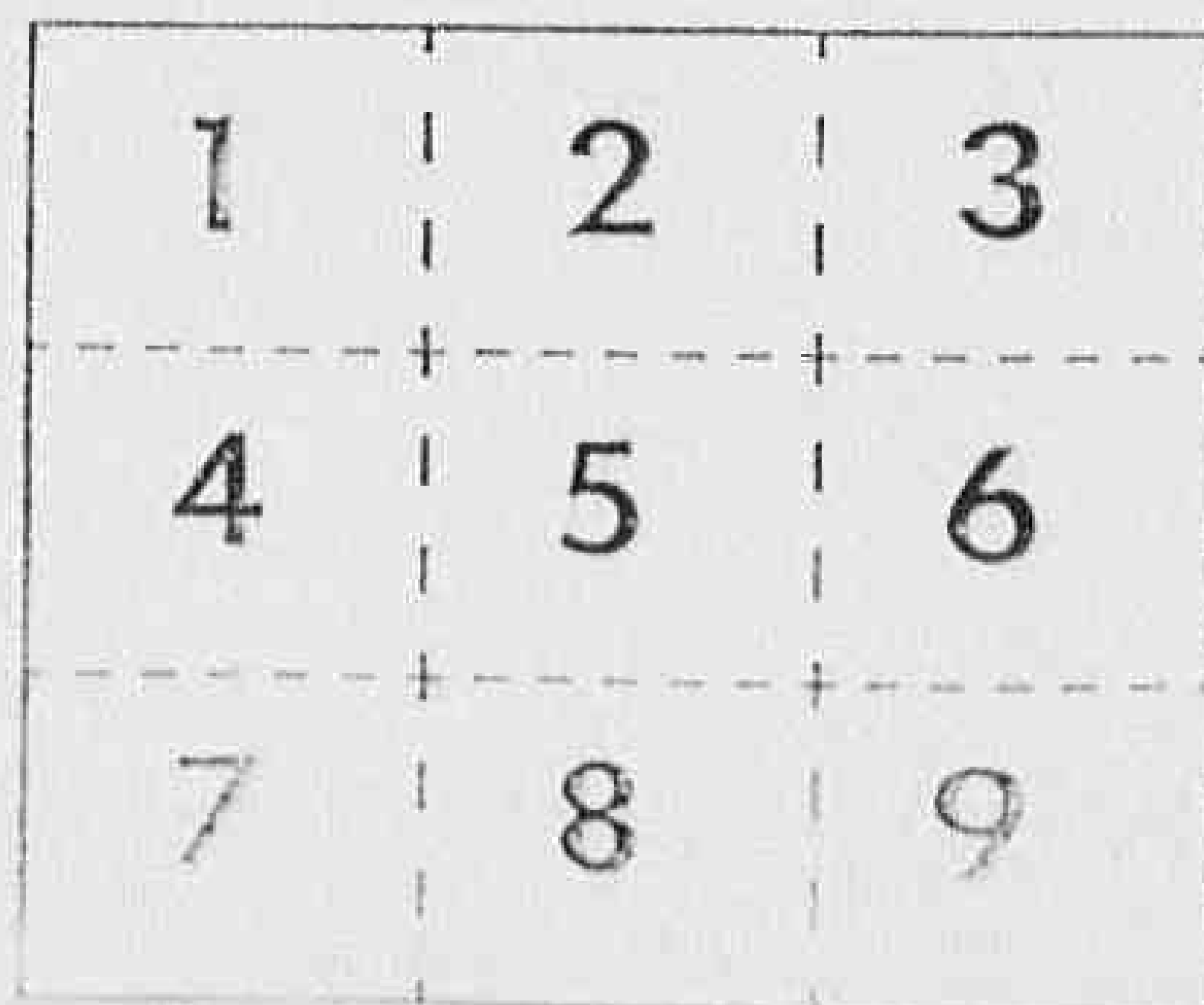
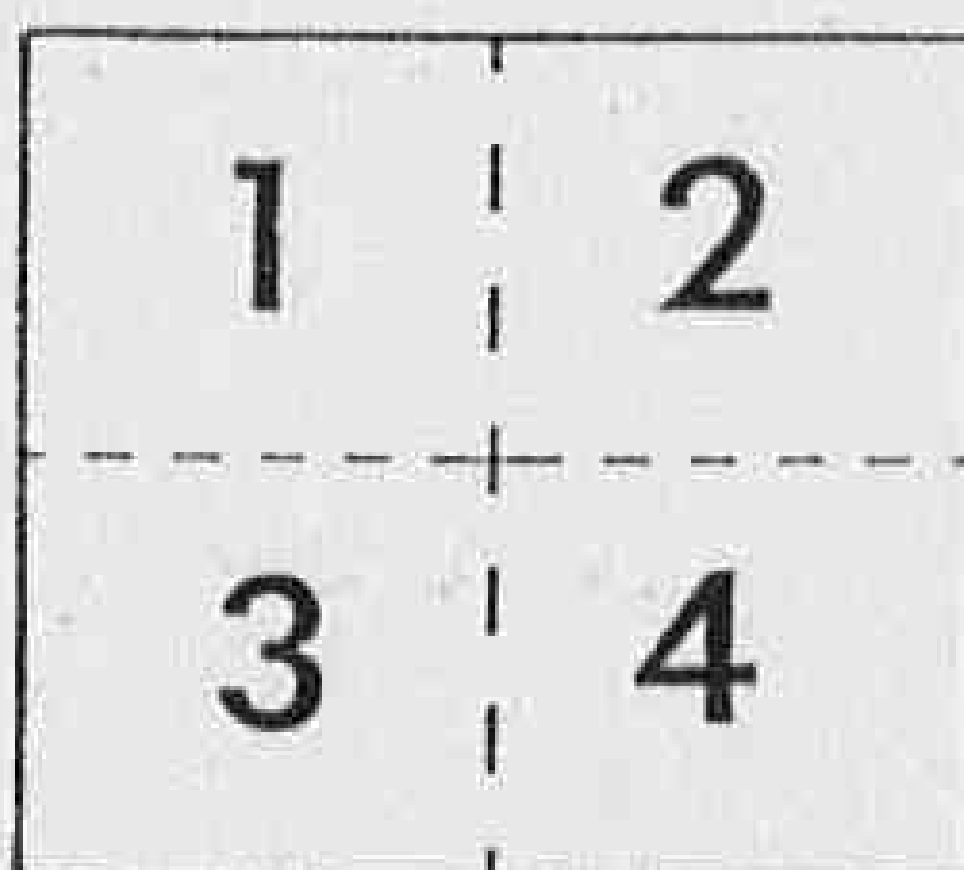
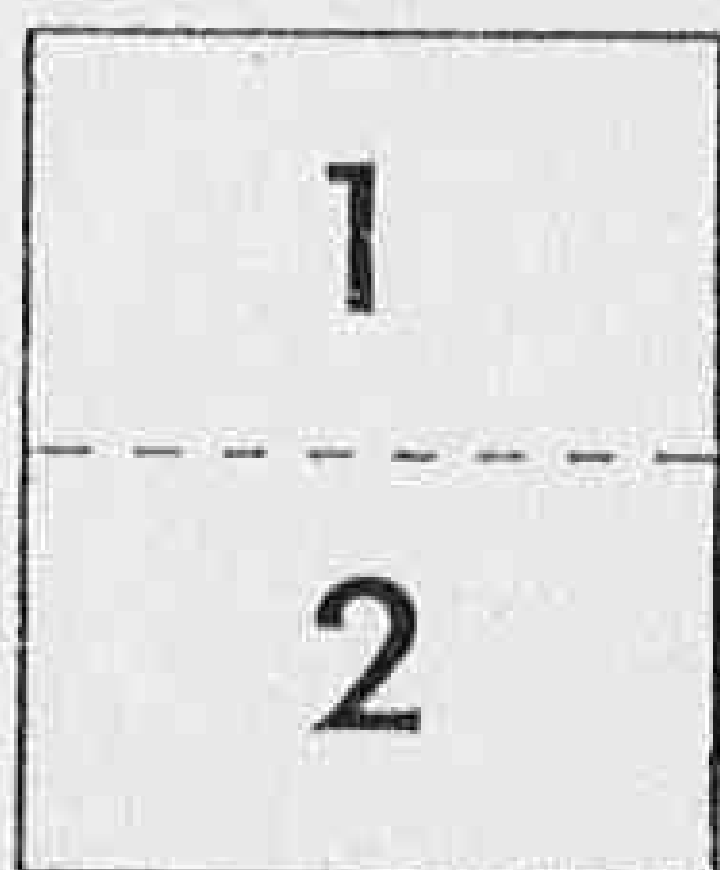

SUBJECT: Civilian Circulation Permits.

TO : The Executive Commissioner, Hq. ACC, APO 394.

1. Attention is drawn to a conflict in instructions issued to Italian civilians which is causing much confusion.

2. By "Notice", dated 17 June 1944, signed "Norman E. Fiske, Deputy Executive Commissioner, Allied Control Commission" it is stated that civilians travelling other than by means of motor vehicles will no longer be required to obtain circulation permits when travelling in areas south of the line Fubara, Bracciano, Campagnano, Castelnuovo, Tivoli.

3. Although no copy of the order has come to this Headquarters, Administrative Order No. 10, Hq. Region 3, ACC, dated 4 July 1944, was published in the Risorgimento (Naples) on 5 July 1944, requiring civilians whether in a vehicle, or on foot, to be in possession of a circulation permit signed by an AMG or ACC officer, in order to enter into, or depart from, Naples or Benevento provinces.

4. It is believed that this conflict in orders should be removed at the earliest possible date, and preferably by the amendment of Region 3 Administrative Order No. 10, as its requirement that each individual civilian bear a pass would appear to be an undue burden on movement in an area far removed from the zone of operations.

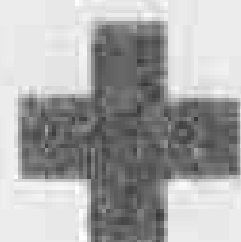

Referring to our today's conversation, my problem can be summed up as follows:

The Italian Red Cross has at present two Mobile Hospitals functioning at Carinola and Venafro. Both these places are - as far as I have been able to understand - located within what is known as the "Zone of communications" of the V and VIII Armies respectively. It has been admitted that certain Italian Red Cross officials, must have access even at a short notice, to these hospitals. To enable them to do so and to avail themselves of whatever transportation may offer itself at the moment, they ought to be issued with a permanent permit to visit the said two places whenever necessary. Should the two hospitals happen to be moved then the question will have to be gone into again.

1. In accordance with orders of operational forces, (D.B.M.F.S.), instructions were issued to Italian Railways by Undersecretary, General di Reimondo, prohibiting travel by civilians on freight trains. There have been numerous casualties, many of them fatal, in addition to which serious interference has been caused to movement of vital military and civilian goods. Further, there have been many thefts.

2. Advice has recently been received by Transportation Sub-Commission that some ACC Regional or Provincial Officers have issued authority to civilians to travel on freight trains.

3. The issue of permits to travel by freight trains is prohibited and all such permits which have been issued must be withdrawn and cancelled.

4. All ACC and AMS officers should be advised of these instructions to avoid further complaints from operational forces or Italian State Railways, of improper interference with *Railway operation*.

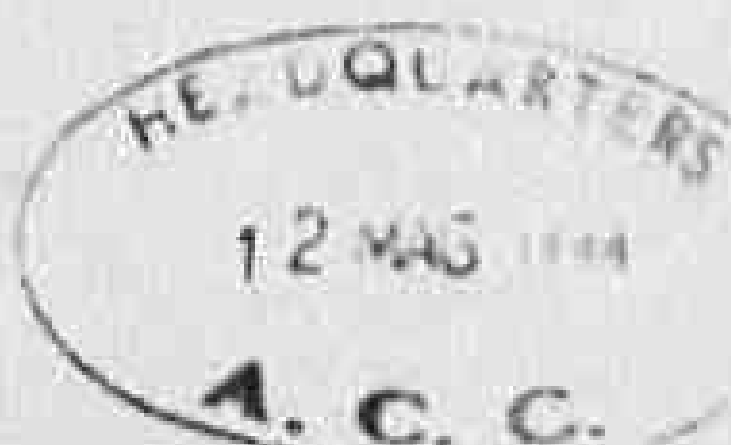

SUBJECT : Improper Grant of Authority.

1. In accordance with directions of operational forces, (DGMTS), instructions were issued to I.S.R. by Gen. di Raimondo, prohibiting travel by civilians on freight trains. This is highly desirable because of number of casualties, many of them fatal, which have occurred, and because of interference with movement of vitally needed products, including theft.
2. This Sub-Commission has received advice that some ACC officer at Cosenza has authorized civilians to travel on freight trains of the Paolo-Cosenza and Sibari-Cosenza lines. It is not known under what circumstances, or by what authority permits were issued. However, it is requested that action be taken to ensure that practice be stopped and that responsible officer collect at once all outstanding permits.
3. This is a most serious matter and it is suggested that formal instructions be issued, through ACC official channels, to all officers thereof, that they shall not issue permits or take any action affecting railways in any wise until matter has been presented to and approved by Transportation Sub-Commission. Any other course of action will result in complaint by military forces and confusion on part of I.S.R. employees.
4. May we expect prompt action, with copies of instructions issued, for transmittal to operational officers concerned?

I will be obliged if you will bring the following to the notice of the Regional Commissioner.

A short time ago I went out to Capua and saw Lieut Freeman about passes to Agricultural Officials for crossing the Volturno.

I agreed with him to only put up people who it was essential should be allowed to cross. The most important of these were a number of Consorzio Agrario employees, who I wish to send around all the Consorzio Agrario warehouses immediately North of the Volturno to check up on the quantities of potato seed received, as there is considerable discrepancy between the amount we have sent from here and that they say they have received. In addition to this it is necessary for these officials to inspect the warehouses to find out their condition for the future amassing campaign.

Capt. Freeman signed passes for these people but they have not been honoured.

Either I must give up trying to do any work North of the Volturno of an Agricultural nature or the matter of passes must be decided, as I cannot spare the time to keep on going up to Capua over every individual case. Lieut. Freeman suggests the matter must be taken up to higher authority. I should be obliged if this could be done.

FORAGE CROP TO BE GATHERED.

To Major White.

It has been brought to my attention again what the question of cutting the forage crop (hay), across the Volturno is of National Importance.

Aside from the fact that it will supply animals with forage for the present and the future, the following idea has been forwarded.

That if this forage is left uncut and ungathered, it will in time become dry and a great fire hazard.

Land covered with this dry forage needs but a few incendiary bombs dropped at spaced intervals and it would soon become an inferno, causing heavy agricultural losses and endangering the lives of Allied troops as well as lives of civilians.

It may be also added that land producing this forage will remain dry once the grass is cut, eliminating greatly the Malaria hazard.

1. Attached hereto is pass taken from TRIVOLIZZI Felice, found at 2030 hours on the San Severo-Foggia road on 7 April in a truck containing about four tons of contraband foodstuffs. There were three other Italians on the truck without passes. The truck was not the truck shown on the pass.

2. The following comments are made on the pass:

- (a) The pass has no date of expiring and therefore can be used repeatedly.
- (b) The English version of the pass authorizes three Italians to purchase horse beans (carrubi) and beet seed (seme di barborelli) at Foggia. Neither is amassable and both may be purchased freely here.
- (c) Below the English version is an Italian version, typed on a different machine, in which the non-amassable horse beans and beet seed have been daftly changed to amassable fave and ceci, thus making the pass apparently valid CC.PR. and CC.FF. for contraband foods.
- (d) An attempt has been made to extend the English version to 14 April.
- (e) The fake Italian version bears the office stamp, which must therefore have been available to the forger.

Memorandum Report to Colonel WHITLEY:

In re SO 7, HQ, Region V, 14 Feb 44, and SO 20, HQ, Region V, 29 Feb 44, I have to report:

During the past week, I have made liaison visits to the 12th Air Force at Foggia, and to 8th Army HQ, AMG.

1. At Foggia, I contacted (on 28 and 30 March) Col. DICE of the 12th Air Force, Col. BIRN (CO of AAF Area Command); also Lt. Col. TEMPERLEY and Lt. Col. ANDREWS.

a. No word had yet been received as to whether the Army is to supply the heavy equipment expected to assist in the sanitary program.

Both Col. BIRN and Lt. Col. ANDREWS seemed quite anxious to have Lt. Col. FINDLAY's assistance in the sanitary program. It is recommended that Lt. Col. MARSHALL (of Regional Public Welfare) be directed to have Lt. Col. FINDLAY, or some other suitable engineer, report as soon as possible to assist in this program.

b. In reference to the memo from Col. BIRN to the R.C., dated 14 March, I found that the 12th A.F.S.C. has its headquarters at Naples, General THOMAS being C.O., and that the headquarters at Foggia have no knowledge of any Charles Balladicono. Also it was learned that in Region III, many of the restrictions on civilian travel in the area concerned (which does not necessarily touch Region V) have been removed.

It is, therefore, suggested that this matter (if it is desired to press it further) be taken up at Naples with 12th A.F.S.C. directly by the liaison section of ACC, or through Region III, ACC.

2. At HQ, 8th Army AMG, I contacted (on March 31) Group Captain BENSON; Wing Commander BERR was then said to be in Campobasso working on a supply matter with Region V.

Captain BENSON informed me that 8th Army AMG had taken over from 5th Army AMG military government in the new 8th Army area four days previously. Captain BENSON also advised that there would be no objection on his part to members of the Agricultural Section of Region V making an agricultural reconnaissance in Chieti Province.

Dear Farley,

Confirming telephone conversation this afternoon, could you get Gibson's agreement to some relaxation in the centralized control of passes to enter FORMIA Province?

As you know it is entirely in the hands of the Provincial Commissioner, Region III have represented to us the difficulties under which they labour when, for example, it is necessary to send into FORMIA Province to purchase grain for communities which are entirely without that commodity.

We think there should be some elasticity in cases such as this and, whilst private needs can well wait until their applications have been vetted by the P.C. FORMIA Province, other P.Cs could be entrusted with the responsibility of approving on his behalf applications of a public or communal nature.

Perhaps, after you have secured Gibson's consent, one of your staff could discuss the matter with Region V and decide on conditions under which this delegation could be permitted.

1. The present arrangement for the issue of permission to travel to other regions is that before a pass can be granted permission must be obtained from the SCAO of the province to which it is proposed that a visit be made.
2. This leads to considerable delays
3. It has been represented by the Economics and Supply Section of this Hq that the delay may have serious economic results e.g. in the case of civilians required to accompany AMG officers in the purchase of olive-oil, for example the permits governing the movement of members of the Comitato Italiano Petroli.
4. Would it be possible to allow the SCAO of the province from which the applicant wishes to leave the authority to grant the pass in those cases when it is certain that the request is not made for personal reasons?
