1. Further reference ACC/202 dated 31 May 44.
2. The particular marriage referred to was that of two Americans following the issuance of a purported marriage license by an officer of AMC. This purported license refers to Circular No. 21 HQ 5th Army which has now been examined.
3. In the first place under Italian law no marriage license is required in Italy. This conclusion is correctly stated specifically in Sec. IV, 3 a of such Circular.
4. The general requirements for the performance of marriages involving military personnel in Italy is set forth in full at Sec. IV of such Circular. However, paragraph 4 Sec. IV is quite misleading. It reads as follows:
"Where any marriage is performed by an Army Chaplain there will be compliance with the pertinent church and state law. Within five days after performing the ceremony the chaplain will file the following with the officer of the Civil State:

- a. A declaration of marriage signed by each of the parties and himself.
- b. A copy of the authorization for marriage from the Commanding General MATOTEA, for member of the military service.
- c. Necessary statements or papers to show eligibility for the marriage of any Italian National."

Under the Concordat no marriage by the clergy is valid unless it is performed by a Roman Catholic priest in accordance with the procedure laid down by Italian law (Law of 27 May 1929 No. 847). An American or British Roman Catholic chaplain would seem to comply with this requirement (but see 5 below).

5. At the present time this Subcommittee is working on a new decree law which the Italian Government proposes to promulgate which will modify the law insofar as marriage by chaplains attached to the Allied Forces of Allied person-

nel are concerned, in this and certain other aspects. The last agreed text is now before the Judge Advocate Generals (both American and British) at AFHQ for final consideration.

6. From the brief report contained in the newspaper clipping which you sent with your letter of 27 May 1944 and which is returned herewith, it is impossible to say whether or not the requirements for a legal marriage in Italy were complied with, inasmuch as the clipping deals in detail only with the purported marriage license, which as pointed out above was an unnecessary surplusage. To be validly performed a marriage in Italy must meet many requirements.

Zone Change Opposed—Proposals to change from zone 1 to zone 3 two large tracts at S. E. 52d and Stark street to provide a parking lot for a frozen food locker plant have been opposed by the city planning commission and a hearing will be held by the city council April 27. 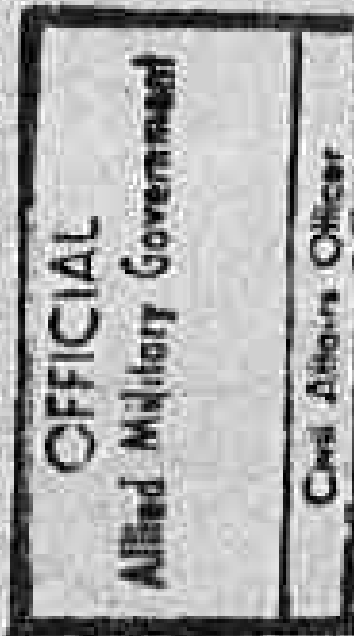

the Nettuno-Anzio beachhead. But it wasn't as simple as that. There was the matter of license, and there was no organized government, Italian or otherwise, on the beachhead at the time.

And that's where Maj. Donald E. Long, on leave as judge of the domestic relations court here, came into the picture.

"After some reflection," Maj. Long recently wrote his wife, "I issued one, the first known of its kind."

The jurist turned soldier then went on to describe the wedding to his wife.

Artillery Echoes Refrain

"It was a pretty wedding," he said. "A soldier sang 'I Love You Truly.' To be married in the midst of battle, within the sound of artillery, within the out tent, is something."

The wedding, he wrote, proves that "love is stronger and more enduring than war."

Maj. Long's improvised license bore the following heading:

"Marriage License, Nettuno-Anzio Beachhead, Italy."

The license then reads:

"Thomas G. Rose, 1st Lt., SC of the county of Fairfield, State of Ohio, and Genevieve V. Clarke, 2d Lt., A. N. C. of the county of Allegheny, State of Pennsylvania, both citizens of the United States of America, and members of the armed forces of the United States having complied with the provisions of circular No. 21, headquarters, 5th army, and having thereafter applied in writing, properly witnessed, for a license to marry, and there being no organized Italian government on this, the Nettuno-Anzio beachhead—

"Therefore, I, Donald E. Long, major, A. U. S., senior civil affairs officer attached to the 3d infantry division, do hereby authorize that the above named parties be united in marriage according to law."

Maj. Long then signed the license and the couple was married the night of March 27 in the blacked-out tent, as German artillery shells burst about them.

The erstwhile judge has been serving in the army since May 23, 1943.

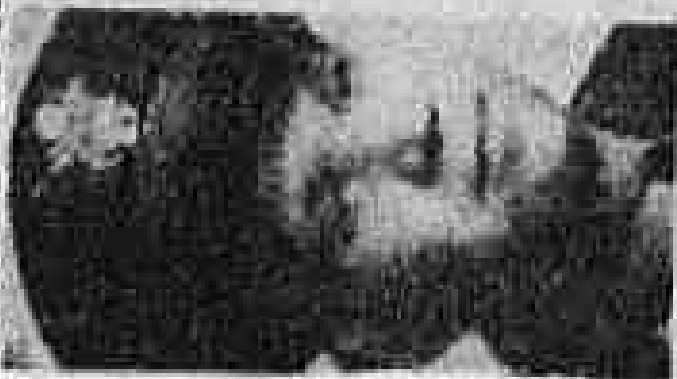

Portlander Gets Legion of Merit

Maj. George M. Baldwin, 2846 N. E. 33d avenue, has been awarded the legion of merit by General Douglas MacArthur for exceptional meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding service in New Guinea.



G. M. Baldwin said, "I found it necessary as the result of the activities of an enemy raiding force concentrated in his battalion area, to convert part of his troops to infantry to ward off repeated attacks. With clear-headed thinking and cool, deliberate organization, he established his defenses according to plans based on previous extensive personal reconnaissance of the area in anticipation of such an attack."

Leadership Lauded

"Although ill, he refused to be evacuated, and successfully directed his men in repulsing all attacks by the enemy. Meanwhile, his firing batteries continued to deliver all artillery fire called for. Maj. Baldwin's personal example was an inspiration to his command, and his splendid leadership was responsible for defeating all enemy attacks."

Maj. Baldwin of the army field artillery was with the 41st division in the Salamaua area in New Guinea. He was hospitalized somewhere in New Guinea, according to the last word received by his wife, Maurine, who with their small son, Greg, lives in Portland. Maj. Baldwin, a graduate of Oregon State college in 1933, was with the M. M. Baldwin Refrigerator company before the war.

A reserve officer, he was transferred to the national guard and in September, 1940, called into federal service with the guard. He has been overseas since April, 1942.

Third Division Veterans Back From Italian Front

Among first army infantrymen from the famous 3d division now fighting in Italy to return home on the army's new rotation furlough system are four from the northwest, three of whom have been awarded silver stars for gallantry in action. Two have been awarded the purple heart, one with oak leaf cluster.

The men are Sgt. Frank R. Hansen, son of Mrs. Mary Hansen, 9005 N. Clarendon street; Cpl. Denzil B. Conway, son of Mrs. Effie Conway, Klamath Falls; PFC Roy Johnson of Eagle Creek and formerly of Yakima, Wash., and Staff Sgt. John C. Mackey, Mount Shasta, Cal.

Sgt. Hansen, who is 38, is proud of the fact that he had never fallen out on a march, not even when the 3d division made a forced march of about 100 miles from Licata to Palermo, Sicily, in less than three days—this in spite of the fact that he was the oldest man in his infantry rifle company. He was a squad leader of his company.

Much Action Seen

Hansen was one of the first to get across the Volturno river during the fighting in Italy, and altogether has seen action in North Africa, Sicily and Italy.

His closest shave also came in Italy, when he was ordered to take his squad on patrol up a hill near Mount Casavola. Approaching a couple of innocent-looking haystacks in an area where no Germans had been reported, the men were startled when six Germans suddenly scrambled to their feet.

"They had been fast asleep," Hansen said, "and didn't wake

when the doughboys moved into Anzio, below Rome.

Staff Sgt. Mackey, 28, wears the silver star for gallantry in action when he led a patrol of 40 men of the 3d infantry division in operations in Sicily behind German and Italian lines and took 700 prisoners.

"We had a patrol of five jeeps, two light tanks and 40 riflemen. Our mission was to establish contact with the 1st infantry division toward Gela," he said. "In the lead jeep I maintained contact with headquarters by radio. Heavy fire and there were frequent delays. We had taken 700 prisoners when we finally drove around a sharp curve and found a heavy machine gun squad of the 1st division. They were mighty surprised to see us."

A veteran of campaigns in Africa, Sicily and Italy, Sgt. Mackey took part in five amphibious landings.

Cpl. Conway, whose mother, Mrs. Effie Conway, now lives with his sister, Mrs. Juanita Reed at 1435 Warden avenue, Klamath Falls, speaks with some authority on the subject of enemy shelling. For he wears the army's silver star award which he earned by aiding wounded comrades under heavy artillery fire in Sicily, and the purple heart as a result of wounds suffered from the same type of enemy fire in Italy.

Anzio Landing Recalled

A mortar squad leader with a unit of the 3d infantry, Cpl. Conway last saw action on the bitterly contested allied beachhead at Anzio. Telling of the action in Sicily when he won the silver star, he said, "I did just what any infantry soldier would be expected to do... I was at my observation post directing mortar fire when artillery shells cut our communications wire."

"I started back to splice the wire and I ran onto one of our machine gun sections that had been badly hit. I did what I could to help the men there, although the shells kept falling. Then I finally found medics to take care of them and went back to work on the wire. I had to splice wire three times that day under heavy artillery fire." Cpl. Conway was hit in the hand and leg by artillery fragments near Venafro, Italy. The same shell, he said, killed three of his comrades.

Holder of the silver star for gallantry in action and the purple heart and oak leaf cluster for being twice wounded, PFC Johnson was in the initial wave which landed at Pedara, North Africa, on November 8, 1942. He again was in the initial wave when American doughboys stormed ashore at Licata, Sicily. His unit saw 34 straight days of combat until the close of the Sicilian campaign.

Shortly after fighting opened on the Italian peninsula, his unit moved into action there and fought several weeks through to Cassino. He again was in a beachhead assault

10. In considering whether permission to marry should be given, COs and Commanders will bear in mind that the general policy is to dissuade members of the forces from marriage overseas. If both the parties are domiciled in the same country the advantages of waiting until they return home should be pointed out. Marriage with a person belonging to a different country particularly by young soldiers, is open to obvious risks of future unhappiness and it is important that every reasonable effort be made by COs (with the help if necessary of the Chaplain) to protect them from improvidence and impetuosity.

With this object in view, consent should be refused outright if the authority concerned is not satisfied that a reasonable basis exists, and in other cases a period of at least 60 days should be imposed between the date of the application and the date on which the marriage is authorized, unless there are circumstances making this delay undesirable or unnecessary.

GRO 162/44 lays down regulations for marriages between persons one of whom is a member of the UK military forces or a British national subject to military law.

Form B is the recommendation and consent of the Commander.

Form C is to be completed when the other party is not a British national.

There are two forms of marriages permitted one being by the appropriate authorities under local Italian law.

Dist. 3 first asked that we should notify all Italian priests who could solemnize a marriage that Form B must be completed before the marriage could take place.

We agreed to do this and notified Regions accordingly.

AAI Adm Ech., asked ten days later, made much more far reaching requests, viz:

- a) That we should check the antecedents of the civilian party.
- b) That we should make sure that there was no security objection to the marriage.
- c) We should check on the moral and social aspect.
- d) We should vet through Public Safety the Form C.
- e) We should notify priests of the requirements. - Form B.

Our first reaction was to consider this more than we could tackle except for the notification to priests and possible checking of Form C through Public Safety Divisions.

We said this, at the same time asking R.C.'s for their views.

AAI has asked that we reconsider, suggesting that the number of cases will be few.

1. I am directed to refer to AMHQ GRC NO: 162 of 1944 and to enquire whether it would be possible for assistance to be afforded by you in regard to the following matters.
2. In the case of an application for the marriage of a member of the UK military forces to an Italian woman it will be necessary to check the antecedents of the woman and to ensure that there is no objection from either a security or a moral and social point of view. This will be exceedingly difficult for a CO, or a Bde and Area Comd to do. Would it be practicable for the completed Form 'C', (vide app 'C' of the GRC) to be passed to your Public Security Branch, for enquiries to be made by them. The number of marriages should not be large, in view of the directions given in para 10 of the GRC.
3. With reference to para 7 of the GRC can steps be taken to bring to the notice of all local marriage authorities, whether clerical or civil, the fact that when applying for a marriage to be performed a member of the UK military forces must produce to them a completed Form 'B' (vide app 'A' to GRC) in addition to fulfilling all the requirements of the local law.
4. Any assistance which can be afforded in regard to the above matters will be much appreciated.
