FROM : Political Section

1. As a result of our conversation this morning I would suggest the following. The Political Section are approached by three different classes of Italians who wish to go abroad: (1) Officials of the Ministry for Foreign Affairs, e.g. Legnascchi; (2) A few special cases of interest for political reasons, such as Miss Amendola; (3) Italian nationals whose papers are referred to us by the Ministry for Foreign Affairs, but who do not fall in with Classes (1) or (2).

2. As regards Class (1), I would suggest that in this Headquarters it must be for the Political Section to make themselves responsible for advising AFHQ who should go and who should not go. As to that, G-5, AFHQ have told us that they will only wish to be consulted about appointments to Heads of Foreign Missions, i.e. Ambassadors or Ministers, for the rest they will rely upon us to submit the cases to AFHQ through you for an M.T.A. My understanding with Major Wilson had been that for this purpose it would be sufficient for us to fill in briefly points 8 and 9 of the questionnaire which has to be answered in order to obtain an M.T.A. From my conversation with you I understand that "briefly" needs some definition and in order to save all our time, I suggest that the concrete cases now before you and any future ones should be explained orally if the details given by this Section are not sufficient. Would you agree?

(i.e. urgency and recommendation)

3. As regards Class (2), the cases are very rare and I would suggest once again that if the written explanation at points 8 and 9 of the questionnaire (i.e. as regards urgency of the voyage and the recommendation) are not sufficient that you should obtain the further details that you require from this Section by word of mouth. Do you agree?

4. As regards Class (3), we will transmit these to you with a note in each case to say that we do not wish to be responsible in any way for the application which should be considered by you on its merits in accordance with your usual procedure. Do you agree?

5. I am going up to the Siena Meeting on Wednesday but should be back at this HQ first this Thursday morning. Could you have consulted Colonel Young by then and be able to let me know the views of your Sub-Commission.



Born at The Hague on 2 February 1919. Left in 1920 for the Netherlands Indies, where his father was a high colonial functionary.

In 1922 his parents were divorced and he went with his mother, Mrs. E.M.Schutte, to Europe, where he lived successively in Berlin, Vienna, Merano, Zurich, Constance and Venise.

From 1936 to 1939 he frequented the Commercial School in Florence and in 1939 he studied at the University in Perugia. In 1940 van der Elst stayed in Rome and Merano and from 1941 to 1944 he lived with his mother in Rome, where he had a job with the firm Eugenio Cinguino, via XX Settembre 89 in Rome.

From 19 to 30 June van der Elst was driver and interpreter with the Head Quarters of the Allied Control Commission in Rome.

He asked to be incorporated in the Netherlands Armed Forces in the United Kingdom.



SUBJECT: Travel Control

TO : HQ Allied Control Commission

Reference is made to our MSG 300.4-4 of 18 January and 29 February.

1. A report has been received that on occasion the Italian air service has despatched an aircraft to Tripoli, and that passengers carried in such aircraft have not been required to obtain MTAs (Military Travel Authorizations) to cover their journeys. Whilst it is appreciated that the operation of this service, and of the Italian internal air lines, is supervised by the Air Forces Sub-Commission, nevertheless the Security authorities are insistent that there should be complete control of all travel to and from Italy under the terms of the directives quoted above.

2. It is requested, therefore, that you will ensure the close observance of the regulations for travel control and their application to all Italian air services leaving Italy, Sicily, or Sardinia.

SUBJECT : Military Travel Authorizations.

TO : Regional Commissioners, Regions I, II, III, V, Mand VD, and SCAO's 5th and 8th Armies.

1 Civilians (of whatever nationality) wishing to leave Italian territory (including Sicily and Sardinia) must obtain from the nearest Provincial Commissioner or Senior Civil Affairs Officer, or such other officers as the Regional Commissioner or SCAO may designate, an application form for a Military Travel Authorization, and must fill in the form under the supervision of the officer.

2 The application form will be completed in triplicate and will be typewritten (or written in block letters where no typewriter is available). For travel to North Africa the application form will be completed in quadruplicate.

3 The applicant must furnish (where photographic facilities exist) two full face and two profile photographs of passport size which will be affixed in the spaces provided on two of the application forms. In the case of travel to North Africa (where photographic facilities exist) an extra copy of each photograph will be attached. Where the applicants cannot provide photographs, right thumb prints will be separately made on the application forms in the presence of the officer dealing with the application.

4 (a) The officers mentioned in para 1 above will, satisfy themselves as to the identity of the applicant and as to the reasons for his or her proposed journey, and will note on the first few lines of the "Remarks" section of the application form any information available locally concerning the applicant, and any comments of their own.

(b) Consult with the local (British) Field Security Section, or (American) Counter-Intelligence Corps detachment on each application.

(c) Fill in the items "Counter signature of Civil Affairs Officer and office stamp" (amending title as may be necessary) and "Region and Province", but will leave the remaining spaces blank.

(d) Have noted on the form any observations made by the Field Security Section or Counter-Intelligence Corps.

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- 3 The applicant must furnish (where photographic facilities exist) two full face and two profile photographs of passport size which will be affixed in the spaces provided on two of the application forms. In the case of travel to North Africa (where photographic facilities exist) an extra copy of each photograph will be attached. Where the applicants cannot provide photographs, right thumb prints will be separately made on the application forms in the presence of the officer dealing with the application.
- 4 The officers mentioned in para 1 above will,
  - (a) satisfy themselves as to the identity of the applicant and as to the reasons for his or her proposed journey, and will note on the first few lines of the "Remarks" section of the application form any information available locally concerning the applicant, and any comments of their own.
  - (b) Consult with the local (British) Field Security Section, or (American) Counter-Intelligence Corps detachment on each application.
  - (c) Fill in the items "Counter signature of Civil Affairs Officer and office stamp" (amending title as may be necessary) and "Region and Province", but will leave the remaining spaces blank.
  - (d) Have noted on the form any observations made by the Field Security Section or Counter-Intelligence Corps.
- 5 The appropriate number of copies of the form will be forwarded through channels to the Public Safety Sub Commission, Rear Hq, ACC, for collation and onward transmission.
- 6 Italian Government officials and Italian military personnel will obtain application forms (through the Italian Foreign Ministry and the Italian Supreme Command respectively) from the Public Safety Sub Commission, as above, and such application will be dealt with solely by this Headquarters.

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7 Upon receipt of notification from the deciding authority this Headquarters will forward to the appropriate Provincial Commissioner or SCAC, through channels, a copy of the form, together with a decision as to grant or refusal of the application, and in the former case the Military Travel Authorization will be attached for transmission to the applicant.

8 Officers dealing with applications will on no account communicate to persons whose applications have been refused, the grounds for such refusal; nor attempt to indicate (in view of the detailed research which will be necessary in many cases) the time which may elapse before applications are cleared.

9 It will be made known to intending travellers that the Military Travel Authorization is merely an authorization to leave Italian territory and, with the exception of North Africa, does not authorize their entry to the country of destination, whose visa requirements must be complied with.

10 In the case of travellers from Italian territory to North Africa a French entry visa is not required but (vide para 4) an additional form of application must be submitted.

11 In the case of travellers from Italian territory to the United States (other than U.S. nationals) and of travellers to British territory, including Gibraltar and Malta (other than British nationals) the officer dealing with an applicant will satisfy himself that the applicant holds a passport bearing an entry visa for the United States or British territory, as the case may be, and will note this fact in the remarks section. If necessary, applications should be delayed until the necessary entry visa has been obtained.

12 Applications will not be forwarded in any case in which an entry visa has been refused, whatever may be the country of destination.

13 Military Travel Authorizations are not required for children under the age of sixteen (16) except when travelling unaccompanied. Separate applications must be submitted for wives and for each child over the age of sixteen (16).

14 Except in the case of refugees, journeys will not be authorized except where they benefit the war effort.

15 The following instructions regarding travel control will not apply to British and United States Government officials at the present time, and are intended primarily to cover residents in liberated Italy (including Sicily and Sardinia), or refugees who may wish to leave the country. The regulations will apply to *refugees* who may be given Military Travel

10 In the case of travellers from Italian territory to North Africa a French entry visa is not required but (vide para 4) an additional form of application must be submitted.

11 In the case of travellers from Italian territory to the United States (other than U.S. nationals) and of travellers to British territory, including Gibraltar and Malta (other than British nationals) the officer dealing with an applicant will satisfy himself that the applicant holds a passport bearing an entry visa for the United States or British territory, as the case may be, and will note this fact in the remarks section. If necessary, applications should be delayed until the necessary entry visa has been obtained.

12 Applications will not be forwarded in any case in which an entry visa has been refused, whatever may be the country of destination.

13 Military Travel Authorizations are not required for children under the age of sixteen (16) except when travelling unaccompanied. Separate applications must be submitted for wives and for each child over the age of sixteen (16).

14 Except in the case of refugees, Journeys will not be authorised except where they <sup>are for</sup> benefit the war effort.

15 The following instructions regarding travel control will not apply to British and United States Government officials at the present time, and are intended primarily to cover residents in liberated Italy (including Sicily and Sardinia), or refugees who may wish to leave the country. The regulations will apply to Italian Government officials, who may be Given Military Travel Authorizations for an appropriate number of journeys, and also to Italian Service personnel who intend to travel individually and not in a formed body.

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- 16 Inter-Allied Laissez- Passer and Allied Force Permits do not come within the scope of these instructions, but persons already in possession of these documents for Italy or Sicily not endorsed "Single Journey only" do not require a Military Travel Authorization. 2/
- 17 Copies of the application form referred to will be forwarded under separate cover.
