SUBJECT: Committee of Security, Potenza.

TO : Executive Commissioner.

1. I refer to your letter 256/1/CA dated 27 March 1944.

2. I have carefully considered the file ACC/4016/1 and am unable to agree with your conclusions reached in para. 2.

The facts appear to be that the CIO learned, in the normal course of his duties, of the creation of this special committee at Potenza and as he was not satisfied as to its jurisdiction under Proc. 2 Art. 7 or the manner in which its work was being carried out he caused an investigation to be made.

This was a matter entirely within the province of the CIO (See Art. 7) involving questions solely of legal problems, policy and administration and I am unable to agree that it would have been better for the matter to be handled by the RC & ID Section from the outset.

A full investigation having been made with, as is now clear, the full knowledge of the R.C. the CIO made his recommendations to you when executive action was required.

I think you will agree that if Subcommissions are to perform their proper functions they must be at liberty to investigate and require reports from officers in the field in matters within their respective provinces.
