1. Reference your 354/24/CA dated 8 September 1944, we give below a resume of the Prefect's reply to this matter.

2. "I hereby report that, Vice Prefect Cirmani, questioned about the matter of the economic treatment to be reserved to the General Secretary of our Province Avv. Giovanni Lorenzo Imbriaco, suspended from his office, explained that, under art. 22 of the Decreto Luogotenenziale No. 159 of the 27 July 1944, Avv. Imbriaco is entitled to draw his net salary, excluding all other allowances. The reason for this is that in the meantime, the above Decree, establishing rules for the purging of the Administration, has come into force in this Province. I also bring to your notice that Vice Prefect Cirmani is not at present working at this Prefettura but at the Ministry of Interior, as he now takes orders direct from them."

1. Attached is forwarded copy of letter R/2372 dated 15 Sep 44, received from Regional Commissioner, Region IV, in regard to "COGENA".

2. It is understood here that the new system of receiving civilian bids for movement by schooner only through ACC and implementing them through the Committee of three, namely representatives of MEDBO, ACC and COGENA, has been set up for the purpose of preventing corruption.

3. In connection with the "Cogena" matter, recently certain specific allegations in regard to at least one COGENA Head Office official were handed to Mr. Bell, your representative here. We do not know what action was taken. In any event the official has not been relieved.

In view of the effect of this matter on the public, can we be informed whether an investigation has taken place and of the conclusions.

4. It is further requested that you please let us have your views as to the attitude this Commission should adopt in regard to the general allegations of bribery and corruption within COGENA which we have received from Regional Commissioner, Region IV, and other sources.

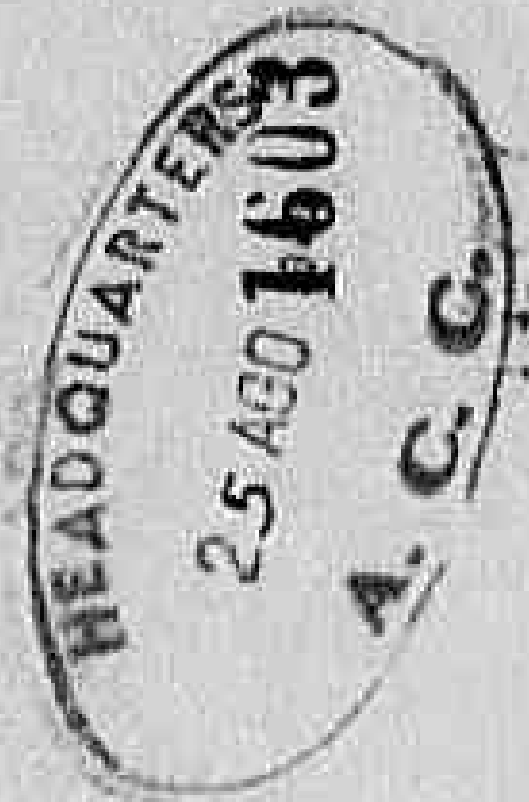

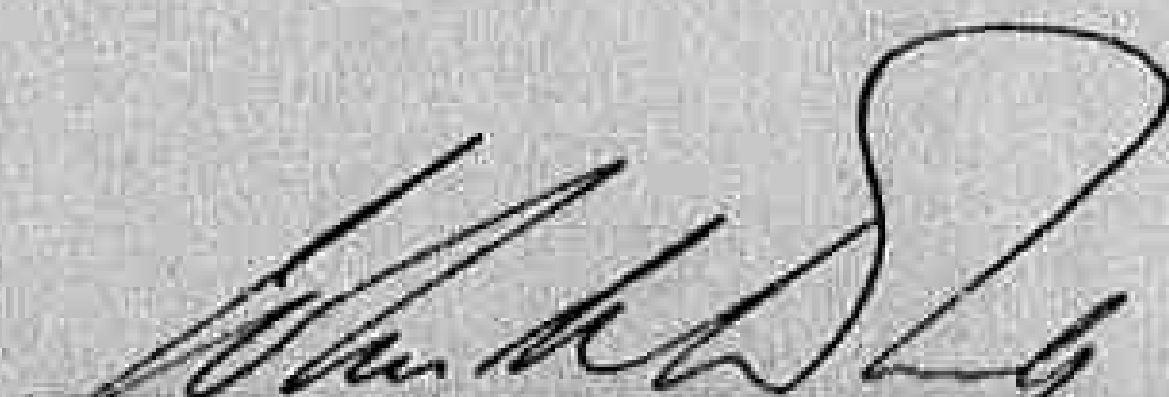

Vatican City, 23 July 1944MEMORANDUM

FLORIDI TULLIO, Mayor of Montecastrilli, in the Province of Terni, farm Administrator of His most Reverend Eminence the Cardinal NICOLA CANALI, President of the Pontifical Commission for the Vatican City State.

According to confidential information received yesterday by Cardinal Canali, Terni, is already on the list of persons to be arrested for political reasons by order of the Allied Central Command.

The only reason for such a serious measure is the position held by Floridi. For several years he presided over the commune of Montecastrilli, first as Podesta' and now as Mayor.

The Cardinal Canali, who for many years has had Floridi in his employ, is in position to declare and guarantee that Floridi has always kept himself out of politics, that in the administration of the rural commune of Montecastrilli, he has always limited himself solely to bureaucratic and administrative work avoiding any political affirmation whatsoever.

In addition, it is certified that Floridi is very honest, a proven gentleman and esteemed by everyone. He has shown a very rare disinterest in refusing to accept any reimbursement whatsoever for expenses, for transfer, etc. for the economic welfare of the commune.

Through his appointment as Podesta' of Montecastrilli, Floridi was under the Prefect of Terni, Dr. Antonucci, who, because of his opposition to the defunct regime, was deprived of his office as Prefect by the German Command. He was imprisoned for a long time in the prisons of Perugia and deported to Germany. Through a lucky circumstance, he managed to escape during the deportation trip.

No reason exists to proceed to Floridi's arrest. On the other hand, many serious reasons exist not only to prevent his arrest, but to keep him in office at least for some time.

The British Governor of Terni is said to have declared that he has received the order for the arrest from the Allied Central Command of Rome.

The Cardinal Canali takes the liberty to point out that the eventual arrest of Floridi would be also a rather offensive reflection towards the Canali family and

lives in the same country home. It is necessary to add that also the present Prefect-Regent of the Province of Terni knows Floridi very well and holds him in high esteem.

For all these reasons and for others which might be mentioned, the Cardinal Canali trusts in the high sense of the Allied Superior Authorities and requests warmly that the threatened arrest of Floridi be not effected.

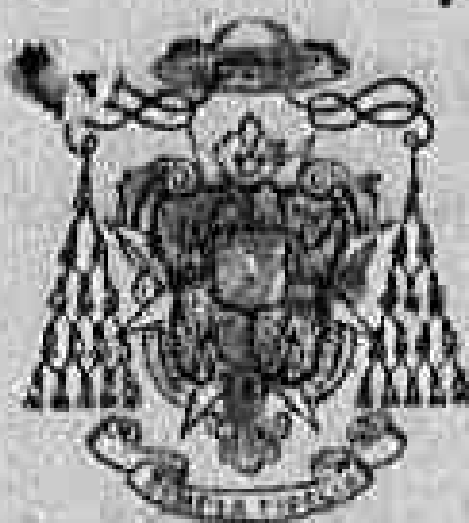

FLORIDI TULLIO, Sindaco di Montecastrilli, nella Provincia di TERNI, Amministratore di campagna di Sua Eminenza Rma il Cardinale NICOLA CANALI, Presidente della Pontificia Commissione per lo Stato della Città del Vaticano.

Secondo notizia riservata, pervenuta ieri al Cardinale Canali, il detto FLORIDI, attuale Sindaco di Montecastrilli, nella Provincia di Terni, è già compreso in un elenco di persone da arrestarsi per motivi politici, per ordine del Comando Centrale Alleato.

L'unico motivo di tale grave misura è la carica coperta dal Floridi, il quale da qualche anno regge il Comune di Montecastrilli, prima come Podestà, ora come Sindaco.

Il Cardinale Canali, che da moltissimi anni ha alle sue dipendenze il Floridi, è in grado di poter dichiarare e garantire che il Floridi è stato sempre completamente estraneo alla politica, che nel reggere il piccolo Comune di campagna di Montecastrilli, si è sempre ed esclusivamente limitato al solo lavoro burocratico ed amministrativo, eliminando sempre qualsiasi affermazione politica.

Inoltre si attesta che il Floridi è onestissimo, ed è un galantuomo provato e da tutti stimato, e ha dato prova di un disinteresse unico, arrivando perfino a rinunciare qualsiasi rimborso di spesa, di trasferta, ecc. per il bene economico del Comune.

Il FLORIDI, per la sua nomina a Podestà di Montecastrilli, è stato creatura del Prefetto di Terni, Dr. Antonucci, il quale, per la sua opposizione al cessato regime, fu dal Comando Germanico destituito dalla

sua carica di Prefetto, imprigionato per lungo tempo nelle carceri di Perugia e deportato in Germania: e per una felice circostanza gli fu possibile fuggire durante il viaggio di deportazione.

Nessuna ragione esiste per procedere all'arresto del Floridi, mentre tutte le ragioni le più serie esistono non soltanto per non arrestarlo, ma per lasciarlo in carica, almeno per qualche altro tempo.

Il Governatore Inglese di TERNI avrebbe dichiarato di avere ricevuto l'ordine di arresto dal Comando Centrale Alleato di Roma.

SUBJECT : Prefect of VITERBO

TO : RC & MG Section

1. It is understood that a new Prefect may be required for the Province of VITERBO almost at once.
2. The Minister of the Interior has suggested the following for this post:-

Avv. LOCCIA, Ivo
Via Pompee Magne 10A, Rome.

LOCCIA is stated to have taken part in the underground patriot movement and consequently to have been imprisoned by the Germans. He is now free and resident as above.

3. The next steps to be taken are:-
 - (a) to interview LOCCIA and ascertain that he is willing to accept the post. It is our experience that a little persuasion and appeal to the candidate's patriotism has to be employed in some cases;
 - (b) to "screen" him from the security point of view;
 - (c) to inform AMG 5th Army that LOCCIA is available when required;
 - (d) to send him forward when the SCAO calls for him.

4. As LOCCIA is in Rome, the steps can best be taken by the ACC authority on the spot. This would appear to be either RC Rome Sub-Region or Region IV Rear HQ which I understand was to be set up in Rome at the beginning of this week.

5. Could the appropriate ACC authority in Rome please be requested to act in this sense?

6. May this Sub-Commission please be kept informed of the position as to LOCCIA and more especially as to

- (a) whether he is willing to serve
- (b) the result of screening.

7. This letter is sent in duplicate with a view to facilitating transmission to Rome.

TO : R.C. Region IV

1. Reference letter R4/091.112 of 17 March 1944, attention is directed to Rules and Regulations pursuant to Art. III Title 2 of General Order No. 5 published 16 January 1944.
2. Rule 5 provides that the Civilian director of Provincial Labour Offices shall be appointed by the Prefect subject to the approval of the Provincial Commissioner who would be acting under the instructions of the Regional Commissioner.
3. The matter of the Foggia appointment is being taken up with Region V.
4. Regarding the standardisation of salaries the conditions and requirements vary so greatly and in the industrial areas will vary to a still greater extent, that it is not thought possible at this moment to attempt any such standardisation.
5. The remaining queries will be found to be covered by the Rules and Regulations mentioned in par. 1 above.

1. The General Order No 5, Title 2 Article III provides for the issue of Rules & Regulations relating to the creation of Regional & Provincial Labour Offices.

2. These Rules & Regulations published under date 16 Jan 44 provide in Rule 5 that the Civilian director of Provincial Offices shall be appointed by the Prefetto & approved by the S.C.A.O. Clerical etc staff is also provided for.

3. Appointments in FOGGIA are now the business of Region V but those referred to in para 2 of letter may have been made by Region IV. If the rule quoted in para 2 above was followed it seems strange that the Prefect should have appointed a subordinate at a higher salary than his own.

4. Regarding para 3 (i) the rule as already noted provides for the appointment & approval & consultation with the Italian Govt. is effected (under AMG conditions) by the choice of the Prefect.

Regarding 3(ii) approval by the I.C.A.O. (P.O.) acting under instructions of the R.O.M.O. (R.C.) should result in standardisation.

Regarding 3(iii) the presumption is correct though AMFA funds could be used if Provincial funds were unable to meet the charge, to be at the eventual debit of the St. Govt. as are all other such advances (in theory).

The Regional Labour Office debts would be the same as for any other civilian appointments under AMG.

5. Having spoken to the author of the letter (Major A.L. Howe) it is discovered that he has not seen the **1586** + Regs. & it would seem that the Labour Officer has not been consulted.

6. Shall we first direct attention to the Rules & Regs ?

1. Under Title 2, Article II of AMG General Order No. 5, Regional and Provincial Labour Offices are created.

2. A Provincial Labour Officer and a Legal Officer were appointed in Foggia under this Order, at salaries of Lire 8,000 and Lire 5,000 per month respectively, exclusive of indemnities in each case. The indemnities presumably relate to the additional allowance of Lire 1,900 payable under Title 1, Article IV, Section 2 of the Order.

3. In connection with these appointments, it is desired to know:-

(i) Whether such appointments should be made by Provincial Commissioners, Regional Headquarters, or HQ. Allied Control Commission. Is the Italian Government to be consulted?

(ii) What machinery is proposed to secure standardisation of salaries in the various Provinces and Regions. It will be observed that the appointment of the Provincial Labour Officer in Foggia carries a higher salary than that of the Prefect of the Province.

(iii) It is presumed that the salary of the Provincial Labour Officer and such other staff as are appointed under this Order will be paid out of Provincial Funds and that no direct payments will be made from AMG funds. May this be confirmed please?
