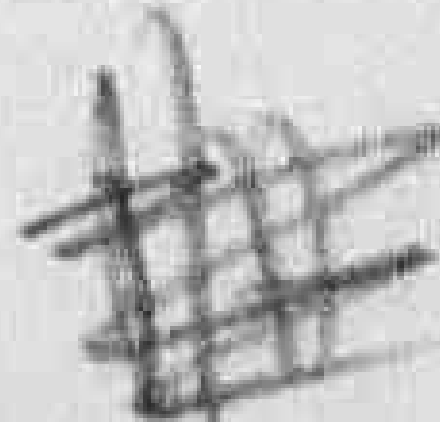
1. Your Regional Commissioners heard this morning with great anxiety the report of the Director of the Public Safety Sub-Commission in which he stated that the ceiling fixed for the Carabinieri in the whole of Italy was insufficient, and that Carabinieri would have to be removed from Regions already liberated in order to fulfil the numbers undoubtedly required for Regions I, XI, and XII.
2. In his statement Colonel Kirk said that of the present ceiling of 55,000 only 42,000 had actually been enrolled. It seems that the Director hopes to obtain the remainder from the Carabinieri which may be found in Northern Italy.
3. The Regional Commissioners have asked me to represent to you in the strongest manner possible the dangerous situation which confronts the Commission with regard to the Carabinieri. I suggest that the present strength of 42,000 be immediately increased to 55,000 by enrolment of men in liberated Italy and that we do not rely on hypothetical number of men who may be picked up in the Northern Regions and who may number from anything between 0 and 20,000.
4. It occurs to me that if we fill our ceiling at once we shall have a much better case to present to AAI regarding any Carabinieri who may be found in the Northern Regions as additional effectives. If we present the case that we have not yet filled up our ceiling, AAI are bound to assume that we are half satisfied with the present situation and are hoping to remedy it when we get North. So far as I can see it is extremely doubtful whether we shall find any effective number of Carabinieri in the North. I make this suggestion without prejudice to the strong recommendations that I know you are making to increase the Carabinieri to a figure consonant with the serious commitments we have in the North.
5. I submit that this is a case which might well be placed before the Supreme Allied Commander himself.

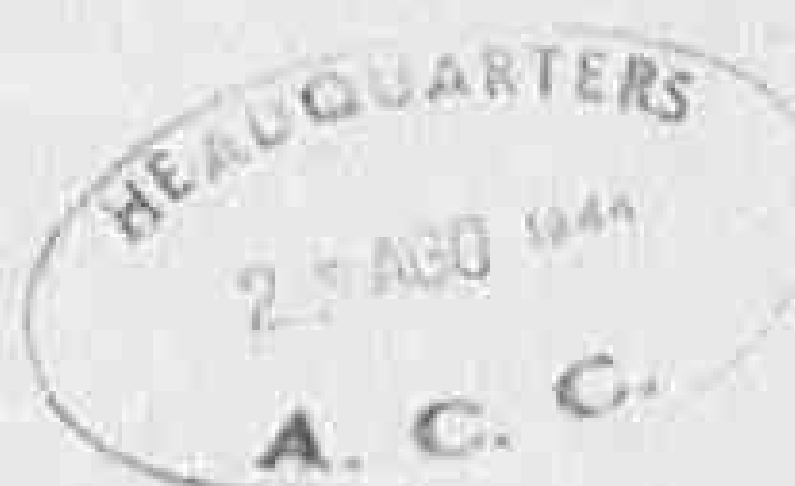

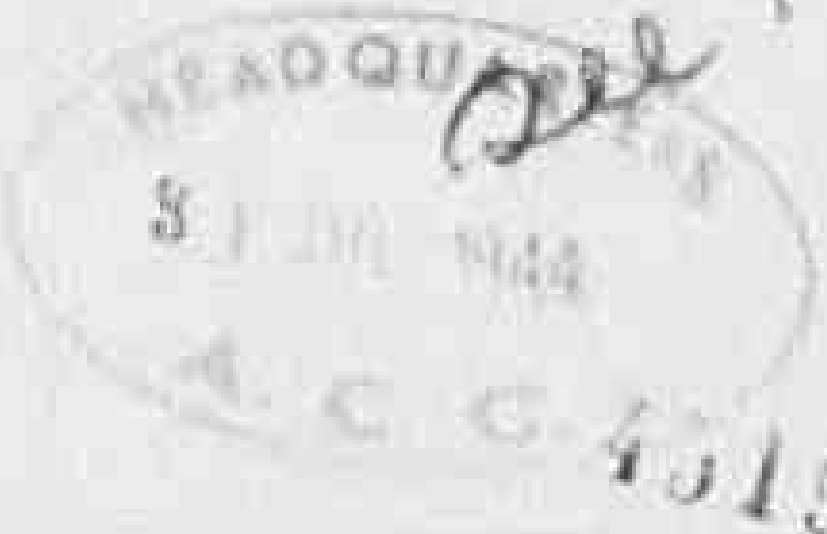

Information has been received that there is a movement of Italian general staff officers into the CC.RR. It seems that this movement is similar to that which took place in Germany after the last war. Many general staff officers due to the decrease of army personnel, are making application to be admitted into the CC.RR., their intention being to make a reserve officer's pool out of the Carabinieri. Only a few officers at a time are transferred from the regular army to the CC.RR., their movement being well concealed.

It is reported that this movement is made possible by General Taddeo Orlando, recently appointed head of all CC.RR. in Italy and who prior to this was Minister of War in Lecce. Taddeo was in charge of an Army Corps which opposed the Allies in Yugo-Slavia. Also he is represented as being an ardent Fascist.

1. Reference your signal 20 July 1944.
2. The considered opinion of the Public Safety Division of Region IV is that the ceiling now set for Carabinieri is too low and should be raised to enable normal establishments to be maintained. It is suggested that an additional ten percent over normal establishment should be made to cover extra duties which formerly came under the jurisdiction of other police bodies which now are no longer in existence.
3. Many Carabinieri are reporting in to Lazio Region headquarters from hiding in the hills. The rapid screening and equipping of these men would aid materially in solving the problem of personnel.

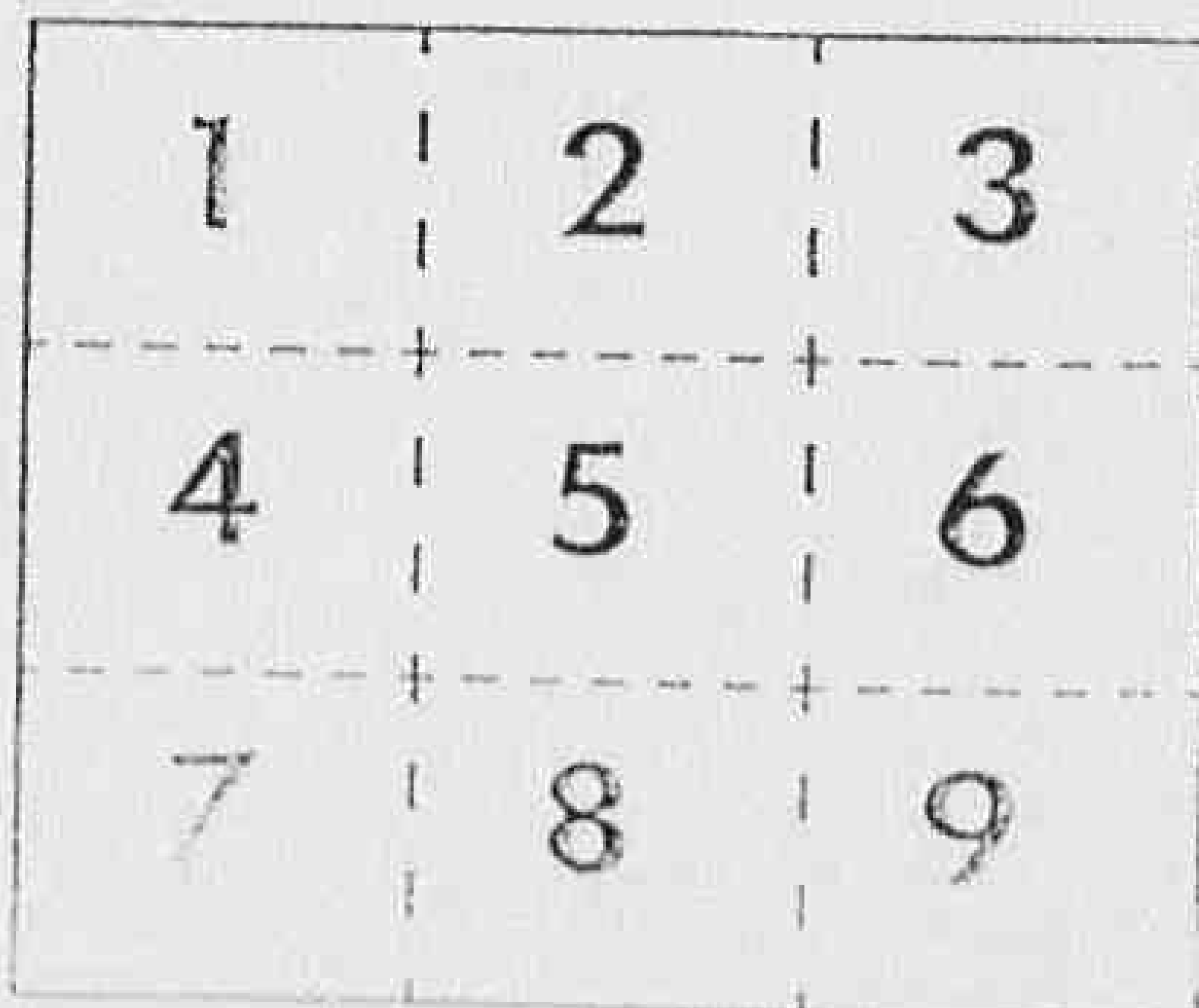
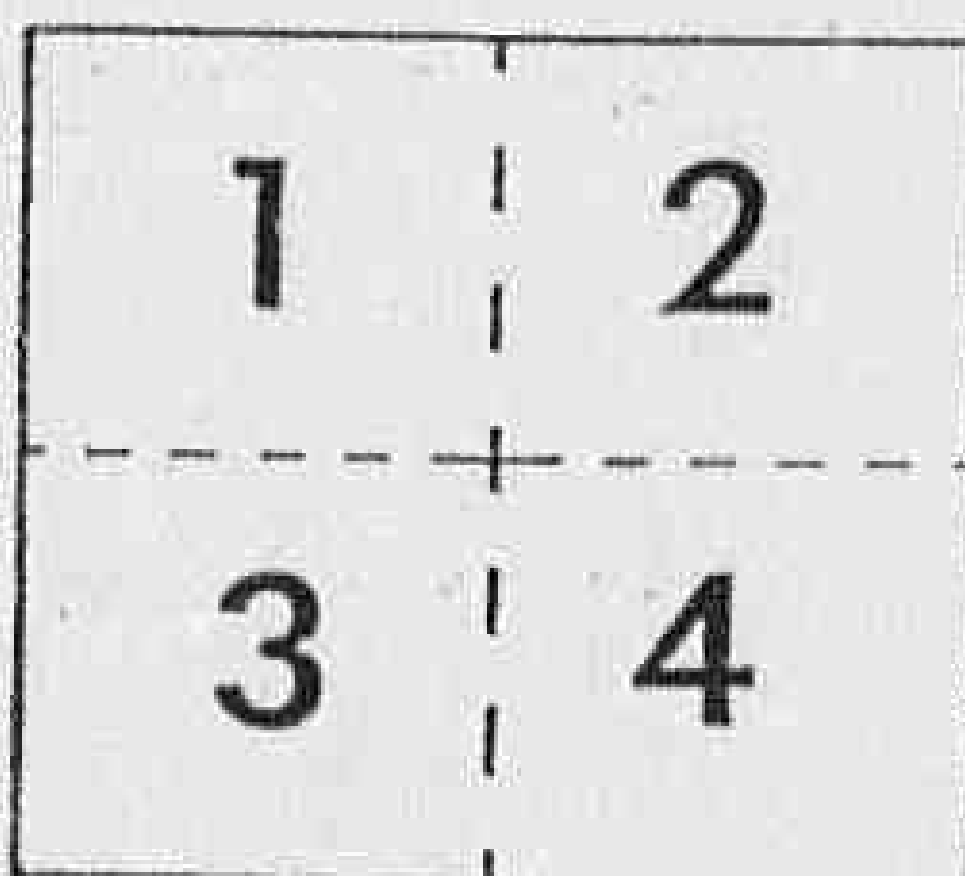

1. The undermentioned views are forwarded for your information and consideration.

a. Re para 2 A (vii) APPX "A". No evidence concerning AVVOCATO DE MARTINO, or Baron CESARE DI BRUNO DI BELMONTE has yet been received in this office or that of Legal Sub-Commission, if this is in your possession may it please be forwarded as it is not at present possible to proceed with the consideration of the action to be taken in these cases.

b. Re para 2 C (vii) and 3 A (ii). The Director of Public Safety does NOT consider it possible to increase the strength of CC.RR. in Regions I and II for the following reasons.

- (i) That CC.RR. are short in numbers and every available man that can be found in Southern Italy is required in the North as the armies move forward.
- (ii) It was intended prior to the present situation to reduce the numbers in Sicily as Region I is already over the peace time establishment, figures are as under:

Present Strength - Sicily	8174
Peace Establishment - Sicily	5475
	<u>2699.</u>

In addition, approximately 160 recruits are just finishing their training in Sicily and can be made available temporarily for duty there.

- (iii) It is further pointed out that supervision and enforcement of grain collection is NOT normally a responsibility of CC.RR. but one of the duties of Inspectors of Agriculture and as far as practicable should remain so.

PUBLICITY - GRANA DEL POPOLO.

1. 1944 is bringing to Italy good fortune in that she is at last being liberated from the yoke of dictator gangs, through Allied assistance.
2. Nature also is provident. Food, a sufficiency for all, is now at hand.
3. The most beautiful crop of grain in twenty years has been harvested without waste. Through this rich blessing Italy can feed herself well in a world in which many people are not so fortunate.
4. The threshing of this gigantic crop of grain is well under way. The collection and the distribution of the crop has begun.
5. The important phase of placing bread and pasta in the hands of all - each person in Italy is entitled to sufficient to sustain his life - has now arrived.
6. It is the sacred duty of all Italians to collect and properly distribute the grain - farmers, Prefects and their staff, Sindaci and their communal committees, the Consorzi, labourers, warehouse men, judges, priests, yea, all must do their part in this, the most important function in the restoration of Italy.
7. Wagons, motors, rail, must be used to move the grain from the overflowing threshing floors to the towns and cities for people to eat who otherwise would go hungry in a land of sufficiency.
8. The Allies guarantee that grain grown on Italian soil will be eaten by Italian people - no shipments will be made outside of Italy of grain grown in Italy.
9. Italians must do the job of collection and distribution. The Allies will support and assist. This collection and distribution of the grain is the first real test of character and fortitude facing Italy in her post War reconstruction.
10. This important and necessary operation is so humanitarian that it transcends political parties or selfish interests. Arise liberated Italy, unite in your efforts and make sure that people of Italy get the food grown on Italian soil.
11. Hard work, team work, and head work, backed up by a determined populace will assure this momentous job.

(Thru. Lt/Col. Smith, L.O., 13th. Corps.)

On 20/6/44, whilst at Ailerona, I received instructions to proceed to the Comune of Cetona.

Owing to the slight delay in preparing the report re handing over of the Comune to Provincial AMG., TERNI Province, I arranged with Capt. T. Wilson to convey two carabinieri to Cetona to await my arrival, but owing to bridges and roads being blown the two carabinieri were dropped about three miles from the town and instructed to proceed on foot.

At about 7.30 p.m. the same evening I came along the Cetona Road but was obliged owing to bridges etc. being blown to walk into the town, a distance of about three miles.

Very few military had traversed the road which was under continuous shell fire. About a mile from the town I came across three large parties of civilian workers totalling about 200, working on three huge road blocks caused by trees etc. which almost blocked the road and would obviously have caused some delay in military operations.

In charge of these workers I found Apuntato CILEA Francesco, No. 6071/105/1907, who was directing the removal of the constructions, and who had recruited all the labour prior to my arrival. As previously stated all the road was under very heavy shell fire and I remained with the Apuntato until all obstructions had been removed.

Together we entered the town where we saw only four soldiers, who had taken cover from shell fire. At the Piazza and at the Municipio I was surprised to find a full set of proclamations posted and an office reserved for AMG.

I feel that the above should be brought to notice with a view of showing the good work being done by Eight Army Mobile Carabinieri and recommending the Apuntato for promotion to Vice Brigadiere.

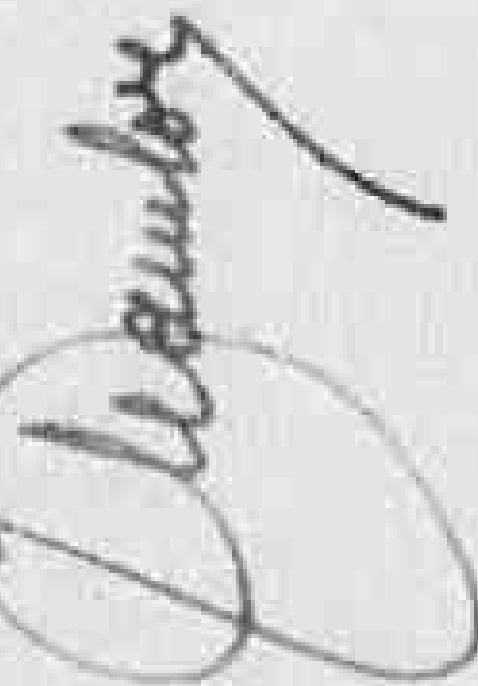

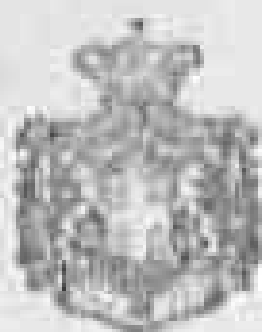

MESSAGE

Of the General Commander to the Royal Carabinieri in
occasion of the 5th June 1944.

130 years of life.

Today we are not celebrating a date; we celebrate a rite. The country is divided; in mourning; we shall retire silently and look behind our heroic and glorious past on services with six Kings, our past of bitter fighting and battles won. Shall we listen to the exhortation of our ancestors who made the AEM great and respected. They tell us not to despair; the AEM is firm and strong. We have cemented it with our blood. The AEM can not and must not die, and the AEM will not die.

Be simple and pure as your father have taught you, when tired, he was coming back from the fields, where you have grown up, under an anxious sun, in learning how to earn your daily bread. Be honest and just, because this is our tradition. Be faithful and elevate your spirit if ever you have doubted. Have the faith for you and your children, so that they could, in the full future, be encouraged not only by your hope but also by the certainty of the resurrection of the Country.

Try to see in the accomplishment without reserve of your task, the reason of living. The Nation expects very much from the AEM. Those who doubt are waiting from your example, imitation and fear; the frightened and distrust are waiting courage from you. The people where you own fear, where you have lived and for whom you are serving are waiting for reassurance and defence. You are the guarantee of peace and justice.

Leave the passionate parties alone.: You must remain impartial and serene because you are the custodian of the law and not the supporters of any party. The AEM has suffered from the war; some have failed, but the Institution has resisted and every day rises again and gains ground, stimulated by the respect of the population who waits the AEM, the AEM of the past, the AEM of ever, the AEM which will be called in the centuries: "The Deserving Generations".

Nearly 60 Carabinieri have been killed in action or massacred to defend the population from the barbaric fury. In a few months 65 have been killed, victims of their duty, in their fight against delinquency. 4334 have crossed the lines, with a serious risk, to serve under the National Government. 2. The Public Safety Sub-Commission has, in conjunction with the Italian authorities, prepared lists of CC.RA. & CC.FF. officers who are believed to be Prisoners of War in India and Africa, and for whom application is made for release, in order of priority as shown on attached lists (Inclosures #2 and #3). *Vol. I (105)*
3. With respect to the name of General Taddei Leonetto, Incl #2, CC.RA. list; on 14 April 1944 you made a special representation by letter (ref. 302/101/GA) to Hq AAI relative to the release of General Taddei.
4. Note that the name of Capt. CASARO Onofrio, shown on Incl #2, CC.RA. list, 1st priority, was previously included on second Comando Supremo priority list of 25 names sent to AFHQ by you on 22 April 1944 (ref. CC/3/222).
5. In view of AFHQ letter (DCC 014.12) dated 11 May 1944 (copy attached as Incl #4), and your memorandum referred to in para 1 above, it is suggested that you might want to send the enclosed lists to AFHQ for information of G-5 and for such use as G-5 can make of them.

SUBJECT: Repatriation of Carabinieri Personnel

TO : H.Q., Allied Control Commission

1. Reference is made to the Chief Commissioner's letter of 23 April enclosing copy of a memorandum from General Pieche who commands the Carabinieri.

2. The letter above referred to has been brought to the attention of the Chief Administrative Officer who caused investigation to be made with a view to seeing what officers and men of the Carabinieri held in North Africa could be made available for repatriation. The results of these investigations appear below in paragraphs 3 and 4.

3. So far as Carabinieri officers are concerned it is stated that 6 in all have been handed back by the British and that so far as is known there are no others in British custody. On the American side 16 were originally registered by them but except in the case of two whose repatriation is being arranged it is not possible to repatriate any more either because of the key positions they are holding or because of their pronounced Fascist views.

4. In the case of Carabinieri other ranks it is not possible to spare more than 50 for repatriation as the balance held are being used for essential duties here but the 50 have been assembled and are now awaiting orders to embark to Italy.

1. During the past two weeks it has become increasingly evident that lack of transport will militate against the most effective use of the Mobile Carabinieri.
2. Army resources are fully strained and no hope can be given from that direction; nor for obvious reasons can formations on the move assist.
3. In the current battle Mobile Carabinieri have been placed in towns within 24 hours of capture.
4. The presence of the Carabinieri in such early stages of occupation has been warmly welcomed by the civilians, and has a good effect.
5. Their period of stay may be only a matter of a few days, when they move on, their place being taken by Provincial Carabinieri.

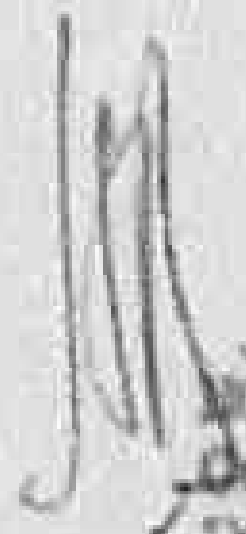

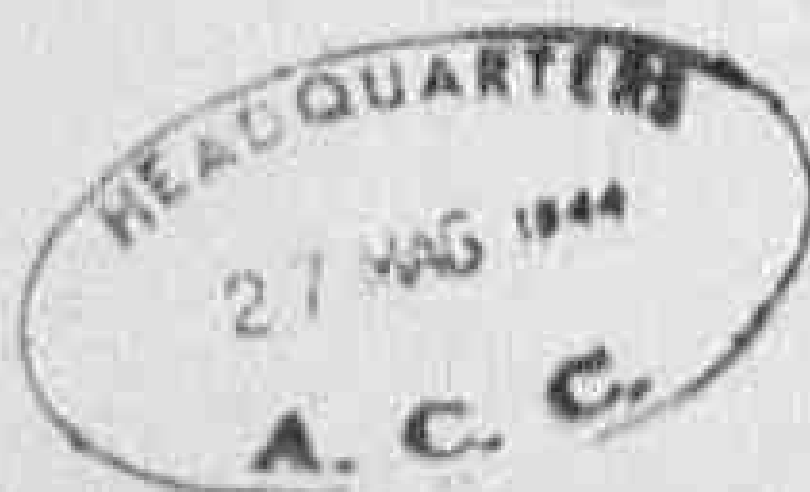

- b. They are invaluable in assisting in refugee work.

9. C.O.R.R. INFILTRATION.

While the orders at present are to collect such persons and return to nearest Legion H.Q. it is not possible to comply. The dearth of C.O.R.R. makes it imperative that they be retained en situ.

It is recommended that a Legion H.Q. be set up soon-time in FORBIA and that they accept such C.O.R.R. from occupied territory, where they can be "screened" on security grounds until such time as the situation becomes normal.

TO : Executive Commissioner, RC & MG Section

1. The attached draft will, I hope, explain the working of the proposed Replacement Centre Scheme which I have arranged with General Picche. This should ensure that organised groups of Carabinieri will be available to police those provinces which we shall have to take over as the military advance progresses.

2. I have already visited Region V and introduced the Colonel of Carabinieri who will have charge of the AQUILA, TERNI, PERCASA Group to the R.P.S.G. and details of planning and organisation are already being worked out between them.

3. This scheme should obviate the necessity for having large numbers of Carabinieri with nothing to do, waiting in the rear of Army Areas and presenting an administrative problem themselves. In future they will be held in the Replacement Centres where they will be specially trained and fitted for their duties.

4. I am anxious that those disbanded Carabinieri who are expected to volunteer for further service should not be immediately re-employed in the locality in which they re-enlist but are directed to the appropriate Replacement Centre where they will be properly "vetted", re-equipped and re-grouped for further service.

5. Instead of dealing with this as a technical matter I would prefer that you should circulate the attached letter to Regional Commissioners and I will follow it up in fuller correspondence with Regional Public Safety Officers.

SUBJECT: Use of Carabinieri

TO : Headquarters, Allied Armies in Italy.

1. I am directed by the Chief Commissioner to invite your attention to and co-operation in the solution of a problem that is becoming acute. At present upwards of one thousand Carabinieri and smaller number of Guardia di Finanza and Agenti di Pubblica Sicurezza are being used as guards on public buildings, dumps and warehouses, generally at the request of military formations.

2. As you are no doubt aware policing of occupied and unoccupied territory is, so far as Italian civilians are concerned, normally carried out by these three agencies:-

- (a) Carabinieri Reali (OLHR)
- (b) Guardia di Finanza (OLFS)
- (c) Agenti di Pubblica Sicurezza.

Of these the Carabinieri are essentially soldiers who are specially and highly trained in police duties, and by virtue of their traditions were, and still are, greatly respected by the civilian population. It is considered that the use of such highly trained policemen on what is a military function, such as guard duties, is extremely wasteful. Furthermore, the number of these police bodies is quite insufficient to perform their present duties and would be more than insufficient to cope with the problem which will arise if a rapid advance were to be made. It is thought that other and less highly trained Italian Military personnel than the Carabinieri should be employed for guards, thus leaving Carabinieri free for their proper functions.

3. The other two bodies, para. 2(b) and (c) above, also have specialised duties and while their use as guards is less common and perhaps not quite so undesirable as in the case of the Carabinieri, it is nevertheless objected to on the grounds that it diverts specialist personnel which can ill be spared from their proper functions.

4. It is suggested that the use of Italian Army personnel or of Allied troops from Replacement Depots, if the former should not be considered as sufficiently reliable, should be considered. As it is necessary to return trained police personnel to their proper duties as soon as possible, the Chief Commissioner would be grateful for your comments on this letter at an early date.

Mr. Col. Shocks also raised the question of boots for officers of the G.D. on the Island. Apparently there is a scheme in force for the clothing of the Carabinieri GIs but at that time nothing had been settled in regard to the officers.
