MEMORANDUM: to Lt. Colonel Shinn.

1. Yesterday Major Ballance made an enquiry shortly before the end of the day about folio 290.
2. Major Ballance had left when I tried to get in touch with him yesterday and to-day is his day off.
3. As nearly as our clerical staff got the message, Major Ballance wished to know if we had taken any action on General Hume's request of movement south of Italian civilians.
4. Since the cable had been sent to him for information only, I do not know what his interest in the subject may be and I have not yet been able to discover, but I have left a message with Major Harbury. If Major Ballance has any questions he can telephone.
5. At no time while we were discussing the proposal of General Hume did it occur to either of us that Major Ballance would come into the picture.

1 The case against BIZZAUHI and others, the subject of this letter, was decided on Saturday 19th instant. The Court, having regard to the technical nature of the offence committed by accused and the fact that they had been detained for a considerable time away from their home, sentenced them to one day's imprisonment.

2 The individuals really to blame in this case were:

(1) The Director of Mercato of the Azienda Antonaria of Rome who issued the passes, (2) An Officer of AMG described as "Local Resources Officer" who was responsible for countersigning them.

3 An examination of the two passes reveals the following irregularities:

(a) The passes purport to be authorizations to carry fruit and vegetables.

(i) They are not signed by the Director.

(ii) They do not give the names of the persons using the vehicle.

(iii) Pass No. 1 incorrectly gives the distance to Abbadia and back as 140, whereas it is really 340.

1 The case against BIZZAGHI and others, the subject of this letter, was decided on Saturday 19th instant. The Court, having regard to the technical nature of the offence committed by accused and the fact that they had been detained for a considerable time away from their home, sentenced them to one day's imprisonment.

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(i) They are not signed by the Director.

(ii) They do not give the names of the persons using the vehicle.

(iii) Pass No. 1 incorrectly gives the distance to Abbadia and back as 140, whereas it is really 340.

(b) It seems clear that neither the Director or the Local Resources Officer are persons authorized to issue passes within the meaning of General Order No. 24, Art. 1, Sect. 1.

(c) The passes are for a place North of the Control Line. The procedure for granting such passes is governed by ACC Memorandum, Ref. 315/76/Ca, dated 26th of April 1944. (See General Order No. 24, Art. II, Sect. 3).

1 June 1944 P.T.O.

(d) Pass No. 1 authorizes the purchase of fruits and vegetables (Frutta e Ortaggi), whereas the actual object of the journey was to purchase mushrooms. The word "Ortaggi" refers to garden produce and cannot include mushrooms, (Funghi) which is a wild product. It is a matter for the consideration of ACC as to whether, in this period of scarcity, a permit should have been issued to go a distance of 340 Kms. to purchase mushrooms which are a luxury article of food, available only to the well-to-do.

4 This is by no means the only case of its kind which has come to my notice. Only to-day, a car with a Rome registration number, was stopped and the driver was found in possession of a pass issued by an AMG Police Officer to travel from Rome to Florence. Actually no passes are being issued to Florence under Army orders, but inasmuch as the pass was to a place North of the Control Line, the Officer concerned should have sent the application to AMG HQ 3 Army and awaited a reply before issuing a permit. The result in this case was that the car had to return to Rome.

5 I suggest that the facts in this case should be brought to the notice of ACC HQ with the following recommendations:

(a) That no authorities to purchase food in other Provinces should be given without first consulting the PC concerned. In most cases, permits to export from Provinces are required.

(b) That all passes are issued in accordance with existing regulations to ensure that all persons in

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(b) That all passes are issued in accordance with existing regulations and that steps should be taken to ensure that all persons in the car must be in possession of permits granted by the competent Authority. Failure on the part of those responsible, has been the cause of all the trouble in the case under reference.

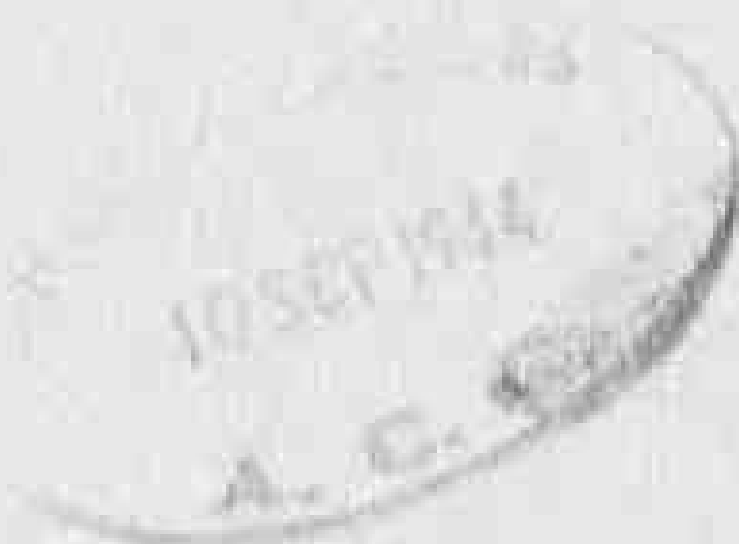

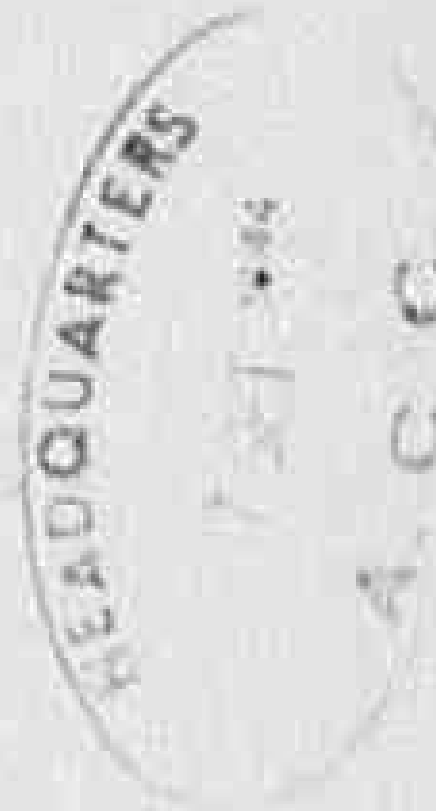

1. It has been reported that Signor Giacomo Stefanelli travelled to Scheggia, Perugia, which is north of the Rear Army Control Line, without being in possession of a standard yellow "movement of Civilians" pass approved by the S.C.A.C. Eight Army.

2. Stefanelli produced the attached documents, viz (a) a P.W.D. pass No. 235, (b) a letter issued by E.I.A.R., dated 24 July 1944, and (c) a letter issued by P.W.D., dated 25 July 1944 at Scheggia when he applied for a pass to return to Rome. His application was refused.

3. While it is realized that the documents referred to at (b) and (c) in paragraph 2 do not purport to be passes authorizing Stefanelli to travel to Scheggia, it is pointed out for information that no civilian may cross the Rear Army Control Line (which runs from Porto Civitanova - Viase - Spoleto - Todi - Orvieto - S. Lorenzo along Route 74 to sea) without a pass approved by the S.C.A.C., AFHQ Fifth or Eight Army. A request for a pass will not be considered unless the journey is in the direct interest of the war effort.

Thank you for your letter of 2nd September on the subject of
Monsignor Borgognini's visit to Loreto.

Although it is true that Loreto is not considerably removed
from the scene of operations it is still in the Army area to enter which
permissions must be obtained from the Army authorities who, as you say, have
a perfect right to refuse. These areas are regarded, and I think rightly
so, in the same way as the restricted areas on the South coast in the U.K.,
to visit which, as you know, permission can only be obtained on very special
circumstances. I fully realize the importance of doing all we can to meet
the Vatican's wishes but the military authorities do regard the matter from
a strictly military point of view and unless a visit is connected with the
war effort or, shall we say, the feeding of the civil population, they do
feel that it is necessary to refuse.

I will, however, represent the matter to Army Headquarters and
ask whether permission can be granted in the special circumstances of the

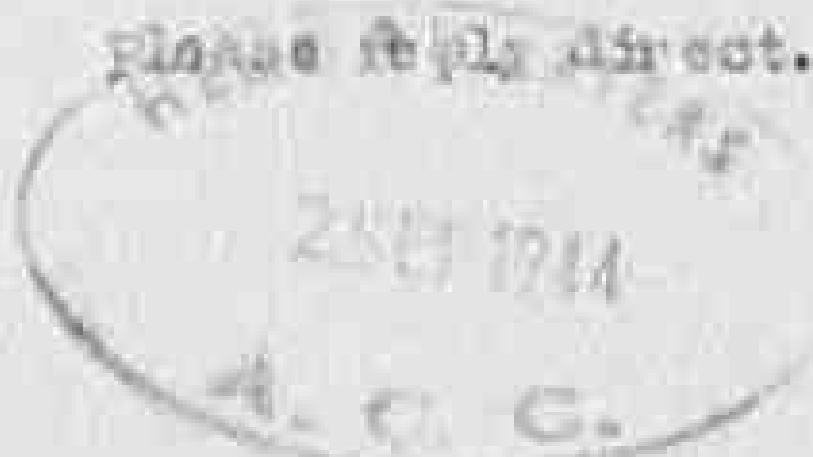

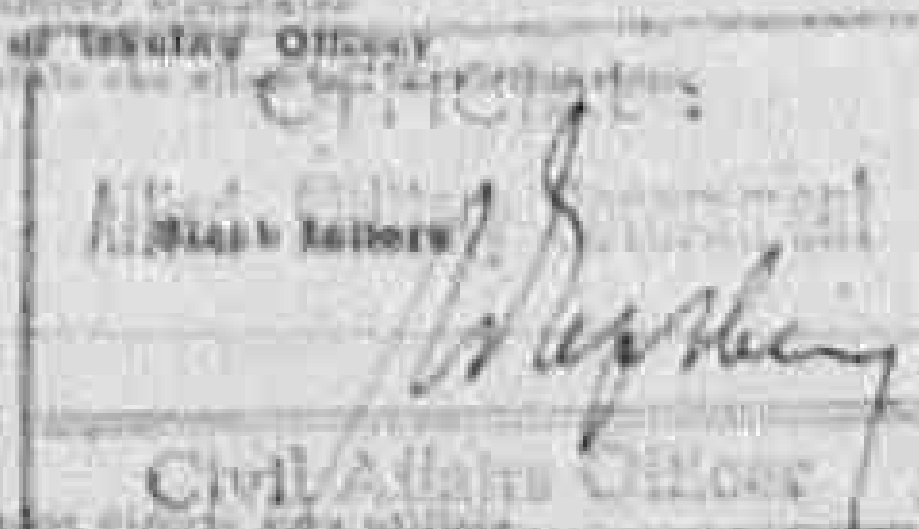

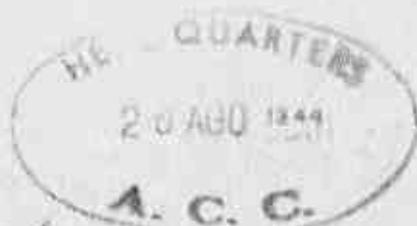
