1. Enclosed is copy report by CMP of 200 Prov Coy, which was forwarded by IC Perugia (when u/c this HQ) with the comment that cars had arrived in the province in similar circumstances on other occasions.
2. It will be seen that the case in point occurred eight days after Executive Memorandum No. 77 had been issued.
3. It is appreciated that the car was not of the S.V.R. but no doubt a prosecution did not follow in this case as the CMP corporal concerned assumed the journey or use of the car to be vatican sponsored.
4. The issue of passes for vatican officials is of course covered by para 12(a) of Executive Memorandum No. 77, and therefore it must be accepted by the vatican authorities that any case coming to notice of vatican state or vatican state sponsored journeys into Army Area being undertaken without the proper authorization will inevitably lead to prosecution.

Sir,

I have to report that at Perugia on Friday 8th September 1944, at about 10.33 hrs, I was on duty at NO. "5" T.C. point, when I stopped civilian car Fiat No. Regn 59316 driven by Sanguigni Sivano of No.5 Via Bernida, Rome.

The only permit he carried for the journey, and the vehicle, was a card placed on the windscreen giving the number, and type of vehicle and the letters vatican commission for the Assistance of Refugees.

Superimposed with the arms of the vatican. A flag bearing the same arms was mounted on the radiator of the vehicle.

The driver stated that his destination was the Italian Police Hq. Perugia and that he had made this journey before.

I satisfied myself that the man was genuine, and allowed him to proceed, but could this matter be carried further as there is nothing to stop other people placing a similar card and circulating outside their legitimate area, without the necessary yellow permit, issued by the A.M.C. Authorities.

SUBJECT : Passes. Bomb Disposal Unit.

TO : Regional Commissioner Lazio,  
(attention : P.P.S.O.).

1. An officer attached to the Ufficio del Direttore, Direzione di Artiglieria di Roma (Mine Clearance Unit), called at this Headquarters with a number of passes for countersignature by a Public Safety Officer. The passes are intended for issue to Military and Civilian members of the Mine Clearance Unit.
2. The passes are printed in two parts. The first part is printed in Italian and contains particulars of the person to whom issued. This part is signed by the Director of the Unit.
3. The second part is printed in English and it is intended that this should be signed by a Public Safety Officer.
4. I took possession of all the second parts of the passes because of the looseness of the English text, copy attached. It will be noted that the pass purports to give the holder 'free circulation'. No expiry date is shown.
5. Apart from any other consideration, the issue of this form of pass is contrary to the instructions contained in Executive Memorandum No.77, dated 31 August, 1944. It is understood that Major Batterby has signed and issued a number of these passes.
6. With regard to the issue of passes to Italian Military Personnel, this is a matter for MHA (Capt. Dalby) and the officer from the Unit has been informed that MHA are prepared to suitably endorse Italian Military Orders.

7. With regard to the issue of passes to civilians, the officer was instructed to apply for standard movement of Civilian Passes which should be endorsed on the back either by Public Safety or M.M.I.A.

8. It is requested that steps be taken to withdraw those passes which have been signed and issued by Major Hatterby.

FAVOUR AND MERITS.

The R.C.A.M.C. Section of R.O. A.O.C. have lodged a very serious complaint involving P/O Perry of the Vesuvius Detachment.

2. It would appear that P/O Perry, without reference to higher authority, has been authorising and countervailing on behalf of this Sub-Commission travel permits and leave passes for I.A.F. personnel to proceed to prohibited areas.

3. The particular case which has brought matters to a head relates to one Mr. Bigi Tetreno whose pass was dated 10th September 1944, and who was authorised to proceed to Pescara.

4. Such authorisation is contrary to R.O. A.O.C. Instruction 1401/10/US1(2) of 4/9/44, and contrary to the directive issued by Bari Officer under reference 313/2/082 dated 8th September 1944.

5. It is requested that P/O Perry be brought before a Superior Officer, and cautioned as to his further activities in this sphere.

6. If any doubt arises as to whom and for where passes may be countervailed, it is suggested the question be referred to W/Odr Minter at the Naples Office who is kept up-to-date on all such matters.

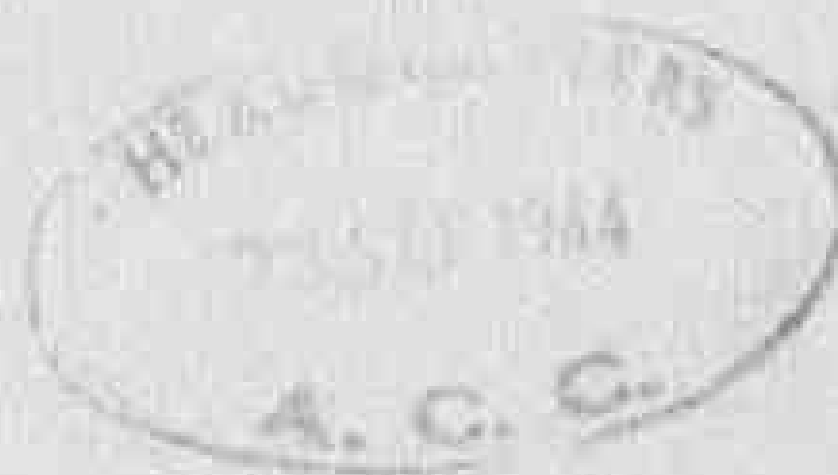

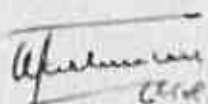

Sir,

I have to report that at about 1320 hours on 30 Aug 44 at BOVINO T.P. a 2 1/2 ton GMC No. 444420 driven by No. 3482 Soldat 1st Class PEREZ JEAN, 632 Company of Munitions (Depot), CAVERSA, and in company with No. 4948 Conducteur JONZALLES MANUEL, was stopped.

On searching the rear of the vehicle it was found to contain five large barrels and one small barrel of olive oil - 35 quintals - for which the driver could not produce any written authority.

The oil was seized by me and is now awaiting transportation to ACC Lacera.

I obtained the particulars of the above named Frenchmen and informed them that it was illegal to transport oil without permission of ACC. I then allowed them to proceed.

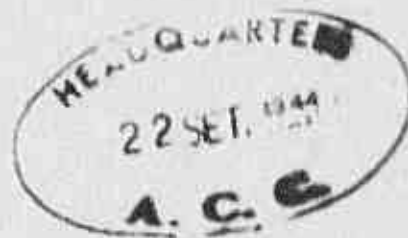

2. The position regarding Sig. Cusmano is appreciated.

3. By way of confirmation of the telephone conversation of over date (Lt. Colonel Shipp - Captain Walsh) Signora Cusmano arrived from Rome at her home in Anversa to the best of my knowledge on 13 September 1944, and had stated that she came to bring her two children to Rome for the purpose of putting them to school, and also to discuss the clearing of certain blocked accounts in the name of her husband.

4. Signora Cusmano approached Captain Walsh with a view to obtaining WD transport for the conveyance of herself and her children to Rome, and in the course of conversation it turned out that she had travelled from Rome to Anversa on a pass which had been issued in the name of another person. She was told by Captain Walsh that the latter was highly irregular and also was requested by him to produce the pass under which she had travelled (at the moment of writing she probably has not had the opportunity to get hold of it). She stated that she had travelled in all good faith under the instructions of her husband, SIG. CUSMANO, who is known to you.

5. Under the circumstances, I propose, as agreed by you in the conversation between Lt. Colonel Shipp and Captain Walsh this morning, to allow Signora Cusmano and her two children to proceed to Rome under their own arrangements. 2. These "passes" are of course invalid, and <sup>would be</sup> irregular for several reasons:

- (a) They are not the authorized AOC forms.
- (b) They do not specify the exact termination of the proposed journey, etc according to Executive Memorandum No. 77.
- (c) There is no assistance for the war effort.

3. It is requested therefore that you ask the Italian authorities to instruct the Sindaco of Battipaglia in particular and all others concerned with control of movement to comply exactly with the regulations of Executive Memorandum No. 77.
