2. It is considered that the present position created by Proclamation 2, Article 1 (5), is entirely satisfactory since it is open for authorization to be given in suitable individual cases for the possession of firearms by permit.

3. This Sub-Commission is not in agreement either with a general relaxation of this principle or with the withdrawal of this discretion to permit the possession of firearms in individual cases.

Subject : Modification of AMG Fire Arms Proclamation.

To : RC & MG Section, HQ, ACC

In reply to your letter 278/38/CA of 2 April 44.

1. The proposal put forward by the Regional Commissioner No. 3 Region was considered at a recent conference attended by the CLO, DCLO, RLOs and SLOs of Armies and other legal officers and it was unanimously agreed that it would be very unwise to issue any Proclamation or Order as suggested on the grounds that to do so would be to open too large a loop hole.
2. It will be observed that the offence created by Proclamation 2 Article I (5) is to have possession of fire arms etc----- except in accordance with a permit of the Allied Military Government.* The desired object, could, therefore be achieved by a system of permits; and this is the course adopted in No. 1 Region, where farmers who had handed in firearms were permitted to withdraw one shotgun, and to have up to 10 cartridges.
3. I would add, however, that this question has today been discussed with Public Safety who are strongly opposed to the restoration of firearms to farmers whether by means of such permits or otherwise.

1. Copy is attached of Executive Memorandum which is being sent out by this H.Q. to Regional Commissioners etc., at the request of the Legal Sub-Commission.
2. The reason for the request is that the Legal Sub-Commission wish to have for ready reference copies of all orders affecting matters on which they may be asked to give advice.

1. Many civilians are charged before Allied Military Courts with being in possession of Allied property contrary to Proclamation No. 2, Article II, paragraph (40). Among the excuses put forward by the accused are that the goods were given in payment for washing done for allied soldiers, or were exchanged for wine or fruit or the like, or were given by allied soldiers to the children of the accused.

2. There is no doubt that in the majority of cases in which an explanation of this kind is given by the accused, it is true, subject to the qualification that often the accused has asked that payment for what he has done or sold should be made in goods rather than cash.

1. Inquiry of many allied soldiers has revealed that they do not realize that they should not hand over to civilians, either as gifts or in payment for services or goods, goods issued to them by, or purchased by them from, army sources, even though the soldiers regard such goods as their own property .

3071

4. It is appreciated that an Order on this subject was issued on 1 February 1944, but it does not yet appear to have reached the individual soldier.

5. The aggregate quantity and value of allied goods in the possession of Italian civilians is very large. Rarely does a soldier realize that his small gift to an Italian may be only one of many given to the same recipient, or that his gift may lead to the recipient's imprisonment.

6. It is recommended -

- a) that the Order of 1 February 1944, issued by 5th Army, be brought to the notice of all personnel in that Army; and
- b) that PSC and 57 Area issue -
 - (i) a notice calling attention of army personnel to the facts that it is a serious offence for Italians to accept as a gift, or to purchase, or to be found in possession of allied property, and that many Italians are being imprisoned because of the unwise generosity of allied soldiers; and
 - (ii) an order forbidding allied soldiers to sell, exchange or give away any equipment or goods issued to them from army stores or purchased by them from RAAFI or PX Stores.

1 Our 40/AS of 24 Feb was written at the request of the Legal Sub-Commission who were finding themselves handicapped for want of a complete collection of authorities. The information contained in the first para of your 273/49/OA of 10 Mar is of course well known to them and is not what they were asking for.

2 The suggestion contained in your second para is not regarded as practical; First, there is no surer that casual visits in the field will ensure a complete library. Second, officers of Sub-Commissions would not normally be likely to meet with instructions issued by bodies such as the Allied Publications Board which is not directly under or a part of ACC. Third, reliance on periodic visits is unsatisfactory in as much as the library would be without copies or orders etc. issued shortly after a visit.

3 What is requested is:

a That an instruction should be issued to all regions and army districts that they will send to the Legal Sub-Commission for their library a copy of all orders or other publications controlling the conduct of Italian Nationals or prescribing any form of procedure, which is still in force and that in future a record copy will be sent to the Legal Sub-Commission whenever any such document is published.

SUBJECT: Proclamation No. 7.

TO : Executive Commissioner, ACC.

1. Region III has requested additional copies of Proclamation No. 7 (Dissolution of Fascist Organizations) which now is out of print.
2. This request raises the question as to whether any useful purpose is to be served by the publication of this Proclamation in already occupied areas or in the forward areas as and when occupied.
3. Since existing and impending Italian legislation suffice to accomplish the objectives of Proclamation No. 7, its publication is not legally necessary in any part of the occupied territory.
4. It accordingly only remains to be determined whether it is politically desirable that the publication of this proclamation be continued.
5. It is clear that the number of proclamations should be maintained at a minimum. It would further appear that the anti-fascist views of Allied Military Government have been sufficiently enunciated in the now occupied areas including Region III as to require no repetition or emphasis. It might, however, be asserted that the contrary is true in areas yet to be occupied.
6. May we have an expression from you as to your wishes with respect to the extent, if at all, that you desire Proclamation No. 7 published.

The form for Proclamation No. 8, as prescribed by higher authority and published in AMGOF Plan, Proclamations and Instructions, 2nd edition, dated September 1943, contains no reference to Italian law in effect on any specified date; it provides a blank for the insertion of a date corresponding approximately to the date of the occupation. When this blank is completed, the proclamation continues in force all price and wage regulations prevailing in the locality at the time of the occupation, until specifically set aside by order of AMG.

It is the view of this Sub-Commission that the proposed alteration in Proclamation No. 8 should not be authorized.

SUBJECT: Proclamation No. 8 Article II.

TO ; Main Hq. A.S.C., APO-394, U.S. Army.

1. It is the opinion of my Legal, Economic and Police advisers that the terms of Article II of Proclamation 8 are unrealistic and impractical of enforcement and that this Proclamation in its present form should not continue to be published in occupied Italy.

2. The rates of wages for labour and the maximum prices of foodstuffs and goods which were prescribed by Italian laws and which by the said Article II were incorporated as a regulation of the Allied Military Government, at the rates and prices officially in force in any locality on 1st September 1943, bear no relation to the present cost of living. This has been demonstrated by the increased cost of commodities which has required us to raise wages. The consequence of this has been that no effort has been made to enforce the terms of Article II. This failure to enforce one part of our proclamation brings into disrespect in general our whole legislation and in particular price regulations.

3. I submit therefore that Proclamation 8 in its present form should not continue to be published in occupied territory, especially not in Rome and that a revised Proclamation should be issued. The revision of this proclamation should consist of a deletion of the text of Article II and the substitution of words stating that the maximum prices of goods and the rates of wages will be fixed by order of the Allied Military Government.

4. In effect this revision would not alter legalistically the position of price fixing. The Italian price laws and the prices fixed thereunder would continue in force as all

Italian laws remain in effect except in so far as these may be abrogated or altered by Proclamation. Anyone who contravened these laws could be prosecuted but such laws would not be particularly homologated by the Allied Military Government as is done by the present terms of Art. II and, in so far as it is impossible, be left unenforced.

5. It is intended to post prices of essential commodities in Rome on arrival there. By General Order No. 5 the wage rates are adjusted.

SUBJECT: Labor Matters.

TO : Executive Commissioner. ←

May I summarize what I understood to be the result of conference on the above mentioned matter on 28 February.

1. General Order No. 17 was published in Region II but was not actually published in Region I as the freedom of labor to organize had already been granted sometime before, and that on 27th February 1944 it was published in Region III.
2. SLO, 5th Army stated General Order No. 5 of the same general import as General Order No. 8 for Sicily was published in 15th Army Group Area, but it is still not clear in exactly what portions of such area it was published.
3. Proclamation No. 8 has not been enforced in presently occupied territory as the basic date used in Art II made it impracticable to do so. In future printings of this proclamation the date can be amended by substituting the words "one week prior to the posting hereof" and the Labor Subcommittee wanted the policy of this proclamation to be continued.
4. The Labor Subcommittee has received a draft of a decree which the Italian Government is expected to promulgate in unoccupied territory combining in effect General Orders Nos. 5 and 17 and that either in that decree or a following one there will be an added list of Fascist institutions to be abolished. After the Labor Subcommittee has examined the proposed decree, it will be transmitted to the Legal Subcommittee before final approval, insofar as ACC is concerned, is given. In the meantime, General Orders Nos. 8 and 17 will no longer be published, but the decree will be made part of the law of occupied territory.
5. Labor Subcommittee have no objection to the Italian Courts continuing their complete jurisdiction in labor disputes.
6. You will consider with the V.P., Economic Section, the question of the revision of General Orders 3, 4 and 5 with a view to bringing them up to date to assist in preventing black market offenses. This Subcommittee has already had some correspondence on this matter (our ACC/4027/L of 17 Feb. 44) with the Economics Section and would be happy to attend any conference.

SUBJECT: Construction of Phrase "Allied Forces".

TO : SAC Region 5, 4, & 5.
SAC 5th Army.

The question has recently arisen as to proclamation offences against members of armed forces such as Yugoslav and Polish contingents and the Corps Expeditionnaire Française who are fighting on the Allied side in Italy and the following directive is issued for your guidance.

1. The expression "Allied Forces" when used in Proclamation No. 2 and other relevant proclamations in describing offences against the Allied Forces will be construed to include organized contingents of other nationalities (such as the above) who are under the command of C in C Italy.

This does not include Italian troops who are only cobelligerents and who in any event have ample resources in their own courts for punishing offenders.

2. In some cases e.g. Proclamation 2 Art II Sec 30 a different wording is used and in this case the normal construction will be used and if for instance words disrespectful to members of the C.E.F. are used it is not an offence under that section.

3. Allied Military Courts have no jurisdiction over members of the "Allied Forces" (Proc 4 Art II Sec 2(a)) and Courts will not therefore try members of organized contingents of armed forces of other nationalities who are under the command of the C in C Italy. This does not preclude trial in A.M. Courts (1) of soldiers of other nationalities who are not in an organized body under the C in C, (2) of Italian soldiers but normally and in the absence of some reason to the contrary they will be handed over to their own Military Courts for trial.

Subject : Labor Matters

To : Executive Commissioner.

1. The chaotic state of proclamations, orders, proposed orders and proposed amendments relating to labor matters (mentioned in detail below) make it desirable in my opinion for the calling of a conference to consider and dispose of various controversial matters and to define policy so that proclamations and orders may be reduced to an up to date and simple statement of Allied Instructions.

2. The Labor Sub-Commission has before it, at the present time the question of syndicate payments, disposition of labor disputes by judicial means, publication of general order no. 5 and the issuance of a new general order no. 17 in territory still occupied, all relating to labor matters.

3. It has also been suggested by SCAG 5th Army that Proclamation No. 8 is now meaningless as far as the freezing of wages is concerned.

4. The SLO 5th Army has just sent to this Legal Sub-Commission certain proposed changes in general order no. 5.

5. In connection with orders dissolving fascist organizations which is one of the features involved consideration will have to be given to the Royal Decree Law of 2 Aug. 1943, No. 704, promulgated by the present Italian Government abolishing the Fascist Party etc.

6. The matter is somewhat urgent and I shall be glad if you will call a conference of the interested parties so that the present unsatisfactory position with regard to proclamations and orders may be clarified.

1. It is requested that the Legal Sub-Commission be relieved of all responsibility in connection with securing the execution, printing (or other reproduction), and distribution of Proclamations and General Orders.

2. For the following reasons it is submitted that the duties of the Legal Sub-Commission with respect to Proclamations and Orders should end upon its certification of the final draft for signature.

- (a) The Legal Sub-Commission has neither the personnel nor the facilities necessary, adequately and efficiently to render the subsequent purely non-legal services to the several sub-commissions which cumulatively are considerable. Such non-legal services include among others; conferences with originating sub-commissions with respect to the form and character of reproduction and extent, means and methods of publication and distribution; messenger and liaison service between printer (or other reproducer) and particular sub-commission; arrangements for printing; the actual packing for shipment and making of arrangements for transportation, delivery and distribution.
- (b) The originating sub-commissions with varying objectives and procedures in most instances must themselves decide the form and character of the reproduction and the extent of distribution and the participation of the Legal Sub-Commission results in needless and unproductive duplication of effort and loss of time. That this is apparent to the Sub-Commissions is indicated by the fact that several during the past three months, at their own request, have handled either the printing or distribution, or both, of documents originating with them.

At your request, GENERAL ORDER NO. 5 (Temporary Wage Adjustment and Abolition of Fascist Syndicates), and the Rules and Regulations issued pursuant thereto, were printed at this Headquarters, and distribution made 2 February 1944 as follows: AMG 5th Army, 6,000 copies; AMG 8th Army, 3,000 copies; and Region 4, 1,000 copies.

2. In accordance with your message, REF. NR. 21646, 21 January 1944, Capt. Lionel E. Bailey (A), O-523970, this Headquarters, has been despatched to AMG 8th Army to advise the SOAO on the application of this Order.

3. As suggested in my conference with Col. Spofford on 9 February 1944, a uniform policy should be adopted in 5th and 8th Army areas, and it is urged that a directive be issued by your Headquarters requiring the posting of this Order in 5th and 8th Army areas within thirty days after the occupation of each Commune.

SUBJECT: Uniformity of Powers of Review.

TO : The Executive Commissioner, A.C.C.

1. The position regarding the examination of judicial records and review of less serious cases is not uniform.

2. Under Proclamation No. 4, Article VII, Section 2 every record of trial by an Allied Military Court is to be transmitted to the C.I.C. for examination and file. By Section 3 the record of any case may on the recommendation of the C.I.C. and shall in the event of a sentence exceeding 2 years imprisonment or a fine of 50,000 Lira be reviewed by the C.C.A.C. or by an officer not below the rank of Lt. Col. appointed by him. Such reviews take place at A.C.C., HQ.

3. Proclamation No. 14 imposes on R.C.I. the duties of examination and file and empowers an R.C.I. to appoint a judicial officer not below the rank of Major for the purpose of reviewing cases where there has been no petition of appeal and the sentence does not exceed 2 years imprisonment or a fine of 50,000 Lira.

4. There has been no such express provision in relation to Army areas and the position concerning examination and review of records in the 5th Army area differs from that in the 8th Army area. In the 5th Army Area the S.I.C. (Lt. Col. Shields) has been given the powers similar to those of an R.C.I. In the 8th Army area it was intended that these powers should be exercised by the C.I.C. of 15th Army Group and they were not given to the S.I.C. of the 8th Army Area (Major Mercer). SUBJECT: Organization of Italian Labor.

TO: HQ, Allied Control Commission
HQ, Allied Military Government, CMV

1. Reference is made to a message originated by HQ AMG, Sicily, number A-643 of 16 October, in which instructions were requested as to whether or not employees in Sicily should be granted the right to organize and select representatives for the purpose of collective bargaining.

2. It was considered that the matter was one which should be decided not as effecting Sicily alone, but as one requiring the definition of a policy which would extend throughout the Kingdom of Italy. This was felt to be desirable, particularly in view of the procedure approved by the Badoglio Government on 2 September.

3. Approval has now been given by the Combined Chiefs of Staff to permit, on a strictly voluntary and democratic basis,

- (a) The election of shop stewards, who are to be unpaid workshop representatives of non-Fascist Labor Unions, and
- (b) Employees to organize and to select representatives for the purpose of collective bargaining.

The foregoing will be subject at all times to the authority of the Deputy President, Allied Control Commission, to approve or disapprove any agreements which may be entered into.

4. Only in case of doubt need reference be made to this Headquarters, but it is desired to stress the importance of maintaining trade union responsibility in carrying out the above policy.

MOTOR VEHICLE CIRCULATION PERMITS, AND AUTHORIZATIONS FOR SUPPLIES

I, MAURICE STANLEY LUSH, C.B.E., M.C., Brigadier, Executive Commissioner

ARTICLE I

RESTRICTION ON USE OF MOTOR VEHICLES

Section 1. No person shall use any motor vehicle on any road or allow any motor vehicle belonging to him to be used on any road unless such motor vehicle is licensed in accordance with Italian law, and a permit for such motor vehicle to be used and an authorization for supplies of petroleum products have been issued in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

Section 2. The permit issued shall be displayed in a position so that it is clearly visible to a person standing in front of the motor vehicle.

ARTICLE II

PERMITS & AUTHORIZATION FOR SUPPLIES OF PETROLEUM PRODUCTS

Section 1. Permits for motor vehicles to be used and authorizations for supplies of petroleum products under this Order will be issued by the Allied Military Government at such times and places in each province as may be publicly notified.

Section 2. Permits issued hereunder will be valid for periods not exceeding four months each, subject nevertheless to earlier cancellation at any time by the Allied Military Government.

Section 3. Every permit and every authorization, together with any unused coupons, shall be surrendered to the office of issue within five (5) days after the date of the expiration thereof or within five (5) days after the dispatch of notice of cancellation, whichever shall be earliest in point of time. Whenever any person to whom any permit and any authorization shall have been previously issued shall cease to be the owner of the motor vehicle with respect to which such permit and authorization were issued, such permit and authorization shall immediately become invalid and he shall

ARTICLE I

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Section 4. A fee of Lira 50, or such other fee as may from time to time be prescribed, shall be charged for each permit issued under the provisions of this Order.

ARTICLE III

COUPONS AND AUTHORIZED SUPPLIES

Section 1. The coupons attached to an authorization shall be valid only for the period shown on the authorization.

Section 2. Petroleum products shall be supplied only by Committee Italiano Petroli, who have been appointed as Petroleum Distributors.

Section 3. Coupons shall be detached from an authorization only by the supplier at the time of supply of petroleum products. The amount of the supply shall not exceed the amount for which the particular coupon is valid.

Section 4. No person shall acquire or supply any petroleum products otherwise than under authority expressly given by the Allied Military Government.

ARTICLE IV

RESTRICTION AGAINST USE OF FUEL

Section 1. No person shall use any motor vehicle or allow any motor vehicle belonging to him to be used for any purpose other than that authorized in the permit issued for such motor vehicle.

Section 2. No person shall waste any petroleum products in any manner whatsoever.

ARTICLE V

OTHER USES OF PETROLEUM PRODUCTS

Section 1. The provisions of this Order with respect to the necessity for procuring of an authorization, before obtaining of supplies of petroleum products and the other provisions of this Order with respect to authorizations, shall be applicable not only to users of motor vehicles of all kinds used on roads, or elsewhere, but also to all non-vehicular users, such users including but not being limited to industrial, agricultural, marine and fishing users, and to wholesale dealers in kerosene, wax or pharmaceutical petroleum products who distribute to individual retail consumers.

Section 2. The provisions of this Article shall not apply to persons acquiring a supply of petroleum products for private household consumption from an authorized dealer.

ARTICLE VI

PENALTIES

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Order shall, on conviction by an Allied Military Court, be liable to imprisonment or fine, or both, as the Court may determine, and in lieu of or in addition to any other lawful punishment, the Court may, on such conviction, order the forfeiture to the Allied Military Government of any motor vehicle or petroleum products concerned.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE USE OF PETROLEUM

Section 1. No person shall use any motor vehicle or allow any motor vehicle belonging to him to be used for any purpose other than that authorized in the permit issued for such motor vehicle.

Section 2. No person shall waste any petroleum products in any manner whatsoever.

ARTICLE V

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ARTICLE VII

DEFINITION

The term "motor vehicle" as used in this Order means any vehicle which is mechanically propelled.

ARTICLE VIII

REPEAL OF GENERAL ORDER NO. 9 (SICILY), EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDER

Section 1. General Order No. 9 as to occupied territory of Sicily, dated 7 October 1943¹⁵ hereby rescinded as of the date of this order.

Section 2. This Order will become effective throughout the Island of Sicily as of the date hereof and in all other provinces, or parts thereof within the Occupied Territory on the mainland of Italy on the date of its first publication therein.
