SUBJECT: Promotion of AVV. Francesco Selvaggi, Prefect of Naples Province to Prefect First Class (Grade 3).

TO : Regional Commissioner, Southern Region, A.C.C.

1. We refer to the letter <sup>103</sup> of 26 Aug. 44. Ref: L-2078/10 from the Regional Commissioner, Region III.
2. In consultation with the Administrative Section it has been decided:
  - a) that the Administrative Order No. 15 of the Regional Commissioner, Region 3 is now considered revoked under the terms of that order since the date when the territory formerly in Region 3 was returned to the Italian Government;
  - b) that the Italian Government may now decide what grade AVV. Selvaggi shall hold.
  - c) that from the point of view of A.C.C. this case is closed.
3. The Italian Government has been informed accordingly by the Administrative Section.

MEMORANDUM: to Lt. Colonel Shipp.

1. The reply of Col. Chapman (26 Aug. 44. Ref: L/2078/10) is his answer to the letter (Ref: 353/24/CA) which we wrote on 18 Aug. 44. ~~for~~ the Executive Commissioner by his direction (folio 93 this file).
2. Col Chapman refers in his letter to Executive Memorandum No. 12 as printed in "Instructions for Guidance of the Officers of the Commission", and to A.C.C. Directive 348/22/CA of 16 June 44. It is supposed that Col. Chapman was referring to Executive Memorandum No. 62 of 16 June 44.
3. An examination of these documents would seem to indicate that there may be some justification for Col. Chapman's contention that his advancement of Avv. Selvaggi was not for a fixed term (see para 4 Ex. Memo. 62, 16 June 44) but strictly limited in Admin. Order No. 15, Region IV of 14 July.
4. Moreover, Col. Chapman says that his action was taken "to redeem a <sup>promise</sup> ~~position~~ given by my predecessors", and that Avv. Selvaggi would have been unable to collect his salary without this action.
5. On the other hand, para. 1 of Ex. Memo. No. 62 would appear to deny Col. Chapman the right to change the grade.
6. Our letter to Col. Chapman, in accordance with the wishes of the Ex. Commissioner, was primarily to find out the reasons for the action of the Regional Commissioner, before any instructions might be issued to him.
7. Capt. Temple of Interior Sub-Commission with whom I discussed the reply of Col. Chapman, was not satisfied either with Col. Chapman's answer or our enquiry. Capt. Temple felt that our letter "was not strong enough"; that Interior should have prepared the letter to Col. Chapman
8. Capt. Temple said that instead of an advance in grade, a protest about Avv. Selvaggi's inadequate salary should have been given to the Italian Government. **1581**
9. It seems to me that Col. Chapman acted in good faith and in accordance with a possible interpretation of Ex. Memo. No. 62.
10. The whole matter was ~~initiated~~ <sup>limited</sup> by the temporary ~~change~~ of his Admin. Memorandum and has been cancelled by the very provisions of that Memorandum when the territory was handed over to the Italian Government.
11. Would it not be a good thing if the Exco. Commissioner reviewed the whole case with the Admin. Section to decide whether anything further need be done.

1. Reference is to your letter 353/94/CA of 18 August 44.
2. When Avv. Selvaggi was appointed Prefect of NAPLES by my predecessor he was not vested with the emoluments due to him as Prefect. Further he was not able to draw the salary appertaining to his former position of cancelliere because he was not carrying out the duties of that office. To remedy this position and to redeem a promise given by my predecessors were the reasons for making Administrative Order No.15. It did not effect a promotion.
3. It is not appreciated why the proposal to promote Avv. Selvaggi should have been submitted to ACC. Neither Executive Memorandum No. 12 (as printed in "Instructions for Guidance of the Officers of the Commission") nor Executive Memorandum No.70 suggests that the approval of ACC is necessary to the promotion of a Prefect. The latter Memorandum has no application to the appointment of Avv. Selvaggi which was made on 13 April 44.
4. ACC directive 348/22/CA, dated 16 June 44, implies that officers have power to make temporary promotions not binding on the Italian Government. The temporary nature of Avv. Selvaggi's promotion was made abundantly clear in Sec.2 of Art.II of the Administrative Order, No.15.

Dear Klibansky,

"...I did not know the Folignos well, but the daughter was at School with my daughter. There was a Debating Club there which parents occasionally used to attend, and I myself heard the girl make rather impassioned pro-Fascist and anti-British speeches there. She spoke rather well. It was perfectly obvious that the speeches were really the product of a maturer mind than her own, and though I should think it probable that they derived from her parents, I have no proof that they did not come from other sources, such as relations in Italy.

When Italy joined in the war Foligno showed no signs of distress at his country becoming an enemy of England's and at once took steps to get himself repatriated.

May I submit the following piece of information to you in case you care to forward it to the Security authorities in Naples.

In the course of a private letter, addressed to a member of this Section, Miss M.V. Taylor, editress of the "Journal of Roman Studies" and Librarian of the Haverfield Library, Oxford, (a person known to be of good judgment and reliable), wrote the following:-

"...I wonder how far the War Office has put on its guard officers at Naples against Professor Foligno, who was Professor of Italian here, was allowed to return to Italy in 1940, and given a job at Naples University by Mussolini which he still holds. He was an active Fascist here and is very clever, and I wouldn't trust him an inch. He would be regarded as coming from Oxford, and therefore alright; but is he? His wife is English and teaching Italian to English officers, and his daughter is employed by Amgot. I don't suppose you can do anything; but you may be able to drop a hint somewhere."

I have known Professor Foligno at Oxford, and can confirm that he certainly was an active propagandist of Fascism. His English wife was as ardently Fascist and pro-Italian as himself.

1. I enclose a copy of the Minister of Interior's letter no. 2234 dated 1 August to Interior Sub-Commission, together with copy of the Order of RC, Region III, therein mentioned. Copies of English translation of both documents are also annexed.
2. You will observe that the Order purports to promote Avv. SELVAGGI to Grade III in the Italian Civil Service. This is not only contrary to international law and ultra vires the Allied Control Commission: it is contrary to the understanding in such matters between the Italian Government and the Commission, and to Executive Memorandum No. 12 (Revised edition of 12th June 1944).
3. The Order places this Section and particularly the Interior Sub-Commission (which negotiated with the Italian Government the agreement as to the use of the title "Prefetto Reggente") in an embarrassing position and gives the Italian Government just cause for complaint against the Allied Control Commission.
4. You will observe from Sections 1(b) of the Order that it is to cease to have effect when the Province of Naples ceases wholly or in part to be under Allied Military Government. As the major part of the Province was transferred to the Italian Government's control on 30th July, the Order ceased to have effect on that date. I should nevertheless have been prepared to recommend that the Order ought to be rescinded, in order to clear the Commission with the Italian Government. To do so, however, would raise difficult questions of law as to the power of the Commission and its officers to make even rescinding Orders after the transfer of territory on 30th July.
5. I propose, with your concurrence, to inform the Italian Government that the Order is not legally effective and that the Commission will treat it as never having been made. I also propose - and again with your concurrence - to cause an enquiry to be made of the Regional Commissioner as to his reasons for issuing such an Order.

HEREBY ORDER

Article I.

Salary, etc. of the Prefect

Avv. Francesco Selvaggi, Prefect of the Province of Naples, is by the present decree, recognized as having the qualification and grade of Prefect first class (grade III) and he shall be paid the salary and receive all the financial compensation which are due to his position and grade.

Article II.

Date this order shall become effective.

Section 1. This order must be considered as having become effective on and from the 13th. April 1944.

Section 2. The present order will cease to have effect in the following cases:

- a) if avv. Francesco Selvaggi submit his resignation or is removed from the office of Prefect of the Province of Naples, or
- b) if the Province of Naples ceases wholly or in part to be controlled by the Allied Military Government,

whichever of these two cases may happen to come first.

Avellino.

TO : R.C. & M.G. Section  
Headquarters Allied Control Commission.

1. On the transfer of Commendatore Giovanni Battista Zanframundo, Prefect of the Province of Avellino, to Frosinone, it was decided to ask Commendatore Raffaele Intonti to act as Prefect until other arrangements could be made.

2. Commendatore Intonti, who was at the time President of the Provincial Council, agreed, under pressure, to act as Prefect; indicating at the same time that he had only just retired after 30 years of Magisterial work, and that he wished as soon as possible to be released in order to enjoy the leisure to which he felt himself entitled.

3. The matter is not considered one of urgency, but it is requested that the Italian Government may be approached in order to find a suitable official to fill the post of Prefect of Avellino, in due course.

1. As directed, investigations have been made concerning the bona fides of the above named from a Security point of view, the following result :-

2. Foligno, who was born in Milan on 15th May, 1878 was from 1909 to 1940 Professor of Italian at Oxford University, and upon his return to Italy became the Professor of English literature at Naples University.

3. He joined the Fascist Party in 1932, but has held no office in the Party. Whilst in England he is said to have supported and been a propagandist of the Fascist party, and to have used his influence to prevent non Fascist Italians from gaining University positions. At the entry of Italy into this War, Foligno was interned, but subsequently returned to Italy with the Embassy staff.

4. Enquiries have been made of four of his former pupils who are now with the British Army in Italy, and with one exception, they refer to him as a good man who can be trusted not to indulge in anti-British propaganda or acts against the Allies. The other states that Foligno was a Fascist and supported the Fascist party. 15.49

5. Enquiries have also been made of a well known anti Fascist, Professor Omodeo, the present Minister of Education, and in addition the President of the Epuration Commission in Italy. He states that Foligno was said to have been a Fascist in England, and upon his return to Italy said that England was going to lose the War. Professor referred to this as a realistic view, judged from the subject's impression of events in England before his departure, and not so much a result of political wishful thinking. His thirty years in England had given him much of the British "self depreciation" manner, and he adversely criticised the English social set up, and other things, much in the same

CONFIDENTIAL

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manner as Swift, Byron and G.B. Shaw. Professor Omodeo did not regard this as of special importance, nor did he regard him as likely to be dangerous from an Allied point of view. He added that Foligno did not feel too much at home in Italy after his long stay in England, and said that he had no knowledge of any anti-British acts or propaganda on the part of the Subject.

6. When interviewed by Lieutenant Fehr of this Branch, Foligno freely admitted that he had joined the Fascist party and concurred with their sentiments. As he was, and had been for some time, living in England, he only had a theoretical knowledge of the doctrine, and he was convinced, as an Italian, that it was the right thing for Italy. When sanctions were imposed on Italy as a result of the Abyssinian campaign, he says that he felt it very strongly, and as an Italian he adopted the Italian view point. He denied that he ever expressed any political views in class, and the only expression of opinion he did make was privately, which he felt anyone was entitled to do. Upon his return to Italy, when he saw how Fascism worked in practice, he realized that it was not the proper solution to Italy's troubles, as it was being badly administered.

7. The Questura records reveal nothing derogatory to Foligno from our point of view, in fact they have little information concerning him, and none of Fascist nature.

8. Foligno married in England a woman who was his landlady, and this has resulted in a certain amount of ostracism which both he and his wife felt very keenly. Their daughter was born in England, but has retained her Italian nationality. His wife states that she does not teach English to Allied officers, but does instruct some Italians in the English language. The daughter is employed in the Claims and Hirings Department of the office of the Town Major of Naples, and gives assistance at Courts Martial. She has discharged her duties very satisfactorily, and has given no cause for suspicion. Both these ladies are homesick for England, having left all their friends there.

9. At the age of 66, and being very deaf, with half of his life in England, I cannot regard Professor Foligno as a danger to Allied Security. He seems to have been under the theoretical spell of Fascism in its early days, and at the time of the sanctions, envisaged the return of Italy to its full former glory. The bubble having been completely exploded, I am convinced that this man would not endeavour to engineer its return. From a security point of view therefore, there seems no reason to remove him from his post.

10. Lt. Vella, of the Education Sub-Commission, has personal knowledge of the Professor and concurs in the opinion that he does not constitute a danger if he retains his chair at the Naples University.

May I submit the following piece of information to you in case you care to forward it to the Security authorities in Naples.

In the course of a private letter, addressed to a member of this Section, Miss M.V. Taylor, editress of the "Journal of Roman Studies" and Librarian of the Haverfield Library, Oxford, (a person known to be of good judgement and reliable), wrote the following:-

"... I wonder how far the War Office has put on its guard officers at Naples against Professor Foligno who was Professor of Italian here, was allowed to return to Italy in 1940, and given a job at Naples University by Mussolini which he still holds. He was an active Fascist here and is very clever, and I wouldn't trust him an inch. He would be regarded as coming from Oxford, and therefore all right; but is he? His wife is English and teaching Italian to English officers, and his daughter is employed by Amgot. I don't suppose you can do anything; but you may be able to drop a hint somewhere."

I have known Professor Foligno at Oxford, and can confirm that he certainly was an active propagandist of Fascism. His English wife was as ardently Fascist and pro-Italian as himself.



Se sotto questa parvente tranquillità di vita egli abbia svolto un'azione sotterranea, io non ho modo nè di affermarlo nè di escluderlo. Tuttavia la cosa più probabile è che, distaccato dall'ambiente inglese, egli a Napoli si sia trovato in un ambiente su cui non aveva presa.

Io non l'ho mai considerato pericoloso anche perchè gli Inglesi lo hanno tollerato in Inghilterra a guerra europea iniziata, dal settembre 1939 al giugno 1940.

May I submit the following piece of information to you in case you care to forward it to the Security authorities in Naples.

In the course of a private letter, addressed to a member of this Section, Miss M.V. Taylor, editress of the "Journal of Roman Studies" and Librarian of the Haverfield Library, Oxford, (a person known to be of good judgment and reliable), wrote the following:-

"... I wonder how far the War Office has put on its guard officers at Naples against Professor Foligno, who was Professor of Italian here, was allowed to return to Italy in 1940, and given a job at Naples University by Mussolini which he still holds. He was an active Fascist here and is very clever, and I wouldn't trust him an inch. He would be regarded as coming from Oxford, and therefore all right; but is he? His wife is English and teaching Italian to English officers, and his daughter is employed by Amgot. I don't suppose you can do anything; but you may be able to drop a hint somewhere."

I have known Professor Foligno at Oxford, and can confirm that he certainly was an active propagandist for Fascism. His English wife was as ardently Fascist **1330** pro-Italian as himself.



1. For weeks I have been examining into law enforcement in Naples Province and more particularly into the Questura. It is my firm belief that the Questura needs a house cleaning. A new Questore must be appointed.

2. For weeks I have been searching for the man. There is no official presently in the Questura who could be promoted. Moreover, any promotion would continue the present state of things, I believe. The boys have been working together for too long a time.

3. The Subcommittee on Public Safety may be able to find me a top notch career Questura official who has courage and honesty and who is not encrusted with Fascism. He will have to be found in a region other than Region 3. May be in Sicily there is one.

4. However, I am willing and ready to appoint a non-career Questura man as Questore. In fact, there are many advantages in having an outsider - I mean one from some other branch of the civil service. Consequently, I recommend Cav. Francesco De Scisciolo.

5. De Scisciolo was born on 22 August 1889 at Terlizzi (Province of Bari) and resides at Via Giacinto Gigante No. 7, Naples. He has been a Judge at the Naples Tribunale for the past ten years and he is at present President of the 7th Penal Section as Senior Magistrate. He automatically became a member of the Fascist Party in June 1941 as he was an combatant of the 1915-1918 campaign. Politically, he does not belong to any party, though it is generally known that he has leanings toward liberal ideas.

6. Reports generally indicate that he showed high moral integrity and personal courage in defiance of the Fascist Party, and more particularly in his profession. He is enthusiastically endorsed by all the anti fascist parties which have

recently joined the Badoglio Government. A bachelor, he is exceptionally honest, intelligent and active, and his career would have been far more successful had he adhered to Fascism. He is "persona grata" with the leaders of the political parties of Campania and it is believed that his appointment would be both welcome and opportune.

7. As an assistant to Judge De Scisciolo I would put in Judge Roberto Martinelli who used to be a vice commissario of the Napoli Questura. The CC. RR. report as follows on Martinelli:

"Roberto Martinelli, son of Giuseppe and of Elena Servelli, was born at Bari on October 30, 1908, and has lived in Naples since 1921. Very good moral, civil and political conduct. He has a Degree in Jurisprudence; was vice commissario of Pubblica Sicurezza in the local Questura; in 1938 he entered the office of the magistrates. He has been substitute District Attorney in the Potenza and Salerno Tribunali and since September 20, 1943, has been District Attorney in the penal court of Naples.

He is a cultured man, honest, correct; members of his family are magistrates. He is well thought of amongst his colleagues and by the general public.

It is said that he was a member of the ex-fascist party because of his position as vice commissario of the Questura. It does not appear that he has done any propaganda for the fascist party, nor has he held any political positions.

At present he does not manifest any political tendencies; he is very much in favor of the Allied Military Government.

His financial and social positions are good; his comportment in private life is dignified and correct. He is married to Gemma Pappone, 36 years of age; his resides in Via Tasso No. 203."

8. Your orders in this matter would be much appreciated.



3. The Minister has advised Badoglio on Aperlo.

I saw Marshal Badoglio yesterday in company with Brigadier General M. Taylor, A.C.G.

I told the Marshal that I had given further consideration to the suggestion made by me on my last visit to him that, in the interests of administration generally, he should earmark capable administrative and technical officials to take the place of Fascist officials removed by Civil Affairs officers in 15 Army Group area. I told him that one of the chief difficulties in these areas was to find capable men to take charge of communes and other administrative offices. It was also my desire and that of General Joyce, looking into the future, we should help with administration in general by safeguarding communities and by putting into office men who were acceptable to the Italian government, always having regard to the paramount importance of military operations.

The Marshal welcomed the suggestion, asked for a list of senior officials in the forward areas and promised that his Minister of the Interior would make available known and capable officials to be on call on demand.

2. I asked the Marshal to issue instructions that any official correspondence to Italian officials, including correspondence in the 15 Army Group area, should be sent through the A.C.G. H.Q. and not direct to the officials concerned. I quoted several instances which had occurred, which I said were obviously not deliberately mischievous, but were probably due to ignorance on the part of the senders. The Marshal promised to issue such directions.

3. I mentioned to the Marshal that General Basso, who appeared to be the Italian Military Commander in Naples area, was apt to intervene in civil affairs and had apparently set up a civil affairs office in his H.Q. This was quite unacceptable and I hoped that orders would be given for him to confine his activities to military matters. The Marshal explained that General Basso had been Military and Civil Governor of Bardonia before coming to Naples and in his new appointment found it difficult to cast off his civil responsibility. He would, however, be given instructions to cease activities in this connection.

4. The Marshal then said that he had asked General Joyce for approval to appoint one Montagna, an ex-ambassador, as High Commissioner in Naples to look after the political situation there and represent him. He explained that he would remove the present Prefect and appoint a capable Prefect from Lacirio area to serve under Montagna. He added that he knew Colonel Fume had found Montagna useful and he hoped the proposal would be acceptable. Brigadier General Taylor explained at once that the appointment, if acceptable, would have to be made by the Commander in Chief as Military Governor, and that there was great doubt as to whether the title of 'High Commissioner' would be acceptable. I said that it would not be acceptable and suggested that Montagna

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General Joyce before this meeting had asked me particularly to try and meet the Marshal on the appointment of Montagna.

5. I told the General after the meeting that I would try and obtain approval for the Marshal's visit to Naples and would find a solution for the Montagna appointment, but that it must be clearly understood that the appointment would have to be made by the Allied Military Government and Montagna could not be regarded as a representative of Badoglio but purely as an administrator.

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
