1. Reference to directions contained in communication No. 301/33/CA dated 28/5/44 regarding the proposed issue of identity cards to the Italian civil police.
2. No identity cards of the type referred to in paragraph 4 of that communication have been issued in this Region; furthermore, none of the official warrant cards held by the police services bears the direction appearing in paragraph 1 to the effect that the holders are not to be interfered with in the performance of their duties.

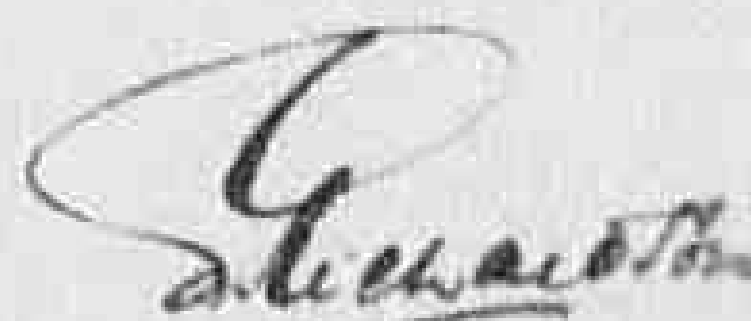

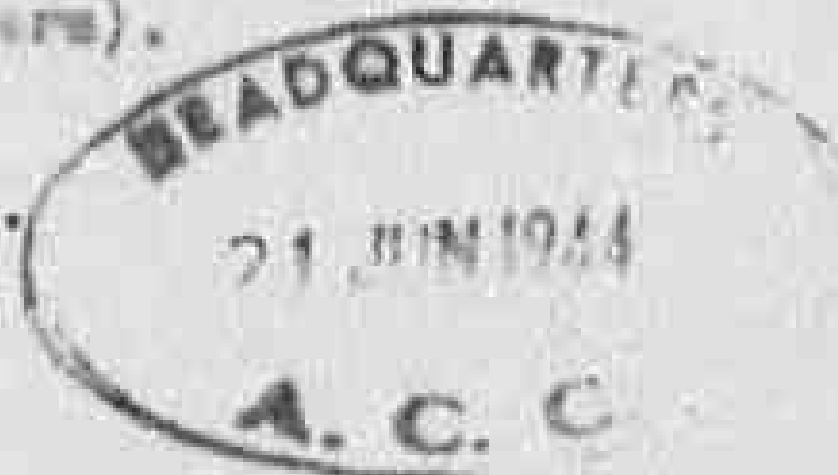

2. The nature of his duty is such that it will take him to all parts of Allied occupied Italy.

3. This letter will act as a permit for the Marchese to travel to any part of Allied occupied Italy for purposes of duty and exempts him from all curfew restrictions.

4. It remains, of course, in the discretion of the Army Commander whether the Marchese should be permitted to enter the Forward Areas, but it is requested that every facility should be afforded him to enter those Areas when his presence would not interfere with operations, so that he may carry out the momentous and significant task he has undertaken; to aid and expedite his work will be a timely act in the furtherance of our cause.

5. The Marchese is in possession of Italian Passport No. 91/933, issued in Rome 22 July, 1943.

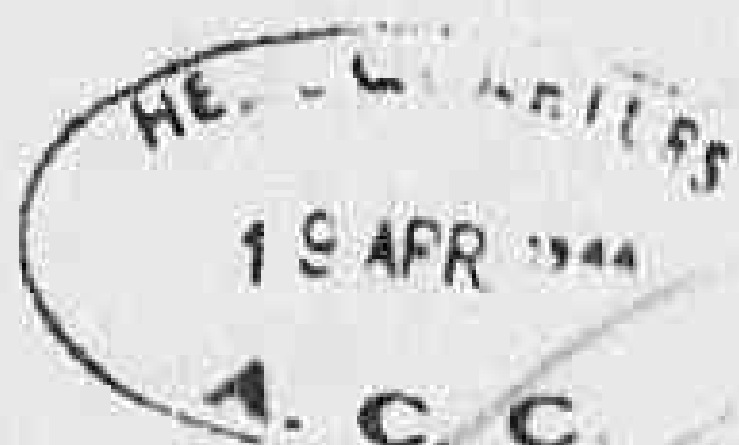

1. I have spoken about this matter with Lt. Col. Gibson, SSO 1 (IB) H.Q. A.A.I. and it appears that no machinery exists whereby the permit asked for can be granted to an Italian.

2. I suggested that a permit over the signature of the Executive Commissioner might answer the difficulty and Lt. Gibson agreed that there would be no objection to this, with the rider that in Forward Areas, the Marquis would have to conform with the wishes of the Army Commander, i.e. that he would not be permitted to enter those areas when operational reasons so dictated.

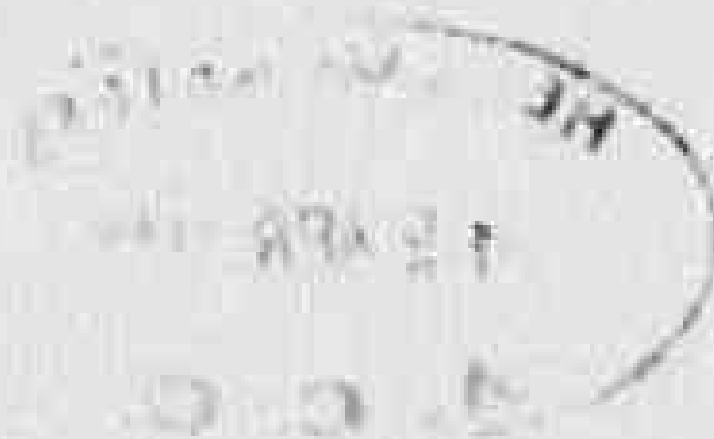

(1) A meeting recently took place between Col. Young, Director of Security, Lt. Col. Martin, Deputy Chief of Public Safety, and Lt. Col. Gibson, I(b), A.C.W.F., regarding the use of Civilian Identity Cards for security purposes.

(2) It was decided that to achieve any substantial results would be a practical impossibility having regard to the effect of military operations and other dislocating factors, such as movement of refugees.

(3) Under these circumstances, a directive such as that proposed, vide our ACC/14406/PS, will not now be required, but I understand that it is the intention of the Public Safety Sub-Commission to emphasize the need for proper compliance with the Italian Registration and Identity Card system in those areas under the control of the Italian Government.

I refer to your 301/1/CA/100, of 25.2.64.

In principle I agree with you entirely that the issue and complexity of identity cards is very necessary. I must, however, point out that in practice an identity card without a photograph is valueless and that the issue of cards with photographs and the accompanying record may for this year be a very lengthy business.

The registration of the population of Gibraltar took 10 weeks; that of 40,000 residents in Metropolitan took 5 months. The reason is that it is useless to carry out a registration unless it is done effectively.

I will consult Mr. H. A. T. T. and suggest a programme within the next few days.

SUBJECT: Civilian Identity Cards

TO: P.C.M.C., C.F.,
S.C.M.C., A.M.G., Fifth and Eighth Armies

1. In the interests of security it is essential that every civilian shall produce on demand a current civilian identity card issued by the Italian authorities.
2. Under Section III of Proclamation Number 3, and under Article III of Proclamation Number II IV is an offense, punishable by Military Courts, for a person not to have an identity card in his possession at all times. Persons who have lost their identity cards are required by Section 2, Article III, Proclamation II, as amended by Article II of Proclamation II, to report the fact.
3. In general, an identity card is issued by the Sindaco of the Comune in which a person resides, but Italian law also provides for the issue of identity cards by Governmental Offices, Postal, Police and Railway authorities, etc. An identity card is valid only for three years.
4. S.C.M.C. will take immediate steps, in conjunction with the Prefects, to ensure that every Sindaco is in a position to deal with all applications for identity cards.
5. All possible help will be given in the procurement of supplies, and the following instructions are issued for guidance:-
 - a. Photographs will be dispensed with in localities in which photographic materials are not available. The photographic resources of a locality however will be surveyed, and where shortages exist, all available materials will be earmarked, and steps will be taken to prevent them being diverted to uses which are unessential.
 - b. In the absence of a photograph, the left thumb print of a person will be imprinted in the space reserved for the photograph.
 - c. Where the identity of a person has not been fully established, an identity card will be issued on a temporary basis only, and the date of expiry will be plainly shown on the card.
6. An alien should be in possession of either (1) a passport and an alien registration certificate, or (2) if he is an interned or displaced person, a

7. If leakage of vital military information is to be prevented, especially in areas where the Army is static, the provisions of the proclamations, referred to in para. 2, must be vigorously enforced.

8. Accordingly, no civilian will be allowed to enter ASD/ACC premises until he has produced his identity card.

9. No permit, authorisation, ration card, etc., will be issued at any office until the identity card of the person applying for same has been checked.

10. Prefects will instruct Governmental agencies and public enterprises to check the identity cards of their employees. This matter will be brought to the notice of the General public by means of the press, poster, etc.

11. The Quarters and CC.RH. will be instructed to carry out spot checks at places of entertainment, food stores, railway stations, etc., and elsewhere where such checks are considered necessary.

12. The Quartermaster, CO. HQ, and Prefecture will report to S.C.A.C. on this matter. A resume of this reports will be submitted through channels so as to reach this headquarters on 1 April 1944. Thereafter, the matter will be covered by H.C.A.P.C. in their monthly progress reports.

SUBJECT: Identification Cards.

TO : Main HQ, AGC, APO 394.

1. I have gone into the question of the issue of Identification Cards and hereunder give some information on the existing system and recommendations for a general improvement and tightening up.

2. The system of Identification Cards (Tessere di Riconoscimento) in Italy stems from a decree of the Minister of the Interior of 1926. This law provides that the Podestà of a Comune was obliged, upon demand, to furnish an Identification Card to every individual over the age of 15 years.

3. It was not obligatory upon any person to have an Identification Card but there were so many activities that required some sort of identification that it became necessary to provide some standard type of card, bearing a photograph of the holder, issued by a governmental agency. Persons staying in hotels over-night or being stopped in the street found an Identification Card the simplest means of proving identity.

4. This, however, was not the only type of Identification Card, as all Government, Police, Railway, Postal and such like employees and even employees in large industries had an Identification Card, which served the same purpose.

5. Practically everybody had an Identification Card of one sort or the other. If they had not they were liable to periods of detention pending verification of names, addresses, bona fides etc.

6. Proclamation No. 11, Article 3 provides:-

" Section 1. Possession of Identity Cards - All persons must have in their possession at all times an identity card in accordance with Italian law and must produce the same upon the demand of any member of the Allied Forces.

Section 2. Loss of Identity Card - If any person has lost or shall lose his identity card he shall report that fact both to the Senior Civil Police Officer in his territory

and to the official of the local government by whom the card was originally issued. A duplicate card may be issued to him provided the word "duplicate" is marked thereon.

7. Having regard to the existing Italian law these sections of Article 3, Proclamation 11, were rather purposeless and of little effect in law.

8. Considerable use was made of the cards by requiring production and inasmuch as practically everybody had an Identification Card of sorts this was very useful in establishing identity. Of course, many refugees and others had lost their cards and they were advised to obtain duplicates. Italian law did not make it an offence to fail to have a card, fail to produce it, fail to notify change of address or fail to notify loss.

9. I feel that to set up a new Registration system and issue new Identification Cards to everybody is far too big a scheme at the present time and would take a considerable period before it could be accomplished.

10. The present system, however, is very faulty and could be tightened up by a Proclamation or Decree providing :-

- a that everybody must have an Identification Card with his or her photograph thereon.
This would mean that everybody at present without a card would have to make personal application for one within a specified period and at a designated place.
Arrangements would have to be made to provide facilities for photographing.
- b that such cards must be in the holders' possession at all times.
- c that same must be produced on demand of any member of the Allied Forces or Civil Police.
- d that changes of address (other than temporary) must be notified.
- e that loss must be reported and a duplicate obtained.

Further, it should be made an offence, carrying a substantial penalty, to forge, alter or deface a card, or to be in possession of a card belonging to another person.

11. As soon as the system was in operation every opportunity should be taken to require production and arrangements should be made for spot checks by police, Military and Civil.

4. Photographs are not possible owing to film shortage.
5. Use fingerprints.

Subject: Christian Brothers' School

I refer to your letter of 25.12.43.

In regard to I agree with you entirely that the issue and regularity possession of identity cards is very necessary. I must, however, point out that in practice an identity card without a photograph is valueless and that the issue of cards with photographs and the registration necessary for this work is a very lengthy business.

The registration of the population of Gibraltar took 10 months; that of 40,000 Italians in Tripoli took 5 months. The point is that it is useless to carry out registration unless it is done effectively.

I will consult the H. H. H. and suggest a compromise within the next few days.

1. The security control of civilians in Allied occupied ITALY has been seriously impeded in the past by the fact that a considerable proportion of the civilian population is not in possession of identity documents.
2. It is considered that the possession of individual identity cards ^{should} be made universal and compulsory. It is appreciated that this will involve a considerable amount of work, but it is pointed out that in addition to benefiting military security, such a scheme should also prove of value for purely administrative purposes such as rationing, etc.
3. The following procedure is suggested:
 - (a) That the normal Italian State Identity Card be used.
 - (b) That ACQ/AMF should ensure that adequate supplies of these cards are made available.
 - (c) That ACQ/AMF should then arrange for an order to be published to the Italian population to the effect that the possession of an identity card is now compulsory for all civilians and that non-compliance after a certain date would constitute a punishable offence.
 - (d) That the Identity Cards should be applied for and issued in the normal way through the appropriate Italian civil authority (Podesta, etc).
 - (e) That as new areas are occupied by Allied Forces the above order should be published immediately on the arrival of an AMF officer, for implementation by the Podesta concerned.
4. Such a scheme is already being set on foot by AMF Eighth Army in the Eighth Army area (see attached copy of instructions). It is considered most desirable that similar measures be taken as soon as possible in the rest of Allied occupied ITALY.
5. It should be noted that no special arrangements are required in respect of non-Italian refugees arriving in Allied occupied ITALY since these are already being issued by U.S.D.I.C. with temporary identity documents.

1. At a meeting held at this HQ with GSI(b) Eighth Army, it was decided that in the interests of security it is essential that all civilians have on their person at all times the usual Italian Identity Card.
2. Of civilians, who have passed through P.S.G. fifty per cent have been without Identity Cards. That percentage is probably high, as such persons were mostly suspect, but the situation must be viewed with concern, particularly in view of the present static occupation of the Army, which necessitates stringent security measures to ensure that no leakage of information takes place.
3. It is appreciated that in many cases the applicant can not produce proper proof of identity. The card must be issued notwithstanding. It is also appreciated that photographs can not be obtained, they may be omitted, but the left thumb print will be imprinted in the space reserved for the photograph. Once such card is issued, however, it will be possible to keep a check on the holder's movement.
4. Refugees moving under Army control out of the Army area need not have such cards.
5. Refugees moved into Army area for residence must comply with the order.
6. An Army Instruction is about to be issued providing that civilians entering Army area from Allied Occupied Areas must be in possession of an Identity document to support any pass or permit and that such pass or permit must be endorsed by the Podesta at destination within 24 hours of arrival.
7. Above orders apply only to Eighth Army area.
