SUBJECT: American Nationals Whose Passports Have Expired.

TO: Vice-President, R.C. & M.G. Section, A.C.C.-R.Q. ✓

1. A certain Anna Gerandolo, 37 Years of age, now residing at Via Landati No. 8, Altamura, Prov. of Bari, was naturalized as an American citizen in New York on 3 October 1935 (we have seen her Naturalization papers). Her American address is 248 Sherman Ave., New York City, where her husband, an American citizen now lives.

2. She has an American Passport No. 475663, issued 10 Sept 1937, which she has never renewed. She did not return to the United States, she states, because they did not have enough money for the trip. After the war came and she remained here, staying with her mother and father in Altamura, waiting for the war to end. Her daughter was with her, and she is still with her, aged 17, and on the same passport.

3. The woman states that she did not know that she should lose her citizenship if she did not renew the passport, until she was so advised by this HQ. She states that she never read the passport where it advises her to renew at the end of two years.

4. We are writing to ask if there is anything that this woman can now do to have her passport renewed? Also, does her carelessness deprive her 17 year old daughter of her citizenship? (The mother and daughter state that the girl's father was an American citizen before she was born, but that she was born in Italy. The father came back to Italy and married the woman, she remained until after the baby was born, the father returned and they all three went to America.)
