Whether or not he falls into one of the dismissal categories is not quite clear, but should he do so I feel that everything possible should be done, through A.C.C. channels to save him from dismissal since he is an energetic, straightforward and extremely valuable official.

At this time, particularly, it would be nothing short of a disaster for the grain collection campaign in LUCANIA were he to be relieved of his appointment.

Prof. VIGGIANI was given the appointment of Ispettore Agrario Compartimentale (Regg/te) on 4th April 1944 by the then Minister of Agriculture Marchesi Lucifero. He was informed that the Minister confirming his appointment, would be published at an early date. Such confirmation has not yet been received.

It was while he held this post that he was ejected from the party and from all fascist appointments.

It is because he held the Fascist appointment of Podestà of the Capoluogo of POTENZA, that he may come within the dismissal category.

In his first interview with the Minister of Agriculture, this question was discussed and Viggiani was advised this was NOT a dismissal category except in the case of towns of over 50,000 inhabitants (population of Potenza is 27,000).

However, at an interview yesterday with the Under-Secretary of State for Agriculture, Prof. Bergami, at SALERNO, Viggiani learnt that the post he had held was now included among the dismissal categories.

Viggiani's impulse was to tender his immediate resignation rather than suffer the indignity of dismissal. He was advised however by the Under-Secretary to await events, and told that his case would if possible receive special consideration. Viggiani also discussed the matter with me this morning, when I advised him strongly NOT to resign.

It would be a great tragedy to lose Viggiani, since he is extremely capable and I have no hesitation in saying, it will be impossible to find another Compartimento Inspector of Agriculture of the same calibre. In any event a change at this time would be disastrous. This is especially true in view of the fact that the present Provincial Inspector, d'Amelio, is far from being satisfactory, and also, incidentally, has a fascist record. If he were to fall under the axe of defascistization I should be better contented.

I have no doubt that Provincial Commissioner MATTEA will endorse what I say.

I feel we should do everything in our power, through A.O.C. channels to keep Viggiani in office and if possible, to get his appointment officially confirmed immediately.

If we do not act at once, we may find it is too late.

May strong representations please be made to the Agricultural and Interior Sub-Commissions to this effect.

1. Quoted below is telegram just received from Region II.

"IMMEDIATE CONFIRMATION APPOINTMENT VIGGIANI COMPARTMENT INSPECTOR AGRICULTURE IUCANIA RECOMMENDED AND URGENT. UNCERTAINTY AND DISLOCATION OF PRESENT ORGANIZATION MOST UNDESIRABLE IN MIDDLE OF CRANIO DEL POPOLO DRIVE."

2. Regional Commissioner, Potenza, Provincial Commissioner, and this Sub-Commission urge that you do everything possible to confirm appointment of Viggiani. It is ~~our~~ understanding that Viggiani may be removed but must not be removed because of recent decree. Provincial Commissioner informs me that his membership in a former Fascist organization was in an area with a smaller population than the minimum established by the decree.

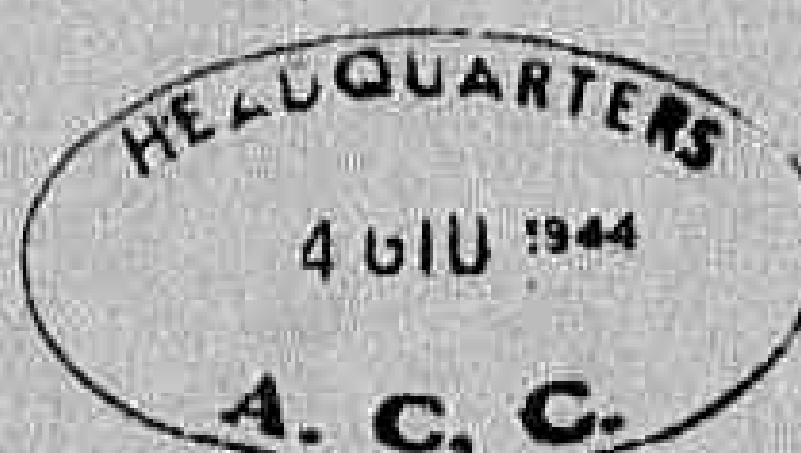

SUBJECT: Ex-Prefect of Bari, LI VOTI

TO : RC & MG Section

1. I interviewed the Minister in this matter personally. He informed me that he had definitely decided not to employ LI VOTI any more either in the capacity of Prefect or Vice-Prefect, and temporarily, at any rate, he would be retired to look after his olive trees.
2. I had informed him that LI VOTI would be (on the reports we had received of him) unacceptable in any such appointments. He accepted this without demur and in a fully co-operative spirit.
3. He did state, however, he might find it necessary in the future to approach me again and ask if LI VOTI could be re-employed in some junior administrative appointment, since they were in such short supply. I informed him that when such application was received, it would be given consideration.

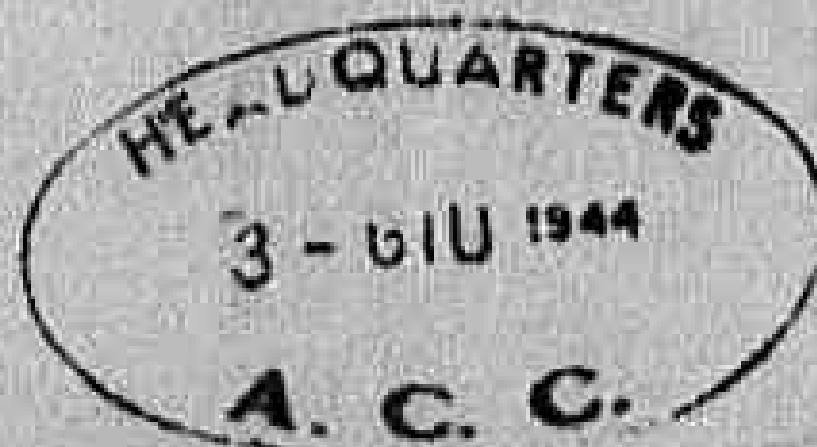

To : The Under-Secretary of State for PP.TT.

1. We are advised by the Legal Sub-Commission of A.C.C. that the purported promotion of Sig. Crapulli from Grade B to Grade A by the A.M.G. authorities in Matera is not valid.

2. The A.M.G. has the right to appoint officials to positions during the period of Allied Military Government, and for the tenure of his appointment he will receive the pay of the position. The A.C.C. reserves the right to require the retention of such officials after territory has been transferred to Italian Government administration. No change of appointment temporarily authorized by A.M.G. is however recognized as a permanent promotion.

3. In the case of Sig. Crapulli, he should receive the pay of the appointment of Provincial Director until he was superseded with our permission, but his permanent grade is not considered changed until promotion is authorized by the Italian Government.

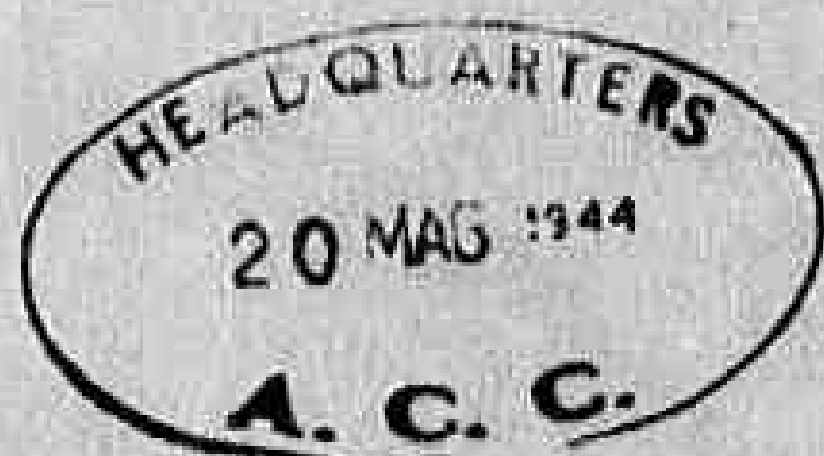

2. The fact of the matter is that Signor Crapulli is being harassed by two employees, DI DONNA and SCAMARCIO who represent the Federazione Italiana Sindacati Postelegrafonici. DI DONNA and SCAMARCIO are organizers who are having great difficulty in getting postal and telegraph employees in Matera to join their particular union.

Therefore, a certain P. STALLONE, the Secretary General of their union is using every possible method to injure the standing and reputation of Signor Crapulli, making outlandish and bizarre vilifications. I attach letter from STALLONE to P.W.B. Bari.

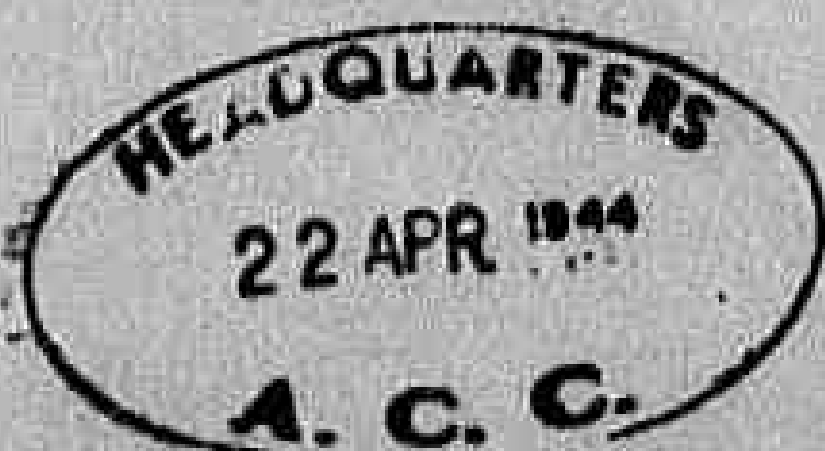

At the risk of being repetitious, I wish to emphasize again the importance of maintaining in office, officials who were appointed during the Military Government period. Such men took the risk of cooperating with the Allies, frequently, under our orders disregarding orders received from the Badoglio Government and carrying out ours. To have them replaced now by the Italian Government without any consultation with the men responsible for their appointment is ruinous to our prestige and influence with the Italian officials.

2. Herewith copy of our letter ACC/4083/1/L dated 27 Feb. 44.

3. No doubt you have received letter from Region II, 2201/55/A, dated 28 March 44. With reference to para 1 thereof this case was referred to this H. Q. by Region II for a decision as to the proper tribunal and with no hint that any particular decision would for local reasons be desirable. On the contrary Colonel Pollock of this Sub-Commission discussed the matter with the officers on the spot and on receiving his verbal report it was decided in pursuance of the usual policy that Italian Army Officers should normally be tried by their own tribunals, to hand the case over to the Public Safety Sub-Commission for transmission to CCRR. One factor that influenced this decision was the delay of over two months in handling the case by local AMG officers before referring the matter to HQ, A.C.C., coupled with the restoration of territory. It is not understood how handing the matter over to an Italian Tribunal can possibly be used as a ground for supposing that AMG were trying to hush the matter up, the reverse must inevitably be the case.

A. Following frequent rumors that Allied property was in the possession of Capt. Dominici CCR, Capt. Hobbs awaited opportunity to search his flat.

In December, removal of two tires and petrol from a military car under guard of the CCR, and suggestion they had been taken to D's flat, led LO CAPO to search flats of both the Major of CCR, and of Capt. D.

The Major did not demur, and nothing was found in his flat. While it was searched however, from it Capt D. tried to telephone his own flat, but was prevented.

B. In spite of D's denials of possessing any property open to objection, search of his flat revealed:

1. Large quantity of Italian Cloth.
2. Two rolls of CCR cloth.
3. Nineteen pairs of boots.
4. 8 pistols and ammunition (German and Italian)
5. Five shotguns (Italians)
6. One AMERICAN CARBINE (issue pattern)

Capt. D. prevaricated in general, and lied in particular, since much of the above was found subsequent to his assurance there was nothing more of the kind in his flat.

His explanation as to the cloth, was that it has been bought by him at various towns and periods covering two years.

As to the carbine, he stated it was a gift from a Lieut Simpson USA Forces. As to the arms, he stated those were part of the arms surrendered in compliance with the MG's Proclamation. He denied ownership of one of the cases containing some of the material, stating it belonged to another officer of the CCR.

C. Capt D was placed under house arrest on 23-12-43 the day of the search, and without prejudice to any AMG investigations, the CAPO agreed to a request by the Colonel of the CCR for a full inquiry by him. 1592

After frequent delays, the Col. presented the CAPO with a report, and with a statement by Capt. D. he had been instructed to inform Capt D that any such statement must be voluntary and need not be made. The principal contentions of the statement and report are:

1. Bills referring to purchases of approximately half the cloth were attached. But those are not specifically identifiable with the cloth in his possession. Some refer to more, and some to less than the quantity found. In the case of one premises are known to have been looted.

Part of the cloth resembles property known to have been looted, from a train while under guard of Capt. D's subordinates.

2. Officers of AMG en stated frequently to have taken shot guns surrendered to the CCR for use on shooting parties. Officers specified an Colonel Grant then CC RM subana Reggio, Major Benton Jones and Capt. Loman. On one occasion a Baron Franco is stated to have taken 10 shot guns on their behalf, and to have returned 9 this is corroborated by the Baron. The Baron is stated to have been retained up to date by Colonel Grant.

But the Baron denies those included those found in D's flat.

3. Nineteen pairs of CCRB cloth.

4. Eighteen pairs of boots.

5. 8 pistols and ammunition (German and Italian)

6. Five shotguns (Italians)

7. One AMERICAN CARBINE (issue pattern)

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But the Baron denies those included those found in D's flat.

D's explanation of his possession of the arms is in brief, that he kept them in his flat for greater security, since AMG officers might else have demanded them or his subordinates in his absence.

But labels showing ownership of the 5 shot guns had been rubbed off, and when in October, the owners requested their return as sanctioned by AMG policy. This he reported to them as late as January, but the register at the CCRB barracks shows him to have crossed off the entries as to those guns, as having been returned to their owners.

The officer in question was removed to Catanzaro where he has moved about freely, pending a hearing of his case by a board of CC.RR. officers at date unknown.

By what can only be considered as a ruse in the worst possible taste, Captain Dominici obtained entrance to a party given by the P.C., Catanzaro in the following way.

On the day before the dance the daughter of the Colonel of the CC.RR. rang up the P.C. and asked if she might have a ticket for a Captain of the CC.RR. The P.C. agreed, asked what his name was, and was informed that she would tell him the next day.

Next morning he rang her up and asked for the officer's name, which she then gave as Captain Dominici. While the name conveyed a meaning to the mind of the P.C. Catanzaro, the full facts of the case were not within his knowledge. He replied, however, that surely there were circumstances which made the request most surprising, and was it approved by her father. She replied in the affirmative.

Capt. Dominici appeared at the party, and it is notable that when offered drinks, he is stated to have said that while he could not drink with Allied Officers, he was glad to attend their reception.

3. If admittedly, the P.C. Catanzaro made an error of judgment in not cancelling the invitation when Capt. Dominici's name was dis-

1. The following letter from the Ministry of Education (Prot. 276, addressed to Provveditore, Lecce, and for information to Provveditore, Matera) has come to the attention of this office:

" " In relazione alla nota a margine distinta, si prega la S.V. di comunicare al Preside Prof. Minervini Nicola che questo Ministero pur tenendo presente il suo esposto del 7 Febbraio, conferma il trasferimento per servizio del R.Liceo Ginnasio di Gallipoli alla Presidenza del R.Liceo Ginnasio di Matera.

Si gradirà conoscere, da parte dell'Ufficio cui la presente è diretta per conoscenza, sotto quale data il Prof. Minervini ha assunto l'Ufficio cui era stato destinato con ministeriale n° 24/O.CL. del 14 dicembre s.a.

2. For your information, an attempt was made to transfer Preside Minervini to Matera in Dec. last (copy of relevant letter is attached.) In view of the fact that Region II was then still A.M.G., and that no information of the matter whatever had been sent to this H.Q., the R.C.A.O., Lt. Col. MacCaffrey, wrote on 22 dec to Liaison Officer, A.M.M., Brindisi, (Subject: Attempted Usurpation of the Power of AMG, Region II) pointing out very explicitly the incorrectness of the procedure, and stating that he had taken action to render the order ineffective.
3. Since Region II is now A.C.C., procedure has, of course, changed. The following important facts, however, remain to be taken into account:
4. Although Sig. Cuomo states that Preside Minervini is being transferred "per servizio" it is understood that the actual reason is political. Minervini was a Squadrista, "Marcia su Roma", and "Sciarpia littorio" and was reported on to that effect by the Carabinieri at Lecce. It is also stated that "il provvedimento è stato de-

P.T.O.

terminato dalla necessità di evitare che il preside Minervini potesse offrire, con la sua permanenza in detta sede, motivo a manifestazioni ostili.

5. In view of all this, it is considered remarkable that the Minister is again pressing for the transfer. Minervini is one of the two Educational Officials in Lecce in whose respect it was considered essential by the Italian authorities to take immediate action to remove him from his post even before the "Defascistizzazione" provisions were put into execution. He appears to be an apriori case for dismissal.
6. It is considered highly undesirable that a man with this record should come to an important Educational post in Matera, where personnel with no more against them than he has have already been dismissed. His arrival here would certainly cause trouble.
7. The Provveditore at Matera has been strongly advised to keep Minervini out of the post while the matter is being dealt with. Minervini has not yet arrived here.
8. Action by you in this matter will be appreciated.
9. As a subsidiary point of principle, may I suggest that transfers for political reasons from one Province to another are in any case undesirable. Where a man's record is bad enough for a Province to wish to get rid of him altogether it is very questionable whether another Province should be required to take him. In only two cases (Bellizzi of Potenza, and the Provveditore of Salerno) has this office lent itself to such a recommendation, and that with misgiving. It is suggested that the whole principle is worth reconsidering.

Potenza Province

Forty important governmental officials were removed from office as shown on the attached list. In addition two officials of the Unione Provinciale dell'Agricoltura and one official of the Official of the Unione Provinciale dell'Industria were interned.

Cosenza Province

The Prefect and the Questura fled. 390 public officials were removed from office in Cosenza city and 1297 additional officials were removed from office in the rest of the province - 1012 were employed in the communal administration, 285 by the Associazione Nazionale Enti Economici Agricoli and the bulk of the balance worked in the provincial administration. The abolition of the Fascist party displaced 397 public officials in this province automatically, 460 of whom were from the city of Cosenza. The province has 152 communes with a total population of 587,125. The largest city is Cosenza with a population of 40,032.

Reggio Province

In this province 46 public officials fled, 180 were removed from office by AMG and 83 automatically were displaced because of the abolition of the Fascist organizations to which they were attached. In sixty-eight of the eighty-nine communes both the Podesta and the Political Secretary were removed. In four communes the Commissari who was acting as Podesta and also the Political Secretary were removed. Of the officials that fled, 34 were connected with the postal service, ten belonging to the Aff. Prov. dell'Economia, one was in the Espito dell'Avverrot dell'Avello and another in the Ufficio case Economiche. Of those employees removed, other than the ones above-mentioned, 104 were employed by the Incorporated Farrone Stato, two from the Anti Edilizio and one from the Questorie.

1. The efficient Prefect found at Matera upon the arrival of AMG was transferred to Lecce upon the request of the Badoglio government with the approval of Maj. Gen. Lord Rennell, during October. After several weeks trial the Vice-prefect, Signore Giovanni Moscato, was found to be inefficient, was removed and returned to the territory under control of the king. It is reported that he has since been appointed an Undersecretary in the Badoglio government.

2. Upon the recommendation of the provincial S.C.A.O., Dr. Guido Tamburro, then Chief of the Provincial Cabinet and Commissioner of the city of Matera, was appointed Prefect, subject to final approval by higher AMG authority. Dr. Tamburro is a career official with a family dependent upon his earnings. He has informed the Provincial S.C.A.O. that officials of the Badoglio government, in conversation and correspondence, have intimated to him that he was jeopardizing his career by occupying the position of Prefect and discharging its duties efficiently and in accordance with AMG instructions.

3. I am enclosing a copy of a letter received by him recently. The tone of this letter is certainly threatening and objectionable.

4. Certainly we cannot expect loyal cooperation from Italian officials appointed by us if they are laboring under the constant threat that when control passes from AMG they will be punished for having obeyed our orders.

5. Information is requested as to whether there is any basis for the statement in the next to the last paragraph to the effect that Dr. Tamburro must explain why he holds office without having asked for or received the prior consent of the government; if so, what are the exact facts and limitations upon AMG authorities to appoint officials?

6. If there is no basis for Signore Reale's statements, it is respectfully requested that strong representations be made to stop any such undermining of our authority and to obtain guarantees that the all too few Italian officials who have carried out our orders with

From the letter read from you dated 9 Nov it is noted that you sign in the capacity of Prefect of the Realm. I am compelled to remind you that your actual legal status does not permit you to use any title other than "First Secretary". It is known that when in sudden and exceptional circumstances one assumes functions of high rank, this situation must also apply to official acts deputed to a functionary and signed "Per".

This elementary judicial principle must also be a necessity in every functionary, for the sake of correctness and discipline. The case under review has nothing to do with any Authority outside your administration.

Also, you must explain, in due course, why you held office without having asked for or received the prior consent (preventive assent) of the Government, which behaviour shows an ill-informed and incorrect desire to follow a career and in any case is alien to that sound balance essential in every functionary.

SUBJECT: Prefect of Matera.

TO : Administrative Director.

1. This is a matter of first importance and delicacy which may require high level policy and action.

2. In the first place, however, petulant, threatening and objectionable as Signor Reale's letter is to Prefect Tamburro it must be pointed out that Prefect Tamburro should not sign himself Prefetto del Regno as he apparently did but simply as Prefect. This is the practice followed in Region I.

3. Signor Reale has, in my opinion, acted improperly in regard to the following:

A. Addressing Prefect Tamburro as 1^o Segretario in view of his approved appointment by A.M.G.

B. In writing at all to the Prefect.

4. SGAO. Region I puts the position with clarity, and I would only add to it by stating it is already well known to this Sub-Commission that considerable jealousy exists between the career and the non-career officials.

5. There is no provision as indicated in Signor Reale's letter (closing paragraph) and Signor Reale should be called upon to explain what he means by this.

6. I regard, in serious degree, the letter and attitude of Signor Reale, and it seems to me questionable whether in view of it, he should continue to hold office. 1365

7. I also draw your attention to the second paragraph of the letter of the SGAO. Matters in regard to Signor Moscato and Signor Vitto. These officials should be screened at an early date, a further report submitted, and if the SGAO is correct in his statements and appreciation, these officials should be removed from office.

8. To summarize - I recommend that:

A. All Prefects in Region be instructed to sign themselves as Il Prefetto.

He has been very energetic, keen to cooperate with the ACC officials, but alarmed at the prospect of the turnover to the Badoglio Government, owing to his bitter experiences under the Fascist regime when he was a Socialist Deputy. He is greatly devoted to free speech and free press, but has cooperated in persuading editors to modify the extreme tone of some newspapers. He assisted in clearing up the aftermath of two demonstrations, and in the opinion of the Provincial Commissioner, demonstrated that as Prefect he could take a vigorous course of action against disturbers of the peace.

3. His personal relations with the Provincial Commissioner have been frank and easy. He is also reported to have shown firmness to those who thought the first Socialist Prefect in the province would not refuse any request from old associates and sympathizers.
